

Comprehensive Plan and Parks, Recreation & Open Space Plan Update

"IF YOU FAIL TO PLAN, YOU ARE PLANNING TO FAIL!" - BENJAMIN FRANKLIN

In 2013, East Goshen Township Board of Supervisors authorized the update of two major plans for the Township: 1) the Comprehensive Plan and 2) the Parks, Recreation & Open Space Plan

Comprehensive Plan

A Comprehensive Plan is a long-range plan that guides a municipality's vision for the future. In February of 2013, the Township assembled a Task Force to create this Comprehensive Plan. The Task Force consists of dedicated volunteer residents, township staff and two professional consultants. As part of the plan, the Task Force is assessing the current conditions, creating a vision for the future and developing implementation strategies and steps to achieve the vision.

Some key components of the Comprehensive Plan include an evaluation of current and future land uses, economic development and redevelopment potential, natural, historical and cultural resource protection and energy conservation. The overall goal of the Comprehensive Plan is to create an implementable plan that the Township can use to keep East Goshen the premier Township that it is.

It is anticipated that the Comprehensive Plan draft document will be completed this summer and forwarded to the Board of Supervisors for review and adoption by December of 2014. Following adoption, this plan will be utilized to guide future land use decisions. The Task Force invites all residents to share their thoughts, positive and negative, about the Township. Your input is vital to establishing a vision for the future. All Comprehensive Plan Task Force meetings are open to the public and we encourage you to attend.

Parks, Recreation & Open Space Plan

The goal of the Township's Parks, Recreation and Open Space Plan is to develop a plan of action to enhance the Township's parks, recreation and open space over the next ten years. In October 2013, the Township assembled another Task Force comprised of residents, township staff and three professional consultants to prepare the plan.

The Task Force, lead by Toole Recreation Planning, has been hard at work assessing the existing Township parks and open space and assembling input from key stakeholders. Public input has also been sought via an online survey and an open house, which was held in January. Thank you to all who have participated! The feedback has been very positive to date.

In general, the Plan will provide:

- An assessment of the existing open space, park and recreation programs
- Recommendations for open space conservation and stewardship
- Recommendations related to parkland and recreation facilities
- A feasibility analysis of potential greenways and trails
- Recommendations for administration, management, maintenance and financing

This plan is scheduled to be completed and adopted by the end of the summer. Once again, the Task Force welcomes your input into this plan. Meetings are open to the public.


AREA TOWNSHIPS SET TO LAUNCH CITIZEN EDUCATION PROGRAM

The West Chester Area Council of Governments is proud to announce the formation of the Neighborhood University of Greater West Chester, set to begin in September 2014. The Neighborhood University is intended to provide area citizens with the tools necessary to be better advocates for their community by educating them on local government structure, and by increasing their awareness of available municipal services and resources. Developed by the staffs of several area Townships, the free 11-week training program will educate area residents on the inner workings of local government. Neighborhood University is open to any citizen 16 or older residing in one of the participating communities (East Bradford, East Goshen, Thornbury (ChesCo), West Chester, West Goshen, West Whiteland, and Westtown). Eleven, 2-hour sessions will be facilitated by local, county and

state government officials, area business professionals and others, and will cover topics including:

- Structure of local government in Pennsylvania
- Fire, Police and Emergency Management
- Water Resource Management
- Zoning, Land Use, and Development
- Public Finances
- Transportation Management

EAST GOSHEN RECYCLING – A CONTINUING SUCCESS STORY

Refuse collection and disposal for East Goshen Township includes three waste streams that are efficiently managed by the Township and its contractor. The three waste streams are trash, single stream recyclables, and yard wastes. Trash is collected and transported to the Chester County Solid Waste Authority's Lanchester Landfill in Narvon, PA, where it is disposed. Single stream recyclables are transported to a recycling facility, sorted, and sold. Yard waste is composted and used for various purposes.

East Goshen Township generates 5,500 to 6,000 tons of refuse per year that is collected by our contract hauler, A.J. Blossenski. Because our refuse is collected in three streams, a significant portion is not disposed in a landfill. During the past



two years (2012 and 2013), approximately 35% (by weight) of the refuse collected in the Township has been recycled. Single stream recyclables are approximately 20% by weight and yard waste approximately 15% by weight of the total refuse collected in the Township.

The Township earns revenue from the sale of its recycled materials. Recycling revenue is used to decrease overall refuse management costs for East Goshen Township residents. This revenue includes rebates earned from the sale of recycled materials and grant payments. Recycling revenue has increased from \$35,190 in 2011, to \$37,435 in 2012, and \$54,045 in 2013. This revenue has helped East Goshen Township keep residential refuse rates stable over the past few years.

STORMWATER IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

Healthy Outside Habits Will Protect our Streams and Wetlands



◆ PET WASTE:

- Pick up pet waste. Left on the ground, pet waste increases public health risk by washing harmful bacteria into the nearest storm drain and stream.

◆ CAR CARE:

- Wash your car on the lawn so the water will infiltrate into the ground keeping dirty, soapy water out of the storm drain and stream.
- Repair leaks and dispose of used auto fluids at your local repair shop.

◆ POOL CARE:

- Drain the pool only when a test kit indicates no chlorine levels. Chlorine is detrimental to aquatic life in the receiving stream.
- Properly store pool chemicals to prevent leaks and spills.

◆ STORM DRAINS:

- Keep storm drains near to your property clear of debris and litter.
- Do not blow grass clippings or leaves into the street. This prevents clogging of the storm drains.

Residents, municipalities, businesses and developers need to work together to prevent stormwater pollution.


GEORGE CLYMER: A FOUNDING FATHER IN EAST GOSHEN'S MIDST

George Clymer was born in Philadelphia and orphaned at a young age. Upon the death of his parents he was taken in by his wealthy maternal aunt and uncle, Hannah and William Coleman. William Coleman reared George to become a merchant, and advanced him from clerk to full-fledged partner in his mercantile firm. Upon his death he bequeathed the firm to his ward. Later Clymer merged operations with the Merediths, a prominent business family, and cemented the relationship by marrying his senior partner's daughter, Elizabeth, in 1765.

Motivated, at least partly, by the impact of British economic restrictions on his business, Clymer embraced the revolutionary cause early and was one of the first to recommend independence. He attended patriotic meetings, served on the Pennsylvania council of safety, and in 1773 headed a committee that forced the resignation of Philadelphia tea consignees appointed by Britain under the Tea Act. In 1775-76 he acted as one of the first two Continental treasurers, personally underwriting the war by exchanging all his own money for Continental currency.

In the Continental Congress (1776-77 & 1780-82) the quiet and unassuming Clymer rarely spoke in debate but made his mark in committee efforts, especially those pertaining to commerce, finance, and military affairs. During the War for Independence, he also served on a series of commissions that conducted important field investigations. In December 1776, when Congress fled from Philadelphia to Baltimore, he remained behind to carry on congressional business.

Shortly after their victory at the Battle of Brandywine (September 11, 1777), British troops advancing on Philadelphia

detoured for the sole purpose of vandalizing Clymer's home in Chester County. His wife and children hid nearby in the woods.

In 1776, Clymer's father-in-law, Reese Meredith, purchased approximately 360 acres of land in Goshen Township, Chester County from the estate of Aaron Ashbridge. East Goshen's historic Blacksmith Shop is located on this parcel of land as well as the Bow Tree development. The property, upon the death of Meredith in 1778, passed to his son Samuel and his son-in-law George Clymer. During the Fall of 1777, the family of Mr. Clymer resided at the Chester County property. The house, located in Bow Tree, is on the register of historic homes in East Goshen Township.

After a brief retirement following his last term in the Continental Congress, Clymer was reelected to the Pennsylvania legislature where he had previously served while still in Congress. As a state legislator, he reformed the penal code and opposed capital punishment.

The next phase of Clymer's career consisted of service in the U.S. House of Representatives in the First Congress (1789-91) followed by

appointment as collector of excise taxes on alcoholic beverages in Pennsylvania (1791-94). In 1795-96, he sat on a Presidential commission that negotiated a treaty with the Cherokee and Creek Indians in Georgia. During his retirement, Clymer advanced various community projects, including the Philadelphia Society for Promoting Agriculture and the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts.

George Clymer died at the age of 73 in 1813 at Summerseat, his estate at Morrisville, Pennsylvania. He is buried at the Friends Meeting House Cemetery at Trenton, NJ.

THE COMMERCE COMMISSION OF EAST GOSHEN TOWNSHIP

The Commerce Commission (CC) was created to be of help, service, and support to the Township's business communities, as well as a goodwill ambassador and advocate on their behalf. A cornerstone of our relationship with the business constituencies is valued trust and mutual cooperation.

The Commerce Commission has made great strides to deliver services and amenities to the Commercial (C) and Industrial & Business Park (I/BP) zones. East Goshen's Business Directory was crafted for the C-zone's retail districts and centers of stores and shops, and cataloged with their own links, on the Township website at www.eastgoshen.org last year as a service provided for all the businesses, their employees, residents, and visitors to East Goshen. It is updated and amended as needed. Both Goshen Corporate Parks within the I/BP-zones also received walking & bicycle paths' curbside paint striping and motorist signage for their employees, and Township residents' health and safety. It is also our wish to be as unobtrusive as possible.

The owners and corporate leaders of both C-zones and I/BP-zones took part in the 2nd set of fact-finding Business Forums (for each zone), where they shared their thoughts, needs and desires for the success of their respective businesses and the future of the Township. The Forums were held in the Fall 2012 and Fall 2013, about a year apart.

The CC received a number of requests from the business leaders. Those within our, or the Township's immediate capabilities were quickly fulfilled. Also evident from the round-table discussions during the Forums, and their aftermath, were positive actions being taken by businesses to further enhance their locations with improvements or amenities, efforts which the CC and the Township support and

assist in every way possible.

At the time of this writing (late January) we have concluded establishing our Goals 2014. A few corporations exhibited interest in highly skilled workforce positions that have not been easy to fill. We will be working with county and academic resources, and researching options that may be of help to those corporate leaders in addressing this need.

We have also met with a number of landlords in the shopping districts within the C-zones for during 2013, as a goal to capture their thoughts on the properties they influence and control. We should conclude this goal by March or April this year. Prior to this writing, the Township has achieved 100% occupancy within the I/BP zones. This is gratifying to the businesses and tenants within the respective zones, as well as to the Township. Similar results in other business centers can transpire with landlord trust and cooperation.

The Commerce Commission is also a part of the Comprehensive Plan 2015 Updating Task Force. It is incumbent upon the Township and all ABCs (Authorities, Boards, and Commissions), as part of PA municipal law every 10 years, to update its comprehensive plan (in our case: the East Goshen Comp Plan of 2005) now for year 2015, and beyond. The Commerce Commission is charged with planning and zoning input for the C & I/BP zones that will be directed to, and reviewed by this task force and ultimately sent to the Board of Supervisors, as the updating of the Comprehensive Plan moves forward.

We are also in process of establishing a Commerce Commission Newsletter for the business owners and corporate leaders to be apprised of activities and events that may be of interest to their respective business communities.

MAJOR PROGRESS WITH SEWER CAPITAL PROJECTS

The Municipal Authority's goals for 2013 were met. The three planned construction projects were completed on time and within budget - the Marydell Pump Station Diversion, the Hershey Mill Pump Station Force Main Diversion and the Reserve Pump Station Elimination. All three projects will divert Township wastewater flows that were formerly conveyed to the West Goshen Wastewater Treatment Plant to the Ridley Creek Sewer Treatment Plant to take advantage of the available capacity. Site restoration was also completed for the Lockwood Wastewater Treatment Plant decommissioning.

The most visible project was the Marydell Pump Station Diversion. This project was completed in August 2013 just under the total budget for construction and engineering oversight of \$281,000 despite significant PECO and Sunoco utility coordination requirements.

The Hershey Mill Pump Station Force Main Diversion project was substantially completed in May with final restoration completed in July 2013. This project had a total budget of \$215,000 for construction and engineering oversight and was completed for \$192,000.

The Reserve Pump Station Elimination was substantially completed and in service by October 15, 2013, with final restoration to be completed in the spring. This project was budgeted at \$150,000 for construction and engineering oversight and will be completed for approximately \$130,000.

These projects are being financed with a \$2.5 million note issued by the Delaware Valley Regional Finance Authority at a very favorable 3.049% interest rate over 20 years. As part of the loan process, East Goshen received a AAA credit rating from the Kroll Bond Rating Agency. In its report, which is available on the Township website, Kroll praised the Township for its strong financial management policies, favorable cash position, stable property values, highly-educated population and diverse employment base.

The Ridley Creek Sewage Treatment Plant operated within its monthly permit limits for the entire 2013 year. Three excursions of instantaneous or weekly maximum concentration limits occurred due to high flows attributed to major storm events in June and August. The Township staff continued its aggressive program to control extraneous flows from entering the sewer collection system from groundwater and rain event sources known as inflow and infiltration (I&I). Repairs to sewer infrastructure were performed as necessary.

The next planned capital project is the Reservoir Road Pump Station Project. This pump station is likely to be sited in the vicinity of Reservoir and Strasburg Roads along the Chester Creek Interceptor Sewer. This pump station will divert wastewater from the West Goshen service area to the Ridley Creek Sewage Treatment Plant. This diversion is intended to reduce and maintain East Goshen's wastewater discharge to West Goshen below the limit of 1.0 million gallons per day established in the inter-municipal agreement between the two Townships. Routing options for the force main are currently being evaluated and planning will continue throughout 2014.

The Public Works Department is continuing to look for I&I (Inflow & Infiltration) in the public sewer system. One of the tools that we have added to our tool box is smoke testing equipment. Smoke testing has been done for years by the sewer industry to locate places in the sewer system through which surface water (inflow) can enter the sewer system. It works by pressurizing the sewer lines with air and blowing smoke into the sewer line. The smoke, which is nontoxic, will then come out in areas that are not sealed, such as sewer clean-outs with missing or broken caps, manholes that are not sealed properly and the ground if a pipe is broken. We will begin testing in the Ridley Creek Collection System this spring and affected property owners will be notified in advance.

HEALTHY LAWNS IN EAST GOSHEN

The way we take care of our lawns affects more than the grass. The amount of mowing and watering we do and the fertilizers and pesticides we use affect our air, our ponds, our streams, and our health.

Fertilizers and pesticides often run into ponds and streams, resulting in water pollution, in algae blooms and in sick and hungry fish, since chemicals can wipe out the insects fish eat.

As far as the air around us is concerned, mowing affects its breathability. Gasoline-powered mowers emit carbon monoxide and hydrocarbons (not to mention noise pollution). The more mowing by these mowers, the worse our air gets.

And the health of us and our neighbors suffers, because we are breathing substances that are toxic and losing the clean air and water which keep us well.

Fortunately, The Chester County Water Authority has come up with suggestions which will cut down on mowing and watering and encourage a healthy lawn.

- 1) **Mow High.** Set the mower as high as it will go — 3-4" is recommended.
- 2) **Leave the grass clippings on the lawn.**
- 3) **Water infrequently.** Water only when the grass shows signs of drought stress and then water deeply.

Mowing High slows growth and discourages disease. When grass is cut often and short it grows rapidly, weakening the

plant and encouraging disease and pests. Also, taller turf produces more grass plants and shades out weed seedlings.

Grass Clippings left on the lawn return moisture and nitrogen to the soil, thus feeding the lawn's root system. The clippings will decompose rapidly with no thatch buildup.

Infrequent Watering is better for maintaining a lawn. It encourages the grass roots to grow deep, deeper than weed roots, so that the grass draws on moisture in the ground while the weeds die in the dry surface soil. Showers and thunderstorms usually provide enough water for established lawns, so only a new lawn will require watering.

In East Goshen, we can have beautiful healthy lawns at less expense not only by watering them less and mowing them high but also by not using chemicals harmful to grasses, birds, lady bugs, pets and us. (Feed the grass when it needs it with compost or another good organic, and if you feel desperate for weed control, use something harmless like corn gluten, which both fertilizes grasses and discourages broad-leaf weeds.) We can also cut down on lawn work by substituting trees or shrubs, ground covers or wild flowers, for some of the grass. That will look lovely too. So—Here's to a summer of lush healthy lawns—with less mowing, watering and spreading of chemicals involved.
