1 draft 2 EAST GOSHEN TOWNSHIP 3 CONSERVANCY BOARD MEETING 4 March 14, 2012 5 7:00 P.M. 6 7 The East Goshen Township Conservancy Board met for their regularly scheduled meeting on Wednesday, 8 March 14, 2012, at the East Goshen Township Building. Board members present were: Chairman Sandra 9 Snyder, Bryan Del Monte, Scott Sanders, and Walter Wuicik. Others present: Erich Meyer and Sally Warren 10 CALL TO ORDER 11 1. 12 Sandra called the meeting to order at 7:00pm and led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. 13 14 2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES The Chairman noted that the minutes of the February 8, 2012 were approved as corrected. 15 16 17 3. CHAIRMANS REPORT Sandy reported that there was \$300 in expenses for February - \$250 to CRC Watershed and \$50 18 A. 19 for the PA Environmental Conservation dues. 20 B. Sandy attended the Neighborhood University seminars that the Township held to acquaint residents with the operation of the Township, the ABCs, fire department and police department. 21 22 She highly recommends that everyone attend the next time the Township holds these meetings. 23 24 4. **OLD BUSINESS** 25 Name for Reforested Area – Sandy will check with Ginnie to see if she found out about any A. other names. In the meantime, Scott made a motion to accept Clymer's Woods as the name for 26 27 the reforested area. Walter seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. B. Ponds at Supplee Valley – Bryan mentioned that the trails in Supplee Valley don't go near the 28 29 ponds so he isn't very concerned about the cattails. The north pond is the one Ginnie voiced concern about. Scott commented that residents in the Township who live near ponds, have 30 31 complained in the past about the condition of the ponds. He suggested that the Township start a 32 program to maintain the ponds and partner with the Homeowners Associations to train the 33 residents and share in the costs. Walter mentioned that the Township had a formal report done 34 on the ponds about 10 years ago. Fence – After discussion and referral to a catalog that Scott provided, the Board decided to C. 35 authorize Mark Miller to purchase black wire fencing, 400 ft by 4 ft high, 2 x 2 inch or 2 x 4 36 37 inch openings, to replace the orange fencing currently being used in the reforested area. 38 D. Wood chips - Sandy will email Mark Miller as a reminder about the wood chips that have to be 39 put around the trees in the reforested area. 40 E. Newsletter – Unfortunately, the Conservancy Board's article did not get into the upcoming Newsletter. All of the ABC's were encouraged to post articles on the Township website on a 41 regular basis, so Scott will take his article to Rick Smith. The Board discussed other possible 42 43 topics for articles – reforested area naming, official plant list, etc. 44 F. Conferences – Bryan attended a seminar at Longwood Gardens about livable landscapes. The speaker was Jose Alminana, Andropogon Assocs., who did the landscaping at the Black Box in 45 Applebrook. Items discussed were – protect, preserve and restore native plants (willow oaks, 46 bald cypress etc.), water collection, and organic matter in the top 10-12" of a lawn. Bryan 47 48 mentioned the serpentine barrens to him. Bryn suggested having Jose come in the fall to talk to 49

Sandy announced that the PEC 15th Annual Conference was cancelled. Several Board members

wanted to attend it.

H. Sandy has a point of contact with the Lion's Club. Russel Rickert is the President and has some people signed up for conservation projects, so Sandy will include him in those emails.

5. NEW BUSINESS

- A. Adopt a Highway Scott mentioned that he talked to Mark Miller about adopting Westtown Way, where people turn off of Route 3 and throw trash out of their cars. They found out that part of the road is State road and part is Township road. In order to be in the program, there has to be at least a 2-mile stretch in the state part of the road. Sandy commented that the State provides all the materials and picks up the bags when you're done. Sandy made a motion to get more information about adopting a highway in the Conservancy Board's name. Scott suggested that she ask the State if they will allow Westtown Way to count, even though it is part state and part township. It is safe. Bryan's only concern when selecting a road is safety and blind spots. Scott seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- B. Sandy pointed out that the Central Chester County Bike and Pedestrian Circulation Plan will hold 2 meetings on March 29, 2012 at the West Whiteland Township Building. The times are 2-4 pm and 6-8pm with a presentation at 7:00 pm.
- C. Goose Creek Cleanup The CRC will be holding their 7th Annual cleanup on April 21, 2012 from 9-11 am. Bryan mentioned that they have a pre-cleanup on Friday from 1-3 pm.
- D. Villanova University is going to be making bat boxes and bird houses. Ann at CRC emailed Bryan about it since we had a project using these. He hasn't had a follow-up yet.
- E. Ginnie sent an email about honey bees. Their population has declined dramatically since 2006. Bryan said he did respond.
- F. An update on the reforested area was supposed to come from Gerry Hertel. His students reported the new plantings. Bryan responded to him. They will visit the area again in the Spring. Sandy will include him on emails so he is aware of the Conservancy Board's projects.
- G. 2012 Goals The Board of Supervisors prioritized the Board's goals for 2012 and want to know if they agree or not. Also, if a goal is added during the year, the BOS wants an updated list. The Board reviewed the list and made the following changes:
 - a. Invasives
 - b. Riparian buffer plantings
 - c. Recycling
 - d. Combine goals #4 & #5 for educating residents
 - e. NLT

Public: In answer to questions from Sally Warren, the Board uses articles in the Township Newsletter to educate residents about invasives. The Township Ordinance has lists of recommended trees and plants. The Public Works department removes invasives on Township property. They cannot go on private property or state roads to remove invasive vines from trees. Scott mentioned that there are State ordinances about planting invasives, i.e. bamboo, etc.

- H. Sandy will talk to Rick Smith about allocating an information box for the Conservancy Board in the Township Building lobby.
- I. On April 21, 2012 there will be recycling for electronics at the East Goshen Park from 10-4.
- J. Sandy asked everyone to pick a date for the Spring planting April 28th or May 5th.
- K. The Conservancy Board's sign at the wetlands was replaced and the Historical Commission is very pleased.

Mr. Miller,

Thank you for contacting Bartlett Tree Experts. In keeping with your request, the subject American Sycamore was examined during our on-site meeting of Friday, March 16th. This tree is located at the right/front property corner addressed to 710 Sycamore Drive. Several digital photographs of the tree are attached for your reference.

The American Sycamore was measured at 32.0" diameter inches at the standard 4.5' above soil grade. The canopy was estimated at 65.0' in height and 50.0' in width. The general health of this specimen is rated as average, owing to its inherent susceptibility to Anthracnose Fungus. The canopy of the American Sycamore is free of coarse dead wood, 2" diameter and larger. The main trunk has no apparent structural defects and each of the tree's buttress roots is live and without incidence of insect or disease attack.

The four (4.0") sewer lateral to 710 Sycamore Drive is scheduled for immediate replacement. This excavation will require opening a trench, 42.0" wide by 7.0' deep. The excavation will be made four (4.0') from the trunk of the American Sycamore. Anchor roots and absorptive roots will be lost on the south/west side of the trunk, representing a minimal 40% loss in live root tissue.

The thirty-six (36.0") storm sewer pipe is also due to be removed and replaced on the north/west side of the American Sycamore tree. This excavation will

require opening a trench six (6.0') wide and seven foot six inches (7' 6") deep. This excavation will be made five (5.0') feet from the trunk. Anchor roots and absorptive roots will be lost on the north/west side of the trunk, representing a minimum 30% loss in live root tissue.

The combined seventy percent (70%) loss in live anchor roots and absorptive root tissues will render the American Sycamore immediately unstable. The tree will represent an unacceptable risk of failure to nearby homes, private lawn areas and the Sycamore Drive right-of-way, potentially endangering residents, parked and moving vehicles. This specimen is accordingly recommended for prompt removal.

The replacement of the American Sycamore tree should not be permitted above the original tree stump location. Residual tree roots will eventually decompose, leaving the site unstable for the root ball of a replacement tree. The potential for air pockets beneath the soil surface will subject the anchor and absorptive roots of the new tree to desiccation.


- 1. The township will develop a policy and criteria for the removal of street trees.
