- A. Walter Sewer Authority report The Lockwood Plant closed and they began backfilling the ponds in. They have stopped treating and the facility has been drained. The area will be going back to the residents of Lockwood Chase as open space. The sewage will be diverted to Ridley Creek Treatment plant. A new design is in the works for Marydell Reserve and Hershey Mill Estates (which currently flow to West Goshen's plant), to divert one of the two developments into East Goshen's Ridley Creek Treatment plant. The open house date for the Ridley Creek Treatment Plant is still undecided.
- A. **Erich P&Rec** Community Day was a huge success, around 5500 people attended the event both residents and non-residents. There were some minor issues with long lines for food, which P&R will attempt to remedy before the event next year.
- B. BOS / Carmen Battavio The budgeting process is fully underway for 2013. The biggest issue currently before the BOS is the Police Contract. Thornbury turned down the contract the BOS offered, which included an indemnification clause and would have taken them through the end of 2013.

## EAST GOSHEN TOWNSHIP CONSERVANCY BOARD MEETING July 31, 2012 7:00 P.M.

The East Goshen Township Conservancy Board met for a special advertised meeting at 1325 West Chester Pike to walk the site on Tuesday, July 31, 2012. The Board of supervisors recommended that the Conservancy Board meet with the applicant and their consultants to review the Conditional Use Plans and the proposed landscaping and tree removal for the project and make a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors. The Conservancy Board members present for the site walk were: Chairman Sandra Snyder, Vice Chairman Scott Sanders, Bryan Del Monte, Ginnie Newlin and Walter Wujick. Others present: Adam Knox, Planning Commission, Mark Gordon, Township Zoning Officer and the following residents:

#### CALL TO ORDER

Sandra called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm.

## 1325 West Chester Pike, Conditional Use Application:

The Chairman opened the meeting with some brief comments on the purpose of the meeting. Mark Gordon gave a brief overview of the application and the process moving forward. Mark explained that the Conservancy Board is not typically involved at this point during a Conditional Use application however due to the number of large trees scheduled to be removed and the proximity of the new apartment buildings to the abutting single family residential homes the Board of Supervisors has asked the Conservancy to review the plans and provide the Board with a recommendation.

The applicant, Scott Fagan and his Engineer Dennis O'Neill, briefly outlined the work that has been done to assess the health and viability of the trees, as well as the engineering and planning to layout the parking and proposed buildings for the project.

The arborist for the applicant explained that he recently assessed the trees to be removed and has marked them with colored ribbons.

Pink Ribbon:

Tree is damaged and or has health issues

Yellow:

Tree is viable

The applicant will have a revised and accurate tree inventory for the Conservancy Board to review at the August  $8^{th}$  meeting.

The Board Members and attendees walked the site and reviewed the plans submitted asking questions of the applicants experts.

Numerous conversations were simultaneous and off the record. The Conservancy Board will discuss this application and the plans and make a formal recommendation to the Board of Supervisors at their meeting on August 8, 2012. Sandra adjourned the meeting at 8:05 PM.
