#### LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Dear Friends, Neighbors and Fellow Residents,

Today is a beautiful February 3rd and you may wonder why I am writing this article. Well, our Chairman, Senya Isayeff, quite unexpectedly resigned as of January 4th and the Board voted for me to be Chairman this year. With that comes the responsibility for writing this column. I hope you enjoy reading it and find the columns informative.

There is also something else new in the newsletter. The pictures of the Supervisors have been added at the bottom of th next page. If you recognize any of us when you are out and about, just say "hi" or let us know any questions or comments you may have. Getting first-hand information is the best way to know what is important to our residents.

I want to share some of the things that have been accomplished during the seven years Senya has been a Supervisor:

- The East Boot Road Bridge was rebuilt at a cost of \$500,000 with a State grant contributing \$400,000;
- An updated Comprehensive Plan was approved, partially funded by a \$50,000 grant from the Chester County Planning Commission;
- An updated Park, Open Space and Recreation Plan was approved;
- A Feasibility Study for the Paoli Pike Trail was approved, partially funded by a \$52,500 grant from the State;

- \$3,154,000 in grants were secured for the construction of the Paoli Pike Trail from Reservoir Road to Line Road;
- \$52,500 in state grants were awarded for the development of a Paoli Pike Corridor Master Plan;
- \$475,000 in grant funds were secured for a new playground in the Township Park; and
- \$257,500 in state grants were secured to improve the timing of the traffic signals on West Chester Pike, which is a joint project with Westtown and West Goshen.

In addition, at Senya's suggestion, we established a Commerce Commission to work with our businesses to address issues they may have and established a Futurist Committee to identify opportunities we should consider now in order to keep our Township competitive in the future. Both of these committees have enjoyed great success. These accomplishments would not have happened without the outstanding efforts of our staff and our volunteers.

We interviewed several candidates who expressed an interest in becoming a supervisor to fill Senya's unexpired term. The Board ultimately selected **Michael Lynch**, who is a longtime resident of East Goshen and is currently the Manager of East Bradford Township. Mike brings considerable knowledge and experience *Continued on page 3...*

It is free to sign up for ReadyChesCo, and you can choose the type of alerts that you get. Your wireless carrier may charge you to get messages on your device, so check your plan to see what is covered. You can choose to stop getting these messages at any time.

with him and will be an excellent addition to our Board.

Now let's highlight some of the things that are going on in the Township.

The Milltown Dam impoundment project (the area above the Dam) is well underway. The committee of volunteers and the consultant have had meetings with residents to determine what features they feel would be appropriate for the impoundment area. Three concept plans have been developed after these meetings and were well received by the committee. The preferred concept plan should have been selected and the final plan being developed around the time you receive this newsletter. The Board of Supervisors should receive the final plan in June for review and approval. It should be mentioned that the Supervisors have not been involved in the preparation of the plan. The Supervisors feel that the residents should determine what features they would like to see in the impoundment area.

The Hershey's Mill Dam impoundment project is also well underway and is going through the same process and on the same schedule as the Milltown Dam. The Hershey's Mill Estates Homeowner's Association has also coordinated with the homeowners, the Dam committee and the consultant to identify which features are appropriate for the impoundment. Again, it is important to point out that the Supervisors have not been involved and feel that the residents should determine what features are appropriate for the final plan, which will be submitted to the Board for review and approval.

**Sunoco** has been working for some time with the Department of Environmental Protection and has obtained permits necessary to begin construction of the new pipeline. Sunoco anticipates being ready for construction in the spring. We will schedule a meeting with Sunoco for residents to attend when it is appropriate so that we will all know what to expect when construction begins.

The current police contracts for the Westtown-East Goshen Police Department (WEGO) expire on December 31, 2018. Three contracts must be prepared and executed in order to meet that deadline. The Boards for both Westtown and East Goshen have begun preparing a new inter-municipal agreement so that WEGO can continue providing police service to the two Townships. A contract must also be executed with Thornbury Township, if WEGO is to continue providing police service to them. Lastly, a new labor contract must be negotiated with the police officers. Negotiations can start at any time, if all parties agree, but must start by March, 2018.

As mentioned in previous newsletters, the Township has an e-mail communication called "Constant Contact". Residents are able to receive timely information on specific areas of interest. Residents can sign up by going to the Township's website at www.eastgoshen.org.

If you have an interest in giving back to the community, let us know. We are always looking for motivated folks to volunteer to serve on any one of our Authorities, Boards or Commissions.

#### Spring Has Sprung and So Have the Solicitors

A permit is required to solicit in East Goshen Township. Soliciting permits issued by the Township contain a photo of the person soliciting along with their name and the name of the company they represent. The person doing the soliciting must display their permit while soliciting in the Township. Soliciting is permitted Monday through Friday (9:00 am to 8:00 pm), Saturday (9:00 am to 6:00 pm), and Sunday (noon to 6:00 pm).

The Township cannot prohibit soliciting. However, you as a resident can prohibit soliciting at your residence by completing the Solicitors Do Not Call application (available at the Township Building or at www.eastgoshen.org) and submitting it to the Township. We distribute a copy of the Solicitors Do Not Call List with the soliciting permit and permit holders are advised to check the website for updates.

If you have signed up on the Solicitors Do Not Call List but still have people soliciting, call the police.

#### And the Walkers are Back in the Park

There are two pedestrian crossings at East Goshen Park. Under the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, the driver of a vehicle **shall** yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian crossing the road.

#### **Thirty-Five Years and Counting**

Thirty-five years ago on January 1, 1982, the Westtown-East Goshen Police Department commenced operations under the direction of Chief Charles MacIntyre. The Department started with seven full-time officers and seven part-time officers. The two townships were divided into three zones and there were three officers on the first and second shifts, and two officers on the third shift. The Department responded to 235 calls in East Goshen and 226 calls in Westtown during the month of January.



The Chester County SPCA has changed its name to the Brandywine Valley SPCA and is still looking for old towels, sheets, and blankets to use as bedding in the animal cages. A drop-off bin is located at the Township Building.

#### COMMERCIAL VEHICLE TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT

This article highlights the commercial vehicle enforcement duties of the Westtown-East Goshen Regional Police Department's Traffic Safety Unit (TSU) and answers some frequently asked questions about commercial vehicle enforcement.

#### WHY PERFORM COMMERCIAL VEHICLE ENFORCEMENT?

- According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, approximately 25% of all commercial vehicles inspected in the U.S. are placed out-of-service due to either vehicle or operator safety violations. Unfortunately, our department has found that our percentages are much higher. For example, in 2014 our officers placed approximately 40-45% of all inspected commercial vehicles and drivers out-of-service due to unsafe conditions.
- According the U.S. Department of Transportation, there were 30,800 fatal crashes in the United States in 2012; 12% involved at least one large truck or bus. Additionally, there were approximately 5.5 million nonfatal crashes in 2012; 6.6% involved at least one large truck or bus.
- The amount of kinetic energy involved in a commercial vehicle crash is considerably higher than that of a passenger vehicle crash. As a result, the likelihood of injury and death is higher when a commercial vehicle is involved in a crash.

#### HOW MUCH COMMERCIAL VEHICLE ENFORCEMENT DO WE PERFORM?

- Commercial vehicle enforcement requires advanced training and certifications, which are difficult to acquire and therefore only two members of the department currently have Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program certification.
- In 2014, WEGO conducted a total of 3,450 hours of traffic enforcement. Of that total, 805 hours involved commercial vehicles (23.3%).
- During the first five months of 2015, the Traffic Safety Unit completed 94 commercial vehicle inspections and issued 277 citations for violations.

### HOW DO WE DETERMINE WHERE IT WILL CONDUCT COMMERCIAL VEHICLE ENFORCEMENT?

- The sites for our enforcement details are chosen based upon the volume of commercial vehicle traffic and the incidence of crashes.
- For example, Route 202 is frequently selected because it has an extremely high volume of commercial vehicle traffic. Approximately 50,000 60,000 vehicles travel on Route 202 in our jurisdiction on a daily basis; approximately 15-20% of those vehicles are commercial vehicles.
- The portion of Route 202 in our area also has a relatively high rate of serious commercial vehicle crashes. On April 9, 2015, a three axle truck loaded with sod rear-ended a vehicle that had stopped at a red light along Route 202 in Thornbury Township, pushing it through the intersection and into oncoming traffic. At the time of the crash, only one of the truck's six brake systems was operational. The driver indicated that he was aware that the vehicle was having brake problems but he chose to continue driving. The female operator of the car that was struck suffered a concussion, a fracture of her orbital socket, and a severe facial laceration. This same intersection was the site of two fatal crashes involving commercial vehicles within the last 8 years. The last crash, which occurred in 2009, occurred when a 14,500 pound box truck failed to stop at the red light and struck a stopped car. The car was pushed into another stopped car, causing it to catch fire killing the driver inside.

- The sites for our commercial vehicle enforcement are also selected to meet the safety guidelines established by federal and state protocol giving officers enough space to conduct the enforcement safely and motorists enough advance visual notice of police activity.
- Lastly, sites for commercial vehicle enforcement are selected based on traffic complaints. For example, we frequently receive complaints that motorists fail to stop at the red light at Route 202 & Skiles Boulevard in Westtown Township. This violation is extremely concerning because an elementary and a middle school are located at this intersection. By ensuring a highly-visible police presence at that location, we have dramatically reduced red light violations.

#### TRAFFIC SAFETY UNIT COMMERCIAL VEHICLE SUCCESS STORIES IN 2016:

In June 2016, TSU stopped a truck that began its trip in Ontario, California, which is a known nexus of drug distribution. The stop was conducted in Westtown Township along Rt. 202. The operator exhibited a false log book and had taken a cross county route that was not consistent with industry standards. Closer examination showed that the trailer locks and securement mechanisms had been tampered with and there were significant time gaps in the driver's story. Further investigation showed that the driver had an extensive criminal history of drug possession and distribution including a charge for the importation of cocaine. A narcotics dog from the Chester

County Sheriff's department alerted to the vehicle but a search found no drugs. The investigation showed that the driver had most likely dropped a load of contraband in a suburb of Chicago and was then continuing his trip to Swedesboro, New Jersey.

In a similar incident, TSU officers stopped a tractor trailer travelling from Miami to New York on Route 202 in Westtown Township, which is not a normal route for a truck headed to New York. Multiple indicators were found that the vehicle and driver were involved in the transportation of large amounts of narcotics. The driver had recently been released from federal prison after serving 10 years for the attempted importation of 1.5 tons of cocaine through the Port of Miami. It is believed that this vehicle had recently dropped a large load of narcotics in the area, but the location has not yet been identified.

In August 2016, TSU stopped a pickup truck style car hauler that was traveling from Virginia to a car dealership in Westtown Township. This stop was made in the 1500 block of West Chester Pike. An odor of narcotics was detected coming from the vehicle and in a subsequent search, narcotics were found in the vehicle. The driver was arrested for Driving under the Influence along with Possession of a Controlled Substance, log book violations and several equipment violations.

Our officers continue to work closely with federal, state and regional partners to identify those operators who are using the guise of legitimate business to support criminal enterprise. TSU members have undergone extensive training and education in the identification of those involved in the trafficking of contraband. In part due to the reputation of the WEGO TSU, Officer Lewis has been selected to become a national instructor in the identification and transportation of illegal and controlled substances.

#### GOSHEN FIRE COMPANY: READY TO RESPOND WHEN YOU NEED US

Most Township residents are familiar with the role that the Goshen Fire Company plays in delivering essential emergency services to East Goshen Township and surrounding communities. On a regular basis you have likely seen our fire trucks, ambulances, and fire police vehicle as they travel throughout the Township enacting their emergency and non-emergency roles. You have probably also interacted with our personnel as you supported your fire company through our fundraising activities throughout the year, including our upcoming flower sales and the Goshen Country Fair.



Like many residents, you may be fortunate never to have experienced an emergency situation where you needed to call upon us to respond during your time of need. Regardless of whether or not you have experienced such an emergency, perhaps you have wondered what happens when you place that call for assistance, initiating a response by the Goshen Fire Company. The process that begins when you call 9-1-1 is both effective and efficient and supports our mission and commitment to provide exceptional services to our stakeholders.

While your emergency will typically involve a fire event or a medical emergency or traumatic injury requiring fire and/or emergency medical services, we will use the example of a fire in your kitchen to illustrate how, together with our public safety partners, we are prepared to deliver emergency services designed to fully address your needs and meet your expectations throughout an emergency event.

An essential element of an effective and efficient system is *convenience*. Were you to discover a fire in your kitchen, you would simply have to dial 9-1-1 to request assistance. Your call would be answered by a call taker at the Chester County 9-1-1 Center who would solicit all necessary information about your emergency and then pass it on to a dispatcher who would dispatch the appropriate fire and emergency service units – including fire, emergency medical services, and/or police – and after dispatching the necessary resources would monitor their response and coordinate communications throughout the incident.

Accessibility is an essential attribute of the public safety system that serves you. It is important that emergency service resources be available to respond to your emergency at all times. We make sure that this will be the case, whether through a response from our two stations, or through mutual aid in situations where we are committed to another incident or need additional units to assist at a particular incident.

There are many ways in which we prepare in advance to serve you. Our preparation activities include ensuring that our personnel, apparatus, and equipment are continually in a state of *readiness* to serve our community. Our engineering staff ensures that all of our apparatus are in proper working order and that personnel who drive and operate our apparatus are highly qualified. We continually do equipment checks to make sure that all equipment is working properly and that personnel are proficient in the use of the various equipment that they may use based on the needs of an incident.

While the apparatus and equipment that we will bring to and use at your emergency incident are essential, the most important resource in providing the high quality services that you expect and deserve is without question our personnel. Our cadre of personnel is comprised of dedicated individuals who volunteer their time to serve our community, supplemented by full-time and part-time career staff. Through this combination staffing arrangement we are able to deliver professional, time-critical emergency services 24/7 regardless of the challenges resulting from varying transaction volumes and unscheduled service delivery.

Our commitment to the community that we serve and to you as its residents includes ensuring that all of our emergency responders have the necessary knowledge, skills, and attitude to serve you professionally. In addition to the initial training that new personnel receive when they join our ranks, we provide ongoing training opportunities throughout the year to ensure that members maintain their competency to enact their current roles and responsibilities, as well as to prepare for advancement within the department. We are committed to delivering services that are consistent, courteous, and *professional* during every emergency response.

We pledge to deliver services *effectively* and *efficiently*, in a timely and cost-effective manner. Our top priority is always to ensure the *safety* of our emergency responders and those who live in, work in, or travel to and through the community that we have the privilege of serving. We thank you for your continuing support of the Goshen Fire Company, enabling us to have the necessary resources to continue to serve our community.





#### Public Works Update—2017

As you may know, East Goshen resurfaces all Township-owned roads on a 17-year cycle. This means that if your street was last resurfaced in 2000, it is due for a facelift again this year. Generally, we resurface roads in late summer and early fall, when the weather begins to cool, but conditions are still dry.

Resurfacing roads involves more than simply applying a fresh coat of blacktop and some white and yellow paint. Roads need to be rebuilt from the ground up, a process that involves several steps. First, we raise any manholes on your street that have started to

sink over the past 17 years. Not only do raised manholes result in a smoother driving surface, they also result in less infiltration and inflow into the Township sewer system, which, in turn, leads to lower sewage treatment costs. Repairing manholes also provides a good opportunity to televise and clean sewer lines along your street. Next, we repair the curbs and inlets, which are frequently in bad shape after 17 years of road traffic, snow storms, heavy rains and the normal shifting of the ground. We then mill the road, removing as much of the existing blacktop as possible, which allows us to make base repairs to the roadway. The milled blacktop can then be recycled for other road projects. Finally, we resurface and restripe the street. Your road will feel like a racetrack when we're done, but all residents are kindly reminded that the speed limit on most residential streets remains 25 miles per hour and that they should drive accordingly.

You will receive a letter from the Township prior to us beginning any work on your street. Fortunately, road work can usually be done one lane at a time, and other than a very short period after the blacktop has been laid, you should not experience any problems or delays getting into or out of your driveway.

The following streets/neighborhoods are scheduled for resurfacing in 2017:

- Reservoir Road (north of Strasburg Road)
- Westtown Way
- Mill Valley (Amstel Way, South Tulip Drive, Barkway Lane)
- The Meadows (Meadow Drive, Hollyberry Lane)
- Wentworth (Tallmadge Drive, Saratoga Drive, Von Steuben Drive, General's Way, Schuyler Drive, Nathaniel Drive & Continental Drive)
- The eastern half of Hershey's Mill Estates (Millrace Lane, Foxglove Lane, Candytuft Lane, Mayapple Lane, and the eastern section of Tanglewood Drive)

#### HISTORY IN OUR BACKYARD: EAST GOSHEN AND THE GREAT SEPARATION

Imagine, if you will, downtown Goshenville in the 19th century. The images are the stuff of summertime idyll—children rolling wooden hoops and assembling cornhusk dolls in their dusty front yards; mothers having a good chat over embroidery patterns and boiling pots of beef; the broad-shouldered blacksmiths fashioning sturdy horseshoes and nails over hot embers in the blacksmith shop. These are evocative images, redolent of simpler, more pastoral times.

The daily lives of Goshenville's early settlers are well documented at the Living History Days hosted by the Township's Historical Commission. These are great events and you'd be remiss to skip them.

But what of their faith? The early settlers of Goshenville were, with few exceptions, Quakers, a Christian movement rooted in simplicity and anchored by the belief that there is God in all of us—or "That of God in everyone". Quaker meeting houses are temples of austerity, lacking steeples, religious statues or crosses. Quaker services (or "meetings") throughout the mid-Atlantic region are generally conducted without a pastor or minister and feature long moments of silence in lieu of prayer, interrupted by an occasional "message", in which a congregant shares his or her innermost thoughts with the rest of the meeting.

The history of Quakerism in the United States is dominated by one epochal event, known as "The Great Separation". Like the Reformation to the Catholic Church, the Great Separation pitted dueling visions of religion and, in Goshenville's case, neighbors against each other in a bitter struggle for the heart and soul of the Quaker movement. On one

side were the Orthodox Friends who wanted a belief system more closely aligned with the teachings of the Bible. On the other were the followers of a New York Quaker named Elias Hicks (no clear relation to former East Goshen Supervisor Ira Hicks), an abolitionist who eschewed traditional biblical principles like original sin and atonement. Hick's followers, or Hicksite Friends, were more rural and less wealthy than their Orthodox brethren, who tended to live in larger cities like Philadelphia and Baltimore. These tensions between Orthodox and Hicksite Friends boiled over at the 1827 Philadelphia Yearly Meeting and, like the Catholic versus Protestant conflicts that cleaved Europe from Luther to the end of the Thirty Years War, deeply divided American Quakerism until 1968 when a truce was finally called. Fortunately, as ardent pacifists, Quakers never resorted to bloodshed.

So, what did the Great Separation have to do with Goshenville? Bear with me.



Built in 1849 as an Orthodox meeting house, this building now serves as a Grange and classroom space.

The Goshen Monthly Meeting House at the corner of North Chester Road and Paoli Pike was built in 1836 and represents the third iteration of a meeting house at that site. Goshen Monthly Meeting, like most Quaker meetings in Chester County, aligned itself with the Hicksite Friends. Thirteen years later in 1849, another meeting house was built on the same property, and operated as a rival Orthodox meeting house for 42 years until 1891. Today, this other meeting house is used both as a Grange and as classroom and activity space for the Goshen Friends School. There are also two separate cemeteries on the Goshen Monthly Meeting grounds—one Orthodox (visible from North Chester Road), the other Hicksite (partially visible from Paoli Pike).

when Hicksite Friends elsewhere would have been shunned for fraternizing with Orthodox Friends (and vice versa), Goshenville was home to both a Hicksite and an Orthodox meeting on the same property. This is both an interesting bit of local history and a profound metaphor for ourselves as residents of East Goshen and the modern torchbearers of Goshenville—that despite our differences in race, religion and politics, we have always been able to put aside our differences and work together peacefully to find common cause in our community.






