LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Dear Friends, Neighbors and Fellow Residents,

Today is a wonderful day in East Goshen with sun, clouds and possibly a few showers. By the time you receive this newsletter, you should be enjoying a warm summer day. There are many things going on in East Goshen, some of which I will highlight below.

On June 3rd, the Township held its Bi-Centennial Celebration in honor of the separation of Goshen Township into East and West Goshen 200 years ago. There are many people that need to be thanked for their efforts, but none more so than Jason Lang, East Goshen's Director of Park and Recreation, and Bonnie Dean, a resident of West Goshen. It is hard to imagine that this event would have happened without their tireless efforts to pull everything and everyone together.

Now, let's highlight some of the other things that are going on.

In April, the Board of Supervisors held a meeting at Fugett Middle School for **Sunoco Logistics** to make a presentation on what residents can expect during the construction of the Mariner 2 (20 inch) and Mariner 2x (16 inch) pipelines along Boot Road and North Chester Road (Route 352). Approximately 200 people attended this meeting. Sonoco has received the necessary permits to start construction, which began in early May. The technique to be used in the majority of the Township will be Horizontal Directional Drilling (HDD). There will be six drill sites for staging the drilling machines and associated equipment. The drills can drill at an average rate of 100 feet per day. The sections of installed pipe will be welded at each drill site. The exception to this will be at the Hershey's Mill Shopping Center where an open cut technique will be used. There, the ground will be dug up and the pipe installed at a depth of 48 inches.

Sunoco estimates it will take 18 months or so to install the pipe and restore the affected properties. No road closures will be necessary. Sunoco must abide by all Township ordinances.

The plans for the impoundment areas above the **Milltown and Hersey's Mill Dams** have been on the Township website since April for residents to review and make comments. The plans were finalized at the May meetings of the two Dam Committees. The Board of Supervisors will review the plans and may make a decision regarding the plans at its meeting at the end of June.

On My 24th, the Board conducted its **Annual Financial Planning Session** to discuss five and ten year budget projections. In addition, this year we discussed the details involved in a bond financing for the Township's various planned capital projects and our share of the improvements to the West Goshen Wastewater Treatment Plant. Our projects include the breaching of and the improvements to the impoundment areas of the two dams, the construction of the Paoli Pike Trail and the improvements to the Township Park. We have been fortunate to

have received nearly four million dollars in grants for the Paoli Pike Trail and the improvements to the Township Park and we recently filed grant applications for the two Dams. These grants will substantially reduce our financing requirements to complete the work. Jason Lang and Mark Gordon, Director of Zoning and Codes, deserve kudos for their success in obtaining these grants.

The Board approved a change in the Alarm Systems Ordinance due to the significant percentage of fire calls that are false alarms compared with our neighboring communities. As a result, new fees have been established for false fire alarms, while false alarms for police have remained the same. The new fees are to encourage residents to maintain their alarm systems. The first two false fire alarms in a rolling 12 month period receive a warning, the 3rd and 4th false fire alarms result in a \$500 fine, the 5th and 6th in a \$1,000 fine and after that, the fine is \$2,000 for each additional occurrence.

East Whiteland Township has contacted us to see if we are interested in revisiting the possibility of improving the intersection of King Road and North Chester Road (RT 352). The Board authorized updating the engineering study prepared by McMahon Associates several years ago.

The Board approved no change in the **Sewer Rates** for this year.

Congratulations to our Park and Recreation Department for winning this year's Governor's Award for Local Government Excellence in Health and Wellness as the State's best program for its Fit and Fun in the Park initiative of 2016.

As mentioned in previous Newsletters, the Township has an e-mail communication platform called "Constant Contact". Residents are able to receive timely information on specific areas of interest. Residents can sign up by going to the Township's website at www.eastgoshen.org.

ODDS & ENDS FROM RICK SMITH, TOWNSHIP MANAGER

Sunoco

As I am writing this article, Sunoco has commenced construction on the Pennsylvania Pipeline Project, also known as Mariner East 2. The project will involve the construction of two additional pipelines in East Goshen, bringing the total number of pipelines in the Township to eleven. Paoli Pike

The speed limit on Paoli Pike is 35 mph and there are two pedestrian crossings at East Goshen Park. Under the Vehicle Code, the driver of a vehicle **shall** yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian crossing the road. We have requested the police to provide additional enforcement along Paoli Pike.

Soliciting

There is a knock on your door or your doorbell rings. You look out the window and see a stranger standing at your front door. The first thing to keep in mind is that **you are under no obligation to open your door.** The second thing is that a permit is required to solicit in East Goshen Township and the person doing the soliciting must display their permit while soliciting.

If you do choose to open your front door and the person attempts to sell you something, ask if they have a soliciting permit. If they do not have a permit and you are not interested in what they are selling, just say you are not interested and close your door. You should then call 911 and report that someone is soliciting at your house without a permit. In addition, if you have signed up on the Solicitors Do Not Call List through the township and someone attempts to solicit at your house, call 911.

While you may think it is overkill to call the police, keep in mind that the person who is soliciting without a permit or soliciting at a house on the Do Not Call List is breaking the law.









IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE FALSE ALARM ORDINANCE

The East Goshen Township Board of Supervisors amended the Alarm Ordinance on February 21, 2017. Under the amended ordinance, which went into effect on April 1, 2017, the fees for a false fire alarm were increased as shown below. The Board took this action in an attempt to reduce the number of false fire alarms that the Fire Department has to respond to.

I would note that fees are for false alarms that occur within a rolling 12 month period, which begins on the date of the first false alarm. If another false alarm does not occur within 12 months, the slate is wiped clean.

FALSE FIRE ALARM

- 1st false fire alarm: a warning will be issued;
- 2nd false fire alarm: a warning will be issued;
- 3rd and 4th false fire alarm: \$500;
- 5th and 6th false fire alarm: \$1,000; and
- 7th false fire alarm and for each false fire alarm thereafter: \$2,000.

West Goshen Sewer Authority Improvements to Impact East Goshen Township

Wastewater generated in East Goshen Township is treated at two facilities: the Ridley Creek Sewer Plant located near Towne Drive and operated by the East Goshen Municipal Authority, and the West Goshen Sewer Plant, operated by the West Goshen Sewer Authority (WGSA). The Ridley Creek plant handles about 25% of East Goshen Township's wastewater with the remainder going to the West Goshen plant.

The East Goshen Municipal Authority (EGMA) entered into an agreement with the WGSA in 1977, when the West Goshen plant was being expanded. Several other Townships in the area also have agreements with West Goshen.

In addition to paying for wastewater treatment, the EGMA is also responsible for its proportionate share of the cost of any upgrades required at the West Goshen plant. The costs are proportioned based upon a wastewater flow of one million gallons per day, which represents 16.7% of the West Goshen Sewer Plant capacity.

The West Goshen Sewer Authority is currently involved in a major capital program to upgrade the sewer plant and its sewer system. These improvements are necessary to meet safety and environmental standards. The cost of the total capital program is estimated to be \$26,000,000. The estimated EGMA share, including plant improvements and sections of the sewer system utilized by East Goshen, is approximately \$4,200,000.

Although the EGMA has some reserves, the estimated project costs will require borrowing funds through a long term bond issue. The EGMA board and the East Goshen township staff are carefully monitoring West Goshen's capital program activities. This has involved attendance at the WGSA monthly meetings, as well as several special meetings. EGMA has had the various projects reviewed by its consulting engineering firm and by its attorney.

The East Goshen Municipal Authority meets monthly on the second Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Municipal Building.

Financial Update: East Goshen Township to Issue Series 2017 General Obligation Bonds



Over the next four to six weeks, it is anticipated that East Goshen will be issuing approximately \$5.3 million in general obligation bonds to pay for various improvements throughout the Township, including:

- Engineering and construction costs, net of grants received for the Paoli Pike Trail (\$2.1 million)
- The breach of the Hershey's Mill Dam, the partial breach of the Milltown Dam and related improvements above the dams (\$2.5 million)
- The improvements to the Township Park, including the playground renovation, outlined in the 2015 Park Master Plan, net of grants (\$600,000).

In addition, it is expected that another \$2.9 million will be issued for the Municipal Authority to fund East Goshen's share of project costs associated with the upgrades at the West Goshen Sewer Treatment Plant (see article on page 4). This portion of the debt will be backed by sewer rates.

Below find a number of Frequently Asked Questions about this bond sale:

I've read that East Goshen Township has ample reserves. Why do we need to borrow the money in the first place?

While East Goshen is in a very favorable financial position, an expenditure of over \$5 million would deplete almost all of our cash reserves, and likely force immediate questions about tax increases. Moreover, with interest rates still near historic lows, this is a perfect time to go to the bond market.

How much debt does East Goshen currently have on its books?

Fortunately, East Goshen has very little debt on its books, relatively speaking, and the debt it does have will be paid off within the next six years. All total, East Goshen has about \$4 million in outstanding debt, including \$700,000 for the acquisition of Applebrook

Park (matures in 2019); \$2.4 million for various miscellaneous improvements undertaken in the early 2000s (matures in 2023); and \$800,000 for East Goshen's portion of the Westtown-East Goshen police building (matures in 2023). Because of the rapid amortization schedule of Township debt, it will be possible to wrap the new debt service around the existing debt so that most of the principal on the new debt does not become payable until the existing debt has been retired, thereby ensuring that overall debt service costs remain relatively flat from one year to the next.







I've heard that East Goshen has a AAA credit rating? What does this mean and how does the credit rating affect the bond sale?


On June 5th, East Goshen Township received a Aaa credit rating with a Stable Outlook from Moody's Investor Service. This is the highest bond rating that an organization can receive, and much as a high FICO score corresponds with low interest rates on credit cards, mortgages and car loans, so too does a AAA rating substantially reduce an organization's borrowing costs in the bond market. East Goshen Township is one of only seven townships in the Commonwealth to be rated "Aaa" by Moody's and joins Tredyffrin Township and West Whiteland Township as one of only three municipalities in the Commonwealth to have all three taxing authorities—the municipality, the county and the school district—rated "Aaa". This rating reaffirms the AAA rating that the East Goshen Municipal Authority received from the Kroll Bond Rating Agency in 2013.

I've got some money that I'd like to invest and also show my support for my Township. How can I purchase these bonds?

The Township plans to issue these bonds through a competitive bond sale, in which large underwriters (e.g. Goldman Sachs, Royal Bank of Canada, JP Morgan Chase, etc) will have an opportunity to bid on the right to purchase the bonds in an on-line auction. A competitive bond sale is different from a negotiated bond sale, in which a municipality selects an underwriter in advance. We are hopeful that the negotiated sale will result in the lowest possible interest rates.

However, one of the drawbacks of a competitive sale is that there is no opportunity to reserve a portion of the new bonds for retail investors at the time of sale. With that said, once the bonds have been sold to the underwriter, you may be able to purchase them—generally in increments of \$5,000—through a brokerage firm.

I've heard the terms "electoral debt" and "non-electoral debt" before. What do those terms mean?



Under the Pennsylvania Local Government Unit Debt Act, municipalities are allowed to borrow up to 250% of their annual revenues without seeking approval from voters. This 250% limit is therefore the threshold at which an organization's debt runs the risk of being unsustainable. For perspective, East Goshen's current outstanding debt represents about 40% of its annual revenues and even with another \$5 million issue, the percentage will still be under 100%.




AND AWAY WEGO!

and information on Hiking Week, which will be observed this year from Thursday, May 25 through Friday, June 2. During Hiking Week, DCNR teams with the Keystone Trails Association to offer free organized hikes and walks. Visit the site to find out which parks will be featured.

CAMPING

Make sure to visit www.dcnr.state.pa.us for information on primitive camping, motorized camping and group camping – the three main distinctions DCNR provides regulation and pointers on. Did you know that you must place your camp more than

100 feet from a waterway in Pennsylvania? Download a fact sheet from the Pennsylvania Bureau of Forestry through the site and read the rules before you start your camping trip. All three forms of camping may require a permit, so it's a good idea to check out the materials on the website while planning your camp-out, including the reservations page.

WATER SPORTS

Heading out on the water as it heats up this summer? DCNR's Rivers Resource Program manages everything from conservation program and grant work to guided water trails for kayaks and canoes. *ExplorePAtrails.com* also contains water trail information in its searchable database, so be sure to check there, too. You'll also want to check *fishandboat.com* for information on licensing your boat and for even more water trails and programs to enjoy. You can download the PA Boating Handbook there as well.

East Goshen Township: Celebrating 200 Years!

A LOOK BACK AT OUR FOUNDING DOCUMENTS

On February 3, 1817 the Court of General Quarter Sessions acknowledged a petition from the residents of Goshen Township asking that Goshen Township be divided into two Townships. The Court appointed Richard Thomas, George Massey and John Jacob to determine if the request should be granted and, if so, to propose a dividing line. On June 12, 1817 Richard Thomas, George Massey and John Jacob issued the following report.



In pursuance of the powers vested in the subscribers, we have (agreeably to public notice given) this day met a considerable number of the Inhabitants of Goshen, and having discovered a general voice in favor of a division of said township, coinciding with our own Judgment we propose the following as the dividing line. Beginning at a corner of the lands of John Fordythe and Benjamin Hickman, on the north side of Westtown township, thence a Northerly course along the line dividing said lands, to a corner of John Rettew and Rebecca Hoopers's land, thence along the line dividing said lands, and of said Rettew, Jesse Matlack, Eli Thomas and John Marshall on the East Sides and William Rettew on the West side to the Street Road, thence alone the same Westerly to a corner of Jesse McCall's lands on the West and Nathan Sharples, William Minster and Isaac Haines on the East side to the North West corners of said Haines's land, thence along the lines of said Hain's and land of John Temple an easterly course to the middle of old Chester Road, thence along the middle of the same Northwesterly about fifty seven perches and five tenths, thence a Northerly direction, on the line dividing the lands of John Morgan, Isaiah Fawkes and Benjamin Matlack on the West side and Enos Garrett and Eli Patterson on the East side to intersect West Whiteland township lines, which we propose as a line dividing said township; the East side thereof to be known by the name of East Goshen, and the West side to be known by the name of West Goshen for further illustration we refer to the annexed plot, and add that from our own knowledge and information received, we apprehend the division is nearly in equal parts as relates to taxable property.

Witness our hands and Seals this 12th of 6th month 1817.

KEEP YARD WASTE AWAY FROM STREAMS


Dumping of yard clippings, leaves, and other debris into stream valleys and floodplains is a serious problem.

- Yard waste like leaves, grass, and brush piled along stream edges suffocates and kills the trees and shrubs that are critical for avoiding stream bank erosion.
- Yard waste piled along streams can easily be washed into streams during large rain events. Once in the stream, this burst of organic material contributes a harmful excess of nutrients, which in turn robs the stream of oxygen needed by fish and aquatic insects.
- Leaves and other yard waste raked into streets often wash into storm drains, causing flooding, impeding stream flow,

and creating areas of stagnant water that may create mosquito problems.




