10	The East Goshen Township Historical Commission held its regularly scheduled meeting on
11	Thursday, May 13, 2010 at 7:00 pm at the East Goshen Township Building. In
12	attendance were: Chairman Kathryn Yahraes, Co-Vice Chairmen Ben Rohrbeck and
13	Ellen Carmody, and members Sue Ciorletti, Ed Lendrat, Chris Reardon, Judy Schafer,
14	and Joe Zug. Jason Young was absent. Also in attendance were: Gary Althouse
15	(Township Building Inspector), Senya Isayeff (BOS), and Ruth Scadding (Parks and
16	Recreation.
17	
18	1 & 2. CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE
19	The Chairman called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm. Ed Lendrat led those present in the Pledge
20	of Allegiance. The Chairman asked for a moment of silence as well as support for our troops
21	overseas and their families.
22	
23	Kathryn Yahraes introduced Joyce Tarsi, ABC Secretary, as the substitute
24	Recording Secretary for this meeting.
25	
26	3. MINUTES
27	Joe Zug made a motion and Ben Rohrbeck seconded approval of the March 11, 2010 minutes as
28	submitted. No further discussion or comments were made. The vote was unanimous to accept
29	the minutes.
30	
31	Minutes of April 8, 2010 were reviewed. The spelling of Ed Lendrat's name was noted as well
32	as a change of the World War II sign to include Honor Roll. Chris Reardon made a motion to
33	accept the minutes. Sue Ciorletti seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous to accept the
34	minutes with corrections noted. Ellen Carmody abstained from voting since she was absent
35	from that meeting.

37	4. ACTIVITY CALENDAR and ANNOUNCEMENTS.
38	
39	Kathryn Yahraes noted this coming Saturday, May 15 <sup>th</sup> , the ABC's will hold a meeting to
40	exchange information. A show of hands was taken to see who could attend.
41	
42	It was noted that the Paoli Illumination has been moved from October to September 18. Chris
43	Reardon mentioned the Colonial Plantation Revolutionary War Re-enactment was to be held
44	this upcoming Saturday and Sunday. Ellen Carmody pointed out that Historic New Castle Days
45	will be presenting an exhibit "Tying the Knot" detailing wedding customs in the colonial days.
46	She will email details to all.

It was suggested that events other than the regularly scheduled ABC meetings be posted on the billboard. Senya Isayeff will give this suggestion to Rick Smith for discussion by the BOS at the next meeting.

#### 5. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Kathryn reminded those in attendance that next Tuesday is the Primary Election and to be sure and vote.

Kathryn announced that Joe Ewing, who has served on the Zoning Hearing Board since 1996, has resigned. He will be moving out of the Township.

Ben noted former Historical Commission member Nancy Daversa (who writes mystery books) brought a friend -- a noted children's book author Anne Isaacs -- to the Blacksmith Shop and Plank house. Anne is writing a children's book and needed to research the area since the story will end in Goshenville.

# 6. SUBDIVISION/LAND DEVELOPMENT

Nothing new was reported.

#### 7. OLD BUSINESS

Historical Commission member Jason Young has resigned but will formally submit a letter to the BOS. Jason will still volunteer for the Commission activities.

Kathryn talked about upcoming venues that would be good to try to sell the Living History Day Books since there are approximately 175 books left in inventory. The EGT fireworks event was discussed as a possibility with the aid of Plank House volunteers to go around and sell the book or, at least, make people aware of it. Also, contacting various realtors who would purchase the books for the homebuyer was another suggestion. Ellen recommended a poster be placed in the lobby on Election Day to advertize the book. Fellow members endorsed the ideas.

Sarah Credeur briefly stopped in at the meeting and offered to look at the script for TT & V W with may include the Grange. She has been a long time resident, has a wealth of history, and can be an invaluable source of information. Sarah also said she would provide information on each name that is listed on the Milltown and Goshen Heights Honor Roll plaque now displayed in the big meeting room.

The formation of a "Building and Grounds Committee" to oversee the upkeep of maintenance on the Blacksmith Shop and Plank House was brought up. It will be put on the agenda for June for further discussion.

- 89 <u>Living History Day</u> All activities are on target. Judy gave a summation of the Springton
- 90 Manor Farm Sheep to wool Day held in April. She made connections with a "toy lady" and a
- 91 "spinner". Both will be invited to participate in our LHD. Kathryn visited Historic
- Sugartown's event the same day and took photos for future references for ideas.

<u>Philadelphia Campaign</u> – Chris will email a letter to the coordinator expressing our interest in a vendor opportunity. Table space would be shared with Paoli Battlefield. He felt this event would be good exposure for the Township as well as to sell the East Goshen History book.

<u>Education Center Activities</u> – Sue commented that the suggestion of "Marketing Layering" is a good idea. Visitors should be given insight to the past history but not given the whole story so there would be enough information to peake the visitors' interest so that the visitors might come back again.

## Other Projects - none discussed

<u>Family Research</u> – Ed reported since he has been working with the census committee, his research has been put on hold. Ed suggested putting a blurb in the next East Goshen Newsletter that research has been done on various historic homes and ask additional information on these properties be shared. Kathryn mentioned a previous idea of writing a letter to historic property owners inviting them to a "special event" just for them. In addition to giving them a copy of the chain of title for their house, a program would be presented and tours of the Plank House and Blacksmith Shop would be available.

#### 8. NEW BUSINESS

A. <u>Expenses</u> – The Historic Commission will cover the expense of an Images of America book given to Anne Isaacs – the children's book author doing research on Goshenville.

B. <u>ABC's Meeting</u> - Kathryn took a head count of who would be attending Saturday's meeting. The purpose of the meeting was to gather ideas on how each ABC could help or cross-promote each other's ABC activities, whether directly or indirectly. Suggested topics of discussion included advertising announcements or events other than meetings on the board located on the corner of Paoli Pike and Boot Road, cooperative programs, advocacy role for all ABC members, Education of the residents and their families.

c. <u>Liaison Reports</u> – Reports had all been emailed. No additional questions or comments were
 made.

D. <u>501.c.3</u> - The Township BOS has agreed to set up a 501.c.3 account. The Township Solicitor will set it up on a *pro bono* basis. A member from each ABC will be nominated to serve. The objective of the 501.c.3 is to establish a foundation which will grow and relieve budgeting burdens on existing ABCs. It would also include the Residents' "Save the Dam" fundraising efforts. Ellen was nominated with Ben as the back-up.

F. Other New Business — Ben reported Bob Koski, of the "Tory Inne", donated historic pictures of the Inne when it was the Post Office and General Store for Goshenville along with a box of old items found on the property during its renovation. Bob requested the items be displayed in the Blacksmith Shop. With Bob and Linda moving to the Rochester, NY area, the Inne is will be rented until a buyer is found. A question was raised if the renters or new owners would have to

139 140 141 142	re-apply for a conditional use permit if the use were to be changed from a B & B. (The historic resource qualifies for adaptive re-use under Township Ordinance.) Senya Isayeff replied that the renters may have a "By Right" use of the facility and would be suitable for commercial use. Parking is another issue in itself and would be looked at by the Planning Commission.

144	Kathryn also reported the "Clocktower Farm" historic property is under contract for sale and
145	settlement will occur before the end of June.
