**EAST GOSHEN TOWNSHIP  
HISTORICAL COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES  
May 12, 2011**

The East Goshen Township Historical Commission held a scheduled meeting on Thursday, May 12, 2011 at 7:00 p.m. at the East Goshen Township Building. In attendance were: Chairman Ellen Carmody, Co-Vice Chairmen Ben Rohrbeck and Chris Reardon, Kathryn Yahraes, Judy Schafer, Joe Zug and non-voting member Ed Lendrat. Also in attendance were Gary Althouse (Township Building Inspector and Staff Liaison to the HC), Dolores Higgins and Erich Meyer.

**1. CALL TO ORDER**

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

**2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE & MOMENT OF SILENCE**

Ben led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance and in a moment of silence for our troops.

**3. MINUTES**

A. Kathryn moved to approve the minutes of the March 10, 2011 as corrected. Chris seconded the motion. The motion passed.

B. Ben moved to approve the minutes of April 14, 2011 as written. Joe seconded the motion. The motion passed.

**4. ANNOUNCEMENTS**

A. The Activity Calendar was reviewed.

**5. TREASURER'S REPORT**

A. The report was reviewed. Ellen mentioned that the U.S. flag for 1861-63 with 34 stars was purchased. Concrete was purchased for installing the signs.

B. Kathryn gave the following report on the royalties from the Images of America Book up to

March 2011:	9/2008	\$556.70
	10/2009	\$574.87
	4/2010	\$324.13
	10/2010	\$ 54.06

These funds are dedicated to the Historical Commission. The cost that the Historical Commission was responsible for was taken out. Chris commented that the Commission should take some of the books to sell on July 4<sup>th</sup>.

**6. CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT**

A. Ellen reported that she and Kathryn attended the 501.c.3 committee meeting and gave their wish list. One item was a video. The committee suggested using high school or college students. The committee needs a proposal of what the Historical Commission wants, how much it will cost, who has already been approached, and how far in the process they are. Joe explained that donations given to the Blacksmith Shop could be directed through the 501.c.3 and be eligible for a tax deduction. Ben voiced concern about restrictions of donations. It was decided that the Commission will keep track informally of the donations that are put in the bucket at the Blacksmith Shop. Ben wants to report these collections and the expenses they cover.

B. The Chairmen of the ABCs met with Senya who announced that the Chester County Industrial Council will be taking a tour of East Goshen to publicize East Goshen. Senya asked for ideas on how to promote East Goshen and encourage more residents to volunteer. One possible idea was to have a Volunteer Coordinator for the Township's Celebration in 2017.

1 C. GPS Project – Chris needs an official letter from the Township stating that they are working  
2 on a Township project. They will be driving around the township taking pictures of houses, etc.  
3 D. Advertising for June 4<sup>th</sup> – Ellen has been giving out posters and fliers. She asked the  
4 Commission members to take some. Don Beideman will write an article for the newspaper. An  
5 idea for a topic was “What it takes to change from a Revolutionary format to a Civil War format.”  
6 Ellen asked if anyone has cd’s for the Civil War era.  
7

## 8 **7. OLD BUSINESS**

9 A. Cell Tower Update – Kathryn and Ellen went to the Zoning Hearing Board meeting  
10 regarding Liberty Tower. The presenter had photos of what it would look like but had none taken  
11 from the history area. Chris feels that moving the tower 100 yards or so from behind the WAWA  
12 to the Township Building doesn’t take the concerns away. Kathryn reported that John Snook,  
13 East Brandywine Supervisor and land management planner, was the Township’s expert witness.  
14 John helped East Goshen write the Historic Ordinance and Comprehensive Plan. Ellen feels the  
15 Historic Commission should protest the cell tower at the WAWA because of the visual impact.  
16 Chris moved to reissue the Historical Commission’s letter to protest a cell tower on both areas  
17 being considered (the WAWA and the Township Building). Ben seconded the motion. The  
18 motion passed.

19 May 24<sup>th</sup> the Board of Supervisors is holding a public meeting for cell tower discussion.

20 B. Research Update – Ed gave out packets of his latest research results. The next 9 houses will  
21 be located North of East Strasburg Road and East of North Chester Road.  
22 He found 2 letters written during the Civil War era by East Goshen residents Oliver E. Jackson  
23 and Benjamin Franklin Baldwin.

## 24 **8. NEW BUSINESS**

25 A. Ben reported:

- 26 1. He emailed the Chairman of East Whiteland suggesting that they meet to share  
27 research.
- 28 2. The sign at Lockwood Chase mentions the “Battle of the Clouds.”
- 29 3. Local folklore says there are revolutionary soldiers buried at the intersection of Rt.  
30 352 and King Rd. Sean Moyer has additional information about this area.

31 B. 501.c.3 Requests – Kathryn passed around the Historical Commission’s grant wish list.  
32 Another project is a building for the Conestoga wagon. Ellen asked Commission members to  
33 think about this. Chris is against erecting another building. It would be an imposition on those  
34 in the Blacksmith shop and he and Ben are working on a different idea. They would like to move  
35 the meeting room out of the Blacksmith Shop and make it into a museum room instead. Signs for  
36 historic houses in East Goshen is low on the list.

37 C. Hershey’s Mill Dam – Ellen mentioned that there may be a request for funds to establish  
38 the Rocky Hill and Hershey’s Mill Dam areas as historic. A lot of research has already been  
39 done. There are some grants for educational projects.

40 D. Kathryn suggested putting an extra \$2000 request for volunteer costumes because for just  
41 the dress it will cost about \$159 each. This does not include shoes, bonnet, undergarments, etc.  
42 Dolores explained that dresses of this era were fitted, so it will be difficult to have several  
43 volunteers use one dress.

44 E. Commission members reviewed the list of project ideas:

- 45 1. Judy feels the East Goshen Township website needs to include the Civil War.

- 1 2. Kathryn likes the idea of taking traveling trunks with Civil War items in them to the  
2 schools. Ellen feels they will need to have a maintenance plan for the trunks.  
3 3. A video of Ben in the Blacksmith Shop  
4 4. Dolores suggested checking with local schools that have communication students that  
5 need to do internships.  
6 5. Design a laptop Power Point presentation  
7 F. Ben reported that the floor at the double doors at the Blacksmith Shop are getting worse  
8 and may be a safety hazard.  
9 G. Kathryn announced that the next meeting with the volunteers will be May 19<sup>th</sup> at 7pm.  
10 Ellen mentioned that the tours in May will not be in the first person. Because the day is  
11 longer this year, Ben will need another person to cover the Blacksmith Shop. Dolores  
12 needs to fit the female volunteers who will be wearing Civil War dresses.

20 Applebrook was dedicated this week and named after Whitey Hassler.  
21 B. Conservancy Board – They will be planting shrubs in Applebrook this Saturday, May 14<sup>th</sup> at  
22 9 am. Need volunteers.  
23 C. Municipal Authority – The construction phase is done. They plan to have an open house in  
24 the Fall.  
25 D. Planning Commission – 1422 Paoli Pike – Dr. Zalenska. Chris explained that they have a  
26 deadline of August 2012, which they may not be able to meet. They have a 60 day extension.  
27 Kathryn mentioned that Senya feels the Historical Commission should write a letter stating that,  
28 based on the new information, the Commission wants to revisit the decision to waive the Historic  
29 Impact Study.

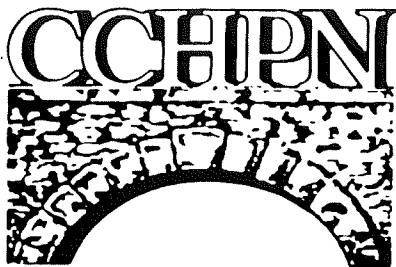

Dear Friends and Fans of Save America's Treasures:

We write with great regret and a heavy heart to update you on Save America's Treasures. As you will see from the memo below from Stephanie Meeks, President of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, we were informed late last week that Save America's Treasures will officially close as a program of the National Trust on June 30th. With the program's termination, our positions also will be eliminated.

For the past year and a half, since February 1, 2010 when we first learned of the Administration's puzzling decision to end the federal Save America's Treasures program, we have worked tirelessly with our Trust colleagues, federal partners and countless friends on Capitol Hill and across the country to ensure the program's survival. Throughout these challenging times, the hundreds of letters of support and offers of assistance we received from you boosted our spirits and strengthened our resolve. You should feel proud that this joint effort was a success and our voices were heard. With SAT's broad bi-partisan support, the House voted last August to re-instate SAT for 2011, and the Senate was poised to follow suit.

Unfortunately, as you know, a 2011 budget was not passed last year, and our federal funding fell victim to a new Congress and the ensuing budget battles. Because the President's budget did not include SAT for two years in a row, and Congress has decided against reinstating any programs the Administration has eliminated, Save America's Treasures will not be funded in 2012, either. Although we presented a variety of creative solutions to develop a fully-private program, the National Trust decided it could not maintain SAT without federal support.

This decision is disappointing and sad on many levels-- the end of a bright era in preservation, and for us personally. It has been an enormously rewarding 12+ years and a true pleasure and privilege to work with you, helping facilitate your incredible efforts to save our nation's rich heritage. We count our long-standing partnership and friendship with each of you as a highlight of our tenure at the Trust, and we hope our paths will cross again before too long. Our personal contact information is below, along with that of key representatives from our federal partner agencies for any ongoing SAT-related business.

In the coming months, the National Trust may invite you to participate in some of their other programs and activities. This is a challenging time for those of us concerned about the protection of our country's precious cultural resources, but with the steadfast commitment you and so many others have shown over more than a decade, we are confident that better days lie ahead.

While the National Trust's SAT program soon will be a memory, we share with you a proud legacy of treasured places we helped save. Keep up the great work, keep in touch, and thank you again for all you continue to do to ensure a brighter future for our past.
