6 7	The regular meeting of the East Goshen Township Park and Recreation Commission was held on Thursday, September 4, 2014 at the Township Building. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Heidi Karpa at 7:15				
8	pm. Commission members present were:

18	CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE				
19	Heidi led the Pledge of Allegiance.				
20	Heidi asked for a moment of silence to remember our troops.				
21	Heidi asked if anyone would be recording the meeting. There was no response.				
22					
23	APPROVAL OF MINUTES				
24	1. Heidi noted that the minutes of the August 7, 2014 meeting were approved.				
25					
26	NEW BUSINESS				
27	1. <u>2015 Budget</u> – Jason provided copy of the 2015 Budget Request which also included actuals for 2012				
28	and 2013 and 2014TYD as of 6/30/14. He applied the 1.7% increase that the Township is using for the				
29	2015 request. Going forward all new programs will include a cost for his salary.				
30	He is proposing 3 new programs as follows:				
31	a. East Goshen Township Sports Camp – This is for ages 10-13 for kids who want to have fun				
32	playing sports. There will be teams and they will play a different sport each day.				
33	b. Full Day Camp – The pilot program this year had 18 participants. Jason wants to increase it to				
34	2 weeks for 2015. He anticipates a full day camp all summer by 2017 when the school is				
35	scheduled to have air-conditioning.				
36	c. Recreation Community Services – These are revenue producing programs. Suggestions are				
37	stickers and magnets with East Goshen logo and tickets for Hershey and Dorney Parks. The tickets				
38	will be sold at a discount less than the online price. Any unsold tickets can be returned for a full				
39	refund.				
40	Jason had 3 options for Community Day. The Commission members all agreed to have fireworks and				
41	a mid-level band (Grease Band) for 2015. Fundraising for this event was discussed. Heidi suggested				
42	sending the residents of the township a letter in January asking for donations and we can give them a				
43 44	sticker. Jason is selling water at the Farmers Market for the Friends. John will attend the next Friends meeting.				
45					
46	The 2015 Proposed Budget includes fee increases for trips from \$35 to \$40 and for ½ day camp to \$90.				
47	2. Tennis Courts- Russell Miller, 1507 Wilson Lane – He moved here in 1975. He and his wife have used				
48					
49	the tennis courts regularly. He is concerned about the lack of use of the tennis courts. There used to be				
50	tournaments, etc. At East High School people are waiting in line to use the courts. The EG courts #1,				
51	2, & 3 are okay. There were a few things that needed repair. He got in touch with Jason and Public Works made those repairs. Courts #4, 5 & 6 however, are in need of major repair. There are tennis				
52	programs for women and children but not men.				
53	Betsy wants to unlock the courts and stop selling the tennis tags. The cost is \$30 for each resident and				
54	\$50 for non-residents. People will go where it is free. Anne Marie mentioned that the board decided to				
55	lock the courts years ago because skateboarders and roller skaters were wrecking the surface of the				

1 2	courts. Mr. Miller commented that a few years ago he saw kids on the courts and asked how they got there. They climbed the fence. He has noticed recently that the fence has been cut so the kids can slide
3	under it. Russ volunteered to work with Jason to explore other options.
	under it. Russ volunteered to work with Jason to explore other options.

5	3. Park Special Events – Jason reported that there will be a total of 7 special events in the Park in 2014.
6	The fee is \$200. He is proposing the following:
7	a. Applications for special events must be received 6 months in advance with 2 months
8	for approval. This gives them 4 months to find another venue if we deny their request.
9	b. Change the fee to \$1.00 per person.
10	Betsy does not want too many special events in the park because they interfere with casual use by
11	residents. Jason will only allow amplification at the Veterans Pavilion.
12	The Commission members all agreed to change the fee to \$1.00 per participant. Also, only non-
13	competitive walks will be allowed in the park and they agreed to 6 months advance notice of
14	applications.

17	1. Open Space Plan – Joe reported that the Township has requested an extension until June 2015 for the

24	2. The Farmers Market will be held at Hershey's Mill on October 30.
25	3. Jason reminded the members that someone else will have to write an article for the next newsletter.

28	1. Joe reminded everyone that the Commission still has 1 open seat. Liaisons were discussed.

31	There being no further business PJ moved to adjourn the meeting. John seconded the motion. The meeting was
32	adjourned at 9:00 pm.
