## LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Dear Friends, Neighbors and Fellow Residents,

On behalf of the entire Board of Supervisors, we wish everyone in the Township the warmest Season's Greetings! It's hard to believe that 2017 is almost over.

I would like to take this opportunity to update everyone on concrete steps the Township has recently taken with respect to the Sunoco Pipeline. On October 3, 2017, the East Goshen Township Board of Supervisors adopted a resolution regarding the need for policy changes with respect to oil and gas pipelines in Pennsylvania. This resolution has been shared with Governor



Tom Wolf, Senator Tom Killion, Representative Carolyn Comitta, and the elected officials of every other municipality in Chester County. We believe that this resolution is a powerful document that can serve as a template for other local governments to help restore local control over zoning and land use decisions in Pennsylvania.

By way of background, in the last newsletter I noted that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC) had previously determined that Sunoco is a public utility and therefore that it has the right to

transport petroleum products within its service area in Pennsylvania. Once the PUC determines that a pipeline company is a public utility, the company has the ability to install as many pipelines as it wants, wherever it wants within its service territory. In addition, neither the

PUC nor any other state agency or local government has the power to tell a pipeline company where a pipeline can and cannot be located.

In order to correct this imbalance of power, change is needed to the state laws that govern pipelines. To that end, the resolution adopted by the Board identifies six action items for our State Senators, State Representatives and the Governor:

1. Develop a policy for determining the location of oil and gas pipelines for the common good of all of the citizens of the Commonwealth.

Currently the Commonwealth does not have any policy regarding the location of pipelines. We think it should have one!

2. Reevaluate the legal framework for the siting of oil and gas pipelines to allow for an active role by local governments, including the authority to directly participate and responsibly influence the siting process.

In other words, local governments that will have to host the pipelines should have an opportunity to participate in the siting process.

3. Reevaluate the legal framework for oil and gas pipelines to establish "easement saturation standards" that recognize the practical limitations for the number of pipelines, size of pipelines, and character of the products transmitted within a given pipeline easement.

Currently, any decisions about the number of pipelines in an easement and what they transport are at the sole discretion of the pipeline company.

4. Reevaluate the legal framework for oil and gas pipelines to provide funding resources to local governments that host oil and gas pipelines, to enable local governments to effectively review, inspect, and monitor these 'industrial highways' to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of their residents.

Pipelines companies are not subject to real estate tax or an extraction tax. As a result, while municipalities have the responsibility to provide for the health, safety and welfare of their residents, they do not receive any financial assistance from the pipeline companies.

5. Establish a Pennsylvania agency tasked with the authority for the siting (with municipal input) and regulation of oil and gas pipelines, both during construction and when in service, in order to minimize adverse impact on the citizens, or, in the alternative, restructure the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission to provide adequate and effective funding, resources, and legislative tools to perform this function.

There should be a state agency that approves pipelines routes and has the ability to develop and enforce standards related to vibration and noise during construction and safety standards during operation.

6. Utilize the influence of the Governor, Pennsylvania Senate, and Pennsylvania House of Representatives to affect similar changes for interstate pipelines at the Federal level.

There are similar problems with the siting and regulation of interstate natural gas pipelines that run between two or more states, and therefore fall under the purview of federal regulations.

As Thomas Jefferson famously said, "the government closest to the people serves the people best."

The Board of Supervisors encourages you to contact your state legislators about the action items listed above and help us realize Jefferson's vision.



## ODDS & ENDS FROM RICK SMITH, TOWNSHIP MANAGER

#### **Street Address Numbers**

You are required to place your street number on your mailbox and on the front wall of your house. This helps ensure that fire department and police department can find you in the event of an emergency.

#### Paoli Pike

There are two pedestrian crossings at the East Goshen Park. The applicable section of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code reads as follows.



#### § 3542. Right-of-way of pedestrians in crosswalks.

- (a) General rule.--When traffic-control signals are not in place or not in operation, the driver of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian crossing the roadway within any marked crosswalk or within any unmarked crosswalk at an intersection.
- **(b)** Exercise of care by pedestrian.--No pedestrian shall suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle, which is so close as to constitute a hazard.
- (c) Limitation on vehicles passing.--Whenever any vehicle is stopped at any crosswalk at an intersection or at any marked crosswalk to permit a pedestrian to cross the roadway, the driver of any other vehicle approaching from the rear shall not overtake and pass the stopped vehicle.
- **(d) Application of section.--**Subsection (a) does not apply under the conditions stated in section 3543(b) (relating to pedestrians crossing at other than crosswalks).
- (e) Penalties.--The driver of a vehicle who violates subsection (a) commits a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$50.

#### North Chester Road

PennDOT will be repaying North Chester Road (SR 352) from West Chester Pike (SR 3) to Lancaster Pike (SR 30) in 2018.

## LATEST NEWS FROM THE GOSHEN FIRE COMPANY

Monday nights are "drill nights" at Goshen Fire Company, when our members train to handle a wide variety of situations they might face when you place a 911 call. In addition to training at our fire houses, we also use the facilities of the West

Chester Fire Department Training Center, as well as the state of the art Chester County Public Safety Training Campus in South Coatesville.

#### Some of our recent training sessions have covered such topics as:

- Forcible Entry; we use a door prop to teach firefighters how to breach a locked door to gain access to a building to fight a fire or to search for residents. These techniques can also be used if EMS personnel were to encounter a patient unable to open a locked door.
- RIT, or Rapid Intervention Team training; a RIT team is dispatched on all structure fires, standing by with the specific task of rescuing potentially injured firefighters.
- Vehicle Rescue; we utilize junk cars for training with various specialized
  hand and power tools used to stabilize a wrecked vehicle, to prevent further
  injury while EMS personnel tend to patients, and to extricate injured
  passengers safely. These tools, sometimes known as the "jaws of life", are
  used to remove vehicle doors and/or roofs, to move dashboards, and to
  move damaged parts of a vehicle away from the occupants.
- *CAFS*, or Compressed Air Foam Systems are used along with water when fighting some types of fires. The air/foam combination, when injected into the stream of water, increases the efficiency of fighting the fire by cooling and depriving the fire of oxygen.

Each member of Goshen Fire Company also receives annual training in CPR, First Aid, Bloodborne Pathogen Safety, and Hazardous Materials Awareness.

We welcome new volunteer members of all ages and backgrounds to our Fire, EMS, Fire Police and Administration divisions. Stop by our 1320 Park Avenue station any Monday night, or go to www.goshenfireco.org for more information.

#### 2018 Township Budget

The Township's 2018 budget was presented at a public meeting of the Board of Supervisors on November 14th, and it is anticipated that it will be adopted by the time that the newsletter is received in mailboxes. Importantly, no real estate tax rate increase is proposed for the 15th consecutive year. More information about the Township's 2018 budget can be found at www.eastgoshen.org/services/finance/budget.

#### 2018 Real Estate Tax Payments

Please note that the 2018 Township Real Estate Tax Invoices will be mailed on February 1st. **If you have an escrow account,** please forward your invoice to your mortgage company and do not mail payment directly to the Township as your mortgage company will make the payment. Every year, we receive hundreds of duplicate tax payments that need to be researched and returned to residents, at considerable time and energy for Township staff. However, if you do not have an escrow account and you pay your bill directly to the Township, please be sure that you use your real estate tax account number on your payment (and not your sewer and trash account number) in order to avoid the payment being credited to the wrong account. Thanks!

## Sewer/ Trash Automatic Debit Program

Interested in having your sewer/trash bill automatically debited from your bank account every three months? East Goshen Township offers an Electronic Debit Program for your quarterly payments. As long as your account is current, you can opt to have your payments automatically deducted from your bank account and never be late again! #### TIPS FOR A SAFE AND FUN WINTER IN PA!

The leaves are down and the temperature is falling – it's time to begin preparing for another winter in Pennsylvania. Travel safely this year in winter conditions by making sure your vehicle is ready and that you know where to find information on road conditions. Once you're ready to travel safely, I encourage you to explore the many outdoor winter activities offered in our own backyard and throughout the state!





#### PREPARING FOR WINTER DRIVING

Winter weather can bring unexpected conditions, so make sure that both you and your vehicle are ready for ice and snow. Prior to the winter driving season, you should have a mechanic check your brakes, battery, hoses and belts. PennDOT offers several resources at **penndot.gov**, including tips for getting your vehicle ready, what to include in a winter emergency kit and a winter driving guide.

#### WINTER ROAD CONDITIONS

Once you're prepared to drive this winter in Pennsylvania – or anytime – you can check conditions on more than 40,000 roadway miles – including for color-coded winter conditions on 2,900 miles of roads – by visiting **511PA.com.** PennDOT's Automated Vehicle Locator plow tracking tool is available for all of the more than 2,200 PennDOT-owned and rented plow trucks, with vehicle locations viewable on **511PA.com.**



## A THANK YOU TO OUR FIRST RESPONDERS

On the evening of Thursday, November 16th, a catastrophic five-alarm fire ripped through the Barclay Friends Senior Living Community in West Chester. 133 senior citizens were safely evacuated by emergency responders in what was among the most dangerous fires in our region's long history.

This tragedy highlighted the tremendous bravery of hundreds of firefighters in Southeastern Pennsylvania, some who came from as far away as Lower Merion and Lancaster to assist in the effort to protect lives and property, as wells as scores of good Samaritans who provided aid on that cold, dark night in other important ways.

Among the very long list of heroic first responders—and even a few neighbors—who willingly risked their own lives to save others were five employees of the East Goshen Public Works Department who also serve as volunteer firefighters: Kevin Miller, Mike Holmes, Dusty Kilgore, Steve Hiro, and Mark Miller.

## UPCOMING BULK TRASH AND YARD WASTE DATES

## **Bulk Trash Days**

A bulk item must be able to be picked up and handled by two people. A maximum of two bulk items may be placed out for pickup at one time.



- December 14th and 15th
- January 11th and 12th
- February 15th and 16th
- March 15th and 16th

## **Yard Waste Days\***

Only paper bags will be collected, no plastic bags will be taken. You may also use a trash can; provided it weighs no more than 50 lbs.

- December 13th
- January 10th and 24th
- February 7th and 21st
- March 7th and 21st



## \* Christmas trees are collected as yard waste.

No yard waste in plastic bags will be accepted. Note that originally, December 27th was scheduled as a yard waste day. However, to accommodate the extra needed recycling day on December 27th, this yard waste pick-up day has been cancelled. Therefore, the first pick-up for Christmas trees will be on **January 10th.**

## WINTER WEATHER AND SNOW REMOVAL:

#### **Snow Removal:**

- We put a layer of brine on the road before the snow event starts; this prevents snow from bonding to the pavement and creating ice
- Then we put a layer of salt down on the roads when the snow event starts
- Once the snow starts to accumulate, the plows make at least one pass through every Township street until the snow stops
- When the snow stops, we begin to clear the streets by pushing the snow to the curb
- Cul-de-sacs and storm drains are the final areas to be cleaned up after a storm

## **Important Information on Snow Removal:**

- Do not park on the street during a snow event
- When shoveling your driveway leave the last six feet of your driveway un-shoveled until the plowing has ceased.
   This un-shoveled part will allow the snow being pushed by the plow to remain on the plow and not end up in your driveway
- When clearing your driveway, do not deposit the snow into the roadway. This can cause hazardous conditions to other motorists
- The Township does not plow residential driveways
- If an ambulance has been called to an address in the Township, we will help bring in the emergency vehicle
- Please remember that we cannot be everywhere at once.

- We will plow all roads in order of traffic priority—main roads then secondary roads
- Our snow plow drivers are asked to take precautions to avoid striking mailboxes with their plows but snow can be extremely heavy and a cold brittle mail box can come down easily

## Mailboxes:

- Expensive or ornate mailboxes should be replaced with a basic mailbox for the winter months
- Mailboxes should be located so the face of the box is 6 8 inches back from the edge of the roadway. This is according to USPS guidelines. We suggest you put them as far as 15 inches back from the road edge
- Is your mailbox sturdy? Plastic mailboxes tend to become brittle from the sun's UV rays. Make sure the door on the mailbox is closed tightly. If the door is missing or open the mailbox may "fold" on impact from the snow
- The East Goshen Board of Supervisors has passed a resolution that states the Township will reimburse a resident \$25 for replacement or repair of a damaged mailbox, provided the resident has notified the Township within one week of the storm. The Township does not repair mailboxes

## Stop that sheen- and keep our stream clean!

**Did you know** that Americans are responsible for **180** million of gallons of used motor oil escaping into our waterways each year? Even relatively small leaks from improperly maintained vehicles are collectively polluting our creeks, streams and rivers. Oil-contaminated runoff makes its way from roads and driveways into storm drains and ultimately our streams.



Please do your part by checking your cars and equipment regularly for leaks and have them fixed promptly. If you change the oil yourself, use a drip pan, and bring the used motor oil to a used motor oil drop off location. Clean up any oil spills you find with absorbent material, then sweep; do not hose the area.

Remember, when your car is leaking oil on the street, it is not just leaking on the street! *It ends up in a stream.* 



On behalf of the East Goshen Township Park Commission, I hope everyone has enjoyed a wonderful 2017. Things have certainly gone well for the Parks and Recreation Department. From receiving the state-wide Health and Wellness Award from Governor Wolf this past spring, to the Bicentennial Celebration being named one of the nation's five best Park Champion events, to the construction of our new destination playground – 2017 has been quite a year!

As you read this in the middle of December, many aspects of construction of the new Destination Playground are complete. However, final installation is weather dependent and the playground will not be open until early spring. This project has taken two years to come to fruition, moving from a planning phase heavily influenced by East Goshen children, to a project funding phase and finally construction this fall and into early spring. We would once again like to thank the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (\$250,000) and Department of Community and Economic Development (\$225,000) for their financial and technical project support. Additionally, we'd like to thank the Radcliffe family for their generous private donation in memory of their daughter Charlotte "Charley" Radcliffe. They may live in West Goshen Township – but their home



is in East Goshen Park.



One wonderful unique feature of the new playground is the poured in place surfacing. Poured in place surfacing is virtually maintenance free, which means it'll save the Township considerably in on-going maintenance costs. Parents can also rest assured the playground will always have consistent and uncompromised fall height attenuation – no more mulch getting kicked out from under the swings! Because the surfacing is such an important and beneficial aspect of the new playground, it does mean the new playground area, defined as everything across the bridge, will be a dog free zone. Dogs going the bathroom, even marking territory, could compromise the quality of the surface. The playground will also become known as the park with the "giant life-size Lego's to play with..." – also known as the Imagination Playground! The Imagination Playground is a 105 piece set of outdoor quality blue foam pieces in

a myriad of shapes, meant to encourage open ended and social play! We've developed the

Play Ambassador volunteer experience to facilitate the action, and I strongly encourage anyone interested to call the Township to learn more! It is a perfect volunteer opportunity for high school and college students, those interested in teaching or early childhood

education, or residents who just like to have fun!

While the Park Commission revels in a fantastic 2017, we do have a number of other projects slated for 2018 as well. A picnic grove area, complete with gazebo, walkway and ADA picnic tables will be constructed early in the New Year. It's also time to hit the courts again – we recently resurfaced the three tennis courts and, in the early spring, we are excited to start pickle ball activities. We hope you have a wonderful holiday season – see you in 2018!






