The East Goshen Township Board of Supervisors and other ABC members met on Saturday, January 9, 2010, at 8:05am at the East Goshen Township Building for the Annual Planning Session. In attendance were:

Historical Commission

Kathryn Yahraes presented the Historical Commission's 2009 accomplishments and 2010 goals (see attached).

Don advised that payments for the Images of America books need to be processed in a timely manner. He paid with a check some time ago which has still not been cashed.

Conservancy Board

Jane Fava presented the Conservancy Board's 2010 goals (see attached).

Linda Polishuk asked if the purple loosestrife in Wentworth will be addressed this year as part of the plan to control invasive plants and Jane said yes. Linda then asked if there are plans to create a meadow at Applebrook. Jane said it's necessary to control the invasive plants before attempting to create a meadow, and noted that creating a meadow is a huge undertaking.

Ginnie Newlin said the Township needs to advocate for proper stormwater management and needs to take more steps to be "green."

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Don led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

MOMENT OF SILENCE

Carmen called for a moment of silence to honor the men and women serving their country in the armed forces and their families. Carmen then recommended that individual ABCs start the practice of having a moment of silence at their meetings.

Municipal Authority

Fran Beck presented the Municipal Authority's 2010 goals (see attached).

Senya Isayeff asked how much the new sewage treatment plant will cost. Rick said it will cost approximately \$9.5 million.

Linda Polishuk asked if less sewage will be treated at West Goshen when the new East Goshen plant is completed. Rick said the Township plans to keep the amount sent to West Goshen at under 1 million gallons once the new plant is complete.

Park & Rec

Ann Marie Fletcher-Moore presented the Park & Rec Board's 2009 accomplishments and 2010 goals (see attached).

Jane Fava requested that Park & Rec let residents know not to over-fertilize their lawns as the excess nutrients contribute to algae growth in Township ponds.

Ginnie Newlin said it's important that the Township have walking ways for residents to get from point A to point B.

Ann Marie asked Rick for the status of the pedestrian bridge for Applebrook. Rick said ACOE has signed off on it, and now the Township must wait for DEP.

Jim McRee suggested that Park & Rec charge more than \$5 for the Parents' Night Out program and consider it as a fundraising opportunity.

Linda Polishuk asked how much a pond aerator costs. Rick and Don told her they cost approximately \$4,200 each, plus installation fees.

Don noted that the Township is working on bringing back fireworks for 2010. Hank Belber of Applebrook has pledged \$10K and may be able to raise \$15K, and the Township will pay for the balance. Carmen said the Battavio family will donate \$500.

Planning Commission

George Martynick presented the Planning Commission's 2010 goals (see attached). He also reviewed a spreadsheet of Planning Commission assignments under the Comprehensive Plan that need to be handled by other ABCs instead (in most cases the Conservancy Board).

Deer Committee

Jim McRee gave an update on the Deer Committee's activities and presented their goals for 2010 (see attached).

Board of Supervisors

Don McConathy presented the Supervisors' 2009 accomplishments and 2010 goals (see attached).

Don asked that all ABCs provide Rick Smith with a list of their 2010 officers and liaisons.

Don announced that Supervisor Marty Shane is recovering from back surgery and hopes to be back at meetings very soon. Don also announced that Supervisor Joe McDonough has retired and moved to South Carolina. The Board is taking resumes from individuals interested in the open position.

Don announced that Keep East Goshen Beautiful Day is scheduled for April 17 this year.

Ginny Newlin said it's less expensive to keep a meadow than to maintain a lawn.

Peter Mylonas asked the status of the Traditions development in West Goshen. Rick said East Goshen presented its concerns at a meeting with the developer yesterday (January 10), and the folks from Traditions seemed receptive.

Jim McRee asked if there is any news on the proposed development in Willistown along Line Road. Don said things have been quiet about the project and there is no news at this time.

Jane Fava asked about the parking situation along Line Road during soccer events. Don said that the parking fine has been raised to \$35 and in addition, Mark Miller is looking into installing a berm along the roadway to prevent parking.

Kathryn Yahraes asked if a send-off event is being planned for Joe McDonough. Don said the Board may do something for him when he is back in the area in May.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:50am.

2009 GOALS AND OBJECTIVES EAST GOSHEN TOWNSHIP – HISTORICAL COMMISSION



IMMEDIATE GOALS

A. Work with Township officials, community members and organizations to find innovative solutions that will meet the DEP guidelines for Hershey's Mill Dam while preserving the integrity of the Hershey's Mill Historic District including the historic viewscape as a secondary resource.

HIGH

- The Historical Commission held several Workshops to address the situation as well as discussing at its monthly meetings. The Commission provided leadership and support to the residents working toward saving the Dam. In addition, input was provided to the BOS on many levels. Together, the residents and the Commission convinced the BOS to turn down the stimulus money that would have covered breaching the Dam. A table at the Goshen Fair was staffed by HC Members and Community Volunteers in order to educate the community on the situation and to recruit volunteer help to SAVE THE DAM.
- B. Continue to work on the marketing aspects of the "Images of America" history book for East Goshen Township with a publication date of April/May 2009.

HIGH

- With a late-April release date, books were sold at all of the polls in the Township during the Primary Election. In addition, books were sold on weekends at the Plank House as well as at the Township Building during the week. Books were also sold at the two Living History Days. A comprehensive plan for marketing was formulated and will continue to be implemented throughout 2010
- C. Plan and implement two Living History Days. Expand activities for both days.

<u>HIGH</u>

- Two very successful Living History Days were held June 6 and September 19. Attendance was estimated to be over 250 in June and approximately 500 in September. Several new demonstration activities were added. Stepped up publicity in the surrounding schools and in the community were responsible for the high fall attendance. An expanded "photo" opportunity for kids and their families in colonial costume was a big hit in the fall.
- D. Continue to explore new approaches to attracting visitors to the Plank House and Blacksmith Shop Educational Center. Concentrate on School groups.

HIGH

- New demonstration activities were added for Living History Days. A number of ideas were brainstormed for implementation.
 Inroads were made with improved approaches to local elementary schools. Additional volunteers must be recruited in order to have a larger presence with students during the school year.
- E. Implement a media campaign to promote historical activities.

MEDIUM

- More publicity was garnered this year than in the past. A complete year-long campaign development will carry over to 2010.
- F. Produce a brochure to highlight the historical aspects of Goshenville and distribute it as a learning tool.

MEDIUM

- Revision of existing brochures was accomplished. Layout of a new brochure was completed. Printing needs to be done in 2010.
- G. Enhance the historical section on the web site.

HIGH

Better use of the web site was made through submission of information on existing activities both in the Township and in the
community. Some articles, information and photos were placed on the site. Total section development still needs to be
accomplished with the re-modeling of the entire website in the upcoming year.

H. Prepare recommendations for housing the Conestoga Wagon.

LOW

The Wagon was kept inside the Blacksmith Shop. Separate facilities for the Wagon were not addressed at this time.

LONG-TERM GOALS

A. Work on the County GIS Historical Project for East Goshen Township with the assistance of the County Historic Preservation Officer.

LOW

- . Some initial plans were made. Non-commission volunteers to carry the load of this project need to be recruited and trained.
- B. Begin development of one living history program for the Township using a "first person interpreter" approach.

MEDIUM

- Revolutionary War period was completed as was early 1800's. The third segment Civil War Period will be completed in 2010.
- C. Investigate designs and develop requirements for plaques to be made available to local historical houses.

LOW

- Carry over this goal to 2010.
- D. Continue to plan for a new Town Tour & Village Walk location with an involvement target date of 2010. Assist neighboring municipalities as needed.

MEDIUM

- Contact maintained with CC P & R and the Historic Preservation Officer in planning for 2010. Assistance was offered to Avon Grove but was not needed after all.
- E. Fine-tune the 10-year implementation timeline of the Action Plan for the Historic Commission as identified in Chapter 10 of the Township's Comprehensive Plan.

MEDIUM

- Completed.
- F. Serve as a resource for local schools including the "Graduation Project" requirement of the West Chester Area School District.

LOW

- Although the WCASD knows that we are available to be a resource to students, there were no "takers" this year.
- Involve residents in the process of nominating the Rocky Hill Historic District for inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places.

TOM

Not undertaken at this time and will carry over to 2010.

ONGOING HISTORICAL COMMISSION RESPONSIBILITIES AND ACTIVITIES

A. Maintain an awareness of the roles, responsibilities, duties and contributions of the Historical Commission.

MEDIUM

- Strong Liaison activity with the other ABCs has been maintained. Visibility of the Commission in the community is evident. Activity will continue to be an ongoing activity. Two programs on Commission activities were taped for Channel 20 along with three other programs that were aired.
- Maintain the development of a strong volunteer program beyond the Commission members that will provide more staff to help with events and special projects. Continue to involve other ABC's in local historic events and programs.

HIGH

- Several new "beyond the Commission" volunteers were recruited and assignments were made. Additional volunteers will continue to be needed to staff the Plank House on an ongoing basis. Coverage was increased to include the month of October.
- C. Enhance and expand the Oral History Program. Complete four oral histories per year. Recruit additional volunteers to help.

HIGH

- Although one program was completed, the additional three programs were not done. Specific recruitment of volunteers is needed.
- D. Initiate comprehensive research of the property owners. Continue to update the chain of title for the entries on the Inventory of Historic Resources. Complete the chain of title for new entries. Begin comprehensive auditing of file contents for properties.

MEDIUM

- Work has begun on research of all past owners of properties. Work will spread out over a 2-3 year period of time. Additional volunteers to be recruited.
- Continue to implement as well as review and recommend changes to the Board of Supervisors for the Historic Preservation Ordinance. As the Commission identifies new resources, add them to the Historic Inventory list.

HIGH

- This is being done through awareness of and exposure to other ordinances from throughout the county. No changes are needed at this time.
- F. Promote our Township in the community through participation in historic-related events and activities including work with groups such as the Chester County Historical Society (CCHS), Chester County Historical Preservation Network (CCHPN), the Regional Historic Group and others.

MEDIUM

- The Commission works closely with county groups. Members participated in the annual History Day Competition at Immaculata as judges and exhibitors again this year. Participation of members in the Annual CCHPN Workshop as well as the Volunteer Recognition. Members had key roles for the Paoli Battlefield Illumination which, unfortunately, ended up being canceled due to weather. Many different groups in the county including other municipalities look to our Commission for help with their projects.
- G. Provide articles for every Township newsletter.

- This was accomplished. In-depth articles can no longer be utilized due to space limitations. Shorter "teaser" articles are now

Participation in the Spring Clean-up Day was done with 100% participation again this year. The fall day will spill over to the new year because of weather.

AN ORDINANCE OF EAST GOSHEN TOWNSHIP, CHESTER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 163 OF THE EAST GOSHEN TOWNSHIP TITLED. "PARKS AND RECREATION CODE, AREAS," SPECIFICALLY SECTION 163-3.N(1), WHICH REGULATES THE USE OF FIREARMS AND **TOWNSHIP** PARKS. **FIREWORKS** IN PLAYGROUNDS AND OPEN SPACE.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, by the Board of Supervisors of East Goshen Township, that Chapter 163 of the Code of the Township of East Goshen, titled, "Parks and Recreation Areas", shall be amended as follows:

SECTION I. Section 163-2 shall be amended by adding the following definition:

FIREARM- An instrument used in the propulsion of a shot, shell, bullet, missile, rocket or any other object by the action of gunpowder exploded, explosive powder or the expansion of gas.

SECTION II. Section 163-3.N(1) shall be amended to read as follows:

"(1) No person, other than a sworn police officer or other law enforcement officer engaged in the performance of his or her official duties, shall discharge any firearm within the limits of any active park or passive park as defined in this Chapter. No person shall shoot a bow and arrow or crossbow within the limits of any active park or passive park, as defined in this Chapter, unless they are participating in a deer management program pursuant to subsection (3) below."

SECTION III. Severability. If any sentence, clause, section or part of this Ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts hereof. It is hereby

declared as the intent of the Board of Supervisors that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.

<u>SECTION IV</u>. <u>Repealer</u>. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances conflicting with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as the same affects this Ordinance.

SECTION V. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective five days after its enactment as law provides.

SECTION I. A new subparagraph E shall be added to Section 240-38.5 which shall provide as follows:

"E. Where approved by the Board of Supervisors as a conditional use, a property on which a historic resource is located and adaptively reused shall be permitted one freestanding sign with a maximum area of 32 square feet for the entire property regardless of the number of uses conducted on the property."

SECTION II. SEVERABILITY. If any provision, sentence, clause, section or part of this ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts hereof. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Board of Supervisors that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid provision, sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.

<u>SECTION III.</u> <u>REPEALER</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as the same affects this Ordinance.

SECTION IV. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after enactment as by law provided.

Dear Board Members:

At our meeting on January 6, 2010 the Planning Commission discussed a proposed amendment to the Historic Preservation Ordinance related to signage for historic properties which receive approval for an adaptive reuse or have multiple principal uses. Right now the ordinance allows each adaptive reuse approved to have a 32 square foot sign. This amendment proposes to limit the total sign area to 32 square feet for the property as a whole.

The commission voted unanimously in favor to recommend that the Board of Supervisors consider approval of the amendment to the zoning ordinance as outlined below:

§240-38.5.

E. Where approved by the Board of Supervisors as a conditional use, a property on which a historic resource is located and adaptively reused shall be permitted one freestanding sign with a maximum area of 32 square feet for the entire property regardless of the number of uses conducted on the property.

The proposed amendment recommendation is a revision from a previous recommendation made at our October 7, 2009 meeting.

The Chester County Planning Commission has reviewed a proposed amendment to the East Goshen Township Zoning Ordinance, submitted pursuant to the provisions of the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code, Section 609(e). We received this referral for review on October 30, 2009. We offer the following comments to assist in your review of the proposed East Goshen Township Zoning Ordinance amendment:

DESCRIPTION OF THE AMENDMENT:

The amendment allows, as a conditional use, one sign (up to 32 square feet) at a property on which a historic resource has been adaptively reused.

RELATIONSHIP TO LANDSCAPES2:

The updated 2009 Chester County Comprehensive Plan, *Landscapes2*, includes Historic Resources Objective HR 1: "Plan cooperatively to preserve and interpret historic and archeological resources and landscapes." In addition, Historic Resources Objective HR 2.2 promotes the protection of historic resources and their contexts, which are integral to their meaning and significance. The amendment can help preserve the integrity of the Township's historic resources, and is consistent with *Landscapes2*.

CONSIDERATIONS:

1. The Township may wish to apply additional considerations to the sign's relationship with the historic resource, to ensure that the sign is compatible with the historic resource and will not have any adverse effects on it. We suggest that such considerations could involve an assessment of lighting to ensure that it is oriented downwards from the top of the sign to limit light pollution, and a review of sign construction materials (i.e., neon or fluorescent lamps and plastic signs might not be appropriate when used in proximity to historic resources). The Board of Supervisors could also consider the use of period-appropriate materials such as wood, mounting hardware and paint, and the use of appropriate lettering styles and colors. Because this provision is regulated by conditional use, the Board of Supervisors would be permitted to "...attach such reasonable conditions and safeguards, in addition to those expressed in the ordinance, as it may deem necessary to implement the purposes of ...the zoning ordinance." (Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code, Section 913.2(a)).

2. The Township should consider how this amendment will relate to Zoning Ordinance Section 240-22.U (which is not proposed for amendment), which relates to historic wall signs located on properties listed on the East Goshen Township Historic Resource Inventory, and which contains different dimensional limitations.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: The Chester County Planning Commission recommends that the Township adopt the proposed amendment after reviewing the suggestions in this letter.

We request an official copy of the adopted ordinance be sent to the County Planning Commission as required by Section 609(g) of the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code. This will allow us to maintain a current file copy of your ordinance.



ORDINANCE NO. OF 2010

AN ORDINANCE OF WILLISTOWN TOWNSHIP, CHESTER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AMENDING AND RE-ADOPTING THE OFFICIAL MAP OF WILLISTOWN TOWNSHIP.

- WHEREAS, Article IV of the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code (Act 247 of 1968, as amended by Act 170 of 1988), grants Pennsylvania municipalities the power to adopt an official map for the municipality insofar as it is based on an adopted comprehensive plan; and
- **WHEREAS**, by Ordinance No. 8 of 2000, enacted on September 25, 2000, Willistown Township adopted an official map for the southern portion of the Township located generally south of Goshen and Barr Roads; and
- WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 8 of 2002, enacted on November 25, 2002, Willistown Township adopted an official map for the entire Township; and
- **WHEREAS**, by Ordinance No. 9 of 2004, enacted on August 23, 2004, Willistown Township amended and re-adopted the official map for the entire Township; and
- WHEREAS, Willistown Township has undertaken a periodic update to the official map, in order to further facilitate the acquisition and preservation of proposed public parks and open space reservations, trail links, pedestrian ways and easements, for the benefit of existing and future residents and populations; and
- WHEREAS, the park land and open space preservation concept is consistent with the Willistown Township Comprehensive Plan and the Willistown Township Open Space, Park and Recreation Plan; and
- WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Willistown Township has reviewed the official map update for the Township and desires to adopt the same as the Official Map of the Township of Willistown.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ORDAINED and ENACTED as follows:

- <u>Section 1</u>. Willistown Township hereby adopts as the Official Map of the Township of Willistown, Chester County, Pennsylvania, the Willistown Township Official Map, prepared by Next Level Mapping, dated December, 2009, and all attachments.
- <u>Section 2</u>. Willistown Township's Official Map will include all roadways and properties located in Willistown Township, Chester County, Pennsylvania, as depicted on said Map.

- <u>Section 3</u>. The properties depicted as proposed open space reservations shall be reserved for future taking or acquisition for public use in perpetuity until actually acquired by the Township.
- Section 4. The Township may initiate surveys of property locations for the purposes of taking action.
- <u>Section 5</u>. Whenever lands and easements are to be acquired pursuant to the Official Map, boundary descriptions by metes and bounds descriptions shall be made by a licensed surveyor.
- Section 6. The Township directs that following adoption of this Ordinance, a copy of the Official Map of Willistown Township, verified by the Board of Supervisors, shall be submitted to the Recorder of Deeds of the County of Chester to be recorded within sixty (60) days of the effective date hereof.
- <u>Section 7</u>. This Ordinance is enacted for the purpose of serving and promoting the public health, safety, convenience and general welfare; to facilitate adequate provision of public streets and facilities; to improve traffic circulation; to provide for the recreational and open space needs of the community; to protect and enhance water resources; and to facilitate the subdivision of land and the use of land and water courses.
- <u>Section 8</u>. Should any section or provision of this Ordinance be declared by the courts to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of any other section or provision of this Ordinance than the one so declared.
- Section 9. This Ordinance shall become effective in accordance with the provisions of law.
- Section 10. From: Rick Smith, Township Manager Re: Refuse and Recycling Bid

We are in the final year of our refuse and recycling contract which expires on December 31st and we will need to prepare bid specifications and solicit bids later this year. In order to facilitate that process I have prepared a decision tree for the Board's use. Once you answer these questions I will be in a better position to draft the bid specifications.

In addition the Board might want to consider conducting a statistically valid survey, to determine what the residents want. We could possibly use students from West Chester University for assistance with the preparation and mailing of the survey and compilation and analysis of the results.

By way of background under the current system a homeowner can put out an unlimited amount of trash twice a week. Recyclables are collected once a week. During non leaf and yard waste collection weeks the homeowner can put out up to three cans, bags or bundles of yard waste, grass clippings, etc on each collection day. There is one bulk collection day (unlimited) per month. There are 4 yard waste collections days in the spring, 6 leaf collection days in the fall and we collect Christmas trees in January. We have provided our residents with leaf bags (at no cost) for the last three years. In a nutshell we take almost everything you can get to the curb.

Questions

- 1. Continue with the current system or change it? Antidotal information indicates that most residents like all aspects of the current system with the exception of the cost (\$96/qtr).
- 2. If "change" consider getting out of the refuse and recycling business. Both East Whiteland and Willistown allow their residents to contract with whomever they choose. If the homeowner is not satisfied with their service they can change haulers.
- 3. Go to a pure pay per bag system like West Whiteland. They pay \$2 per bag. This plus the money that they receive from the state for recycling covers the cost of their refuse and recycling program.
- 4. Consider going to once a week collection. Typically the second collection day of each week is very light.

- 5. Limit the amount of trash that the homeowners can put out. This would force people to recycle more. This can be accomplished by:
 - a. Use toters. Everyone would get one toter. A homeowners could purchase an additional toter(s) or we could sell bags for thos homeownesr who occasional had extra trash.
 - b. Allow one can for the base price and have the homeowner pay extra for each additional can or bag.
- 6. Reduce the number of yard waste cans, bundles or bags during non-leaf and yard waste collection weeks.
- 7. Charge extra for those services that are not used equally by all residents.
 - a. Charge a fee for bulk pick up. We could sell stickers.
 - b. Charge for leaf pickup. We could sell the bags or sell stickers.
 - c. Charge for Christmas tree pickup.

East Goshen has a park system that includes recreation areas and passive open space. There are both township and neighborhood parks.

There are different activities and facilities available at the different parks. Some are for passive use only and others allow organized events. In all of the parks, please pick up your trash.

Some parks have facilities that you can reserve, with a permit. These would include pavilions and ball fields. East Goshen Park and Mill Creek have ball fields available to reserve with a permit.

East Goshen has parks and also has areas that are retention basins and wetlands. Parks include East Goshen Township Park, Applebrook Preserve, Mill Creek Park and the Reservoir. Applebrook Preserve and the Reservoir have spots suitable for fishing.

Both Applebrook and East Goshen have paved walking trails. Applebrook also permits rollerblades, bicycles and skateboards, East Goshen Park does not.

At all of the parks dogs are welcome but must be on a leash and their waste must be picked up.

East Goshen Park is the main park and with 55 acres also has a playground, tennis courts, basketball, and pavilions available for use with a permit.

ACTIVE PARK — A park that is intended, designed, equipped and designated by the Park Board for activities by individuals or groups participating in one or more of the following activities: individual athletic activity, organized athletic/sport's activities by groups or teams, whether formal or informal, group picnics, theatrical events, national holiday events and similar formal activities.

PASSIVE PARK — A park that is intended as permanent open space primarily maintained in a relatively natural and/or landscaped setting and designated by the Park Board primarily for pastoral enjoyment, but not for organized activities by individuals or groups participating in one or more of the following activities: individual athletic activity, organized athletic/sport's activities by groups, teams or individuals, whether formal or informal, group picnics, theatrical events, national holiday events and similar formal activities. Examples of permitted activities and facilities are walking trails, nonmotorized biking, running, rollerblading, picnic areas, bird watching and similar benign activities. [Amended 7-15-2003 by Ord. No. 129-H-03]

SPONSOR — The individual who vouches for and who assumes responsibility for a person or group during the period such person or group uses the park, and who shall be personally responsible for any damages to the park or costs incurred by the township as a result of such use.

§ 163-3. Rules and regulations.

The following rules and regulations are hereby established for the management and protection of all parks, playgrounds and open space owned by the Township of East Goshen, hereinafter designated the "parks," and apply to both active and passive parks.

- A. Hours of operation. All parks, whether active or passive, shall be open daily to all township residents and their accompanied guests between sunrise and sunset. No person other than authorized employees of the township shall be in any park at any time between sunset and sunrise. At sundown, all activities in the parks, with the exception of those activities under the direct supervision of the Park Board or by those persons issued validly existing permits or other written authorization by the township as hereinafter provided, shall cease; and all unauthorized persons shall promptly leave. Except as above provided, no person, other than authorized township employees, shall be in the parks between the hours of sundown and sunrise.
 - B. Protection of park property. No one shall injure, deface, remove, cut or damage any of the trees, plants, shrubs, turf, buildings, structures or fixtures or any other township park property.
 - C. Removal of park equipment. No one shall climb, stand upon or remove any bench, seat, table, fence, grill or recreational equipment or facility from any park or change the location thereof without permission from the Park Board.
- D. Disorderly conduct prohibited. No one shall conduct himself within any park in a boisterous, immoral or indecent manner as to annoy any other person using the park or nearby residents. Any township police officer or other law enforcement official may forthwith remove any person from any township park for such conduct.

I have reviewed the Home-related business application you have submitted for your property at the above referenced address. The Township Zoning Ordinance, §240-32.K outlines the requirements for a home-related business use.

Upon my review of your application I have determined that your application does not meet the requirements set forth in the ordinance, specifically §240-32.K(8) and §240.32.K(9).

- The ordinance (§240-32.K.(8)) prohibits business vehicles that exceed 10,000 pounds of gross vehicle weight (GVW); your application states that the combined vehicle weight of your two business vehicles will be 16,900 ponds GVW. This exceeds the 10,000 pound GVW requirement.
- 2. The ordinance (§240-32.K.(8)) outlines the uses permitted, which includes skilled workers such as electricians or plumbers. I don't consider landscapers to be skilled workers.

Your application for a Home-related business to operate a landscaping services business from your property at 1533 Bancroft Drive is **DENIED**. You have the right to appeal the denial of this application to the East Goshen Township Zoning Hearing Board. If you wish to do this, you must send a check payable to East Goshen Township in the amount of \$350.00 along with a completed Zoning Hearing Board application and all other related materials to:
