Borough bans animals from all its public celebrations

KENNET SQUARE — Borough Council has approved a ban on dogs at all special events in the borough. The vote was 6-1, with Dan Maffei dissenting.

Effective immediately, dogs and other pets, with the exception of service animals, are banned from events such as the Mushroom Festival, Cinco deMayo, Kennett Square Brewfest, the borough's Halloween Parade, the East Linden Street Block Party, Beers on Broad Street and the Memorial Day Parade.

Fines for those who bring pets to these events range from \$50 to \$300, said Police Chief Ed Zunino.

"I think this makes a lot of sense," said Councilman Geoff Bosley. "You can't take your dog to Disney World, the Phillies game or the county fair. It's just an accident waiting to happen."


Last year, council adopted a resolution prohibiting pets at the Mushroom Festival, but without an ordinance there was no means of enforcement.

The new ordinance gives council the power to ban pets at all special events.

"Police will now have the authority to cite somebody for violating his ordinance," said David Miller, council president.

Mayor Matt Fetick, who oversees the police department, said officers will not give dog owners the option to have their pets at the festivals. He said police will use discretion before issuing a citation.

The Mushroom Festival Committee has put a notice on its Web site warning residents that they should leave





The annual Chadds Ford Days celebration has gone to the dogs — literally.

Actually, the organizers of the 65th event (which is just days away) want people to know that they've been canine friendly for a long time.

"We've always invited dogs to our event," said Matt DiFilippo, office manager for the event's hosts, the Chadds Ford Historical Society. He added that the event's committee chairs wanted people to know that, especially since dogs have been in the news lately.

"With dogs being banned at Kennett's events, and the (shooting deaths in Pennsbury Township) of Emma and Luna last year, they just thought they should remind people that we are dog friendly."

So dog friendly in fact that they've added a few events specifically for the four-pawed visitors, including obedience training sessions and dog owner tips.

Presented by local dog trainers, Clever Dog, along with the obedience tips is a dog obstacle course that will also be demoed — and your dog is even welcome to give it a try.

There are also dog relay races, a pet parade, "obedience drills," health and safety tips for owners and at the end of it all, \$10 gift certificates for the winners.



And as usual, there are waste pick-up bags, water stations and plenty of trees and open grass — just like every year, DiFilippo said.

The annual Chadds Ford Days weekend attracts dozens of vendors and crafters from throughout the region, from bowl and arrowhead makers to quilters and luthiers.

And there are also numerous re-enactment groups in attendance, another important component of Chadds Ford Days, making everything from paper to canning demonstrations.

The group members are also available for pictures as they stroll the grounds in period costumes.

"I think we have almost a dozen different demonstrations scheduled," DiFilippo said.

And also look for numerous area restaurants on hand, including those "famous" Jimmy John's hotdogs, Maggie Moo's Ice Cream, the Chadds Ford Winery and Brandywine Prime, among others.

And of course many area fine artists will also have their works in display and available for purchase.

This year's Chadds Ford Days celebration is held on the grounds of the Chadds Ford Historical Society's Barn Visitors Center at 1736 Creek Road, in Chadds Ford Township. The dates for the event are today and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Parking and admission is free. For more information, please visit www.chaddsfordhistory.org.

Dear Mr. Smith,

USDA APHIS Wildlife Services (WS) has completed the resident Canada goose management program for East Goshen Township. WS provided on site assistance in managing the local resident Canada goose population, reducing accumulations of goose droppings in residential lots and walkways, minimizing safety risks posed by aggressive geese, and reducing damage to landscaping.

With the assistance of Township employees, WS conducted a population roundup on the night of 18 June 2010 during the Canada goose molting season. During the molt, the adult geese lose their flight feathers and are physically unable to fly. At this time, goslings are growing their first set of adult feathers and are also flightless. WS discreetly conducted a roundup of 130 geese, approximately 50% of the total population of geese that were on the sites targeted for removal. The geese were then taken to a processor and donated for charitable food distribution. Population roundups may be used every year to reduce damage as long as East Goshen Township continues to utilize non-lethal techniques including nest and egg treatment and harassment.

As you know, population roundups are only two of many strategies WS recommends for a successful integrated management program. Other approaches include habitat alteration, various methods of harassment, prohibition of waterfowl feeding, and other methods of population reduction. East Goshen should continue to utilize as many of these strategies as possible. WS recommends a community-based approach to reducing damage caused by Canada geese. Encouraging neighboring communities to take action to reduce the local Canada goose population would aid the efforts in your community. If residents require additional support in implementing these measures, please don't hesitate to contact WS for technical assistance or on site management.

We hope you are pleased with the results of the Canada goose population roundup and we hope to work with you again in the coming season. Enclosed you will find an invoice for program costs. These services were provided as agreed upon at approximately 36% below our initial estimated cost. The reduced cost was due to budget savings WS achieved while working similar projects aimed at reducing resident Canada goose damage in your general area. Also, fewer geese were removed than previously estimated, thus reducing processing costs. Your prompt payment will be greatly appreciated. Please call if you have any questions.

Re: Paving Program

The Township is responsible for 61 miles of Township roads. Under the current paving program, theoretically, a street should be repaved every 17½ years, which means we need to pave 3.5 miles a year. However, since 2003, we have only been able to pave an average of 2.5 miles per year. This equates to a paving cycle of 24 years.

We spend about \$240,000 a year on the paving program. I would note that in addition to the wearing course this cost includes base repair and curb replacement. The cost per mile has varied over the years ranging from a low of \$63,000 in 2003 to a high of \$278,000 in 2007. Our average cost is \$108,000 per mile.

It has been suggested that we base the paving cycle on a street's classification, in order to reduce our annual costs. Specifically streets that have less traffic would be paved less frequently. We looked at two options both of which are based on the current paving cycle of 24 years.

<u>Cul-de-sac Streets</u> – The Township has 46 miles of thru streets and 15 miles of cul-de-sacs. If we extended the paving cycle for the cul-de-sacs by 50% (to 36 years), we would only have to pave 2.3 miles per year as opposed to our average of 2.5 miles. We would reduce our costs by \$21,000 per year (\$108,000 x 0.2 miles).

However, this would only reduce our costs by 9% and paving all of the streets in a development except for the cul-de-sacs may not sit to well for residents on the cul-de-sacs.

<u>Development Streets</u> – The Township has 47 miles of development streets and 14 miles of collector streets and. A collector street serves pass thru traffic in addition to the residents who live on it. If we extended the paving cycle for the developments by 50% (to 36 years), we would only need to pave 1.9 miles per year. We would reduce our costs by \$64,800 per year (\$108,000 x 0.6 miles).

This would allow us to reduce our paving costs by over 25%. However, 36 years is a long time in the life of a street so we would have to institute a crack sealing program that would increase our maintenance costs.

Per the request of Louis F. Smith, Township Manager, East Goshen Township, PENNDOT has marked locations for the installation of the following signage along Paoli Pike (SR 2014) near the entrance of the East Goshen Township Park: (All locations have been marked on the roadway in white paint)

W11-2 (Pedestrian) signs	Quantity:	(10)
· W16-7P (Diagonal Downward Arrow) placards	Quantity:	(4)
W16-9P (AHEAD) placards	Quantity:	(2)

The initial township letter dated 6-9-10 had requested the installation of W16-2 (500 Feet) placards on the approach to the park entrance. There are two (2) existing crosswalks connecting the park entrance with Hibberd Lane which are approximately 100 feet apart. Due to this situation and other existing signage on Paoli Pike, it was determined that the installation of W16-9P (AHEAD) placards be utilized in lieu of the requested W16-2 (500 Feet) placards.

If the usage of distance placards is a priority, it is recommended that they be affixed below the existing PARK ENTRANCE AHEAD signs. The distances measured were as follows:

Westbound Paoli Pike	PARK ENTRANCE AHEAD	565 feet from driveway
Eastbound Paoli Pike	PARK ENTRANCE AHEAD	800 feet from driveway

The new crosswalk signs may be mounted back-to-back on the same sign post. It is also recommended that a large tree branch located on right side of the park driveway be removed as it will obscure the new crosswalk signs when installed. (See Photos)

We are writing to inform you that at their meeting on September 14, 2010 the East Goshen Township Board of Supervisors expressed its support for the proposed acquisition and easement grant application for Thorncroft Therapeutic Horseback Riding, Inc.

Thorncroft's mainstreaming equestrian facility has been in operation since 1969. About 375 clients are taught there weekly, over half of whom have a disability. The property is being acquired in order to continue and expand Thorncroft's services and programs for the foreseeable future. French Pickering Creeks Conservation Trust is assisting with this effort by submitting an application on Thorncroft's behalf for grant funding from the 1675 Foundation.

On completion of the project, Thorncroft has agreed to donate conservation easements to the Trust. The Dixon family has also committed to donating easements to the Trust on their lands adjoining the equestrian facility. The entire transaction will result in a contiguous area of perpetually protected open space totaling 74+/- acres. Preservation of these parcels will further add to the considerable amount of protected open space along the eastern boundary of East Goshen Township as shown in the attached map.

The Board of Supervisors considers the Thorncroft and Dixon lands to be high priorities for conservation. East Goshen's <u>Open Space</u>, <u>Recreation</u>, and <u>Environmental Resources Plan</u> identifies the properties as having important environmental resources such as stream corridors, wetlands, floodplain, and prime agricultural soils. The properties are located along Line Road, which is identified in the <u>Plan</u> as a scenic resource. However, of critical importance is Thorncroft's proposal to develop a public trail on the acquired property that will provide a link in the proposed 2.5+ mile trail connecting East Goshen's Township Park on Paoli Pike with the Ashbridge Preserve on East Strasburg Road, which is owned by the Willistown Conservation.

We truly believe that this proposed transaction will be beneficial to the health and welfare of our Township, insure the perpetuation of the wonderful work that Thorncroft has carried on for almost 40 years in the Township, permanently protect 74 acres of beautiful lands for the Township and Chester County, and create a public trail corridor exceeding 2.5 miles in length. The Board is grateful to Thorncroft and the French and Pickering Creeks Conservation Trust for their efforts to preserve this critical property.
