Re: Hershey Mill Dam Trees

It has been three years since PA DEP has advised us to remove the trees on the dam. Since then we have conducted numerous engineering studies, but the only physical modifications we have made with the dam has been to drawn down the impoundment.

This has eliminated the possibility of a sunny day breach. However, it does not lessen the possibility of rainy day breech since the impoundment refills during even a moderate rainfall event.

It will cost \$9,000 to remove the seven trees located east of the spillway (28" ash, 28'oak, 30" maple, 20" beech, 18" ash, 18" ash and 24" beech) and the 24" maple tree just west of the spillway. We estimate that it will cost an additional \$5,000 to grind the all of the stumps, remove the chips and backfill the voids and other eroded areas with 2RC and stabilize them.

Taking these actions would address DEP's concerns.

Dear Resident:

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection has advised the Township that it needs to remove the trees from the Hershey Mill Dam located at the corner of Greenhill Road and Hershey Mill Road.

The concern is that, if one of the trees located on the dam toppled during a storm, it could cause the dam to fail catastrophically. A catastrophic failure of the dam could cause injury or death to a person downstream of the dam, especially to a motorist on Greenhill Road.

During Hurricane Irene the Township did not get the hurricane force winds that were predicted and fortunately the dam did not fail during the storm. However, the dam did overtop during the storm. The Board is concerned about the potential failure of the dam and believes that it is prudent to remove the trees from the dam in order to minimize the risk of a failure.

At their meeting on September 20, 2011, the Board will consider taking action to have the trees removed.

In accordance with Township policy, this letter is being sent to all property owners within 1,000 feet of the Hershey Mill Dam. Its purpose is to let you know that this matter will be on the agenda for the Board of Supervisors meeting on September 20, 2011 at 7:00 pm at the Township Building.

The engineer has determined that the new sewer line between Dolphin Drive and Tanglewood Drive would need to run across the Township's property in Hershey Mill Estates.

RIGHT-OF-WAY AGREEMENT

GOSHEN TOWNSHIP ("Owner"),	a Township of the Seco	and Class of Chester County,
Pennsylvania,		

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Owner owns a tract of land situate in East Goshen Township ("Township"), Chester County, Pennsylvania, located on the north side of Tanglewood Drive, recorded in Book V-65, page 185, in the office of the Recorder of Deeds of Chester County, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, the Authority is now constructing a sewer system for the Township to serve certain areas of the Township for which the Authority must obtain a certain right-of-way and easement upon, over and under the aforesaid tract of land of the Owner.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter contained, and in consideration of the payment to the Owner of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by the Owner, the Authority and the Owner, each intending to be legally bound hereby, do hereby agree as follows:

1. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>: The term "sewer lines" when used in this instrument shall refer to a sanitary sewer pipe, conduit, manhole, drain, marker, service connection and other appurtenances to be constructed by the Authority, meeting the specifications of the consulting engineers of the Authority, as approved by the Authority for use in the aforesaid sewer system within the sanitary sewer easement on Owner's property, as shown on the plan of "Proposed Easement for Proposed Sanitary Sewer Main" prepared by Pennoni Associates, Inc., marked Exhibit "A," attached hereto and made a part hereof.

- 2. <u>GRANT TO AUTHORITY</u>: The Owner hereby gives and grants to the Authority the free and uninterrupted right, liberty and privilege:
 - A. To install, construct, reconstruct, replace, remove, enlarge, inspect, operate, repair, make connections with and maintain perpetually such sewer lines, their accessories and appurtenances, as the Authority may from time to time require, consisting of underground pipes, conduits, manholes, drains, markers, mains, service connections and other appurtenances upon, over and under a strip of land twenty (20) feet wide, more or less, across the aforesaid tract of land belonging to Owner as shown on Exhibit "A", and as more particularly described by metes and bounds on Exhibit "B", together with a temporary right-of-way, as shown on Exhibit "A", during the period of construction.
 - B. To carry away and dispose of sewage through said sewer lines, regardless of the source of such sewage.

To have and to hold the same perpetually to the Authority and its successors or assigns, together with the right and privilege at any and all times to enter the said premises, or any part thereof, provided that the Authority gives to the Owner reasonable advance notification of the nature of any intended work on the premises and the expected duration of such work, for the purpose of installing, constructing, reconstructing, replacing, removing, enlarging, inspecting, operating, repairing, maintaining, and/or making connections with the sewer lines or other appropriate means of access to the sewer lines; all upon the condition that the Authority will at all times during the construction, reconstruction, replacement, removal, repair or maintenance of the sewer lines cause every reasonable means to be used to protect from injury or damage all property, including lawns, trees, shrubbery, fences, buildings, walls, roads, water courses, natural features, or any existing improvement thereto, and will at all times after doing any work in connection with the construction, reconstruction, replacement, removal, repair or maintenance of the sewer lines, cause the said premises to be restored to the condition in which the same were found before such work was undertaken, including replacement and/or repair of damaged property, to the extent reasonably possible under the circumstances and consistent with the rights and privileges herein granted.

3. COVENANTS OF THE OWNER:

A. The Owner does hereby release, remise, quitclaim and discharge the Authority, the Township and their several agents, servants, contractors and employees from any claim or right to damages or other emolument of value for the rights, liberties and privileges given and granted to the Authority under this Indenture.

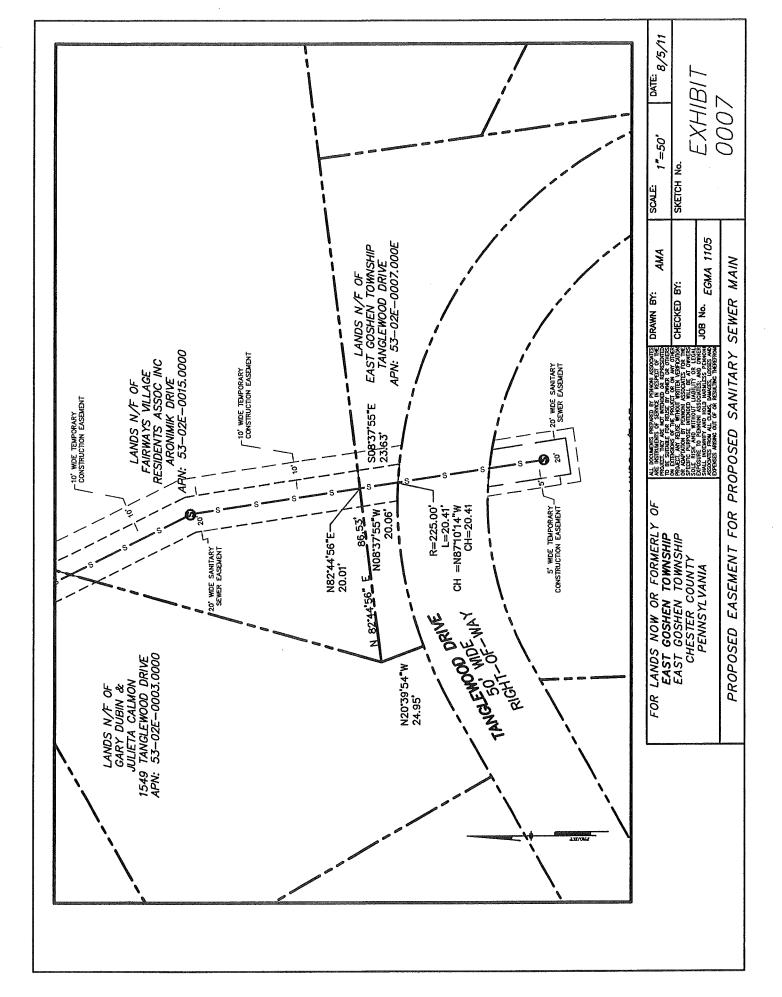
- B. The Owner does hereby covenant that he is lawfully seized and possessed of a good and marketable title in fee simple to the aforesaid tract of land and that he has a good and lawful right to grant the rights and privileges herein granted to the Authority, and he further covenants that he will execute or procure any additional necessary assurances of the rights and privileges herein granted.
- C. The Owner does hereby expressly consent to any transfer, conveyance, pledge, lease or mortgage by the Authority of the said sewer lines, including, but not limited to, the leasing thereof by the Authority, as lessor, to the Township, as lessee.
- D. The Owner does hereby covenant that no structure or other obstruction shall be erected or permitted on the aforesaid strip of land.
- E. The provisions of this Indenture shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Authority, its successors and assigns, and the Owner, his heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns.

When I set up the plan for 2011 I planned to pave Milltown (1.46 miles), Manley Road (1.22 miles) and Ashbridge (1.49 miles). This was over the 3.5 miles that the Board had established, but I wanted to try and start to make up for the fact that we have, for a variety of reasons, not paved 3.5 miles of road a year in the last several years.

The recent spike in oils prices and the requirement that we pay prevailing wage increased my projected costs this year. For example when we awarded the bid blacktop was \$51.20 a ton. The contract has an escalator clause so the price we paid in some cases was as much a \$58.75 a ton. I subsequently asked for and the Board approved an additional \$66,000 for paving just in case we ran short of money.

So far I have paved Milltown and Manley Road. There is a short (200 foot) section of Manley Road that I plan to pave once the homeowner connects to the public sewer. I also paved Walnut Hill Road (.24 miles) since it was deteriorated and we had received complaints about the condition of the road.

When I surveyed the roads this spring I concluded that Marydell (2.52 miles) was in worse shape then Ashbridge so I planned to start base repair in preparation for next year's paving.

So far in 2011 we have paved 2.92 miles of road at a cost of \$304,914 (\$247,459 materials and \$57,455 equipment rental). We originally budgeted \$436,000 (\$300,000 for materials and \$136,000 for equipment rental).

I would recommend that we use up the remainder of what was originally budgeted (\$436,000) and pave as much of Marydell as we can..

Assuming I do not do anything in Marydell this year the paving plan for the next five years is as follows:

2012 Marydell (2.52 miles) Pin Oaks (2.06 miles)

2013 Ashbridge (1.49 miles) Grand Oak Run (2.06 miles) Wilson Dr. (.046 mile)

2014 Bittersweet (1.3 miles) Charter Chase (1.4 miles) Indian Hills (1.02 miles

2015 Supplee Valley (1.42 miles) Rockland (0.90 mile) Waterford (0.60 mile) Line Road (1.09 mile)

2016 Wentworth (1.06 mile) Wyllpen (1.54 mile) Dutton Mill (0.73)

East Boot Road (1.09 miles)
Mill Valley (0.46 miles)
Ellis Lane (1.19 miles)
Reservoir Road (1.61)

Professionally managed municipalities in southeastern Pennsylvania interested in joining the Delaware Valley Insurance Trust should complete the Trust's exposure questionnaire which is available on-line under the "Membership" page. In addition to the completed questionnaire, prospective members will need to submit copies of current insurance policies and a five-year loss run in order to obtain underwriting approval.

The Trust's risk control manager and two-thirds or the current membership must approve all applicants. Membership requires the adoption of an ordinance and the execution of the Trust Agreement. A minimum two-year commitment to the program is required. All applicants must be approved by a 2/3rds vote of the current membership.

The Trust does not pay brokerage commissions to insurance agents or brokers.

The Trust levies a \$1,000 application fee to help offset underwriting expenses. If the applicant joins, the \$1,000 application fee is applied as credit to the members' first year premium contribution. Coverage comparisons with current commercial insurance policies, and presentations before governing boards or committees, are both available to applicants upon request.
