# **Technical Specifications**

#### 1. General

The East Goshen Township Board of Supervisors is soliciting proposals from Recreation and Trail Planners to develop a Feasibility Study and Master Plan for a Multimodal trail along Paoli Pike as outlined in the approved GTRP Application. The Paoli Pike Trail is also featured in the Central Chester County Bicycle and Pedestrian Circulation Plan which can be found at:

The selected planning consultant will enter into a contract with the Township to conduct a study and develop a plan for the trail; to be completed no later than October 31, 2015.

# 2. Study and Plan Approach

A detailed description shall be included outlining the approach and the standards that the final version of the Study and Plan will meet.

## 3. Required Information

- a. Provide a sample of your standard contract for services.
- b. Provide a project schedule for the Feasibility Study and Master Plan.

- c. Provide a detailed breakdown of all project costs.
- **d.** Provide three municipal references from Pennsylvania where you have completed similar Trail Study and Plan projects.

## 4. Township Obligations in support of the Trail Study and Master Plan

a. Once RFPs are received the Township selection committee will review the proposals and make a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors will review all RFPs and consider the committee recommendation to interview at least two (2) consultants. Upon the Board's selection of a consultant, the Trail committee will assist the planning consultant and oversee the study and plan development.

### Exhibit 1 - Project Description

### (a) Project Location


The project area is the Paoli Pike corridor, which is a 2.8-mile Major Arterial road (primarily two-lanes) which traverses East GoshenTownship and has an average daily traffic of 13,800 vehicles (year 2005 data).

### (b) Consistency with other local plans

The Paoli Pike Trail is noted in the Central Chester County Bicycle and Pedestrian Circulation Plan as a priority project for implementation. Currently, there are no dedicated bike lanes in the Central Chester County Region. The Paoli Pike Trail would fulfill a significant missing link in multi-municipal bicycle and pedestrian planning in Chester County. This proposed trail corridor could also provide for future multi-municipal links through West Goshen Township, Willistown Township, and West Chester Borough.

This project will support the objectives of the East Goshen Township Comprehensive Plan (2005), specifically:

 Objective 8F: Investigate alternative transportation needs including pedestrian and bike paths, and connect these routes with major centers of activity and recreation;



 Objective 6D: Use trails to provide recreational opportunities and/or link residential communities with East Goshen parks, open space and area merchants.

The project also advances the recommendations of the Township Open Space, Recreation and Environmental Resources Plan (1993), which recommends expansion of trails outside of the East Goshen Township Park properties straddling Paoli Pike, to incorporate trail extensions to adjacent neighborhoods and extensions to the nearby schools.

### (c) Economic Development Impact

Population and employment forecasts by DVRPC anticipate an additional 20,000 residents and 15,000 jobs in the Central Chester County Region over the next 25 years. These demographic trends suggest that the demand for alternative transportation options such as walking, biking, and transit will continue to increase in this Region. The anticipated economic impact that this project will have on the community includes job creation for construction, operations and maintenance. Furthermore, in that a greenway and trail system will improve the overall quality of life in the community, increase property values, and increase the likelihood of new businesses locating within the Township.

### (d) Historical and proposed use of land used by the project

The project will utilize the public right-of-way of Paoli Pike to establish a safe multi-modal pathway for pedestrians and cyclists. Off-street options will be employed on adjacent properties where feasible access can be provided and will increase the safety and functionality of the trail.

### (e) Estimated start and end dates of construction

This grant is desired to fund the first phase of the project, for a Master Plan and Feasibility Study. The overall project schedule is anticipated as follows:

### Phase 1 (utilizing grant funds)

January-March 2015: Select consultant to perform trail planning study

April - October 2015: Conduct Trail Study

### **Future Phases**

October 2015 - March 2016: Develop Preliminary Construction Drawings


June – December 2016: Develop Final Construction Documents January-April 2017: Permitting Approvals and Secure Funding

May-November 2017: Construction


### (f) Municipalities

The project is located within East Goshen Township, and will facilitate future regional trail connections within the neighboring municipalities of West Goshen, Willistown, and West Chester.

### (g) Description of the trails and recreational facilities in the project area



The Paoli Pike Trail - (H) on attached diagram - is envisioned to connect to a broader network of trails within Central Chester County, and ultimately to the Chester Valley Trail (A) which is one of Southeastern Pennsylvania's regional spines (see Circuit map, next page).

The Phase 1 project budget has been established by the East Goshen Township Engineer (Pennoni Associates), based on the expected project scope of work and experience with other similar projects in the southeast Pennsylvania region. Funds requested for this grant will be for professional consulting services to prepare a Master Plan and Feasibility Study for the Paoli Pike Trail. This letter shall certify that the East Goshen Township Board of Supervisors approved matching funds of 25% for a Greenways, Trails and Recreation Program grant in the amount of \$70,000 at their meeting on July 15, 2014. Thank you for your consideration of this worthwhile project for our community.




