6	The regular meeting of the East Goshen Township Park and Recreation Commission was held on Thursday,
7	May 7, 2015 at the Township Building. The meeting was called to order by Vice Chairman Betsy Williams at
8	7:00 pm.

15	CALL TO ODDED DE ED CE OF ALLECIANCE
16	CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE
17	Betsy led the Pledge of Allegiance. Betsy asked for a moment of silence to remember our troops & veterans.
18 19	Betsy asked if anyone would be recording the meeting. There was no response.
20	Belsy asked if anyone would be recording the meeting. There was no response.
21	APPROVAL OF MINUTES
22	1. Betsy noted that the minutes of the April 2, 2015 meeting were approved.
23	1. Detay noted that the infinites of the right 2, 2015 meeting were approved.
24	NEW BUSINESS
25	1. Boy Scouts Event in the Park – Clayton Burton, from the Boy Scouts of America, was present. They
26	have used the park in the past for their Scout Fitness Fest. This year it will be held on Saturday, September
27	20. There are 2 runs and other fitness activities. It is open to everyone, male & female, age 5 to ?. Last
28	year they had about 300 people. A service organization from WCU helps them. Some of the scouts are
29	working for merit badges. Jason mentioned that they will move to the Veterans Pavilion this year because
30	they use a PA system. He will notify WEGO and the neighbors around the park because they use part of a
31	back street for the 3 mile run. The Commission members voted to approve this request.
32	2. <u>Scout Project</u> – Andrew Moore of Troop 93 gave a presentation to build benches and stumps to put in
33	the new butterfly garden. He is working with Mark Miller. There will be 2 benches and 5 stumps. They
34	may add a welcome sign at the entrance of the garden. Jason mentioned that there is $$50-100$ in the
35	budget that could cover some expenses if needed. The Commission members voted to approve this request.

37	OLD BUSINESS
38	1. <u>Tennis Courts</u> – Jason reported that the process for the grant would take too long for not a lot of money.
39	The Commission members agreed to go forward with the project, without the grant. Roller hockey on the tennis courts was discussed. Concerns are the wear & tear on the courts even if they
40	put down boards, too close to the Tot Lot, noise, if they have actual games there, where would the people
41	sit to watch. Betsy recommends a more remote area for this. Jason will include the basketball courts as an
42 43	option in his memo to the BOS. A vote was tabled.
44	2. Community Day – June 27 and it will start at 5:00 pm this year. There will be a band, helicopter,
45	inflatables, lite ups for sale, etc. The raindate is Sunday June 28. Volunteers are needed. Jason will send
46	an email to those who helped last year. There will be food trucks instead of 1 food vendor.
47	3. <u>Color Run</u> – will be held in the am on Saturday June 27 (color in the morning and color in the evening).
48	4. Collette Travel — Jason reported that 9 people have signed up for this trip so far. The revenue to the
49	township will be about \$3400.
50	5. <u>Butterfly Garden</u> – Mark Miller had the area tilled yesterday. The weekend of May 15 the planting will
51	be done. The plants will be in bloom in mid-September which is when we should hear about the grant.
52	6. Open Space and Rec Plan – Draft #7 is done. A Master Plan needs to be done for the park and Tot Lot
53	improvements. The draft will go to the BOS for review, then CCPC and finally will become part of the

Comp Plan. The park plan process will take about 2 years with meetings for input from the residents.

7. Newsletter – Jason thanked Anne Marie and Betsy for putting an article together.

1 Egg Hunt – went very well. There were plenty of eggs for the children. 2 9. <u>Volleyball Courts</u> – were refurbished by Public Works Department. 10. Amphitheater - It is starting to look nice but still needs some structural improvements. 3 11. The Farmers Market opens next Thursday May 14th!!!! There will be 30 vendors, band, face painting, 4 5 inflatable, and more. 12. 2015 Pumpkin Fest – Jason is planning to have an adult flag football game. Cost will be \$100 per 6 7 team and proceeds will go to the Wounded Warrior Project. 13. Events – Jason reviewed the events held or planned for the park. So far 6 special events are approved. 8 14.
