27	1. American Cancer Society; Bark for Life, Sunday October 25– Heather Graham, representative for the

- 2. Bryn Mawr Rehab/Brain Injury Assoc., 5K, Saturday October 3- This will be held from 4:00 pm to 7:00 pm. Last year there were about 170 people. Past patients may participate. Funds raised go to brain injury research. They have done this for several years in East Goshen Park. Joe moved to approve both events as presented. Betsy seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. Jason verified the events in October as 10/3 Bryn Mawr; 10/11 Fall Festival; 10/18 East Goshen Pumpkin Festival;
 - 3. <u>Budget Meeting</u> Jason attended the BOS annual budget meeting last week.
- They want the Tot Lot improvements to start next year. They gave permission for the East Goshen Park Master Plan. Jason will form a Playground Committee with a tentative kickoff meeting in mid-July. They have to decide what is functional and can be retained. The Tot Lot plan should be done by Dec. 2015. He will apply for a DCNR grant in April 2016. There are two options: (1) do the renovation in one phase; or (2) do it in 3 phases over several years. The parks that Betsy visited all had themes so, the committee will consider a theme for the playground.
- b. The Park Master Plan should include the trail coming along Paoli Pike. Jason will put out RFP for bids. The Plan will focus on park specific improvement recommendations and include a destination playground element.
