7	The East Goshen Township Local Traffic Advisory Committee (LTAC) held a meeting
8	on Thursday, August 20, 2015 at 1:00 pm at the East Goshen Township Building.
9	Members in attendance were: Township Manager Rick Smith; Orth-Rodgers Associates
10	representative Dean Kaiser; Pennoni Associates representative Nathan Cline; and WEGO
11	Police Officer Leo Kennedy. Others present were: Township CFO Jon Altshul; and
12	resident Joe Devine, President, Hershey's Mill Estates HOA.
13	
14	The meeting was called to order by Rick Smith at 1:00 pm.
15	
16	No one was recording the meeting.
17	
18	Minutes of October 29, 2014 were approved as submitted.
19	
20	The purpose of today's meeting was to discuss the concerns of the residents of Hershey's
21	Mill Estates and review the results of the Traffic Calming Investigation.
22	
23	Dean reported that they collected data at 3 intersections;
24	1. Rt. 352 & Tanglewood Dr,
25	2. Greenhill Rd. & Foxglove La.
26	3. Hershey's Mill Rd & Tanglewood Dr.
27	Additional speed data was collected near the intersections of
28	1. Tanglewood Dr. & Candytuft
29	2. Tanglewood Dr. & the pool access
30	The survey was conducted between the hours of 7:00-9:30 am and 4:00-6:00 pm in
31	conjunction with peak traffic periods and class schedules at Immaculata University.
32	They looked at license plates for cut-throughs and then speed.
33	Similar studies were done for these locations in 2002 and 2007.  They looked at surrounding conditions; ie, Rt. 352 and King Rd. intersection may be a

35	cause for cut-throughs.  AM cut-throughs were at 48.3% and PM was 6.6%. However, the posted speed limit is
36 37	25 mph and the speed investigation found:
3 <i>1</i> 38	Tanglewood Drive – eastbound – 33 MPH 85 <sup>th</sup> percentile speed
39	Near Candytuft La – westbound – 31 MPH 85 <sup>th</sup> percentile speed
40	Tanglewood Dr near pool access – eastbound 35 MPH 85 <sup>th</sup> percentile speed
41	westbound 32 MPH 85 <sup>th</sup> percentile speed
42	Dean feels it is time to go proceed with the process to see if the community wants speed
43	humps installed.

45	Rick explained that the Committee needs to make a recommendation to the Board of
46	Supervisors. Notice of the BOS meeting will be sent to the residents. If the BOS agrees
47	that it is time to see what the residents want, then the LTAC would conduct an

1 2	informational meeting for the residents and a survey will be sent out. The result of the survey must be 70% responding yes to speed humps.
3	survey must be 70% responding yes to speed numps.
4 5 6	Joe Devine asked Dean if any communities that have speed humps have asked for removal of them. Dean answered that Waterview currently has 5 speed humps and are asking for another. He is not aware of any complaints.
7	
8 9 10	Rick explained that in Hershey's Mill Estates the lots small with driveways close to each other so a speed humps may be in front of someone's home with signs alerting people to the speed hump.
11	
12 13 14 15	Leo mentioned that, out of the 3 townships the Police Department serves, Westtown has the most traffic complaints. There is one road coming off of Rt. 202 where they give out speeding tickets for 55-60 MPH. He feels getting 70% approval in Hershey's Mill Estates may be a challenge.
16	Zotates may be a chamonge.
17	Dean spoke about some deflectors that can be used but aren't recommended. He hasn't
18 19	found any proof that a speed hump decreases property values.
20 21 22	The approximate locations for speed humps are 1523, 1541 & 1566 Tanglewood Dr. The exact locations will be marked on the street by Rick and Dean next week.
23 24 25 26 27	It was the consensus of Committee that they would recommend that the Board of Supervisors authorize the LTAC to hold an informational public meeting regarding the installation of three speed humps on Tanglewood Dr. and following this meeting send a ballot to each property owner in Hershey Mill Estates. The approximate locations for speed humps are 1523, 1541 & 1566 Tanglewood Dr.

Dear Resident:

In response to a request from the Hershey Mill Estates Homeowners Association the East Goshen Township Local Traffic Advisory Committee (LTAC) looked into what can be done to reduce speeding and cut-thru traffic in your neighborhood.

By way of background the traffic conditions in Hershey Mill Estates meet the warrants for speed humps and the LTAC concluded that installing three speed humps on Tanglewood Drive would be appropriate. The Board of Supervisors authorized the LTAC to hold an informational meeting and issue ballots to see if the residents were in favor of the speed humps.

The informational meeting was held on Thursday, October 8, 2015 the Township Building.

Approximately 20 residents attended the meeting and some of the residents at the meeting were in favor of speed humps while others were opposed. One concern repeatedly expressed was that installing speed humps at the proposed locations would not reduce the speed at the curve on Tanglewood Drive by the swimming pool. The general consensus of those in attendance was that prior to sending out a ballot, the Township should undertake some other steps to see if they would reduce the speed of vehicles. These steps would include the following:

- Trim the street trees in order to increase the visibility for motorists and pedestrians.
- Install curve signs with advisory speed placards at the curve by the swimming pool.
- Install raised pavement markers at the curve by the swimming pool.

In addition the LTAC will investigate the possibility of adding fill material along the edge of the road at the curve in order to provide pedestrians with an area to get off of the pavement and reconfiguring the island at Burning Bush Lane and Tanglewood Drive.

The tree trimming is scheduled for this fall, and the curve signs and raised pavement markers will be installed within the next few weeks. Once the above have been completed, I will schedule another informational meeting.
