Net of pass-through accounts, the general fund had revenues of \$9,310,440 and expenses of \$8,746,014 for a year-to-date surplus of \$564,426 through the end of November. Compared to the YTD budget, revenues were \$361,623 over-budget and expenses were \$280,601 under-budget, for a positive budget variance of \$642,224, an improvement of \$130,774 since last month. As of November 30th, the general fund balance was \$4,857,277.

The positive improvement has been driven largely by savings in Public Works. Specifically, due to lowerthan-expected oil prices, the cost of resurfacing is coming in substantially under-budget. Net of core revenues, Public Works is now \$100,331 under-budget, which represents an improvement of approximately \$110,000 since October. The remaining departments all continue to be under-budget.

On the revenue side, Earned Income Tax receipts were somewhat lower than expected for the second straight month. However, this decrease was offset by a robust transfer tax disbursement that reflected the sale of a large apartment complex.

Other funds

Other funds continue to be in a strong position through November.

- The State Liquid Fuels Fund had \$431,170 in revenues and no expenses. The fund balance is \$431,374.
- The Sinking Fund had \$21,941 in revenues and \$343,738 in expenses. The fund balance is \$5,915,638.
- The Transportation Fund had \$3,802 in revenues and \$10,648 in expenses. The fund balance is \$1,061,007.
- The Sewer Operating Fund had \$3,058,156 in revenues and \$2,857,150 in expenses. The fund balance is \$794,547.
- The Refuse Fund had \$921,961 in revenues and \$938,215 in expenses. The fund balance is \$732,644.
- The Sewer Sinking Fund had \$2,482 in revenues and \$17,838 in expenses. The fund balance is \$1,934,957.
- The Operating Reserve Fund had \$2,879 in revenues and no expenses. The fund balance is \$2,478,491.
- The Events Fund had \$7 in revenues and no expenses. The fund balance is \$30,014.

2015 Year-End Projections

I am now projecting that the general fund finishes the year with a surplus of \$342,846 and a positive budget variance of \$642,514 or about \$172,839 more than last month. This positive forecast reflects the savings from resurfacing, as well as higher transfer tax receipts. There are no changes to other funds year-end projections since last month.

Trends in Chester County Assessments

At the December 1st meeting, Senya asked for data comparing the change in real estate assessments in other Chester County municipalities since the topic was last discussed in December 2012.

Below find a table comparing assessment changes among nearby municipalities over this timeframe. As you'll see, East Goshen's increases lag the County as a whole slightly. That said, assessments only change when they are formally appealed or there is new construction. Therefore, because there has been relatively little new construction in East Goshen over this time period (particularly compared to many other Chester County municipalities), these figures reflect great stability in East Goshen.

Overview of the Department of Recreation

The Department of Recreation has one full-time staff person supplemented by seasonal staff working in the summer months. It works daily with all township staff and departments, but most closely with the Public Works Department. It has oversight of the Recreation Program Budget (FY15 - \$121539) and supports the Park Maintenance Budget (FY15 - \$85225). Since 2014, the department has dramatically increased program hours offered to East Goshen residents, specifically revenue generating activities for children. Park permitting revenues have also sharply increased due to a 2015 Park Permit Fee Structure adjustment. The department faces two primary challenges as it seeks to best serve its residents over the next five years.

These primary challenges are:

- 1. Repositioning East Goshen Park to best serve residents as it undergoes upcoming renovations
- 2. Continuing to expand program hours offered while maintaining current staffing footprint

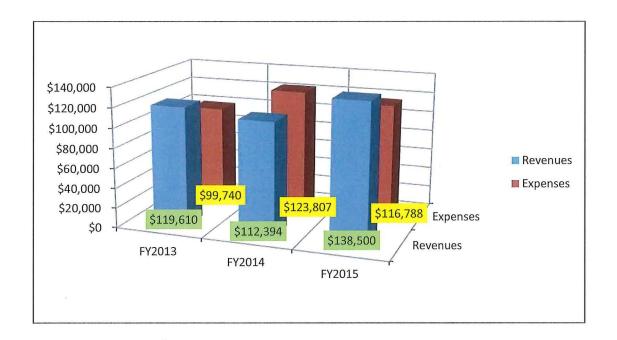

Department Goals, Objectives and Actions

Goal #1: Provide a comprehensive system of parks, trails, open space and recreational programs which are equitably distributed, accessible to all residents and improve residential quality of life.

Objective A: Create a planning framework to guide short and long term department decisions

Action 1. East Goshen Park Master Plan – amenity life cycle, ADA compliance, CIP budget

The Park Master Plan is a decision-guiding tool for the development and renovation of East Goshen Park, so staff can make informed choices that best suit resident recreational needs over the next ten years. Specifically, it will include a complete renovation of the playground area, enhancements to the sport field areas, and a study of how the anticipated Paoli Pike Trail will affect user group's recreational needs.

Action 2. Maintenance Plan

The Maintenance Plan will include a framework for all annual, monthly and weekly park maintenance duties. This framework will be utilized in planning decisions to most efficiently use resources, identify areas for potential expense reduction, Public Works staff hours, and in conjunction with park permitted special events so the turf fields maintain a high quality of play. This will be a joint work product with the Public Works Department.

Action 3. Resident Recreational Needs Assessment

The Recreational Needs Assessment will be done to inform township staff of emerging and future recreational needs and desires of township residents.

How are these actions measurable?

These three action items will be made available after completion (see attached Action Item Matrix) during FY2016.

Goal #2: Ensure department financial self-sufficiency by increasing operational budget revenue.

Objective A – Decrease gap between operational expense and revenue

Objective A1 - Increase department revenues

Action 4: Activity Fee Schedules Assessment

An Activity Fee Schedule Assessment will look at current program offerings, current participation rates, competitor fee schedules, and assess where user fees can be adjusted to increase revenues.

Action 5 - Increase destination trips

The National Parks Collette Trip was a success. We had seven East Goshen residents attend the two-week long trip. East Goshen staff was impressed with Collette Travel, who was responsive throughout the process and provided a quality trip to our residents. In the end, net revenue from this trip was \$2,600 with very little committed staff time. Within the next five years, the Department of Recreation looks to expand destination trip offerings to include two 7-10 day trips, and one long weekend trip. Revenues from this example could easily reach \$7,500 with no township expense and minimal staff time commitment.

Action 6 – Increase park permits

East Goshen Park is a beautiful park that hosts over sixty special event park permits each year from March – November. We can increase both the quantity of special events and the number of large events, generating additional revenues. An outreach campaign begins with an East Goshen Park amenities video – highlighting the grounds, pavilions, bathrooms and infrastructure that position the park well for special event planners.

Action 7 - Utilize Independent Contractors to increase program offerings, conserve staff time and augment revenues

Using independent contractors is a proactive way to augment current program offerings, while conserving staff time. Independent contractors are subject matter experts in their field of recreation, and offer a level of expertise program participants seek. Current East Goshen independent contractors teach Yoga, Zumba and Pilates — but we can easily add a number of fitness, art and cultural programs. Partnerships with independent contractors also provide the township with an additional layer of protection due to the current insurance "Additional Insured" relationship.

Objective A2 – Decrease operational expenses relative to program hours offered

Individual programs will be assessed to see if the current operational model can be changed to decrease expenses, while maintaining program quality. The current program where wage reduction can most likely occur is summer camps.

Action 8 - Seek alternative revenue streams and funding sources, such as sponsorships, grants, partnerships, etc.

There are a number of federal, state and local grant programs East Goshen can utilize to augment planning, asset development, and new program initiatives.

Action 9 – Seek formal/informal relationships to provide in-kind donations

The Department of Recreation will continue to seek relationships with local community leaders and organizations that mutually benefit both parties. This currently is most evident in the EGT-IU Entrepreneurial Academy and the Holiday Tree Lighting Celebration (East HS Choir, Time to Leap Dance)

Action 10 - PT staff hours/wages - room for reductions

An assessment will occur for all in-house programs, to address part-time staff hours and wages, and see if there is room for reduction.

Action 11 - FOEG - pre-event marketing

A symbiotic relationship between the Department of Recreation and the Friends of East Goshen (FOEG) is imperative for long-term solvency. To that end, one tool to develop that will help FOEG solicit support, is a Sponsorship Packet. This can be produced after consultation with FOEG, but would include a tri-fold with information on our big township events, attendance records, ways to contribute and how support of East Goshen positively affects all involved.

Action 12 - Create Volunteer Plan

A volunteer plan would include volunteer needs per program, a description of needed volunteer background checks, and a recruitment plan. East Goshen Recreation currently utilizes over 200 volunteers annually but does not have recognition for volunteer service — this would also be included.

How are these actions measurable?

Assessment for Goal #2 action items comes at the end of each fiscal year.

Goal #3: Enhance Parks and Recreation's appeal compared to other service providers, and its relevance to township residents by promoting East Goshen Park's facilities and amenities and providing outstanding customer service to residents, park users and third party park permittees.

Objective A - Promote the beauty of East Goshen Park as a county-wide destination park

Action 13 – Create a Department Marketing Plan

The Department Marketing Plan would include a department logo and slogan, monthly and annual e-newsletters, and a standard park amenity tri-fold. Additionally, a template marketing timeline for programs and special events would include contacts, flyers, news coverage and dates. Attendance at community fairs will also augment public awareness of upcoming East Goshen special events and programs.

Objective B – Provide outstanding customer service to residents, park users and third party park permittees

Action 14 - Post program feedback assessment

Institute a post program feedback tool to gauge program quality.

Objective C – Highlight department-wide accomplishments and recognitions

Action 15 - Assess NRPA-CAPRA Agency Certification eligibility

The NRPA-CAPRA agency certification program would be indescribably beneficial to the department, providing the biggest "feather in the cap" possible and national acclaim. Currently, there are twenty five agency's certified nationwide (out of 12,000 recreation departments) and none in Pennsylvania. Certification is a lengthy, multi-year process consisting of 144 standards, of which 85% must be met. Moving forward with this Strategic Plan begins the process for accomplishing many of these standards: Maintenance Plan, Marketing Plan, Volunteer Plan etc. It is the department's goal to assess the likelihood of a successful certification in January 2019.

Action 16 – Submit department for PRPS awards

The Recreation Department has many excellent programs that deserve recognition for their creative use of resources and delivery to the public. The Pennsylvania Recreation and Parks Society (PRPS) has an Excellence in Programming Award we will submit to. Award submission will come through the Park Commission, the Director of Recreation recently accepted appointment to the PRPS Awards and Recognitions Committee and can no longer submit self-awards.

Action 17 - Conference Work - join PRPS Awards Committee

It is important for the Recreation Department to engage and become a leader in decision-making across Pennsylvania as a whole.

How are these action items measurable?

Attendance at 3 community fairs annually; e-newsletters monthly and annually and documented Committee work.

Conclusion

The East Goshen Department of Recreation is in an unprecedented stage of growth. With unwavering BOS support, a "can do" township staff attitude and an active resident population, the possibilities to do something really special with the department are endless. The next five years will see a reshaping of the flagship East Goshen Park, an increased communication between park user and township staff; and the beginning of the Paoli Pike Trail. Use of park facilities will change positively, increasing as the trail affords residents, daytime workers and extended reach recreational users a safe pathway from business to government to park. It will be very important to "get things right" the first time, as we plan for changes in park use quantity, participant needs and forecast decision making going forward. Department staff is excited to oversee implementation of this Strategic Plan and looks forward to the next five years.

The WCACOG is considering the joint purchase of a thermoplastic applicator, which is a machine that installs hot plastic pavement markings (such as stop bars) at intersections. The applicator costs \$14,434 and it would be housed at West Goshen. The cost for each municipality depends on the number of participants.

Mark Miller noted that we currently contract (jointly with some other Townships) for line painting and does not recommend we participate in this initiative.

While I think it is important to participate in joint ventures such as this with our fellow COG members, In this case it does not make sense and I would recommend we respectively decline.

During the past leaf season we received a few complaints about people raking their leaves into the street. In addition we have also experienced problems with contractors placing dumpsters on the street.

After reviewing the Township Code and the PA Vehicle Code we determined that there is not a specific prohibition against either of these activities. We contacted the Chief Bernot, who after speaking with the District Attorney's office, advised that the only option would be to cite someone for disorderly conduct. Since we need to update the Township Code to add the speed hump we installed in Waterview I would suggest that we address these issue at the same time.

Suggested Motion: I move that we authorize Township staff to advertise a public hearing to consider adoption of the Vehicles and Traffic Amendment.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF EAST GOSHEN, CHESTER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, **AMENDING** CHAPTER 225 OF THE EAST GOSHEN TOWNSHIP CODE TITLED "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC," SECTION 225-1 TO ADD A DEFINITION FOR "CARTWAY", SECTIONS 225-41 AND 225-43 TO AMEND **VIOLATIONS** AND **PENALTIES PROVISIONS:** AMENDING SECTION 225-43.1 TO PROHIBIT THE ACCUMULATION OF LEAVES AND OTHER DEBRIS AND DUMPSTERS IN THE CARTWAY AND TO AMEND SECTION 225-63, SCHEDULE XIX TO ADD A SPEED **HUMP ON WATERVIEW ROAD SOUTH OF GLENBROOK** LANE.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of East Goshen Township that Chapter 225 of the East Goshen Township Code, titled "Vehicles and Traffic," is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 225-1, titled "Definitions," shall be amended to add the following term:

CARTWAY – The paved portion of a street or highway designed for vehicular traffic.

SECTION 2. Section 225-41, titled "Violations and penalties," shall be amended as follows:

"§ 225-41. Violations and penalties.

Unless otherwise provided in the Vehicle Code (75 Pa.C.S.A. § 101 et seq.), any person convicted of a provision of this article, or any supplement thereto, shall be punishable as provided in § 225-43 hereof."

SECTION 3. Section 225-43, titled "Violations and penalties," shall be amended as follows:

"§ 225-43. Violations and penalties.

Unless otherwise provided in the Vehicle Code (75 Pa.C.S.A. § 101 et seq.), or except as herein specified, any person convicted of a violation of a provision of this chapter, or any supplement thereto, shall pay a fine of \$25 and costs of prosecution."

SECTION 4. Section 225-43.1 shall be amended as follows:

"§ 225-43.1. TRAFFIC HAZARDS AND OBSTRUCTIONS.

- A. It is the duty of the owner of real property to remove from the property any tree, plant, shrub or other similar obstruction, or any part thereof, which by obstructing the view of any driver constitutes a traffic hazard. The failure of an owner to remove the traffic hazard within ten (10) days after notice shall constitute a summary offense. Every day that the owner fails to remove the traffic hazard shall be a separate and distinct offense punishable in accordance with Section 225-43.
- B. An owner of real property is hereby prohibited from placing trees, limbs, leaves or other debris within the cartway of any public street.
- C. An owner of real property is hereby prohibited from placing a dumpster within the cartway of any public street."

SECTION 5. Section 225-63, Schedule XIX shall be amended to add the following:

Name of Street	Device	<u>Location</u>
Waterview Road	speed hump	South of Glenbrook Lane

SECTION 6. Severability. If any sentence, clause, section or part of this Ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections, or parts hereof. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Board of Supervisors that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as the same affects this Ordinance.

<u>SECTION 8.</u> Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be effective five days following enactment as by law provided.

Dear Board Members:

As you all know we are moving quickly towards completing three grant applications in pursuit of funding for the Paoli Pike Trail. The three grants we are seeking for segments C, D, E, F and G require that easement or Rights of Way be secured or in the process of being developed upon grant submission in order to be considered. The grant we are seeking require the Township to fund all the engineering work for the project and this survey work is necessary for the development of the engineered plans for the trail. This survey information is needed if we are going to move forward.

Natasha Manbeck from McMahon Associates has submitted a proposal to the Township for the required survey work for these trail segment areas for your review and consideration.

Staff is of the opinion that this proposal is appropriate and since the information is necessary to advance our grants and that it is appropriate to contract with McMahon since they have firsthand knowledge of the trail plan to this point.

Draft Motion:

Mr. Chairman, I move that we accept the proposal from McMahon Associates Inc. for the land survey work needed for segments C, D, E, F and G of the Paoli Pike Trail for the amount of \$68,950.

As discussed, McMahon Associates, Inc. is pleased to provide this proposal for survey and right-of-way related services in support of three upcoming competitive grant applications and advancing engineering and right-of-way acquisition for priority segments of the proposed Paoli Pike Trail in East Goshen Township, Chester County, PA. This effort is directly related to our current work for the Township on the Paoli Pike Trail – Feasibility Study and Master Plan.

The Township plans to submit three separate competitive grant applications for five priority segments of the Paoli Pike Trail. The scope of services is presented in three separate tasks associated with each of the competitive grant applications.

Scope of Services

Task 1. Segment C – Reservoir Road to Boot Road Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Application

For Segment C, the Township plans to submit a Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) application by January 8, 2016. TAP requires the Township to fund and complete of all preconstruction activities by September 2018. Initiating survey of Segment C will further demonstrate the Township's commitment to the project and also advance engineering for the project to help meet the September 2018 deadline. Additionally, survey and right-of-way related services are not eligible for TAP grant funding. If the Township is not awarded a TAP grant, the survey work can be used to pursue other grant opportunities.

1) The Topographic survey will be obtained using the following procedures and requirements for the proposed route of the Paoli Pike Multi-Use Trail. The survey will cover approximately 1750 feet along the proposed route of the Multi-Use Trail. Survey coverage

- will encompass a 100′ wide swath along the north side of S.R. 2014 Paoli Pike from the intersection of Reservoir Road to Boot Road. This route will cross a gas station, and include 3 drainage reserve areas across 4 properties.
- 2) Topographic survey of S.R. 2014 Paoli Pike from the intersection of Reservoir Road to Boot Road, showing lane striping and driveways.
- 3) Detailed topographic Survey at the intersections of Reservoir Road, T-598 and Boot Road for ADA curb ramp purposes.
- 4) The recovery of boundary evidence is anticipated on the 6 parcels along the proposed trail route on S.R. 2014 Paoli Pike. It is anticipated that the following parcels will be needed in the survey: UPI#'s 53-4-169, 53-4-154, 53-4-155, 53-4-1, 53-4-2 and 53-4-75.

Task 2. Segments D and E – Boot Road to PA 352 PennDOT Multimodal Transportation Fund (MTF) Application

For Segments D and E, the Township plans to submit a Multimodal Transportation Fund (MTF) application by December 18, 2015. The MTF program requires that all grant funded activities be complete within three years. Completing survey of Segments D and E will help to advance engineering to meet this project deadline. Additionally, due to MTF program limits on funding for engineering, permitting, and inspection, the Township will be responsible for the full cost of engineering and permitting. If the Township is not awarded an MTF grant, the survey work can be used to pursue other grant funding opportunities.

- 1) The Topographic survey will be obtained using the following procedures and requirements for the proposed route of the Paoli Pike Multi-Use Trail. The survey will cover approximately 3000 feet along the proposed route of the Multi-Use Trail. Survey coverage will encompass a variable swath along the south side of S.R. 2014 Paoli Pike from the intersection of Boot Road to S.R. 0352 N. Chester Road. The swath will be 75 feet wide from Boot Road to 300′ before the intersection of Goshen Village Rd, the coverage will expand to 180′ at the area of the unnamed tributary of Ridley Creek and then the coverage will be 50′ wide from Goshen Village Road to S.R. 0352 N. Chester Road. This route will cross 8 properties.
- 2) Topographic survey of S.R. 2014 Paoli Pike from the intersection of S.R. 2020 Boot Road, to S.R. 0352 N. Chester Road showing lane striping and driveways.
- 3) Detailed topographic survey at the intersections of S.R. 2020 Boot Road, Goshen Village Rd, 8 separate driveway crossings on the south side of S.R. 2014 Paoli Pike and S.R. 0352 N. Chester Road for ADA curb ramp purposes.
- 4) The recovery of boundary evidence is anticipated on the 8 parcels along the proposed trail route on the south side of S.R. 2014 Paoli Pike. It is anticipated that the following parcels will be needed in the survey: UPI#'s 53-4-77, 53-4-77.1A, 53-4-77.1, 53-4-78.1, 53-4-78.2, 53-4-79, 53-4-80 and 53-4-81.

Task 3. Segments F and G – PA 352 to Existing Applebrook Park Trails Community Conservation Partnership Program (C2P2) and Chester County Municipal Grant

For Segments F and G, the Township plans to submit a Community Conservation Partnership Program (C2P2) grant application by April 13, 2016 and a Chester County Municipal Grant application by February 23, 2016. Both programs require all right-of-way or easements necessary for the project to be secured at or shortly after the time of application. Based on the conceptual trail plan developed and documented in the Paoli Pike Trail – Feasibility Study and Master Plan, a permanent trail easement will be needed for Parcel 53-4-87 on the southeast corner of Paoli Pike and North Chester Road (SR 0352). If the Township does not receive a C2P2 or Chester County grant, the survey and right-of-way work can be used to pursue other grant opportunities.

- 1) The Topographic survey will be obtained using the following procedures and requirements for the proposed route of the Paoli Pike Multi-Use Trail. The survey will cover approximately 1800 total feet along the proposed route of the Multi-Use Trail in two sections. Survey coverage will encompass a 50 to 75 foot swath along the south side of S.R. 2014 Paoli Pike from the intersection of S.R. 0352 N. Chester Road for 600 feet tying into the existing Applebrook Trail. Survey coverage will also encompass an area starting 700 feet south of the intersection of Paoli Pike and Hibbard Lane continuing through the intersection and ending 550′ north of the intersection tying into the existing Applebrook Trail on parcel 53-4-89.1. This route will cross approximately 6 properties.
- 2) Topographic survey of S.R. 2014 Paoli Pike from the intersection of S.R. 0352 N. Chester Road to 550 feet past Hibbard Lane showing lane striping and driveways.
- 3) Detailed topographic Survey at the intersections of S.R. 2014 Paoli Pike and S.R. 0352 N. and the NE and SE corners of S.R. 2014 Paoli Pike and Hibberd Lane for ADA curb ramp purposes.
- 4) The recovery of boundary evidence is anticipated on the parcels along the proposed trail route on the south side of S.R. 2014 Paoli Pike. It is anticipated that the following parcels will be needed in the survey: UPI#'s 53-4-87, 53-4-89.7, 53-4-89.1, 53-4-89.1A and 53-4-89.1B.

In addition, McMahon will complete the following services to assist the Township with the permanent trail easement acquisition for Parcel 53-4-87.

- 5) Complete preliminary design in the area of Parcel 53-4-87 to determine the size and location of the permanent trail easement. This work will be completed in CAD and it is not anticipated that a deliverable will be produced.
- 6) Prepare up to two (2) exhibits depicting the trail and permanent trail easement for the Township's use in coordinating with the property owner and an appraiser.
- 7) Attend one (1) meeting with the Township and the property owner to review the trail and permanent trail easement exhibit.

8) Prepare one (1) plat and legal description for the permanent trail easement. All paperwork will be forwarded to the Township and their solicitor to execute with the property owners and record at the courthouse.

Procedures for Topographic Survey (Tasks 1 – 3)

- The survey datum will be tied to the Pennsylvania State Plane Coordinate System.
- The survey control will be established by use of ground and GPS equipment.
- The topographic survey will be performed by ground based measurement techniques.
- The Right-of-Way lines will be reconstructed utilizing PennDOT, County and local township public records and resources
- AutoCAD Land Development Desktop will be used to prepare the survey. All drawing files will be in an AutoCAD Format (DWG) with a base point of 0,0,0 and a North Rotation of 0 degrees.

Requirements for Topographic Survey (Tasks 1 – 3)

- Roadway and trail cross sections will be obtained on station at 50 foot intervals.
 Additional cross sections will be obtained where there are grade breaks or a change in the terrain.
- Edge of road and edge of shoulder locations.
- The width of the roadway survey in all other areas will extend to the Right of way line.
- Traffic line patterns and the location of all roadway pavement markings.
- Traffic signs with a description of each sign.
- Utility poles and guy wires.
- Trees and landscaping.
- Guide rails, Median barriers and traffic separation islands.
- Curbs, sidewalks and curb ramp locations
- Detailed topographic coverage at the locations of proposed ADA handicap ramps.
- Drainage inlets and end walls manhole covers within the specified limits.
- Visible utilities including water and gas valves, junction boxes and any other utility structures on or near the roadway or proposed trail area.
- Location of underground utilities which are identifiable from utility markings and/or
 plan information from the results of PA One Call inquiry. The locations of underground
 utilities are only approximate.
- Stream and railroad structures & railroad crossings.
- Intersecting Streets and driveways, including widths and types.
- Any other topography within the specified limits which may interfere with grading, construction, or paving operations.
- Surface location of sanitary sewer manholes if structures are safe and accessible and
