Net of pass-through accounts, as of January 31^{st} , the general fund had revenues of \$217,722 and expenses of \$1,029,546 for a year-to-date deficit of \$811,824. Compared to the YTD budget, revenues were \$12,654 under budget and expenses were \$51,406 over budget for a negative budget variance of \$64,060. As of January 31^{st} , the general fund balance was \$3,912,882.

On the expense side, Public Works was \$55,051 over-budget due to the timing of receiving a number of paving and tree removal invoices for work done in December. Many of these expenses will therefore be accrued back to 2015 in our audited financial statements. Interestingly, however, January snow expenses were \$2,600 under budget, despite the historic blizzard of January 23-24. Park and Recreation was \$26,461 over-budget due primarily to the timing of the most recent invoice for Gannett Fleming's upcoming report on the Milltown Dam. Emergency Services was nominally over-budget, but will not be next month due to the \$115,070 credit from WEGO for 2015, which will be reflected in next month's report. Administration and Zoning & Codes were both under-budget.

Earned Income Tax, Real Estate Property Tax and Transfer Tax were all slightly under-budget for the month, but January is historically the slowest month for revenue. A clearer picture of 2016 revenues will not begin to emerge until February when the Q4 EIT disbursements are processed and the first real estate tax payments are received.

Other funds

- The State Liquid Fuels Fund had \$0 in revenues and \$0 expenses. The fund balance is \$200.
- The Sinking Fund had \$402 in revenues and \$7,917 in expenses. The fund balance is \$6,259,945.
- The **Transportation Fund** had \$993 in revenues and \$0 in expenses. The fund balance is \$1,062,206.
- The **Sewer Operating Fund** had \$261,936 in revenues and \$415,721 in expenses. The fund balance is \$475,253.
- The **Refuse Fund** had \$91,116 in revenues and \$79,178 in expenses. The fund balance is \$667,622.
- The **Sewer Sinking Fund** had \$250 in revenues and \$0 in expenses. The fund balance is \$2,103,575.
- The **Operating Reserve Fund** had \$267 in revenues and no expenses. The fund balance is \$2,482,802.
- The Events Fund had \$1 in revenues and no expenses. The fund balance is \$45,016.

Re: HVAC System

We have a computer system (StruxureWare) that controls the Township's building geothermal HVAC system. The system was installed by SassMoore Service Corporation, who was a subcontractor to Five Star.

Earlier this month we had a problem, the system locked up, and while the HVAC system for the building functioned normally I was not able to access the program, to see what the problem was. I contacted SassMoore and they came out and corrected the problem.

They advised me that the one year monitoring/warranty period had ended. So I asked them for service contract. The cost of the service contract is \$6,500 a year it includes monitoring and software upgrades.

The StruxureWare system has worked well over the past year, and it maximizes the efficiency of the geothermal system.

Re: Cornwallis Drive Second Access

In light of the comment in the Chester County Planning Commissions (CCPC) review letter for the Gionfriddo Subdivision the Board has requested that I re-visit the question of what can be done to create a second access for Cornwallis Drive.

Background - The CCPC estimates there are about 63 dwelling units on Cornwallis Drive and Colonial Lane, which are currently served by a single access to North Chester Road. Building permits have been issued or are under review for 4 more lots, there are at least 2 other building lots that I am aware of, and there are 3 remaining properties that could be subdivided with flag lots. Therefore, we could be looking at 72 dwelling units that would be served by a single access to North Chester Road.

The CCPC notes that the <u>Multimodal Circulation Handbook</u> recommends that a maximum of 24 dwelling units utilize a single access point. The Township Zoning Ordinance allows for a maximum of 25 dwelling units to utilize a single access point.

At your meeting on September 28, 2010 the Mark Gordon gave presentation about creating an emergency access between Cornwallis Drive and Wineberry Lane. Under this scenario 38-39 of the dwelling units would still only have one access point. The Proposed Emergency Easement Configuration and minutes are attached.

Options

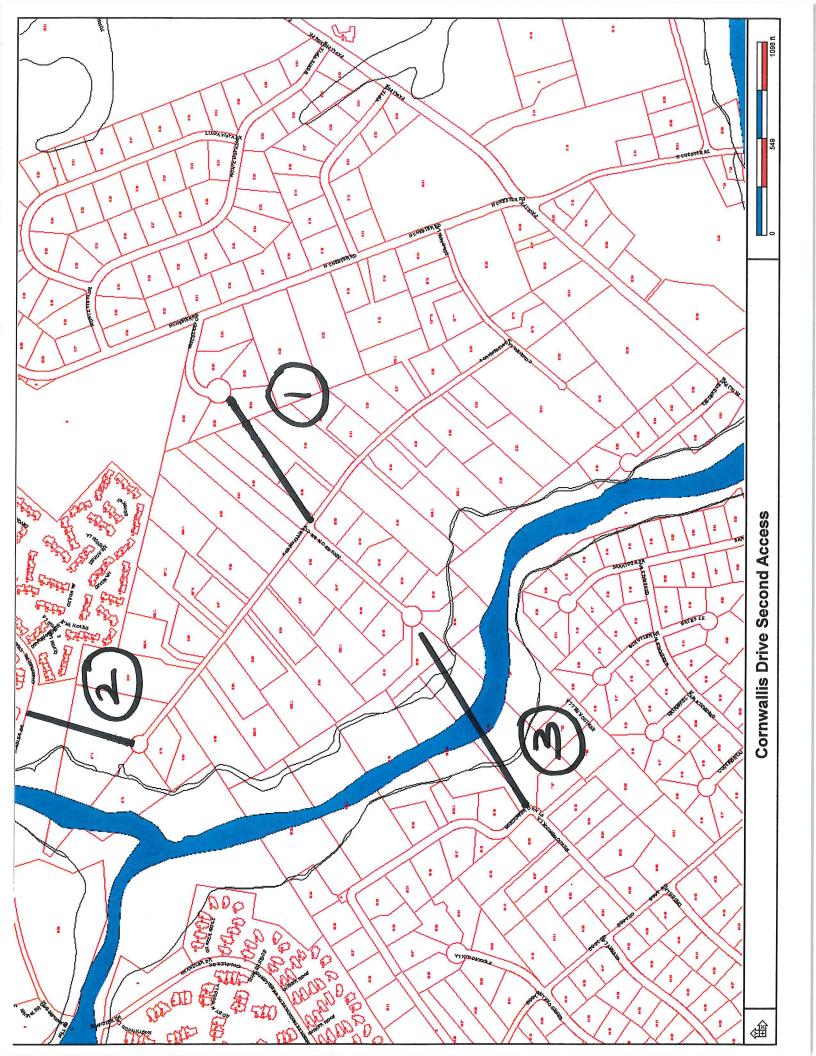
- 1. Cornwallis Drive is bounded on the east by a spray field for Hershey's Mill, Wineberry Lane and homes along North Chester Road. A second access could be created between Cornwallis Drive and Wineberry Lane. Since Wineberry Lane is a public street this connection could be a public street or an emergency access only. The estimated length of the connection to Wineberry Lane is 800 feet.
- 2. Cornwallis Drive is bounded on the north by Hershey's Mill Village. A second access could be created between Cornwallis Drive and Chandler Drive. Since the roads in Hershey's Mill are private we would need to work something out with the Master Association. This would be simpler if it was an emergency access only. The estimated length of this connection is 650 feet.
- 3. Cornwallis Drive is bounded on the west by the Ridley Creek. It would be cost prohibitive to construct bridge over the Ridley Creek, so I have eliminated this as an option.

Right-of-Way – The Township would need to acquire right-of-way for both Options 1 and 2. This can be accomplished through negotiation or condemnation. I do not have an estimate for the cost of right-of-way acquisition.

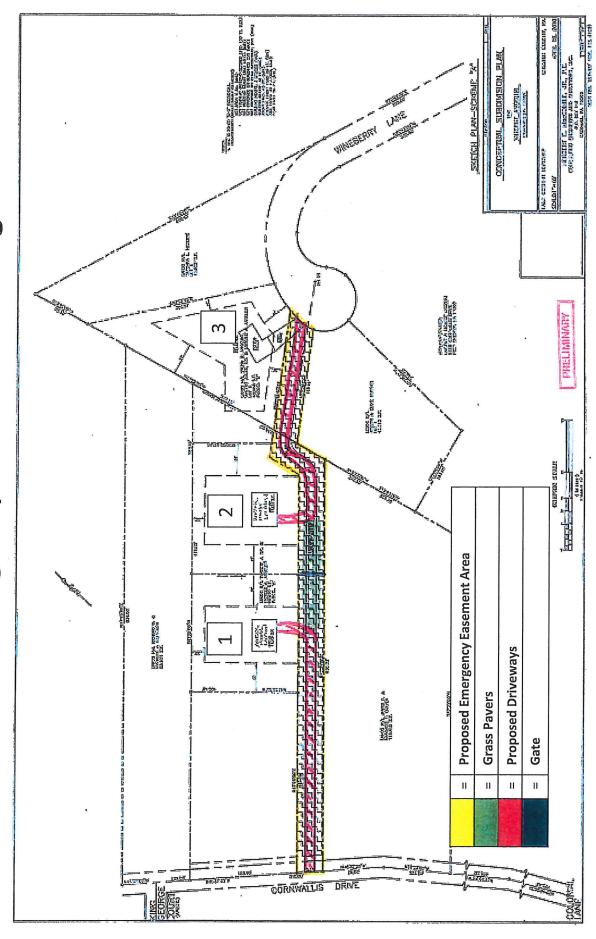
Type of Access – Cornwallis Drive is approximately 18 feet wide. An 18 feet wide paved connection, which would support two-way traffic, between Cornwallis Drive and either Wineberry Lane or Chandler Drive, with the

required storm-water management facilities would cost in the neighborhood of \$200,000. A connection that utilized grass pavers might be somewhat less. However, it would be considered impervious, so storm-water management facilities would be required in either case.

WORKSHOP

Review of Minutes

The draft minutes of August 11 and August 14 were reviewed and corrected.

Bills

The Treasurer's Report and Expenditure Register Report were reviewed.

Agenda Review

The agenda for the formal meeting was reviewed.

Hershey's Mill Dam

Marty said the only issue on the table for the Board tonight is whether to have Rick execute the agreement with NRCS or not; however, the public will no doubt wish to comment on other aspects of the dam issue as well.

Marty said that both Andy Dinniman and Barbara McIlvaine Smith would be sending representatives to the meeting this evening.

Regarding Neil DeRiemer's offer to purchase the dam from the Township, the Supervisors agreed to discuss this matter later, probably as an Executive Session with the Township Solicitor.

The Board then reviewed the spreadsheet Rick prepared showing the cost estimates for the various dam options.

The Board agreed that Rick should get a proposal from Gannett Fleming for a 90-ft spillway with articulated concrete block face.

T-Mobile Variance Request for Utility Pole

The Board reviewed a draft motion prepared by Don for this application. Marty said he had come to the conclusion that granting this variance would violate the letter and spirit of the Township ordinance.

Traditions Independent Living Facility in West Goshen

Marty gave a brief summary of the meeting in West Goshen on August 12 regarding this project.

FORMAL MEETING

Call to Order & Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Marty Shane called the meeting to order at 8:04pm and led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Moment of Silence

Carmen called for a moment of silence to honor the men and women serving their country in the armed forces and their families.

Recording of Meeting

Resident Neil DeRiemer said he would be recording the meeting.

Approval of Minutes

Don moved to approve the minutes of August 11 and August 14 as corrected in Workshop. Carmen seconded the motion. There was no discussion or public comment. The Board voted unanimously to approve the motion.

Chairman's Report

Marty announced that the minimum municipal obligation for 2010 is as follows:

PUBLIC HEARING

Ordinance Amendment Prohibiting Overnight Parking of Commercial Vehicles

The Board conducted a public hearing to consider approval of an ordinance prohibiting the overnight parking of commercial vehicles on public streets.

Carmen moved to approve the ordinance amending Chapter 225 of the Township Code. Thom seconded the motion. The Board voted unanimously to approve the motion.

A court reporter was present and will provide a complete transcript of the proceedings.

FORMAL MEETING (Resumed)

Police Report

Police Chief John Dumond reported there were 621 calls for service from East Goshen in July.

He announced that WEGO is collecting donations for military dogs serving with our troops. They are doing this as a memorial to retired K-9 Rikko, who passed away in June. They are collecting retractable leashes and toys (both must be for large dogs), doggie treats, and blankets. All items must be new. Donations can be made at the police station or at the East Goshen, Westtown, or Thornbury Township offices. Donations will be accepted through the end of October.

Resident Linda Gordon asked if cash donations would be accepted. The Chief said they are not accepting cash, only the items requested. Carmen said he would be happy to take cash donations on behalf of WEGO and provide receipts for residents wishing to do so.

Hershey's Mill Dam

Marty requested that the large audience be respectful and courteous to others during the meeting and while making their comments. He said that due to the large turnout it might be necessary to place a time limit on individual comments.

Marty said the question on the table for the Board tonight is whether or not to execute an agreement for a conservation easement with the NRCS (Natural Resources Conservation Service) which would give the Township access to federal stimulus money to breach the dam. He noted that the Board would not be making a decision tonight on what to do with the dam.

Marty then thanked a number of people for working so hard on this issue:

Reed Bailey (resident)

Henry Sciortino (resident)

Rick Smith (Township Manager)

Rep. Barbara McIlvaine Smith & her staff

Senator Andy Dinniman & his staff

He also thanked the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) for their assistance.

Marty introduced Chris Sappey, Chief of Staff for Barbara McIlvaine Smith. Ms. Sappey said that Barbara appreciates this opportunity to serve the residents of East Goshen by acting as a conduit between the Township and the State. Marty then introduced Pat Laubenstein, also from Barbara McIlvaine Smith's office.

Don Vymazal of Andy Dinniman's office then read a statement from Senator Dinniman. A copy is appended to these minutes.

Marty introduced the Supervisors and Township staff members to the audience. He told the audience the Board would respond to comments at the end of the comment period, and not respond to each individual comments as it was made.

Marty provided the background information on the dam issue. In 2007 the Township received notification from DEP that the dam was not in compliance with their regulations. In order to bring the dam into compliance the Township would either have to restore it in some fashion or breach it. The DEP has instructed the Township to get a permit for the dam work by the end of

the year. Marty said the need to get the permit is the driver for action on this conservation easement agreement this evening.

Marty then told the audience about the changing economic situation in the Township. Whereas the Township used to receive around \$800K per year in real estate transfer taxes, this year the Township will only receive approximately \$200K in transfer taxes. In addition, local employers will be cutting or moving 750-1,000 jobs out of the Township. With each job that is lost, the Township loses \$52 per year for the Emergency Services Tax. In addition, Earned Income Tax revenue will obviously be affected, and this is the largest source of revenue for the Township. Real estate tax revenue will also be taking a hit due to all the reappraisals taking place. Nevertheless, the Board does not want to enact a real estate tax increase in 2010.

Rick Smith then showed several slides of the dam –

- 1) As it exists today.
- 2) With the addition of a 200-ft secondary concrete spillway. With this option the dam, pond, and waterfall remain intact but the trees and shrubs are eliminated. The estimated cost for this option is \$457K.
- 3) With the addition of a 200-ft secondary spillway made of articulated concrete block that will be covered with grass. With this option the dam, pond, and waterfall remain intact but the trees and shrubs are eliminated. The estimated cost for this option is \$351K.
- 4) After a breach, with the area returned to its natural state. The trees and shrubs can remain, but the pond and waterfall will be eliminated. The cost for this option will be covered by a federal grant.
- 5) With a "dam behind the dam." A second dam will be created to bring the dam into compliance. The appearance of the existing waterfall will remain the same. The cost for this option is \$1.6M.
- 6) With a lowered spillway and berm. By lowering the spillway and berm by 6 feet, DEP would be able to reclassify the dam to the Township's favor. The Township would be able to keep a semblance of the dam and waterfall. The pond's water level would be reduced, creating new wetlands. The major con to this approach would be the amount of wetlands restoration work that would be required. The estimated cost for this option is \$265K for the dam work and another \$150K-\$200K for wetlands restoration.

Marty said that Neil DeRiemer, a resident, has proposed another option using a 90-ft spillway. The Township is currently reviewing this option.

Marty stated that there is no relationship between the culverts under Greenhill Road and what the DEP wants done with the dam. The culverts are not an issue.

Public Comment: Neil DeRiemer, 1034 Hershey Mill Road – Asked if NRCS would pay for the option with the lowered waterfall. Marty said no. Marty noted that the Township has received a permit to lower the pond level by 6 feet, and plans to do so this week to get an idea of how large a wetland area would be created.

Public Comment: Joe D'Antonio, 1564 Millrace Lane – He thanked the Board for working with the residents on this issue. He said the residents have given the Board a petition with 425

signatures from individuals who want the dam saved. He then showed a PowerPoint presentation outlining the concerns and wishes of the residents. A copy is appended to these minutes. Mr. D'Antonio said no price can be put on the beauty of the dam, and he urged the Board to vote "No" on accepting the NRCS grant money in order to have more time to evaluate options for the dam.

Public Comment: Neil DeRiemer, 1034 Hershey Mill Road — Stated that Yerkes knows nothing about dams, and Gannett Fleming is guilty of "over-engineering." None of the engineering work the Township has had done in regard to the dam is any good. The Township has been getting faulty data. Mr. DeRiemer said he has independently asked for the opinion of another firm experienced with dams and they have estimated it would cost only \$150K to put in a dam behind the dam. The firm he contacted is Earth Engineering, Inc., who did the dam at Malvern Prep. Marty told Mr. DeRiemer that DEP requires the second dam to be 600 feet.

Mr. DeRiemer then stated that he has offered to purchase the dam and take on the liability issue at no cost to the Township. The Township is welcome to put it out to bid as required by law. He then stated "I beg you not to sign with the NRCS." Mr. DeRiemer said he would even take charge of a fundraising effort to raise the money over a 5-year period.

Public Comment: Bernadette McLoughlin, 1209 Burning Bush Lane — Said the Township's engineering information is wrong. She asked for additional time for the residents to explore the various options and do fundraising. She said that Mr. DeRiemer's proposal would be the most cost-effective option. She stated that if the Township accepts the NRCS grant money, there will be no waterfall, no dam, and no pond by October 2010. Furthermore the federal government would have permanent easement rights to the property. She begged the Board not to accept the NRCS funding because doing so would allow the NRCS to "bully" the Township into an inappropriate deadline. She told the Board the residents do not want lip service; they want the Board to do what's right for the Township.

Public Comment: Grant McLoughlin, 1209 Burning Bush Lane — Reminded the Supervisors that they have gone on the record saying they don't want to breach the dam. If that's truly the case, the Supervisors should demonstrate the courage to vote against the NRCS grant.

Public Comment: Spencer Virta, 1520 Greenhill Road – Expressed concern about the effect a dam breach or a change in the dam's appearance would have on his property value.

Public Comment: Stephen Gothard, 1007 Mill Stream Drive — Said if anything is done to change the dam, it means the residents have failed and so has the Board. He said he does not understand why there is grant money available to breach the dam but no money available to save it.

Public Comment: Maureen Neuhaus, 1224 Foxglove Lane — Noted that the dam is featured in the Images of America - East Goshen Township book the Historical Commission is currently selling, as well as being on the front page of the East Goshen website. She expressed concern about a serious mosquito problem if the dam is breached and wetlands are created. She said more residents should have been notified about this issue, not just those within 1,000 feet of the

dam. She said that the folks who deeded the dam over to the Township would have wanted it preserved and protected.

Public Comment: Henry Sciortino, 1547 Tanglewood Drive — Said the timeline to vote on this issue is arbitrary; there is no need to rush. According to the CFA, there are small blocks of money available. The Township should seriously consider Mr. DeRiemer's offer to buy the dam. He requested that the Supervisors delay a vote on this issue, or if they feel a compelling need to vote, that they vote "No" to the grant.

Public Comment: Maureen Falcone, 1642 Yardley Drive – Asked if anyone has considered installing baffles at the dam to slow the flow of water to Greenhill Road if there is a dam failure.

Public Comment: Bob Schaeffer, 5 Hershey Mill Drive – Asked if the Township owns the property, does that mean the Township is liable if there is a flood. Don said yes. Mr. Schaeffer said he does not like the option of reducing the height of the waterfall.

Public Comment: Bill Reiley, 743 Inverness Drive – Had a question about the timeline for the project. Marty said that once a permit is obtained from the DEP, the Township can take up to five years to do the actual dam restoration work. Don noted that the Township is required to have engineered plans in place at the time of application for the permit, which means the Township has to make a definite decision on an option by the end of the year. Joe McDonough noted that the trees on the dam breast must come down no matter what is decided.

Public Comment: Neil DeRiemer, 1034 Hershey Mill Road — Said he is prepared to sue both the NRCS and the DEP if his property value goes down. He has been told his property value will decrease by \$150-\$175K. He said he is not going away, so the Township can either pay him now or pay him later.

Public Comment: Cynthia Marriott, 1554 Tanglewood Drive — Asked if obtaining National Historic Register status for the dam would allow the Township to stall for time with DEP. Marty told her that getting National Historic Register status would not forestall the need to repair the dam.

Public Comment: Joe D'Antonio, 1564 Millrace Lane — Said if the Board votes "No" on the grant tonight, then the residents can begin fundraising efforts in earnest. Marty said if the Board turns down this money, then the Township is on the hook for this project. He said it is human nature for folks to lose motivation to do something if they know another entity (in this case the Township) will be ultimately responsible for picking up the tab.

Public Comment: Henry Sciortino, 1547 Tanglewood Drive – Indicated that he took umbrage to Marty's comments and found them very insulting to the residents.

Public Comment: Ann D'Antonio, 1564 Millrace Lane — Said the residents want to be part of the solution. She asked the Board to allow residents the chance to help select the option chosen for the dam. She requested the Board vote "No" on the NRCS grant to allow time to come up with a solution.

Marty then responded to the issues and questions raised by the residents:

On why there is no grant money available for restoring the dam – no grant money is available because the government agencies prefer breaching as being the best option from an environmental standpoint.

On why only residents within 1,000 ft of the dam were notified — 1,000 feet is a considerable distance and the Township feels it acted completely appropriately in this regard. Other townships do not notify residents within such a large area. In addition, East Goshen notifies neighboring townships of projects within East Goshen that may affect their residents, so that those Townships can notify their people if they chose to. Marty added that the Township has implemented a "Constant Contact" feature on the website so that any resident interested in various issues can sign up for notifications. Also, sending letters out is quite expensive these days and it would cost a fortune to notify every resident of every issue via letter. Marty then stated that the Hershey's Mill Master Association was notified of this issue, to rebut a claim that the Township did not let Hershey's Mill know.

Regarding the suggestion to put in baffles – Marty said the DEP indicated they do not want the Township to consider baffles.

Marty said he apologized to the residents who took his comments the wrong way and were offended. He stated that this dam project is yet another unfunded mandate from the government, and he does not enjoy being in such a difficult situation.

Carmen said he would vote to authorize up to \$100K of Township funds toward dam restoration and said he is willing to go to bat with the residents to save the dam. He said he believes the residents will work to raise the rest of the money. Carmen said he came into the meeting willing to vote for the Township to sign the NRCS agreement but after hearing the residents this evening he is willing to forego the grant money because he believes the residents will come through with funding.

Thom said he too wants to save the dam. He lived right near the dam in the 1960s and has many fond memories of time spent there. However, the Board has to be responsible to all the Township residents, not just those present this evening, and the Township simply cannot spend money it does not have. Thom said it would be irresponsible of the Board not to accept the grant money. He said he does, however, want to explore options for the dam before September 1.

Don thanked the residents for coming out and providing input. He noted the NRCS has provided little information on the ongoing costs for wetland work, maintenance, etc. once the dam is breached and therefore he cannot support accepting the grant. He noted the Township must still apply for a permit by the end of the year, and will need fully engineered drawings, so the Township must move quickly.

Joe said he has always tried to do what's best for all 17,000 residents in the Township. He said he believes the residents are committed to this cause, to raising the money, and to seeing this project through to the end. Joe said he planned to vote "No" on the grant.

Marty said he hoped the residents would leave the meeting this evening knowing the Board listens to its residents, and he hoped the residents show the same enthusiasm going forward as they demonstrated this evening. Marty said this is a difficult issue for him and he could argue either side. Marty said the Board members are elected and held accountable for their actions by the people. He said he is really torn on this issue, although since 3 Supervisors out of 5 indicated their plan to turn down the stimulus money his vote won't make a difference at this point. Marty said he thinks it best to authorize Rick Smith to execute the agreement to keep the Township's options alive. However, he is going to choose to accept the offer made by the residents to raise funds to restore the dam, bearing in mind there is not much time, which is quite troublesome to him. Marty said the Township must make a decision on an option in the next few months, and that is the issue that troubles him more than anything. Marty said he would choose to come down on the side of the residents, noting that the residents' task is to find sources of funding, be it public or private. He thanked all the residents for coming out this evening and providing input.

Carmen then thanked Marty for providing leadership on this difficult issue.

Don moved to authorize the Township Manager to send a letter to the NRCS advising them of the Board's decision not to proceed with the project. Joe seconded the motion.

Public Comment: Linda Gordon, 240 Line Road — Said she is concerned the Township has still not made a decision on the "fix" for this problem. She wondered how the residents, who cannot agree on a solution, can work together to raise such a significant amount of money. Ms. Gordon said she does not want the Board to turn down free money, and she is afraid that by doing so the rest of the residents will end up paying for the fix in the end.

Public Comment: Bill Egan, 1422 Mill Creek Drive — Said he agreed with Linda Gordon. He stated it will be a serious dereliction of fiscal responsibility for the Board not to keep its options open by signing the NRCS agreement.

Public Comment: Neil DeRiemer, 1034 Hershey Mill Road – Said there is no disagreement among the residents on what the fix should be. The residents want to preserve the dam as it exists today.

Public Comment: Howard Jones, 1048 Kennett Way – Said he hopes the residents do as they have promised and come up with the funding.

There was no further public comment or discussion among the Board. The Board voted 4:1 to approve the motion and not accept the NRCS grant money. (Thom was opposed.)

T-Mobile Variance Request for Utility Pole

T-Mobile was represented by Don Petrosa, Esq. Mr. Petrosa summarized his client's application for the Board. The Board then reviewed renderings provided by the applicant. Thom asked if T-Mobile could paint the pole green, and Mr. Petrosa said he did not know why not. Carmen said that after looking at T-Mobile's coverage map, he believed they would be back before the Board in the future to request more poles. Bryan Grebis, an RF engineer for T-Mobile, stated that they have no plans for additional poles in East Goshen at this time. Marty said if T-Mobile

is able to get a variance from the Zoning Hearing Board it would essentially render the Township's ordinance meaningless. Marty said T-Mobile's argument is that they have a hardship because PECO won't let them use one of their poles. Rick asked about putting an extension on the existing 24-ft pole. John Baptista of CMX Engineering said T-Mobile cannot do that because a 24-pole has a foundation which is only designed to support the 24 feet. Marty suggested that T-Mobile look for another site, perhaps somewhere along Paoli Pike.

Don moved to recommend the Zoning Hearing Board oppose the zoning variance application for T-Mobile who is seeking relief from the zoning ordinance to erect a wireless communications facility on a new 40-foot utility pole which would replace an existing 24-foot PECO guy pole within the right of way along N. Chester Road just north of the Boot Road and N. Chester Road intersection and directly behind the New Kent Apartment community. The Zoning Ordinance permits the use of existing utility poles in place since April 7, 1998 to be used for wireless communications facilities and allows extensions of up to 25 feet to a pole to meet this need. The ordinance does not allow for replacement of existing utility poles and granting of this variance will, in fact, amount to a change in the Township zoning ordinance. This replacement has not been permitted in the past and should not be allowed going forward.

Additionally, the applicant has not provided sufficient evidence to support a hardship and the Board believes the relief sought will alter the essential character of the neighborhood, i.e., present a detraction to the viewscape as one travels, especially north on N. Chester Road past the proposed facility. The Board of Supervisors authorizes the Township Solicitor to represent the Board at the Zoning Hearing Board meeting where this application will be discussed. Carmen seconded the motion. There was no further discussion or and no public comment. The Board voted unanimously to approve the motion.

Traditions Independent Living Facility in West Goshen

Marty announced that West Goshen will open a hearing on this issue at their meeting tomorrow, August 19. The hearing will be opened and continued until September 15. Representatives from Traditions are planning to come and speak at an East Goshen Planning Commission meeting and a Board of Supervisors meeting in the near future.

Public Comment: Keith Dickerson, 1212 Culbertson Circle – Said residents handed out flyers to alert folks of this issue. This issue was discussed at the West Goshen Planning Commission meeting last evening, but there were no representatives from Traditions there, and the Township could not speak on the applicant's behalf. Marty encouraged Mr. Dickerson to keep attending the meetings in West Goshen and to get his comments about the project on the record.

Public Comment: Mike Gallagher (West Goshen resident) — Said the issue of widening Boot Road was brought up at the meeting last evening. Marty said the East Goshen Board is not in favor of widening the road.

Marty asked if the Culbertson Circle residents have selected an attorney to represent them, and the residents told him yes. Marty suggested they look into whether or not they have a "right" to sunshine since the Traditions project would not doubt block some sunshine from their properties.

The residents thanked the Board for their time.

Correspondence & Reports of Interest

Marty acknowledged receipt of the following:

- Fire Marshal and Goshen Fire Company reports for July 2009 as well as the 2009 EMS Year-To-Date statistics.
- Letter from Site Engineering Concepts, LLC informing the Township that Matthew and Christine Mullen of 1645 East Strasburg Road will be applying for an individual NPDES permit.
- Letter from Verizon regarding a rate increase for their FIOS TV Premier service.

Meetings and Dates of Importance

Marty noted the upcoming meetings as listed in the agenda.

Public Comment

None.

Adjournment

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:20pm.

WORKSHOP (Resumed)

Damage to Forrest Lane Bridge

The Board authorized the Township Solicitor to pursue action against an individual who lost control of his vehicle on the Forrest Lane Bridge on June 10 and caused \$18,608 worth of damage, so that the Township can attempt to recover the expenses incurred in repairing the bridge.

Visiting Nurses

Don will send Joe Gill an email outlining the information the Board wants him to get from the Visiting Nurses.

No Swimming Signs

Rick said the signs have come in and will be posted at the Hershey's Mill dam tomorrow.

Metered Billing Update

Don said the team is waiting for the rest of the data from Aqua. They should have it by early September. The analysis should be done by the end of September. A letter will go out to the residents soon after the election.

Township Newsletter

The concensus of the Board was to continue publishing the Township newsletter four times per year.

Re: Solid Waste Questions

When the Board adopted the ordinance on January 4, 2016 prohibiting the placement of dumpsters and leaves on a public street the Board raised some questions. My findings are as follows:

Where should residents place their trash cans, recycling containers and yard waste?

The Solid Waste Ordinance (Chapter 194) prohibits the placement of municipal waste and recyclables upon any street, highway or gutter, in the Township. Section 194-3C reads as follows: It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit, dump, spill, throw, place or bury or permit another to deposit, dump, spill, throw, place or bury in or upon any parcel of land, lot, street, highway, gutter or in any alley or in any water or stream or ditch within the limits of the Township any municipal, bulk or hazardous wastes or recyclable materials or construction debris. This provision does not preclude a property owner from temporarily storing these materials for a short period of time, generally less than one week, on his property prior to collection or disposal.

The Solid Waste Ordinance stipulates that recyclable materials, municipal waste and leaf waste be placed at the curb for collection. Section 194-4A reads as follows: All recyclable materials from residences in the Township shall be separated from the municipal waste and placed at the curb for collection by the municipal waste contractor. Similar language appears inSection 194-5A regarding municipal waste and Section 194-7 regarding leaf waste.

The Solid Waste Ordinance does not define the term "curb", although the <u>Merriam Webster Dictionary</u> defines curb as "a raised edging (as of stone or concrete) along a paved street" and this is consistent with how the term is used and illustrations in the Subdivision Ordinance (Chapter 205).

The Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction Act (Act 101 of 1988) requires persons to separate recyclable materials and leaf waste and place them at the "curbside" for collection. The Act does not define the term "curbside".

Conclusion - Reading the above collectively it would seem that residents should place their municipal waste, recyclables, and yard waste on the lawn immediately behind the curb for collection or if there is no curb on the lawn area just off the edge of the paved roadway.

When can a resident place their trash cans, recycling containers and yard waste materials out for collection?

In 2008 the Board amended the Solid Waste Ordinance with the addition of Section 194-6E a result of complaints about residents leaving their trash cans at the curb for extended periods of time.

Section 194.6E reads as follows: Trash cans, trash bags, bulk trash, leaf bags, leaf waste and recycling bins shall not be placed at the curb for collection before noon of the day immediately preceding the scheduled collection day. All municipal waste containers (trash cans) and recycling bins shall be removed from the curb no later than 8:00 a.m. on the day immediately succeeding the scheduled collection day.

The Board also requested I look into the possibility of allowing contractors to obtain a permit to place a dumpster on the street like they do in Malvern Borough.

Malvern Borough allows for the placement of a dumpster on public thoroughfares upon issuance of a permit from the Code Enforcement Official. The dumpster must be protected with flashing lights and covered at all times. The fee is \$35 (10 days) then \$15 a day for each additional day. On a side note Malvern also requires a permit to place a dumpster in a front yard or on the lawn.

I spoke to Mark Miller, who expressed concerns about damage to the public street and motorists running into dumpsters. He also noted that they would be one more thing to contend with during snow removal.

I spoke to Mark Gordon and he noted that since last spring the reroofing permits we issue contain a note that reads "NO DUMPSTERS ON THE ROADWAY- ON PRIVATE PROPERTY ONLY". While some contractors have complained, they have been able to complete their project without putting a dumpster on the street.

In closing I would add that in Malvern and West Chester it is not uncommon to see a dumpster occupying a parking space in front of a building being renovated, since these buildings do not have a driveway. However, I am not aware of any properties on a public street in East Goshen that would not be able to place a dumpster in either their driveway or at some other location on their property.

Accordingly, I would recommend that the Board does not implement a program to allow for the placement of dumpsters on public streets.

Recommendation 3.5A from the Parks, Recreation and Open Space Plan called for the Township to develop an on-line registration system that will accept credit card payments. Technically, we already have a way for people to register and pay for classes and activities online, using a very simple method whereby registrants complete a fillable PDF (which can be emailed to Brian in two clicks via an Adobe server) and then click another link that takes them to our Municipay page. Last year, we received 82 online registrations/payments totaling about \$13,000 for Park & Recreation programs in this manner, out of about 1,100 registrations or \$97,000 all total.

A payment portal would provide the following benefits:

- Ease-of-use and convenience for registrants. Registrants would also know in real-time which programs are full, avoiding misunderstandings and refunds.
- Streamlined back-office processing. For example, a portal that's linked to AMS would require substantially less data entry than occurs now. Currently, staff spends 1-4 hours per week dealing with problems with paper registrations; this work would be eliminated with a portal.
- Lists of participants can be generated in real time, which assists Jason in program logistics. For example, if a parent signs a child up for summer camp on a Sunday night through the portal, they would be on the participant list on Monday morning.

There appear to be no Chester County municipalities that have payment portals for P&R programs, although there are a handful of PA municipalities outside of Chester County, such as Radnor, Lower Merion and Doylestown, that do. Many payment portals are intended for municipalities or organizations (e.g. YMCA, ACAC, etc) with their own multi-purpose recreation center and youth sports leagues, and are therefore not designed for our range of recreation options.

Nevertheless, Jason and I agree that a payment portal could improve the registration process for both registrants and Township staff. We spoke with five vendors about this product, as summarized below.

We would recommend AMS, which would offer the lowest cost, plus seamless integration with our financial software (which AMS also provides).

One deterrent to the use of the payment portal is the convenience fee charged by the credit card processor (the greater of 2.45% or \$3), which we pass on to registrants. Because it is easier for the

Township to manage Recreation programs through the portal, both staff and the Park and Recreation Commission agree that it would be appropriate to increase program fees, including pavilion rental fees, by \$5 across the board in order to cover the cost of the convenience fee, plus the estimated per user cost of the portal itself. The table below provides a break out of estimated costs per user, including convenience fees, which shows that the portal and convenience fee work out to approximately \$4.55 per registrant.

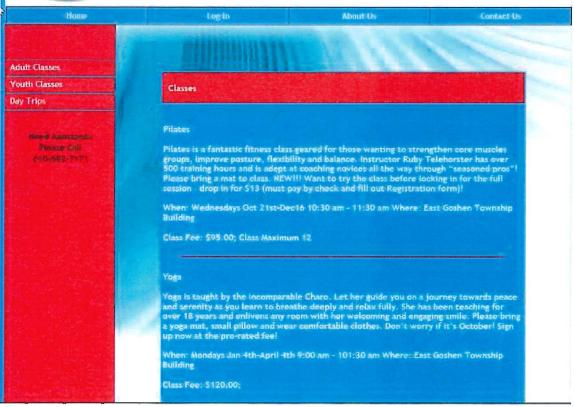
Even with a \$5 per program increase, our camp programs would compare very favorably on price to other area camps. For example, our half-day camp would cost \$90/week, compared to \$180 for a week of half-day camp at the YMCA and \$210 for a week of half-day camp at ACAC.

I have attached some PDFs of a rough mock-up of the AMS portal.

Suggested motion: I move that we contract with AMS for a Parks & Recreation payment portal and that we increase all participant recreation program and pavilion rental fees by \$5 to offset the cost of the portal and associated convenience fees.



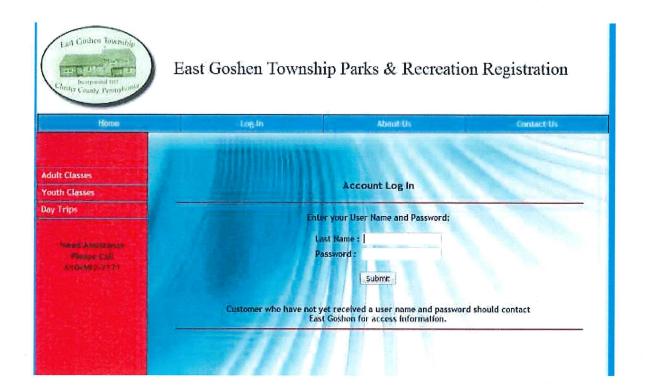
East Goshen Township Parks & Recreation Registration





East Goshen Township Parks & Recreation Registration

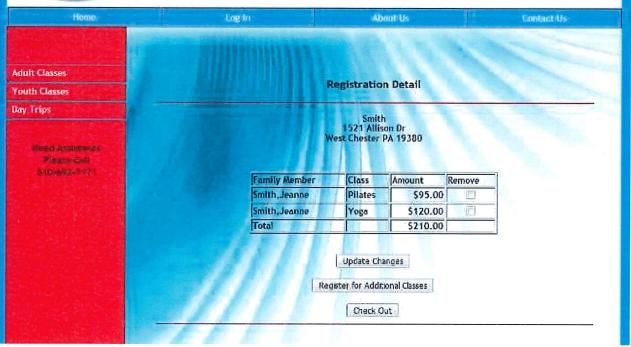

At your meeting on January 4, 2016, the Board of Supervisors approved a reduction in the Performance Guarantee of \$8,640, leaving a balance of \$1,360. I advised K Hov that the balance of the funds are to be retained until such time as the disturbed areas are in the condition that existed before their contractor undertook the repair work to the basin.

I am in receipt of a check from K Hov payable to the Township in the amount of \$1,360 and they want to replace the surety bond with a cash bond.

I would recommend that the Board deposit the check and hold it until such time as the grass is established. From a practical perspective we are better off with cash in hand as opposed to trying to collect on a surety bond.

Suggested Motion: I move that we approve the replacement of the surety bond with a cash bond. The check in the amount of \$1,360 shall be deposited into the Township escrow account and these monies will be retained until such time as the grass in the disturbed areas on the basin is in the condition that existed before the contractor undertook the repair work.

At their meeting on January 4, 2016, the Board of Supervisors approved a reduction in the Performance Guarantee of \$8,640, leaving a balance of \$1,360. It was noted that while the turf on has improved, there are still bare areas, and it is not in the condition that existed before your contractor undertook the repair work to the basin. The amount being withheld is based on a proposal obtained from the Hershey's Mill Homeowners Landscape Division.

As you know, this retention basin is not being dedicated to the Township, and as such K. Hovnanian is not required to post a Maintenance Bond.

Accordingly, the Hershey's Mill Master Association has expressed concerns to the Board of Supervisors that they would be "on the hook" so to speak, for any costs incurred by their landscape contractor in the event the bare areas do not fill in. Call to order & Pledge of Allegiance:

Senya called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and asked Candace Mulhulland to lead the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moment of Silence:

Carmen called for a moment of silence to honor the members of the military who keep us safe both locally and abroad, and to honor those who have given the ultimate of their lives in defense of our nation.

Recording of Meeting: Candace Mulhulland, reporter with *The Daily Local News*, was present and recording the meeting.

Chairman's Report:

a. Senya announced that the Board met in Executive Session on January 19, 2016 to discuss a personnel matter.

b. Senya announced that Christian Middleton has resigned as Tax Collector effective February 1, 2016.

c. Senya announced that on February 23, 2016, a Public Meeting will be held where representatives from Sunoco will give an update on the status of the Mariner 2 project.

Malvern Fire Company Report: Rick commented that there were 10 fire incidents for December, 2015 in East Goshen Township, and 531 EMS incidents for all of 2015 for East Goshen Township. Rick estimated that this figure represents about 20 % of the total Malvern Fire Company EMS incidents.

New Business:

a. Consider Escrow Release for Goshen Meadows: Carmen motioned to release \$697,503.00 from the Goshen Meadow's escrow account for the following portions: Site prep, erosion controls, earthwork, storm sewers, stormwater basins, and sanitary sewers, water line, parking lot construction and miscellaneous. The total remaining in escrow will be \$423,239.78 including \$193,597.63 in the contingency line. Marty seconded. The Board voted unanimously in favor of the motion.

b.
