June 4 review – Estimated 300 people attended. There was good feedback from the artisans. It was good to have the kids in a separate area. Dolls 36 were a hit. There my be an event in October on a Saturday because there was a com-37 38 ment that the felt dolls would make cute ornaments, so we could sell them. Special 39 thanks to the Public Works Department for their invaluable help. They came early to set 40 up the tents and were very helpful. Next year have bottled water for sale. Kathryn suggested that the day be called Living History Day/ Artisan Fair. 41 42 43 Historic Preservation Ordinance – Chris provided copies of the current ordinance. Chapter 240 Article VI (240.6) has the definition of class 1 & 2 Historic Resources. 44 45 Mark Gordon read the Comprehensive Plan comments and objectives - Resource Pro-46 tection Plan. Chris commented that lately there have been some requests to take properties off the list. 47

- 1 Jeannine mentioned that general observation of the East Goshen ordinance compared
- 2 to others is that it is solid and simple. More municipalities are combining Class 1 & 2.
- 3 She suggested that East Goshen do the same because the ordinance doesn't treat the
- 4 two classes differently. The procedures for addition or subtraction of resources are be-
- 5 ing challenged. A lot of municipalities are discussing how to handle historic resources
- 6 that are falling into disrepair and should be demolished (demolition by neglect). Re-
- 7 sources can be mothballed for 10-20 years as long as they are maintained. Allowing
- 8 additional use of a resource (shop, lawyers office etc.) can help generate income to help
- 9 maintain the resource. She suggested some ordinances to look at. Kennett Township
- 10 has started an "At Risk" property list where the Historic Commission works with the
- owner. They also have a program where they acknowledge the people who are main-
- taining a Historic Resource. They are starting to see teardowns, which are impacting
- the properties around them. Historic Impact Studies are part of all Historic Ordinances.
- 14 She recommended a person who will do a seminar for the HC and provide grant infor-
- 15 mation. She commented that a historic resource should be identified as such on sub-
- division plans and the Historic Commission should review those plans. She saw in the
- 17 Solar part of the East Goshen ordinance that a historic resource can't have a solar array
- on it. She feels this should be reconsidered.
- 19 Ed provided a map showing the construction dates of the primary roads in East Goshen.

NEW BUSINESS

Mark explained what DAS (distributed antennas) is and mentioned that Andy Ralf will be at the August 3, 2016 Planning Commission meeting to discuss this.
