Monthly Flows:

The average daily flow to West Goshen was 680,000.

Meters:

Meters were read on a daily basis. The portable meters are installed and they are being read weekly. The permanent meters were calibrated on December 9th.

C.C. Collection:

It was rather busy on Thanksgiving; we had a sewer blockage at 28 Lochwood Lane. We received a call from the 911 center that a resident's sewer backed up into their house and that Roto Rooter was on scene reporting that the Township's system was blocked. When I arrived I was met by Roto Rooter who said that they made several attempts to clear the sewer main but were unsuccessful. When our men arrived we jetted the main line which was full of roots. We also found that the manhole was a drop manhole and that the drop was partially collapsed. Since we backed up the sewage into the house; Belfor was called to take care of sensitizing the basement. On November 28th we excavated the sewer line due to the depth and the condition of the drop, we chose to abandon the outside drop and we installed a new drop inside the manhole. We plugged the old drop and filled it with concrete. I have attached some pictures if the repair.

We had a problem at Hershey Mill Pump Station when the muffin monster tripped out and caused the main to back-up. The crew happened to be working around the corner when the problem occurred so there is minimal carry over. In both instances I contacted DEP to report the carry over. While installing the temporary meters we found a broken sewer lateral with 10 to 15 thousand gallons of infiltration. We also spent two days clearing the sewer right of way in Supplee Valley.

R.C. Collection: We have completed the re-building of the Hunt Country Pump Station

(Pictures Attached).

R.C. Plant: We are in the process of building a storage building for the soda ash.

Dutchland had been in to make the repairs to the SBR. The sludge pump was pulled in SBR1; the pump is not worth re-building so it was replaced

with a spare.


INI Repairs: 12 sewer cap replacements after residents called about caps missing.

PA One Calls: We received 68 Pa One calls November.









Invoices

• Invoices with summaries are provided under separate cover.

Ridley Creek Sewage Treatment Plant (RCSTP)

- The NPDES Permit expires on February 28, 2017. The permit renewal application was finalized and submitted to PADEP on August 31, 2016. No changes to the existing permit are proposed. (No update since last report).
- We continued the evaluation of alternatives for automated alkalinity chemical feed systems
 to eliminate manual feeding and carrying bags up the exterior steps, including tank sizing
 and chemical cost analyses. The preferred alternative is a change to caustic soda from the
 current soda ash treatment. An updated summary letter and discussion will be provided at
 the December MA meeting.
- We met with Dutchland at the RCSTP about repairs to address the peeling at the top of the CIM coating in SBR #3 and the need to re-patch the lifting anchor holes throughout the entire SBR deck. Dutchland performed the repairs thereafter. However, during the follow-up inspection, additional bubbles in the coating were identified lower on the walls in SBR #3. This bubbling is more extensive than in the other SBR tanks, and we are coordinating with Dutchland on a repair.

Reservoir Road Pump Station

- PADEP issued the State Water Obstruction and Encroachment Permit for the pump station site and Chester Creek utility crossing in June 2016; however, they are requiring a separate federal authorization by the Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE). We coordinated with both PADEP and ACOE on this additional review in July and are still awaiting feedback. (No update since last report).
- We revised the NPDES plans and permit application to address CCCD's and DEP's latest comments and resubmitted to CCCD on November 23, 2016.

EGMA 1601

- The Water Quality Management (WQM) Permit application was submitted to PADEP on April 13, 2016. They have informally notified us that they have no comments and are prepared to issue the WQM Permit once the aforementioned NPDES Permit is issued. (No update since last report).
- We previously prepared the front end of the bid document and Division 01 specification sections, including a draft Bid Form. The Bid Form needs to be finalized. Technical specifications were already prepared as part of the WQM Permit application. The full bid document will be completed, assembled, and forwarded to the Township upon receipt of the three remaining permits. (No update since last report).
- We will complete a listing of the permits, expiration dates, and renewal deadlines once the
 three remaining permits are issued. We anticipate including that listing in future Engineer's
 Reports to track the permit statuses. (No update since last report).

RCSTP and Pump Stations' O&M Manual

• We are continuing to add information as provided by the Township as follow-up to our October 5th review meeting with Mark Miller.

White Chimneys Manhole Replacement

 No activity since the last report. We will provide assistance as requested by the Township during construction.

Semi-Annual I&I Reports

 We evaluated apparent inconsistencies in the overall Chester Creek subbasin flows (as metered at the Westtown Way meter) between meter data, averages provided by East Goshen, and billing records from West Goshen. We will discuss with the PW Department to resolve.

Sunoco Pipeline

• No activity since the last report. Sunoco previously agreed to add a condition to the approval letter they are requesting from East Goshen that they (Sunoco) will physically locate the Ashbridge PS force main at the proposed pipeline crossing location and that an East Goshen representative must be present when any work is done near the force main. We had also coordinated with them on a potential conflict with the proposed Reservoir Road PS force main, but there has not yet been a resolution to our knowledge.

New Connections

- 3 & 5 School Lane We reviewed another set of revised plans and calculations for the proposed 2-lot grinder pump system, and we found the design to be acceptable.
- 1420 E. Strasburg Road, Brakman Property We reviewed revised plans for the proposed 3-lot grinder pump system, as proposed for development by Brandolini, and provided comments. A review meeting with the developer, Township staff, and Pennoni is scheduled for December 14, 2016.

EGMA 1601

• 1680 E. Boot Road, Knauer Property – We reviewed a proposed plan for construction of a gravity sewer lateral to service a building addition. We anticipate comments will be issued by December 12, 2016.

DCED Small Water & Sewer Program Grant

• The Township submitted a grant application for the installation of three permanent gravity sewer flow meters in October. The grant agency, the Commonwealth Financing Authority, is scheduled to award grants in March 2017.

West Goshen Sewer System Consultation

• We attended the first regular WGSA Municipal Partners Meeting on November 22, 2016.



Executive Summary

The Ridley Creek sewage treatment plant outfall 001 achieved compliance with the NPDES discharge permit during October 2016. Discharge to Applebrook was discontinued during October and November. Chemical usage utilized for total phosphorus removal, pH and total alkalinity remained consistent with previous months. Inspection of SBR 3 was completed with repairs schedule for early December. No mechanical or operational issues were observed during operation of sludge dewatering equipment.

Treatment Process Operation

During October 2016, there were no exceedances of the final effluent discharge limitations for outfall 001. Additional TSS samples were collected twice per week to allow for a means to calculate a weekly average. The total phosphorus monthly average had a concentration of 0.18 mg/L as compared to the permitted limitation of 0.50 mg/L. Table 1 illustrates the final effluent composite sample data reported for the September 2016 eDMR. During the month, the final effluent total phosphorus concentration discharged ranged from <0.10 to 0.35 mg/L.

Table 4 presents the available Outfall 001 final effluent data for the month of November 2016. During October, the presence of foam conditions on the surface of the SBRs began to increase with foam concentrations ranging from 30% to 60% of the area.

During October, there are no exceedances of the permitted limitations for Outfall 001. There was no discharge from outfall 002. Split sampling of the composite sample collected by Applied Laboratory Services (ALS) is ongoing for comparative analysis and daily results.

The influent wastewater pollutant concentrations and loading entering the wastewater treatment facility remained within the design concentrations. Composite samples are collected at the influent doghouse manhole and influent wet well. The influent flow meter reading is collected from the influent flow meter located prior to the Screening Building, excluding the internal recycle flows.

Table 5 presents the available pollutant data for the influent wastewater collected at the doghouse manhole during October 2016.

Sequencing batch reactors (SBRs) numbered 1, 2 and 4 were in service during October and November. Process monitoring of each SBR included ammonia as N, nitrite as N, Nitrate as N, COD, SSV, MLSS and total phosphorus. Daily analysis of the final effluent flow equalization grab sample is total phosphorus is ongoing. Sample collection and analysis of the influent wastewater collected at the influent pump station wet well is ongoing.

Addition of aluminum sulfate solution to the SBRs to assist with phosphorus removal continued. The volume of aluminum sulfate solution to the SBRs decreased to from 69.7 gpd to 68.5 gpd. Soda ash daily addition decreased from 435 lbs./day to 397 lbs./day. Soda ash assists towards maintaining SBR pH concentrations above 7.0 standard units and assists to replenish alkalinity consumed during the nitrification process and aluminum sulfate solution addition.

SBR No. 3 remains out of service as a treatment unit. The SBR is scheduled to be returned to service on December 15th.

During November, sludge wasting to the sludge holding tanks and decanting of the sludge holding tanks was ongoing. Process monitoring included pH, total alkalinity and total solids.

Sludge holding tank No. 1 was in service. The level at the beginning of the month was 13.48 feet and the level at the end of the month was 10.1 feet. Zero (0) gallons of supernatant were decanted during the month. Three hundred (300) pounds of soda ash were added. The average pH concentration was measured as 6.64 S.U., average total alkalinity measured as 173 mg/l and average total solids concentration measured as 0.93%.



Sludge holding tank No. 2 was in service. The level at the beginning of the month was 6.95 feet and the level at the end of the month was 11.48 feet. Zero (0) gallons of supernatant were decanted during the month. Three hundred (300) pounds of soda ash were added. The average pH concentration was measured as 6.95 S.U., average total alkalinity measured as 248 mg/l and average total solids concentration measured as 0.58%.

Significant Storm/Hydraulic Loading Events

During November, there were three (3) storm event resulting in a daily precipitation amount equal to or greater than 0.5 inches measured during a 24 hour period. A total of 3.32 inches of rainfall were measured during the month. These events occurred on:

November 9th: 0.46 inches
 November 29th: 1.19 inches
 November 30th: 1.47 inches

Plant operations were adjusted to manage the precipitation to prevent exceedances of the permitted discharge limitations for Outfall 001. Adjustments included reading aeration minutes per cycle, extending decant minutes per cycle and reducing settling times. The facility experienced several filled decant cycles during the rain events.

The full bid document will be completed, assembled, and forwarded to the Township upon receipt of the three remaining permits.

We will complete a listing of the permits, expiration dates, and renewal deadlines once the three remaining permits are issued. We anticipate including that listing in future Engineer's Reports to track the permit statuses.

RCSTP and Pump Stations' O&M Plan

We are continuing to add information as provided by the Township as follow up to our October 5th review meeting with Mark Miller.

White Chimneys and Cornwallis Drive Manhole Lining

Work has been completed. It is our understanding that the contractor has submitted invoice(s).

White Chimneys Manhole Replacement

No activity since the last report. We will provide assistance as requested by the Township during construction.

Semi-Annual I&I Reports

No activity since the last report.

Sunoco Pipeline

No activity since last report. Sunoco previously agreed to add a condition to the approval letter they are requesting from East Goshen that they (Sunoco) will physically locate the Ashbridge PS force main at the proposed pipeline crossing location and that an East Goshen representative must be present when any work is done near the force main. We have also coordinated with them on a potential conflict with the proposed Reservoir Road PS force main, but there has not yet been a resolution to our knowledge.

New Connections

We reviewed revised plans and calculations for the proposed grinder pump system at 3 & 5 School Lane, and we provided outstanding comments to the design consultant and Township.

DCED Small Water & Sewer Program Grant

We coordinated scope and prepared a cost estimate for the installation of three permanent gravity sewer flow meters for the Township to include in their grant application.

3. Big Fish Environmental Services — Scott's report for October showed that the Ridley Creek sewage treatment plant outfall 001 achieved compliance with the NPDES discharge permit during September 2016. Discharge to Applebrook was discontinued during September as a result of a pump issue and remained out of service during October. Chemical usage utilized for total phosphorus removal, pH and total alkalinity remained consistent with previous months. No mechanical or operational issues were observed during operation of sludge dewatering equipment.

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

- c. McCloskey is the owner of 734 Peach Tree Drive, East Goshen Township, Chester County, Pennsylvania, UPI# 53-4-438 (the "McCloskey Property").
- d. A sanitary sewer line currently exists on Peach Tree Drive (the "Sanitary Sewer Line").
- e. Both the Vaughan Property and the McCloskey Property are connected to the Sanitary Sewer Line.

- g. Knauer desires to install two (2) sewer laterals (the "Knauer Laterals") through both the Vaughan Property and McCloskey Property in the Easement Area, one to service the existing home on the Knauer Property the second for use if Knauer desires to subdivide the Knauer Property.
- h. In order to connect the Knauer Laterals, for the Knauer Property, it is necessary for Knauer to obtain a sanitary sewer easement over both the Vaughan Property and the McCloskey Property, as depicted in Exhibit "B" hereto (the "Easement Area").

To construct, reconstruct, replace, remove, enlarge, inspect, operate, repair, make connections with and maintain perpetually Knauer Laterals and their accessories and appurtenances, as described in Exhibit A-1 for the Vaughan Property and Exhibit A-2 for the McCloskey Property hereto (the "Sewage Easement") and depicted in Exhibit "B" hereto, Exhibits A-1, A-2 and B are incorporated herein by reference as if set forth herein at length.
- b. To carry away and dispose of sewage through said Knauer Laterals to the Sanitary Sewer Line.
- c. To have and to hold the same perpetually to Knauer, their heirs, executors, successors or assigns, together with the right and privilege at any and all times to enter the said Sewage Easement, or any part thereof, provided that Knauer provide to both Vaughan and McCloskey, reasonable advance notification of the nature of any intended work on the premises and the expected duration of such work, for the purpose of reconstructing, replacing, removing, enlarging, inspecting, operating, repairing, maintaining, and/or making connections with the Knauer Laterals or other appropriate means of access to the Knauer Laterals all upon the condition that Knauer will at all times during the reconstruction, replacement, removal, repair or maintenance of the sewer line cause every reasonable means to be used to protect from injury or damage all property, including lawns, trees, shrubbery, fences, buildings, walls, roads, water courses, natural features, or any existing improvement thereto, and will at all times after doing any work in connection with the construction, reconstruction, replacement, removal, repair or maintenance of the Knauer Laterals, cause the said premises to be restored to the condition in which the same were found before such work was undertaken, including replacement and/or repair of damaged property, to the extent reasonably possible under the circumstances and consistent with the rights and



John O'Connell purchased a building lot at 1668 East Boot and has a permit to construct a new house. The approved plan calls for the house to be served by an on-lot system. A permit has been issued by the CCHD.

Mr. O'Connell would like to connect the new house to the public sewer system, however in order to do so he would need to obtain an easement across one of the lots in Clocktower. To date he has been unsuccessful in obtaining an easement.

Dave Ludin owns the property at 1670 East Boot Road and his property is served by public sewer. In 1995 Mrs. Hankin granted the former owner of 1670 an easement across lots 348 and 358 in the Clocktower subdivision. The easement allows for the installation of a six inch sewer line to provide sewer service to one single family dwelling. The former owner installed a four inch line and connected the house to the sewer.

Apparently, Mr. Ludin is willing to allow Mr. O'Connell to utilize his sewer line to provide sewer service for Mr. O'Connell's new house.

Mr. O'Connell will attend your meeting to discuss the possible connection to the sewer system.

Issues to be resolved:

- Ludin easement is limited to one single family house. Need to amend easement.
- Maintenance responsibilities with two houses on a four inch line. When we sewered Ashbridge, we had a few places where we installed a six inch line with a clean out to provide service to two homes. However, the Township is responsible for maintenance of the six inch line.
- The Township Code requires a separate building sewer to each building unless the Township or Authority Engineer determines it to be impractical.

SANITARY SEWER EASEMENT AGREEMENT

This Sanitary Sewer Easement Agreement is made this and day of ONON, 1995, by and between Henrietta Hankin, 717 Constitution Drive, Eagleview Corporate Center, Post Office Box 562, Exton, PA 19341 ("Grantor") and William Wade ("Grantee").

BACKGROUND

Grantor is the owner of certain real property situate in

1. Grant of Fasement. Grantor hereby grants and conveys to Grantee, his heirs, successors and assigns, an easement within the shaded area on lots 348 and 358 as depicted on a plan of "20 Foot Sanitary Sewer Easement" prepared by Landward Engineers, dated September 29, 1995, attached hereto as Exhibit "A" ("Easement"), for the purpose of installing,

constructing and maintaining a six inch sewer lateral ("Lateral") to provide sanitary sewer service for one single family dwelling. Construction of Lateral. The Lateral shall be installed in strict conformity with the rules and regulations of East Goshen Township, or such municipal authority or public utility that has jurisdiction over the provision of sanitary sewer service (collectively "Township") and shall connect Grantee's property abutting Clocktower Woods to the sanitary sewer mains to be installed in Clock Tower Drive. 
