Monthly Flows:

The average daily flow to West Goshen was 804,000 gallons per day.

Meters:

Meters were read on a daily basis; The Ellis Lane meter went down for two weeks due to the modem failure, Sue spent many pain staking hours trying to get Verizon to fix the problem. Allied Control finally had Verizon follow thru with the new sim cards to get the modem up and running again. The portable flow meters are still in place and being read weekly.

C.C. Collection:

The pump stations were visited on a regular basis with no problems to report. The wet wells were cleaned by an outside contractor; the grit was taken to DELCORA for disposal. We replaced to castings and lids in Hershey Mill Estates. We had two sewer lateral repairs to replace traps and cleanouts.

Invoices

Ridley Creek Sewage Treatment Plant (RCSTP)

- Caustic soda pilot study
 - We met with Mark Miller and John Laidley (controls contractor) on May 9 and determined the controls and electrical systems for the caustic soda chemical feed pump pilot study as well as options for the configuration of a future, permanent caustic feed system. It is our understanding that an electric line was run and an outlet installed at the location of the proposed pilot study feed pump after the meeting.
 - Coyne Chemical and Big Fish performed jar testing on May 23. According to Big Fish, one sample was taken from SBR #4 during the React phase, and 25% caustic soda was added until it reached a pH of 7.0. Alkalinity could not be tested due to problems with the titration equipment. Coyne estimated that the entire plant will need 1.75 GPD of 25% caustic soda based on a flow of 350,000 GPD. However, we had expected the demand to be around 125 GPD based on the current amount of soda ash being used. We are coordinating with Coyne and Big Fish to resolve this discrepancy and to determine an initial feed rate and quantity of caustic soda required for the pilot study.
 - We had selected a chemical feed pump for the Township to acquire for the pilot study based upon our expected 125 GPD demand to pump at approximately 0.3 GPM (17.6 gallons/hr) during the Fill stage only. The spare LMI pump at the plant is only rated for 1 gallon/hr.
 - A pilot study sampling plan has been requested from Big Fish.
 - The intent is still to tap the SBR influent pipe and install the system upon resolution of the chemical feed amount and feed pump selection. The pilot study is expected to be run for 3-4 weeks. Our goal is to begin the pilot study in June.
- SBR tanks CIM coatings
 - O We have researched the SBR tanks' CIM coating bubbling and peeling issues further and have continued coordination with Dutchland. The coating was installed by Dutchland in July-August 2009 and had a 10-year warranty, so it is therefore still under warranty. We are reviewing the warranty document to revisit conditions and if there is an extended period of coverage.
 - O Background The concrete wall panels were precast and pre-stressed, and the walls were post-tensioned. There were hairline cracks that occurred in the walls of the structure allowing some liquid to penetrate through the walls causing concern that it would eventually corrode the rebar and cause spalling. Dutchland originally attempted to coat the cracks with a cementious Sika product that quickly cracked when loaded. They next attempted to grind out each crack and fill it with a Sika 1A / Sikaflex caulk material which also failed under loading. At that point, they proposed coating the interior of the wall with CIM under the premise that the material would remain flexible and not crack and fail under loading, although this is not a traditional application for CIM. Prior to the issues with the cracks in the walls, Dutchland used

Sika on the joints between the precast walls and poured in place floor slab. They also used it on the saw cut expansion joints in the floor slab.

The CIM applied to the joint between the floor slab and the wall and along the expansion joint in the floor was applied by Dutchland personal. The CIM coatings on the walls were applied by Dutchland's subcontractor, CIM East Coast. It is our understanding that CIM East Coast was an authorized supplier and installer by the CIM manufacturer. They employed quality control for the application of the CIM coating on the walls that appeared to be stringent per our observations. For example, the material was only applied at night due to temperature and UV concerns, and they used wet mill gauges to check the thicknesses.

To-date, we have not observed any spalling of concrete. Our expectation is that the coating deterioration observed up to this point can continue to be spot repaired, but the ultimate repair once the coating reaches the end of its useful life will be to completely remove and replace with a new coating, possibly a different material.

Reservoir Road Pump Station

- PADEP issued the State Water Obstruction and Encroachment Permit for the pump station site and Chester Creek utility crossing in June 2016; however, they are requiring a separate federal authorization by the Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE). Due to lack of coordination between PADEP and ACOE, we have had to initiate an application process directly with the ACOE. The ACOE provided lengthy comments and questions on May 5, 2017, including items outside the scope of the Chester Creek encroachment permit application before them such as work at the Ridley Creek, that we are in the process of addressing. We have discussed the comments and our responses on several occasions thereafter with the ACOE reviewer, Dave Caplan. Due to the amount of time that has passed since permitting work was initially performed on this project, certain timeframes have expired since PADEP issued their permit in June 2016 including wetland delineations, PNDI environmental review, and the USFWS bog turtle habitat study approval. We have therefore performed limited field work to revisit the wetland delineations (no changes observed), prepare new wetland field notes requested by ACOE, ran a new PNDI search, and made a new submission to USFWS to re-approve the bog turtle study and proposed exclusionary measures. We are awaiting a response from USFWS. We are meeting with Mr. Caplan at the site on June 19 per his request. We expect that some plan and permit application revisions will be needed following the meeting.
- The bid document will be finalized and submitted upon receipt of the remaining ACOE permit.
- We will complete a listing of the permits, expiration dates, and renewal deadlines once the ACOE permit is issued.

RCSTP and Pump Stations' O&M Manual

We researched 12 boxes of historical plans, design information, permits, and correspondence, amongst other things, from the Township. We also performed a field visit to the recently upgraded Hunt Country Pump Station to obtain equipment information, and we contacted vendors to obtain additional equipment information. The Manual has been updated to address the research, add Hunt Country Pump Station information, and incorporate comments from Mark Miller. An updated copy of the Manual has been submitted to the Township for review with a list of items and information needed to complete the document.

Executive Summary

The Ridley Creek sewage treatment plant outfall 001 achieved compliance with the permitted discharge limitations during the month of April 2017. Discharge to Applebrook remained off line. Chemical usage utilized for total phosphorus removal, pH and total alkalinity remained consistent with previous months. No mechanical or operational issues were observed during operation of sludge dewatering equipment or SBR treatment process.

Treatment Process Operation

The treatment process monitoring and adjustments resulted in compliance with the final effluent discharge limitations for outfall 001. Collection of additional TSS samples continued during the month to assist with a means to calculate a weekly average. These additional samples provide more representative data of the typical water quality discharged on a regular basis as compared to any elevated individual discharge concentration.

The total phosphorus monthly average was reported as 0.22 mg/L as compared to the permitted limitation of 0.50 mg/L. Total phosphorus discharge concentrations ranged from 0.18 to 0.28 mg/L. The ammonia as nitrogen monthly concentration was reported as 0.254 mg/L as compared to the permit discharge limitation of 2.5 mg/L. The ammonia as N weekly maximum was 0.359 mg/L. The total suspended solids (TSS) monthly concentration was reported as 7 mg/L as compared to the permit discharge limitation of 10 mg/L. The weekly maximum concentration was 8 mg/L as compared to the permit discharge limitation of 15 mg/L.

Table 1 illustrates the final effluent composite sample data reported for the April 2017 eDMR. Discharge to Applebrook, Outfall 002, remained discontinued during and May will remain off line until approximately June 2017.

The monthly average influent wastewater pollutant concentrations and loading entering the wastewater treatment facility remained within the design concentrations. Composite samples are collected at the influent doghouse manhole and influent wet well. The influent flow meter reading is collected from the influent flow meter located prior to the Screening Building, excluding the internal recycle flows.

Table 2 presents the available pollutant data for the influent wastewater collected at the doghouse manhole during April 2017.

During May, the presence of foam conditions on the surface of the SBRs began to decrease with foam concentrations ranging from 40% to 100% of the area. Reduction of filled decants and adjustments to the SBR dissolved oxygen control set points to ensure adequate aeration for nitrification assisted to sustain the final effluent water quality.

There are no anticipated exceedances of the permitted limitations for Outfall 001 for May 2017. There was no discharge from outfall 002. Split sampling of the composite sample collected by Applied Laboratory Services (ALS) is ongoing for comparative analysis and daily results.

Sequencing batch reactors (SBRs) numbered 2, 3 and 4 were in service during April and May. Process monitoring of each SBR included ammonia as N, nitrite as N, Nitrate as N, COD, SSV, MLSS and total phosphorus. Daily analysis of the final effluent flow equalization grab sample is total phosphorus is ongoing. Sample collection and analysis of the influent wastewater collected at the influent pump station wet well is ongoing.

Addition of aluminum sulfate solution to the SBRs to assist with phosphorus removal continued. The volume of aluminum sulfate solution to the SBRs increased to from 65.8 gpd to 90.6 gpd. Soda ash daily addition decreased from



372 lbs./day to 268 lbs./day. Soda ash assists towards maintaining SBR pH concentrations above 7.0 standard units and assists to replenish alkalinity consumed during the nitrification process and aluminum sulfate solution addition.

Sludge dewatering increased from 223,018 gallons to 318,706 gallons. A total volume increase of 95,742 gallons.

During May, sludge wasting to the sludge holding tanks and decanting of the sludge holding tanks was ongoing. Process monitoring included pH, total alkalinity and total solids.

Sludge holding tank No. 1 was in service. The level at the beginning of the month was 7.55 feet and the level at the end of the month was 10.07 feet. Six hundred (600) pounds of soda ash were added. The average total solids concentration measured as 0.82%. The average pH and total alkalinity concentrations were measured as 6.72 S.U. and 116 mg/L, respectively.

Sludge holding tank No. 2 was in service. The level at the beginning of the month was 13.9 feet and the level at the end of the month was 8.18 feet. One thousand two hundred and fifty (1,250) pounds of soda ash were added. The total solids concentration measured as 0.75%. The average pH and total alkalinity concentrations were measured as 6.53 S.U. and 163 mg/L, respectively.

Ridley Creek Sewage Treatment Plant (RCSTP)

- The new NPDES Permit has been finalized and became effective on May 1, 2017. It expires in 5 years. Prior to finalizing, the permit was revised by PADEP to adequately address our comments.
- Caustic soda pilot study We submitted a letter to PADEP requesting approval to perform the pilot study, and they responded with their approval. A meeting is scheduled with Mark Miller, John Laidley (controls contractor), and me on May 9 to determine the controls system for the caustic soda chemical feed pump. We are also coordinating with chemical vendors to perform a jar/batch test, and a sampling plan has been requested from the plant operator. The intent is to tap the SBR influent pipe and install the system upon completion of the jar/batch testing.

We are coordinating with Dutchland on the SBR tanks' CIM coating bubbling and peeling in

response to the letter from Chase Corporation, the CIM manufacturer, implying that the coating was not properly installed and is not thick enough.

Mike commented that they will repair as needed. The maintenance timeframe was discussed.

Reservoir Road Pump Station

- PADEP issued the State Water Obstruction and Encroachment Permit for the pump station site and Chester Creek utility crossing in June 2016; however, they are requiring a separate federal authorization by the Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE). We submitted a copy of the full application directly to ACOE the week of April 10, 2016.
- CCCD E&S approval was issued on February 13, 2017, and the NPDES Permit for Stormwater Discharges was issued on March 3, 2017. The NPDES Permit requires a stormwater plan be recorded with the County within 45 days. It is our understanding that the documentation has been recorded.
- The PADEP Water Quality Management (WQM) Permit was issued on March 10, 2017.
- We obtained a 1-year extension from PennDOT for the Highway Occupancy Permit.
- The bid document will be finalized and submitted upon receipt of the remaining ACOE permit.

- 1 We will complete a listing of the permits, expiration dates, and renewal deadlines once the 2 ACOE permit is issued.
- 3 Mike mentioned that the DEP did not submit to the ACOE so some items have expired. He will 4 provide the information they need (wetland delineation report). They want to meet in June for a 5 site walk.

RCSTP and Pump Stations' O&M Manual

We received 8 boxes of historical plans, design information, permits, and correspondence, amongst other things, from the Township. Relevant data is being incorporated into the manual.

In May, the Municipal Authority recorded \$816.34 in interest income and \$233,400 in expenses, for a negative variance of \$232,584. Expenses included \$221,519 from the proceeds of the 2013 bonds for capital improvements at West Goshen STP; \$8,212 for genera engineering, \$2,407 for legal services and \$1,262 for engineering costs related to the Reservoir Road Pump Station.

As of May 31st, the fund balance was \$1,199,475 of which \$1,146,913 is in the main construction account (most of which represents the 2013 note).

As you may have heard, East Goshen Township was awarded a Aaa credit rating from Moody's for its 2017 Series bonds. We expect to hold the competitive sale in early July.

A complete list of all year-to-date expenses and revenues is provided.

Attached is final draft of the Memorandum Agreement No. VIII which addresses how East Goshen will fund its share of the improvements and upgrades to the West Goshen Sewer Treatment Plant and those parts of their sewer system that we utilize.

It was modeled after the Memorandum Agreement No. VII which covered how we paid for our share of the project costs when West Goshen expanded the treatment plant from 4.5 MGD to 6 MGD in 1997.

On June 6th the Board adopted a Debt Parameters Ordinance which outlines the parameters under which East Goshen will borrow the funds to pay for our share of the costs.

Our share of the costs is based on the reserve capacity for the various components.

16.67% for the Treatment Plant and those part of the collection system that we utilize.

54.8% for the Westtown Way Pump Station and Force Main.

The agreement has been reviewed by the East Goshen and West Goshen staff and our respective attorneys and engineers.

MEMORANDUM AGREEMENT NO. VIII

THIS AGREEMENT made the ___ day of ________, 20___, by and among WEST GOSHEN SEWER AUTHORITY ("West Goshen Authority") and the TOWNSHIP OF WEST GOSHEN ("West Goshen"), both of 1025 Paoli Pike, West Chester, Pennsylvania (sometimes collectively referred to as "West Goshen") and the EAST GOSHEN MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY ("East Goshen Authority") and the TOWNSHIP OF EAST GOSHEN ("East Goshen"), both of 1580 Paoli Pike, West Chester, Pennsylvania (sometimes collectively referred to as "East Goshen"), bodies corporate and politic organized and existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, all of the parties hereto entered into an agreement dated September 6, 1977, which dealt with the construction and sharing of certain sanitary sewage facilities located in East Goshen and West Goshen Township (the "1977 Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the 1977 Agreement has been amended seven (7) times: by Memorandum Agreement executed by the parties in June 1981; by Memorandum Agreement II executed by the parties in September 1982; by Memorandum Agreement III executed by the parties on May 22, 1990; by Memorandum Agreement IV executed by the parties on May 14, 1991; by Memorandum Agreement V executed by the parties on August 18, 1992; by Memorandum Agreement VI executed by the parties on April 9, 1997; and by Memorandum Agreement VII executed by the parties August 27, 1997; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Exhibit "C" of the 1977 Agreement, subject to the payment of charges and the limitations of the 1977 Agreement, the West Goshen Authority and West Goshen have granted to East Goshen Authority and East Goshen the right, during the term of the 1977 Agreement, to discharge sewage waste into the West Goshen Waste Water Treatment Plant ("Treatment Plant") in the maximum quantities specified therein, and West Goshen, as lessee of West Goshen Authority's Sewer System and Treatment Plant has agreed to convey, treat and dispose of said sewage waste; and

WHEREAS, West Goshen Authority and West Goshen have decided to replace, improve, modify, repair and update some of the facilities and equipment in their Sewer System and at the Treatment Plant (collectively the "Treatment Plant Project"), and East Goshen Township and East Goshen Authority are obligated to pay its proportional share of the costs for the facilities and equipment in the Treatment Plant Project that they utilize; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have agreed upon the replacements, improvements and modifications for the Treatment Plant Project for which East Goshen is obligated to contribute, as well as the percentage of the costs East Goshen is responsible to pay West Goshen; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Memorandum is to set forth the understandings of East Goshen and West Goshen in this regard.

NOW, THEREFORE. The parties hereto, each binding itself, its successors and assigns, and each presenting that it has proper legal authority to enter into this Memorandum Agreement VIII, and each intending to be legally bound hereby, do mutually represent, covenant and agree as follows:

- 1. Each paragraph of the foregoing recital is incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this Memorandum Agreement VIII.
- 2. Attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "A" is a letter memorandum of Dennis Michael for Joshua T. Fox, P.E., Engineer from HRG for West Goshen, dated March 28, 2017, which sets forth the scope of the work generally to be completed as part of the Treatment Plant Project. Although Exhibit "A" sets forth estimated costs, East Goshen's obligations herein shall be based upon the actual cost of each Item as herein defined.
- 3. East Goshen shall pay its proportionate share, as indicated below, of the costs of the following items ("Item(s)"), if applicable, as outlined in Exhibit "A":
 - a. Structural Repairs to Primary Clarifier No. 3 (16.67%)
 - b. 2016 Sanitary Sewer System Repair Project (Contract 16-1), only those sanitary sewer mains and manholes that convey East Goshen sewage (16.67%)
 - c. Emergency Generator Replacement Project (Contract 16-2) (16.67%)
 - d. Headworks Improvement Project (Contracts 17-1 & 17-2) (16.67%)
 - e. Anaerobic Digester Replacement Project (Contracts 17-3, <u>& 17-4, 17.6 & 17.7</u>) (16.67%)
 - f. Pump Station Phase I Improvements: By-Pass Pump Connections (Contract 17-45), Westtown Way Pump Station (No. 13) and Force Main only (54.80%)
 - g. 2017 Sanitary Sewer System Repair Project (Contract 17-<u>5</u>6), only those sanitary sewer mains and manholes that convey East Goshen sewage (16.67%). Any work involving the Westtown Way Pump Station (No. 13) and Force Main (54.8%)
 - h. Enhanced Chemical Addition Project (16.67%)
 - i. Wastewater Treatment Plant Phase II Improvements (16.67%)

- j. 2018 Sanitary Sewer System Repair Project, only those sanitary sewer mains and manholes that convey East Goshen sewage (16.67%). Any work involving the Westtown Way Pump Station (No. 13) and Force Main (54.8%)
- k. Pump Station Phase II Improvements, Westtown Way Pump Station (No. 13) and Force Main only (54.8%)
- 1. 2019 Sanitary Sewer System Repair Project, only those sanitary sewer mains and manholes that convey East Goshen sewage (16.67%). Any work involving the Westtown Way Pump Station (No. 13) and Force Main (54.8%)
- m. <u>Legal and Engineering fees incurred in the matter of West Goshen Sewer</u>

 <u>Authority v. United States EPA</u>, et al., No. 12-5353 in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania (16.67%)
- 4. East Goshen shall be responsible for financing its share of the costs set forth herein. Accordingly, East Goshen shall not be responsible to pay to any Treatment Plant Project related costs related to financing and interest costs during construction. In addition East Goshen shall only be responsible to pay those Treatment Plant Project related costs that can be capitalized and reasonable legal fees associated with the Treatment Plant Project, and but shall not be responsible to pay Treatment Plant Project related administrative costs for legal services or administrative costs. East Goshen shall be responsible to pay 16.67% of legal and engineering costs related to the application of the NPDES Permit or TMDL for the Treatment Plant.
- Items listed in Exhibit "A", West Goshen shall deliver to East Goshen calculations of East Goshen's obligations to West Goshen pursuant to this Memorandum Agreement No. VIII. This calculation shall include the actual engineering costs for the design, permitting, and bidding of each Item and the estimated engineering cost of the inspection and project closeout for the Item. Within forty-five (45) days thereafter, East Goshen shall pay to West Goshen Sewer Authority a sum equaling it total obligation pursuant to the Memorandum Agreement No. VIII for its share of the costs. East Goshen's money shall be deposited into a separate interest bearing account,

with interest accruing to the benefit of East Goshen. From time to time withdrawals shall be made by West Goshen from said account as is necessary for East Goshen's proportionate share of the cost of the Treatment Plant Project, as identified in the attached Exhibit "A." Each withdrawal from the said interest-bearing account made by West Goshen shall be for completed and inspected work only and shall be in an amount which is not in excess of East Goshen's proportionate share of that part of the work on that Item for which the draw has been requested and for which payment has been authorized by West Goshen. Pursuant to Section 6.07 of the 1977 Agreement West Goshen shall notify East Goshen, for its approval, by e-mail of any change order (and the basis for such change order) that would affect East Goshen's cost for each Item. If the change order is approved East Goshen shall remit the additional funding within thirty (30) from the date of the e-mail. Pursuant to Section 6.08 of the 1977 Agreement as each Item is completed West Goshen's Consulting Engineer shall provide East Goshen in reasonably itemized form the total project cost for each Item, the amount of any applicable insurance proceeds or federal or state grants received or to be received an appropriate adjustments in respect of net income, gain or loss from investment of the funds. Payment for any additional charges shall be within thirty (30) days from the date of the bill and any refund shall be made within thirty (30) days of the final payment to the applicable contractor.

6. To the extent not inconsistent herewith, all provisions of the 1977 Agreement and the subsequent Memorandum Agreements I through VII are hereby ratified and confirmed.
