## Approved July meeting minutes

- 1 Discussed communication needs for Paoli Pike Master Plan (PPMP). Jon Altshul agreed to talk to Mark Gordon about any communication needs for the PPMP and add to the budget as necessary. Brad and Rod to insure this is being addressed as part of PPMP deliverables.
- 2 Discussed the need to engage the services of a professional agency to assist in the branding of EGT -LOGO, signage and web page. We agreed to follow up early next year.
- 3 Rod and Tom to schedule a meeting with WCU Economics Staff to help in the measurement project.
- 4 Mike James presented his research on potential use for WIFI in the Town Center and along the Paoli Pike Trail as they develop. There was strong support for this as a way to attract people to the TC and Trail. There was strong support to consider WIFI for the Park now and then extend this along the Paoli Pike Trail. Mike and Tom will follow up with Jason to gage interest from the Parks group in pursuing this now.
