LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Dear Friends, Neighbors and Fellow Residents,

I hope you all had a fun-filled summer! It was great to see so many of you at Community Day, even if that feels like a lifetime ago now, and I look forward to seeing many of you again at the Township's annual Pumpkin Fest on October 20th. Whatever your autumn pleasures be—football, foliage or Halloween—there's a lot going on in East Goshen that I'd like to take this opportunity to bring everyone up to speed on.

Pipelines

There continues to be a lot of activity around pipelines in the Township. In July, the Board authorized the creation of a new Pipeline Task Force to promote the public interest about pipelines in East Goshen. This seven member volunteer group, which will function like any other ABC group, will undertake reviews and assessments of regulatory and technical aspects of pipeline infrastructure, advise the Board on pending pipeline legislation and regulations, and cultivate relationships with other citizen interest and public advocacy groups in the region. The Board also authorized a \$5,000 payment to Del-Chesco United for Pipeline Safety in support of that group's contract with Quest Consultants to perform a risk assessment of the Mariner East pipeline. Together, we can make a difference!

Police



Rebranding

As part of the implementation of the Paoli Pike Corridor Master Plan, the Township hired Finch Brands, a Philadelphia-based design firm, to assist the Township in developing a new logo to be used on all Township media, from road signage to the website. This logo will help differentiate East Goshen from neighboring communities in order to attract the next generation of home buyers and modernize the Paoli Pike corridor. Working with Township staff and the indefatigable Futurist Committee, Finch has developed a number of final designs, which are provided on page 4 of this newsletter. The Board of Supervisors hopes to make a final decision about the winning design by mid-October. To that end, we are eager to get input from residents on this matter to assist us in making a decision by no later than October 9th. Needless to say, this is your logo and we want to hear from you!

Playground

The new destination playground is a big hit, drawing hundreds kids and their parent, grandparents and guardians to the Park every day. We couldn't be happier with how it turned out, and we hope that it serves as the crown jewel of the Township for generations to come. If you haven't taken your kids or grandkids yet, well, what are you waiting for?



Wash Bay

Over the next few months, expect to see some construction at the Township building. The Township is building a vehicle wash bay in order to comply with state storm water requirements. This building addition, which will pop off the west side of the Public Works garage, will be connected directly to the Township's sewer system to ensure that dirty, soapy water does not flow untreated into storm water inlets and waterways.

Ponds

We are making excellent progress with the permitting process for the Marydell Pond and are optimistic that the dredging work will be underway shortly after this newsletter is received in mailboxes. Given the complexity and length of the permitting process, the Board also recently authorized permitting work to begin on the Bow Tree I Pond (between Bow Tree Drive and Achom Way) to ensure that the Township can stick to the one-pond-per-year schedule that was agreed to last fall. If you are interested in serving on the Bow Tree Pond Committee, we are planning to solicit for applications in late 2018 or early 2019, once the technical aspects of the project have been worked out with the various state regulatory agencies.

Paoli Pike Overlay District

I would be remiss not to mention the fantastic work that our Planning Commission has been doing in collaboration with Thomas Comitta Associates in developing a zoning overlay for the Paoli Pike Corridor. A zoning overlay, which was a key recommendation of the Paoli Pike Corridor Master Plan, would allow for more flexibility in redeveloping the corridor while protecting the Township's residential and historical character. We are heartened by the input received by Township residents who have been attending the Planning Commission's work sessions on this matter. As a Board, we look forward to working with the Planning Commission and interested residents to make this dream a reality and ensure that East Goshen remains the pre-eminent place to live, work and play in Chester County.

Paoli Pike Trail

McMahon Associates, our trail engineer, continues to plug away on the engineering work, while Township staff secures the necessary rights-of-way for the Paoli Pike Trail. Contingent on receiving the necessary permits from PennDOT, we are cautiously optimistic that Public Works can lay the macadam for the section of the trail from North Chester Road to Line Road through Applebrook Park in either late 2018 or early 2019. We're also hopeful that we can go out to bid for construction of the section from North Chester Road to Reservoir Road before the end of 2019.

As mentioned in previous newsletters, the Township has an e-mail communication called **Constant Contact**. Residents are able to receive timely information on specific areas of interest. Residents can sign up by going to the Township's website at www.eastgoshen.org. Residents are also encouraged to sign up for **ReadyChesco**, an emergency notification system, to be made aware of any emergency in your area. ReadyChesco uses mapping technology to tailor specific messages to residents based on where they work or live. Visit www.readychesco.org to sign up today.

Make Your Voice Heard: Help East Goshen Rebrand East Goshen!

Earlier this year, the Township hired Finch Brands, a Philadelphia-based design firm, to assist the Township in developing a new logo to be used on all Township media, from signage to letterhead to the website. This need to rebrand the Township was identified in the recently-adopted Paoli Pike Corridor Master Plan as a way to attract the next generation of home buyers and modernize the Paoli Pike corridor. Working with Township staff and the Futurist Committee, Finch has whittled 20 or so rough ideas down to five final designs, plus retaining the existing logos, for further consideration.

Designs A&B represent stylized renderings of the Blacksmith Shop on North Chester Road across from East Goshen Elementary School. Designs C, D & E represent three actual trees from East Goshen Park, highlighting the Township's park and open space. The existing logos (Design F) also highlight the Blacksmith Shop.

While the Board of Supervisors will ultimately select the winning design at its meeting on October 16th, we want to hear from you about which of these six designs you prefer. To that end, we would be grateful if you could email info@eastgoshen.org ranking your three favorite logo designs by no later than October 9th. This is, after all, your logo—one that you may see more or less daily for years to come—and we need to hear from you!

Township staff, the Futurists Committee and Finch also brainstormed a number of taglines (i.e. "Just Do It", "I Love New York", "Virginia is for Lovers," etc) that could accompany the logo in certain media, such as street light signage or the newsletter. This group discussed scores of taglines, some bold, some corny, some sugar sweet and some comical. Ultimately, the group kept coming back to a well-worn but comforting tagline that signifies the feeling that we get when returning from either a day at the office or a month-long trip out-of-state. That feeling of relief to be back in familiar surroundings with the ones you love.

Dramatic Crash and Rescue at Saint Simon and Jude Results in Numerous Commendations and Awards

On Wednesday, March 14, 2018 at 1:21 PM the Westtown-East Goshen Regional Police Department responded to a serious motor vehicle accident at the intersection of Rt. 3 and Rt. 352 in Westtown Township. Police arrived

on scene, in the parking lot of Saints Simon and Jude Church and found one vehicle overturned and on fire. The male driver, who suffered moderate injuries, was trapped under the vehicle, and police and many other brave citizens were able to push the vehicle over and off of the driver. The individual was treated at the scene by EMS and transported to Paoli Hospital.

The Westtown-East Goshen Regional Police Department would again like to thank all of the brave individuals who came to the assistance of the driver who was involved in the crash. Faculty members of the Saints Simon and Jude School were able to use numerous fire extinguishers to keep the fire from spreading until the driver could be extricated from beneath the vehicle. Here to Help

Starting September 1, 2018, Senior Citizen Transit ID Cards will no longer be valid for travel on SEPTA. SEPTA Senior Fare Cards and PA Driver Licenses/Non-Driver IDs issues before July 2017 will be the only forms of ID valid for travel on SEPTA. With either of these forms of ID, seniors receive free bus, subway, trolley, and Norristown High Speed Line travel, and starting September 1st FREE



Regional Rail rides for travel within Pennsylvania, previously a \$1 fee. Discounted half-fares will remain in place for seniors traveling to-and-from New Jersey and Delaware.

CODE

Construction Activities Requiring Permits

The Township Code requires that all construction activities conducted within the Township have a permit prior to the start of any work. A list of construction activities that require a permit is available on the East Goshen Township website under Services > Permits > Construction Activities which Require a Permit. Some of the more common construction activities requiring permits include siding replacement, stucco replacement, roof replacement, finished basements, deck replacement and/or expansion, and new or expanded hardscaping, just to name a few. The Township Codes Department is happy to discuss your project with you and your contractor in order to answer any questions you may have. Please don't hesitate to call us.

Change of Use and Occupancy Inspections

Are you selling your home in East Goshen Township or thinking about purchasing a new home in East Goshen Township? The Township Code requires that all changes of use and/or occupancy must be permitted through the Township. This results in an inspection by the Township to ensure that a standard level of safety is afforded to all residents, patrons, and workers in East Goshen Township. This application can be found on the East Goshen Township website under Services > Permits > Rentals > Rentals and Change of Use.



Fire Prevention Week is October 7 - 13

- Test your smoke detectors every month.
- Replace smoke detectors every 10 years.
- Change the batteries in your smoke detectors at least twice a year.
- Develop an escape plan and practice it at least twice a year.
- Ensure that you have house numbers on the front of your home and on your mailbox that can be easily read from the street.

False Alarms

Monitored burglar and fire alarms are commonplace in homes and businesses today. These systems and their monitoring services provide a level of safety that has never been afforded in the past. **Owning these systems comes with the responsibility of proper operation and maintenance.** Accidental alarm activations happen and false alarms do occur; however, our emergency services personnel must respond to every call. All alarm owners are afforded two false alarm activations per rolling 12-month period before false alarm fees are imposed. Please be diligent in the operation and maintenance of your monitored alarm systems in order to minimize the number of false activations to which your police and fire company personnel have to respond. **You can prevent false alarms!** Consider these steps to prevent the occurrence of false alarms:

- Have your alarm system inspected and maintained by your alarm company annually (at a minimum).
- Review and update your contact information with your alarm company annually.
- Ensure that all occupants and anyone authorized access to the premises understand how to operate the system.
- Ask your monitoring company if they offer an Enhanced Call Verification feature.
- Ask for, review, and implement best practices for monitored systems as outlined by your alarm company.

Now Every Day is Keep East Goshen Beautiful Day!

This summer, the Township began contracting with A.J. Blosenski to pick up roadside litter along both Township and State-owned roads. This initiative builds on the success of the annual Keep East Goshen Beautiful Day to ensure that our Township looks pristine all year round. Road signs will be posted when the hauler is collecting roadside trash in your area to ensure the haulers' safety from vehicular traffic.



RECYCLING: THINK QUALITY, NOT QUANTITY

About a year ago, East Goshen began to receive invoices from our recycling center for the cost of processing our paper, plastics, glass and aluminum. While these invoices are relatively small (about \$1,500 per month) compared to the Township's entire trash and recycling operation (about \$1,000,000 per year), they were a surprise, as until then global demand for recyclables was high enough that the processor would refund us for a share of their sales.

One major global factor that has contributed to the slowdown in the recycling market is that China is no longer accepting U.S. recyclables due to contamination in our recycling streams. As a result, processing centers now landfill a much larger portion of their outputs than they did as recently as a year ago.




Therefore, as stewards of this earth and residents of the Township, we need to reaffirm our commitment to smart, strategic recycling. Anecdotally, we're hearing stories of recycling centers struggling to eliminate non-recyclable materials and contaminated waste—batteries, food waste, plastic bags, candy wrappers, diapers, you name it—from their supply chains. These materials can gunk up machinery and contaminate huge streams of plastics, glass and paper, rendering them unusable. The old adage "when in doubt, throw it out" has never been more true.

Below find a list of common household items that should be thrown out and not recycled:

- ✓ Plastic bags (they can only be recycled at dedicated recycling stations at grocery stores)
- ✓ Anything with food waste in it. This could include the old plastic ketchup bottle or the greasy pizza box or the plastic cup with the dregs of yesterday's take-out iced coffee or your kid's half-eaten yogurt or that dirty napkin from dinner. If you can't get all the grease or food waste out with a quick rinse, don't recycle it!
- ✓ Straws
- ✓ Plastic bottles with the cap still on (take the cap off)
- ✓ Plastic utensils
- → Drinking glasses and cups
- ✓ Children's toys, wood, clothing
- ✓ Empty chip bags
- ✓ Diapers—clean or dirty!
- Plastic containers with flammable or toxic residue (e.g. empty motor oil containers)







2018 Bulk Trash and Yard Waste Dates

2018 Bulk Trash Days

A bulk item must be able to be picked up and handled by two people. A maximum of two bulk items may be placed out for pickup at one time.



- September 13th and 14th
- October 11th and 12th
- November 15th and 16th
- December 13th and 14th

2018 Yard Waste Days

Only paper bags will be collected, no plastic bags will be taken. You may also use a trash can; provided it weighs no more than 50 lbs.

- September 19th
- October 3rd, 17th, 31st
- November 7th,14th,21st, 28th
- December 12th

THINK TWICE BEFORE FLUSHING

"Don't believe everything you read." We've heard that caution all our lives. When applied to the word "flushable," it is true! Many packages today claim the contents are "flushable." Simply because the package reads 'flushable' doesn't also mean "dissolvable'! Although a product may disappear down your toilet, it may remain intact and cause clogs at pumping stations and treatment plants.

In the 1950's & 1960's, most East Goshen homes had their own on-site sanitary system consisting of a septic tank and cesspool. They needed to be pumped out every few years. We were very careful about what we flushed down the toilet. Once public sewers became available we breathed a sigh of relief and unfortunately assumed that almost anything could be flushed away – now it would be someone else's problem. That "someone else" is the East Goshen and West Goshen Sewage Treatment Plants. The private plant serving Hershey's Mill Village is also affected.

The adage "don't use your toilet as a waste paper basket" has never been more true than it is today. Many products look and feel like toilet paper, but don't dissolve or disintegrate.

Some products that should never be flushed down a toilet are paper towels, tampons, cloth, dental floss, chewing gum, hair, cat litter, disposable diapers, plastics, pop-off toilet bowl cleaners and especially "flushable wipes". All of these products cause trouble at our pumping stations and treatment plants. They clog up screens and filters and require constant attention from Public Works employees. Even the powerful-sounding "Muffin Monsters," which grind up solids, can get clogged by an innocuous wipe.

Please, think twice before flushing.

KEEP YARD WASTE AWAY FROM STREAMS

Dumping of yard clippings, leaves, and other debris into stream valleys and floodplains is a serious problem and is often illegal under state and local floodplain and water quality ordinances.

- Yard waste like leaves, grass, and brush piled along stream edges suffocates and kills the trees and shrubs that are critical for avoiding stream bank erosion.
- Yard waste piled along streams can easily be washed into streams during large rain events. Once in the stream, this burst of organic material contributes a harmful excess of nutrients, which in turn robs the stream of oxygen needed by fish and aquatic insects. Oxygen depletion can be observed for a long distance downstream of these localized deposits of yard waste and ultimately compound in the Delaware Bay.
- Leaves and other yard waste raked into streets often wash into storm drains, causing flooding, impeding stream flow, and creating areas of stagnant water that may create mosquito problems.

A few tips for handling yard waste:

- DO follow your county and municipal schedules for drop off or collection of yard waste. DO NOT use plastic or paper grocery bags, only paper yard waste bags.
- DO compost leaves or yard waste whenever possible. Find out more about composting and yard disposal from the Chester County Solid Waste Authority (http://www.chestercountyswa.org/) or Delaware County Solid Waste Authority (http://www.co.delaware.pa.us/SWA/).
- DO NOT burn leaves. Burning results in air pollution and is prohibited by East Goshen Township Code.
- DO NOT remove leaves and other woody debris from the ground in natural areas of your property, which may include hedgerows and forested areas. Leaves and down woody material provide a great source of food and nutrients for microorganisms that are critical to maintaining healthy soils and plants.

Mosquitoes are Everywhere!!

This year is proving to be a difficult year for mosquitos all throughout the County.

Many considered 2012 to be the worse year historically for mosquito-borne diseases. Unfortunately in Chester County and Pennsylvania 2018 is fast approaching, and in some cases already surpassed, the numbers we saw in 2012!

As you likely know, the Chester County Health Department has a Mosquito-Borne Diseases program which involves education, surveillance and control efforts. A critical element of our surveillance includes collecting mosquito samples using traps that aid in monitoring the mosquito population's rate of infection diseases such as West Nile Virus (WNV) and Zika which is spread to people by mosquito bites.

One of our goals this year is to improve our communications with you regarding surveillance and control efforts to keep you and your residents informed. As such we updated our website to include information for property owners to reduce their risks, and share surveillance data.

We ask that you include prevention information in your communications with your residents via your web page and/or other communications. Feel free to point them to our page, or use the information directly from our page. You can find prevention related information on our Make You and Your Home a Bite Free Zone http://chesco.org/3624/Mosquito-Borne-Diseases page.

Additionally, we encourage you to regularly check our West Nile Virus web page to monitor if positive mosquitos have been detected in your municipality. You can access the West Nile Virus (including data) http://chesco.org/868/West-Nile-Virus.

As we have historically done, we will continue to issue formal communications to you and your citizens in the event we have to conduct an adult mosquito spray. We ask that you communicate the information shared through your communication channels.

Rain gardens are a natural and beautiful way to help your streams. These gardens in slight depressions in the ground trap rainfall from a roof or driveway and prevent it from adding to the polluted runoff that damages streams. Trapped rain water is allowed to slowly sink into the ground while supporting beautiful plants that attract birds and butterflies. You can create your own rain garden in 3 easy steps...

1. Pick the Right Location and Size

The best locations are in natural depressions or low lying areas where water flows naturally from a downspout, driveway, patio or sidewalk. Avoid steep slopes and areas near septic systems or drinking water wells. You must be able to move water from the hard surface (roof, etc.) to the garden location, either by directing a downspout with an extended tube towards it, or simply by following contours and capturing water that is naturally flowing downhill.

A properly sited and prepared rain garden will not allow mosquitoes to breed. Your rain garden will drain within 24-48 hours after a storm. Mosquitoes need seven days or more to complete a breeding cycle.

2. Create a Design and Select Plants

Once you have a location and size for your garden, sketch it out on paper. Determine the mix of species you would like to use, including flowers, grasses, and shrubs that are drought tolerant but can withstand wet conditions. Native plants are adapted to local conditions, easy to maintain and attract birds and butterflies. Fill in your sketch with your selected plants.

3. Construct and Plant your Garden

Spray paint or otherwise mark on the ground the exact shape of your rain garden. Excavate to a depth of 4-8 inches, creating a berm on the downslope side of your garden using the removed sod. Amend your soil as needed to improve drainage. Try to keep the bottom of the basin as flat as possible to increase the area that will come in contact with water regularly. Add plants following your design, placing species that need the most water in the lowest lying areas or in the most direct path from the downspout.



Rain Garden Plants

By using native plants in your rain garden you are giving your plants the best chance to survive the wide range of weather conditions they will experience, from long droughts to large storms. Native plants also support the largest number of wildlife species, including birds, butterflies, and bees.
