DRAFT EAST GOSHEN TOWNSHIP **Park & Recreation Commission Meeting** October 4, 2018

The regular meeting of the East Goshen Township Park and Recreation Commission was held on Thursday, October 4, 2018 at the Township Building. The meeting was called to order by Vice Chairman Dan Leicht at 7:00 pm.

Commission members present were:

CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Dan led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Dan asked for a moment of silence to remember our military, police & veterans.

Dan asked if anyone would be recording the meeting. Mrs. Jessica Bottaro requested permission to record her daughter Angelina's presentation. Permission was given.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

1. The minutes of the September 6, 2018 meeting were approved.

NEW BUSINESS

- 1. Angelina Bottaro Jason introduced Angelina from Girl Scout Troop 41223. Angelina explained that she is giving a presentation for her Silver Girl Scout project. She would like to install bushes around the labyrinth and the zip line in the new playground. It will create a barrier without a fence. She provided a sketch of her plan. She will use Rhodedenrums. The cost will be about \$500. She needs to get donations and 10 volunteers and plans to do this next Spring. Angelina also mentioned that 2 more benches should be installed at the sand box. There is no place for parents to sit. Jason explained that the installation of Rhodedenrums is in the original playground plan. Debbie commented that those bushes need a lot of water. Jason mentioned that he could try to get permission from DNCR to use a different bush. If they install benches they would have to match the ones already installed.
- 2. Natalie Golden Jason introduced Natalie Golden from Girl Scout Troop 41223. Natalie explained that she is giving a presentation for her Silver Girl Scout project. She is proposing to build and install 4 bat boxes in Applebrook Park. She provided a description and map of the project. The purpose is to improve the overall outdoor experience of people using the park by decreasing their exposure to biting insects such as disease carrying mosquitoes. Bats can eat about 1,000 mosquitoes per night. They are endangered due to lack of habitat and a fungus that kills them. A single chamber bat box can hold 50-100 bats. They will be installed on metal poles at least 12 feet above ground and 1/4 mile from a water source. She will ask Home Depot for instructions and supplies.
- 3. Craig Sims, Chester County Council, Boy Scouts of America Jason introduced Craig Sims. Craig explained that the Chester County Council received a grant and purchased a "Daisy" inflatable air rifle (BB) range to teach children proper firearm use and management. It is self-contained. The target is on a pulley so there is no access to that area. There would be 1 NRA/BSA certified instruction to 1 student. They use these at their camps. Younger children would have their parent with them. He would like to bring it to a special township event, such as, Community Day, Farmers Market, etc. Eric asked if they have to sign a waiver. Craig answered that the BSA will carry the liability if someone gets hurt. Jason commented that he will have to check with the Township's insurance carrier. Joe pointed out that the Board of Supervisors will have the final approval. Craig is willing to set it up so everyone can see it. This will be discussed at the November meeting.
