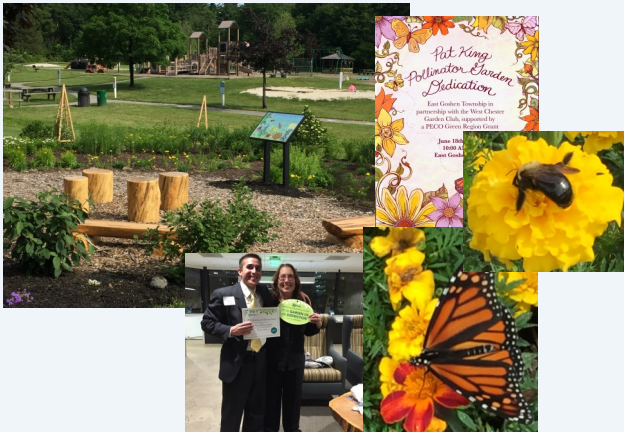


East Goshen Township Parks & Recreation Committed to Conservation



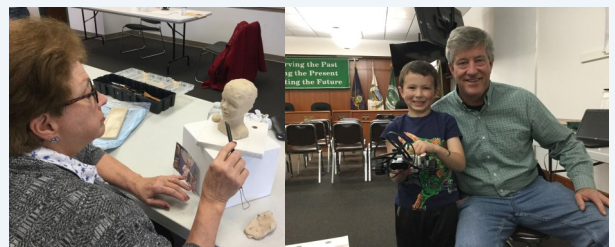
The Pat King Pollinator Garden was placed next to our flagship playground, to encourage youth involvement in environmental education efforts. Installed in 2016, it was later awarded a Pennsylvania Horticulture Society Garden of Distinction Award, one of 9 out of 300 submissions. Project partners were the West Chester Garden Club, PECO Green Region and Conservancy Board.

EGTPR owns the country's second municipal Stones course. Stones is a conservation-focused ball toss sport played "in the woods", with trees, boulders and roots all in play. Rare native species like the Ilex Montana holly were present, propagated offsite, and reintroduced in abundance.



EGTPR hosts e-Recycling events in our parks semi-annually. Since 2015, 129,799 lbs. of tv's, computers and other bulky electronic devices have been recycled rather than being thrown in area landfills.

The Township Municipal Building hosts EGTPR indoor recreation programming. In 2015, geothermal HVAC was installed, with electrical kilowatt usage reduced by 30.2% in the last three years.



EGTPR is currently developing the Milltown Dam and Hershey's Mill Dam Parks in part with LWCF funding. Current ecological repairs collectively satisfy current MS4 permit requirements.
