Monthly Flows:

We have not received the West Goshen flows for April.

Meters:

The meters were read on a daily basis. The meters were calibrated on May 6th, they did not require any adjustments. The probes and transducers were cleaned. The portable meters have been pulled in Bowtree, we will determine the next step after reviewing the last quarter flows.

C.C. Collection:

The pump stations have been visited on a daily basis, routine maintenance was performed at each station. The wet wells were pumped down and the walls were scraped and the grit was vacuumed out. The generators were serviced as part of our preventive maintenance program, each was run under load and all electrical components were checked during the test. The two new pumps for Ashbridge pump station have arrived. They will be installed in the next rotation.

R.C. Collection:

The pumping stations were visited on a daily basis. The wet wells were thoroughly leaned and the grit was vacuumed out. The generators were serviced and run under load. The Hershey Mill generator is starting to burn oil. The pump wires were separated and installed in the new conduit that we installed.

R.C. Plant:

The was run on a daily basis by Big Fish, personal labs were drawn and routine maintenance was performed. I received an e-mail from Ms. Hill who resides behind the plant reporting an odor from plant. I rode down to the plant at 9:30 pm and detected an odor as well. I thought it may have been caused by sludge tank #1 since we were draining it to change a valve. The next morning, I met the operator at the plant, he also detected an odor however, he was confident that it was coming from SBR #2 since it was full of rain water and leaves. The operator dumped soda

ash in the tank and added air to the tank, by the afternoon the odor was gone. We brought McGovern Inc. in to vacuum out the remaining sludge in tank #1 so we could change out the valve. The valve was changed out by Public Works and placed back on line. I contacted the operator and advised him we completed the valve replacement and he should plan on draining tank #2. Once tank #2 is empty we will excavate the valve and replace it. I contacted Ms. Hill via e-mail and explained that we had found the source of the odor and if she had any concerns to please contact me.

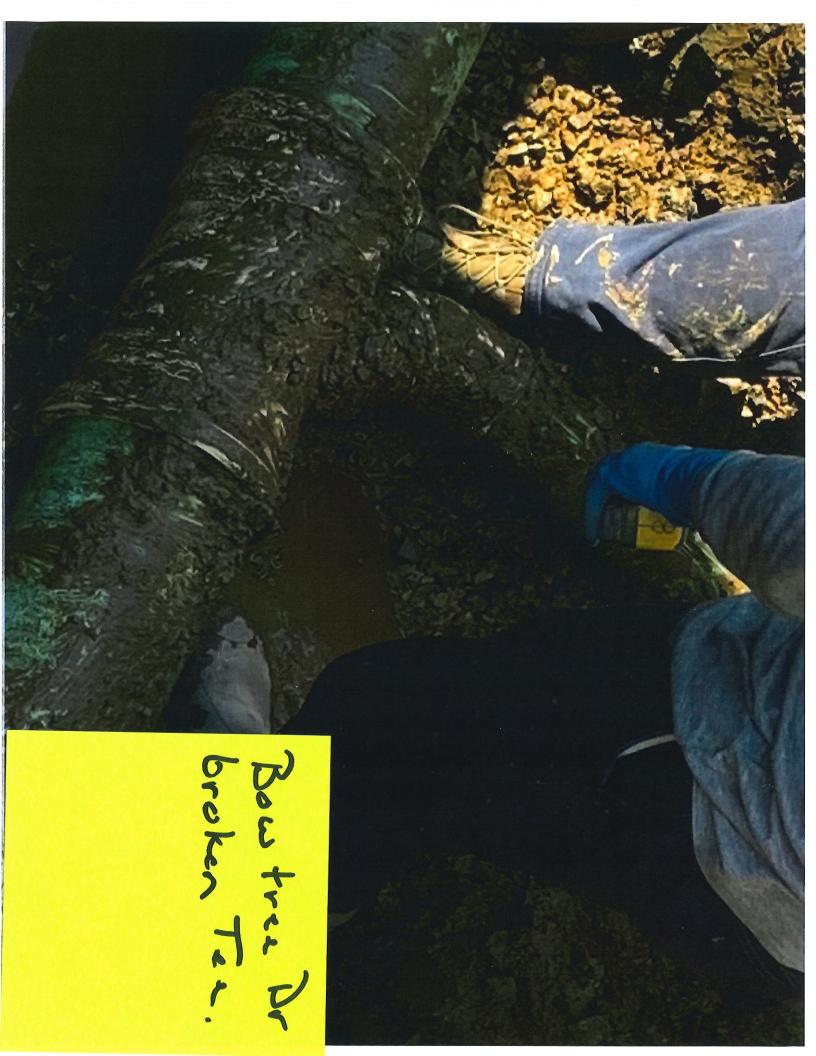
The Public Works Department has milled and paved Tallmadge Drive. The work has been completed.

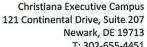

Ridley Creek Sewage Treatment Plant (RCSTP)

No activity since last report.

Barkway Pump Station Grinder

 The Muffin Monster vendor, Watermark, was authorized to proceed. We have reviewed submittals, and it is our understanding that they have released the equipment for production. We anticipate equipment delivery will occur in mid-July.

Tallmadge Drive Sewer Main Replacement

• The 2-year maintenance bond period is until March 21, 2021. We notified the contractor accordingly in writing.

I&I Support and Reporting

- We continued to analyze meter data on a weekly basis for the three portable meters in Bow Tree and provide weekly updates to the PW Director. Data has now been analyzed from February 8 to April 23. As previously reported, there were very low overnight base flows at two of the metering locations (Double Pond and Eldridge Drive), indicating little to no continuous infiltration. There was ±10 gpm of continuous base flow at the Achcom Way meter, and that location also experienced a significant increase in flow on February 21, after a 1.84" rain event.
- Pipe Data View televised the sewers upstream of Achcom Way the week of April 8 and located a
 significant break in the sewer line, which was subsequently repaired. The average flow at Achcom was
 approximately 11,500 gpd over the following five days, which is an approximate 38,000-gpd
 reduction. Additionally, there no longer appears to be any baseflow upstream of the meter location.
 This significant reduction is considered to be primarily due to the repair but also coupled with reduced
 precipitation.

New Connections

- No activity since last report.
- We recommend the Sewer Ordinance be amended to incorporate a few Township policies (i.e. minimum 6" laterals for non-residential uses, grinder pumps conveying into gravity laterals at the ROW line, prohibiting internal manhole drop connections) that have been the source of comments in multiple recent plan submissions.

Hershey's Mill Pump Station

• We provided generator information and photos to the Public Works Director (for coordination with the HOA) and are evaluating the fuel tank sizing and site location alternatives.



Executive Summary

The Ridley Creek sewage treatment plant outfall 001 achieved compliance with the permit discharge limitations for the month of March 2019. Discharge to the Applebrook irrigation lagoon remained off line during March and April 2019. Chemical usage utilized for total phosphorus removal, pH and total alkalinity remained consistent with previous months. No significant mechanical or operational issues were observed during operation of sludge dewatering equipment or SBR treatment process.

Treatment Process Operation

Table 1 illustrates the revised final effluent composite sample data reported for outfall 001 for the March 2019 DMR.

The treatment process performed well during Mach with no abnormalities. The process monitoring, and control data indicates the facility will remain within compliance of the NPDES permit.

The monthly average influent wastewater pollutant concentrations and loading entering the wastewater treatment facility remained within the design concentrations. There were periodic BOD5 and TSS sample concentration atypically less than "normal" conditions. Although these samples are collected from the influent flow meter located prior to the Screening Building which excludes the internal recycle flows, debris can accumulate around the sampler suction line impacting the pollutant concentrations measured.

Table 2 presents the available pollutant data for the influent wastewater collected at the doghouse manhole during March 2019.

During April, the final effluent outfall 001 monthly average flow to Ridley Creek was measured and recorded as 0.368 MGD. This represents approximately 49.1% of the facility's average daily design hydraulic loading of 0.750 MGD. This is decrease as compared to the monthly average for March. During April, there were two (2) days the influent flow measured at the manhole in the field prior to the Screening building exceeded a daily flow of 0.75 MGD. The days were:

March 3rd 798,470 gallons March 10th 801,060 gallons

The corresponding final effluent flows remained less than the 0.750 MGD average daily hydraulic design loading of 0.750 MGD. The final effluent flows were:



March 3rd 566,000 gallons March 10th 640,000 gallons

Continued maintenance activities of cleaning the alum static mixer injector, flushing of the alum chemical piping to the SBRs and weekly draining and cleaning of the disc filters.

The influent organic loadings remain below those of the influent design loadings. Table 4 presents the available pollutant data for the influent wastewater collected at the doghouse manhole during April 2019

The foam on the SBR surface was observed to decrease slightly to approximately 90% coverage of the surface area. The foam thickness is approximately 3 to 4 inches with a light to medium brown color. The warmer water temperatures combined with increasing the F:M ratios to 0.06 will assist to reduce the foam concentrations.



Sequencing batch reactors (SBRs) numbered 1, 3 and 4 are in service during February and March. Process monitoring of each SBR included ammonia as N, nitrite as N, Nitrate as N, COD, SSV, MLSS and total phosphorus. Daily analysis of the final effluent flow equalization grab sample for total phosphorus is ongoing. Sample collection and analysis of the influent wastewater collected at the influent pump station wet well is ongoing.

Addition of aluminum sulfate solution to the SBRs to assist with phosphorus removal continued. Soda ash assists towards maintaining SBR pH concentrations above 7.0 standard units and assists to replenish alkalinity consumed during the nitrification process and aluminum sulfate solution addition.

Significant Rainfall

During April, there were eight (8) days when rainfall occurred. Two (2) storm events resulting in a daily precipitation amount equal to or greater than 0.50 inches measured during a 24-hour period. A total of 3.24 inches of rainfall measured during the month. These events occurred on:

April 19 th	1.02 inches
April 26 th	0.70 inches

Plant operations were adjusted to manage the precipitation to prevent exceedances of the permitted discharge limitations for Outfall 001. Adjustments included reducing aeration minutes per cycle, extending decant minutes per cycle and reducing settling times.

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Call to Order & Pledge of Allegiance

Kevin called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

There was a moment of silence to remember our troops, veterans and first responders.

Kevin asked if anyone would be recording the meeting. There was no response.

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Chairman's Report

1. Phil attended the West Goshen meeting. Their flow was near the limit at 6.4 M gallons/day. They want to revamp the pumping stations and do more training. They formed a committee to plan future capital projects. The West Chester Borough sewer plant is for sale.

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New Business

1. John and Rose Mary Hill, 1745 Towne Drive were present at the meeting. Their property in Clocktower backs up to the berm along the Ridley Creek Plant property. Some of the screening trees have died. Mark Miller looked at the trees and found some others that need to be replaced. He feels about 25 trees will be needed. Walter does not recommend white pines because they don't last as long as other types of pines. Mark explained that there is a sewer easement along the berm so they will plant the trees above that. Mark has the original sight lines from the houses to the plant, which he will look at. Since other properties will be involved he will send a letter to the homeowners.

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Sewer Reports

1. Director of Public Works, Mark Miller's report for March:

Monthly Flows: The average daily flows to West Goshen have not been received. Meters: All meters were read on a daily basis. The three portable meters in Bow Tree are being read on a daily basis. The meter that is monitoring the flows in the first phase of Bow Tree is reading high. We have started cleaning and televising on April 8th. The meters were

calibrated on March 28th. The channels were cleaned and routine adjustments were performed.

<u>C.C. Collection</u>: The pump stations have been visited on a daily basis with no problems to report. The wet wells are scheduled for cleaning next week. A tree came down at the Ashbridge Pump Station, which took out the privacy fence. The tree was removed and the fence will be replaced.

On March 21st we received a call from a resident who was walking his dog in the sewer right of way between Barker Drive and Reservoir Road and noticed sewage coming out of a manhole. We walked the right of way and found the blockage. Due to the location and distance off the road, we had to utilize Pipe Data View to clear the blockage. Once the blockage was clear we spread lime over the area 25' x 50'. I contacted the DEP as required and spoke to inspector Wolfinger and explained what had happened. What we did to rectify the problem was ok with him. I filed a field report.

We continued INI work on Christine Lane and eliminated a significant inflow at a manhole that had been a problem for several months. We completed all the INI repairs that we had located when we televised and we have seen a reduction at the Ashbridge Pump Station. The two new pumps that were ordered for Ashbridge arrived last week.

<u>R.C. Collection:</u> The conduit work at Hershey Mill Pump Station was completed and Lenni Electric separated the wiring for each pump and the float wires. We continued INI work on the system and completed the problems that we found when we were televising. We will be televising the Bow Tree area next week.

Ridley Creek Plant: They cleaned the grit chamber last week. The operator reported that the number one recycling water pump was tripping out under load so we pulled the pump last Tuesday and took it down to Deckmen's for repairs. The operator also had a problem with an O ring blowing out on the recycling screen filter. We ordered fittings to repair the problem. The plant has been operating very well with the high flows and the flows are starting to drop. The field meter was acting up so we had Allied Control look at the meter and determined that the totalizer was not recording, so the controller was pulled for repair.

Alarms: We responded to 27 alarms for March.

Rainfall: March rainfall total was 4.60 inches.

Other: The fountain at Hershey Mill is maintained by the Township. Hershey Mill takes care of the landscaping. The fountain needs repair. Mark will send a letter to Ed McFalls.

Talmadge Dr. is scheduled to mill and pave the end of April.

2. Pennoni Engineer's Report for February

 <u>Tallmadge Drive Sewer Main Replacement – Mike explained the final televising was done by Pipe Data View and vacuum testing passed.</u> The contractor, Iron Eagle, replaced and reset damaged and shifted manhole frames and cleaned up the site. They will have the curbing repaired by a separate contractor at Iron Eagle's expense. All of the closeout documents were reviewed including Change Order #1 and Pay Application #3. The Township has a 2 year warranty and 2 year maintenance bond from Iron Eagle.

- 42 <u>Barkway Pump Station</u> The design plans were finalized. The Muffin Monster vendor provided a quote for materials. Delivery is expected in early August. Public Works will do the installation.
- 44 INI Report The three portable meters in Bow Tree are providing good data. Achom Way has a
- 45 continuous base flow, which increased significantly after a 1.84" rain event. These meters will be
- 46 moved to other locations in the township. They coordinated with pipe inspection contractors for

- 1 inspection of the Chester Creek Interceptor. The cost for laser and sonar inspection of approx. 7,000
- 2 LF of the 24" diameter portion of the interceptor was approx. \$49,000. Pipe Data View (PDV) can
- 3 perform the TV inspection for approx. \$12,000. Including PW Department's time, this is projected to
- 4 be less costly than the laser and sonar inspection.
- 5 Chapter 94 reports: They submitted Chapter 94 reports to the DEP. The RCSTP's average daily
- 6 influent flow was 539,000 gpd in 2018, which is a significant increase from the preceding 4 years but
- 7 remains well within the 750,000 gpd permitted average capacity of the plant. The increased flow is
- 8 considered to be the result of extreme precipitation in 2018. The 5-year projected average flow to the
- 9 RCSTP is 437,000 gpd.
- 10 A grinder pump has been recommended for 204 Line Rd. to tie into Thorncroft.
- Jon feels that the cost of a sewer inspection needs to be reviewed.

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<u>3. Big Fish Environmental Services</u> – Kevin had no concerns about Scott's report which showed that the Ridley Creek sewage treatment plant outfall 001 achieved compliance with the permit discharge limitations for the month of March 2019.

Dear Municipal Authority Members:

As you may know, the Paoli Pike Trail Project is completing the permitting process with PennDOT and we have a number of final housekeeping items to clean up for the project.

Along Segments F and G (Applebrook Park) of the trail, there are two (2) EGT sanitary sewer manholes that need to be adjusted to meet the new final grades. PennDOT requires that the Township and the Municipal Authority enter into an agreement to ensure that the Township is going to pay for and / or reimburse the East Goshen Municipal Authority for the cost of the required adjustment. This is another safeguard PennDOT has in place to ensure all public utilities are protected and reimbursed for the relocation of utility infrastructure.

Mark Miller is well aware of this project requirement and the PW Dept. will perform the work to make the elevation adjustment to these manholes.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Board authorize the Chairman to execute this Project Agreement for Incorporated Work and forward it to the Municipal Authority for their authorization.

Draft Motion:

I move that the Board authorize the Chairman to execute the Project Agreement for Incorporated Work with the East Goshen Municipal Authority for the work needed to adjust the two (2) manholes within the Paoli Pike Trail project area within Segments F and G of the Paoli Pike Trail Project.



PROJECT AGREEMENT FOR INCORPORATED WORK

This Project Agreement, numbered 00001 is made and entered into this ______ day of ______, between "East Goshen Township", hereinafter "Township" and "East Goshen Township Municipal Authority", hereinafter "Utility".

WITNESSETH

Whereas, the <u>Township</u> is about to undertake a project on <u>Paoli Pike (SR 2014)</u> in <u>Chester County</u>, hereinafter "Project" which requires the adjustment of "<u>Utility"</u> castings; and,

Whereas, "<u>Utility</u>" has requested and "<u>Township</u>" has agreed to incorporate the adjustment of said castings into the Project agreement; and,

Whereas, "<u>Utility</u>" agrees to reimburse "<u>Township"</u> the cost of the adjustment of the castings in accordance with this Agreement.

NOWTHEREFORE

In consideration of the foregoing premises and the mutual promises hereinafter set forth, and with intent to be legally bound hereby, the Parties agree as follows:

1. The estimated number of castings to be adjusted and the cost of each are shown on Exhibit 1 which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. Casting adjustment costs are estimated to be a total cost of \$\\$1,970.00\$.

2. In the event the actual number of castings to be adjusted changes from the number estimated in Exhibit 1, "<u>Utility</u>" agrees to reimburse "<u>Township"</u> for the actual number of adjusted castings based on the unit costs shown on Exhibit 1.

3. Upon completion of the work to the satisfaction of "<u>Utility</u>", "<u>Township</u>" shall invoice "<u>Utility</u>" for the adjustment of the castings. "<u>Utility</u>" agrees to pay "<u>Township</u>" within 60 days of receipt of an invoice from "Township".
