LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Dear friends, neighbors and fellow residents:

I would like to wish everyone a very happy summer. Whether you spend it at the beach, the pool or the park, there is a lot going on in East Goshen for everyone!

One important development that I'd like to highlight is the Township's reinvigorated efforts to ensure that the Township remains a **sustainable place to live** for generations to come. To that end, under the leadership of David Shuey, the Township has



formed a new Sustainability Advisory Committee, which is tasked with developing a culture of sustainability. What in the world is Sustainability? It is more than recycling, waste reduction and energy efficiency. It involves community design and land uses, fiscal controls, health and wellness, intergovernmental cooperation and internal management and operations. Last year East Goshen was certified at the "Gold" level by the Sustainable Pennsylvania Community Certification program. That is not good enough, and now we have our eye on the rare "Platinum" rating. From all accounts, the committee has hit the ground running!

At the same time, East Goshen has signed onto an "Energy Transition Plan", which is being spearheaded by the West Chester Area Council of Governments (COG), a consortium that includes several other area municipalities, including West Goshen, West Chester, Westtown, East Bradford and West Whiteland. This plan calls for our region to use 100% renewable electricity by 2035 and 100% renewable energy for all uses by 2050. As a first step, COG has hired Cadmus, a Boston-based consulting firm, to develop a transition plan, with input from local officials and other stakeholders from our area.



Onto the really fun stuff, I would like to cordially invite all Township residents to attend Community Day on **Saturday**, **June 29th** beginning at 4:30pm and continuing on through dusk when the best fireworks display in Chester County explodes across the sky above the Township Park. This is the highlight of the Township's social calendar and is the perfect event for residents of all ages to celebrate our community ties. I would also like to thank all of the corporate and individual donors, who allow the Township to hold the event at no cost to taxpayers. The Board of Supervisors is very grateful for your generosity!



As surely everyone in the Township has seen or heard by now, work recently recommenced on the Mariner East 2 and 2x pipelines. After several months of not drilling due to a variety of legal issues, Energy Transfer and its contractors have recolonized the Boot Road/North Chester Road corridor, creating an eyesore for passing motorists and sound disturbances for residents and businesses along the pipeline route. If you are concerned about noise at your property from the drilling operations, please contact the Township at 610-692-7171. It continues to be the Township's understanding that the work on the pipeline will be completed by the end of 2020; however, the Township has not received a formal update from Energy Transfer on the project completion date since last fall. In the meantime, the Township's new Pipeline Task Force has been working diligently to ensure that the Township's concerns about pipeline activities, both present and future, are

News from the Westtown-East Goshen Police Department

June is National Safety Awareness Month!

The Westtown- East Goshen Regional Police Department would like to remind you of important health and transportation safety tips.

With the hot weather, it is crucial to stay hydrated, wear sunscreen that is at least SPF 30, seek shade,

wear sunglasses, and wear lightly woven fabrics to avoid risk of heat strokes, headaches, heat exhaustion, cramps, or other heat related illnesses. Do not leave children or pets unattended in vehicles; cars heat up fast, which can lead to death.

While spending time outside, ensure that you and your children's bicycle helmets are worn and securely fastened. The chin straps need to be centered under the chin, with no room for more than two fingers to fit between. Helmet sizes vary, so using a tape measure to measure your head size can be helpful.

The Department currently has an officer who is certified as a Child Passenger Safety Technician through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) to perform child safety seat inspections/ installations. This is an important program because car crashes are a leading cause of death for children ages one to 13, and yet NHTSA estimates that three out of four parents are using their child car seats incorrectly.

YMCA Healthy Kids Day



ALL ABOUT FIRE POLICE AND THE GOSHEN COUNTRY FAIR!

Goshen Fire Company has three operating divisions: Fire, Emergency Medical Services, and Fire Police. You might not be familiar with Fire Police, but they are the volunteers that you are most likely

to see on the street after an auto accident.

Fire Police volunteers are sworn in by a District Justice, and have been granted authority by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to limit public access to fire scenes, to close roads and to re-route traffic at accident scenes. Their primary responsibilities are crowd control, scene security, and traffic control, with the purpose of protecting First Responders and the public. They work at the direction of WEGO police officers at auto accident scenes, and you will also see them parking cars at events in East Goshen Park. Like all Goshen first responders, they undergo constant training in traffic control techniques and strategies.

Goshen's Traffic Unit, or "Traffic 54" is a 2009 Ford F-550, and carries a full complement of specialized equipment; lighting, traffic cones, barriers, radios, and protective gear for officers.

Next time you encounter a Goshen Fire Police Officer or see "Traffic 54" closing a road you need to go down, remember that there is probably an accident, fire, fallen tree or fallen wires that you can't see. Slow down, stay off your handheld device, and they will do their best to get you safely around the incident.

Mark your calendar for the 70th annual Goshen Country Fair, which runs from Monday July 29th through Saturday, August 3rd. Fairgrounds open M-F at 6PM, Saturday at 5. PIPELINE SAFETY UPDATE

Since elected to the General Assembly, there have been very few issues that have generated such attention and frustration from the community and presented such a challenge for legislators to address as the pipelines being constructed under East Goshen Township. I want to take this opportunity to share with you the actions I am taking to help solve the problems brought into our neighborhoods by pipeline operators.

I want to re-affirm in the strongest terms that the safety of our community is my top priority and every action I have taken regarding Energy Transfer Partners (ETP) serves that mandate. To date, I have twice called for the enforcement of a shutdown of the Mariner East Pipeline until the stringent safety standards set out by Administrative Law Judge Elizabeth Barnes were met. Additionally, I am the only legislator who has signed onto a critically important formal citizen complaint before the PUC to force ETP compliance.

In the Senate, I have introduced 13 bills that relate to pipeline oversight and safety. The bills include requiring advanced leak protection; mandating that local emergency responders be provided with up-to-date response plans; defining how pipelines near schools must operate; and a resolution that would establish a Pipeline Commission.

Specifically, I introduced Senate Resolution 33, which would establish a special bipartisan legislative commission to recommend safety, oversight and interagency coordination improvements for the transport of oil, natural gas and other hazardous liquids through pipelines in this Commonwealth. I am hopeful that this legislation will get to the Governor's desk this session.

Introducing The East Goshen Pipeline Task Force

Who We Are

The East Goshen Pipeline Task Force is comprised of a group of longtime residents who are dedicated to working with the Township on safety issues related to pipeline construction and operation. Currently, nine pipelines traverse East Goshen Township in a north-south direction. This number is expected to grow to eleven upon completion of the Sunoco Mariner East pipelines. Future projects, such as the imminently-permitted Adelphia pipeline, will also impact our community. The colocation of so many pipelines, combined with the unique demographics of East Goshen and our population density, make the task force an opportunity for a combined effort between residents and Township officials to prioritize public safety.

The Pipeline Task Force meets on the 4th Thursday of each month from 5-7pm at the township building. We welcome you, as East Goshen residents, to attend task force meetings. If you have concerns, questions, or ideas to share with the task force, please send an email to pipelinetf@eastgoshen.org.

How are the Mariner East Pipelines Different from Other Pipelines?

- These pipelines do not carry products used for local energy; this is predominantly an export project for overseas use.
- The Mariner East pipelines are not odorized like methane distribution lines, and the products carried are odorless, colorless, heavier than air, and highly volatile in liquid form.
- No agency approved the routing of Mariner East.
 Pennsylvania does not have a siting oversight authority.
- The installation of Mariner East in East Goshen Township is predominantly horizontal directional drilling, which creates a lot of noise, vibration, and dust.



Recommended Action Items:

- If you have a well, have your water tested as fluid from HDD drilling can get into wells. Additionally, make sure a test is done for bacteria in the water.
- Have a structural engineer examine your home and document its current condition. Don't forget to have pools and sheds included in the inspection. Documentation of the current state of your home and water condition by an expert is needed should the condition change when drilling occurs. (The pipeline does not need to be on your property for this to be needed. Vibration can affect anything that is close to where the pipeline is being constructed.)
- A test for radon is also suggested.
- Consider purchasing a home monitor that detects both carbon monoxide, and combustible gases like ethane, butane, methane, and propane. These can be purchased online, or at local home improvement stores.







ALTERNATIVES TO PESTICIDES

You can have a green and healthy lawn and garden without depending on large amounts of pesticides. It is better for your yard, the people and animals that use your yard, and our streams. Follow the guidelines below to decrease pesticide use.

- Grow native plants that are able to handle the climate and pests of our region. See http://www.dcnr.state.pa.us/forestry/plants/nativeplants/ for more information on native plants, including where to buy them.
- Spread mulch at the base of trees to keep mowers and weed whackers from opening up wounds in the bark. Spread mulch flat on the ground to a height of no more than two inches; do not smother the tree's roots and bark by building a cone or "volcano" around the tree.
- Provide the proper amount of water to keep your lawn and gardens stress-free. Water your lawn deeply, but only every several days and not at all if it rains. Mow your lawn to a height of 2 ½ to 3 inches.
- Get a soil test to determine if you need to use any fertilizers. Apply fertilizers only at the rate needed and never before a storm. A soil test kit can be cheaply obtained from your local Penn State Extension office (610-696-3500).



Bee-balm is a native plant that attracts honey bees and hummingbirds.


- When weeds sprout, hand dig or spot treat them with herbicides.
- Rotate your garden crops, just as farmers do. Do not plant tomatoes or peppers in the same place each year. Consider scattering species throughout your garden. If a tomato hornworm finds one of your tomato plants, for instance, it may easily move to all of your tomato plants if they are next to each other.
- If you find a pest damaging one of your plants, consider the following questions before deciding what approach to take.
 - 1. What is it? If you don't know, Penn State Extension's website, http://extension.psu.edu/pests/ipm, is a good place to start.
 - 2. Where does the pest live, breed, and what does it eat?
 - 3. How many pests are there?
 - 4. How many pests are too many?
 - 5. If I have "too many," what is the best way to get rid of the pest?
 - 6. What are the potential "side effects" of control methods?
- When pesticides are needed, use insecticidal soaps and Bacillus thuringiensis or "Bt."

Being selective in your pesticide use and growing plants native to our region will increase the number of beneficial insects, such as butterflies and other pollinators, in your gardens.



Raise Mower Height for Healthier Lawns, Cleaner Water

Turfgrass, like other plants, must manufacture sugars through photosynthesis in their leaves if they are to develop into a high quality lawn. Closely mowed lawns have limited leaf area to take in the sunlight to produce the food they need to be healthy.

In addition to leaf area, a direct relationship exists between the height of turfgrass plants and the depth and total mass of their root system. Kentucky blue grass and tall fescue lawns mowed at the recommended summer height of 3 inches have roots more than twice as deep as those of closely cropped lawns. The shallow, weak roots of closely mowed lawns exhibit stress first and loss of grass plants to competing weeds is more likely, particularly during the summer. Raising mower heights during the summer will keep soil temperatures cooler, preserve soil moisture and help maintain turfgrass quality.

Thicker lawns are more weed resistant, absorb more stormwater, lose less sediment during storms, and need less fertilizer. So this June, remember to raise your mower height to three inches, or remind your lawn service company, for a healthier lawn and cleaner streams this summer.
