LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Dear Friends, Neighbors and Fellow Residents:

On behalf of the entire Board of Supervisors, I would like to wish you a very happy autumn! Whether you plan to spend the next three months rooting for the Eagles or Nittany Lions or, like me, simply enjoying the foliage in the Park, there's a lot going on in East Goshen Township!

The highlight of the fall calendar is, of course, the annual **Pumpkin Fest**, which will be held this year on Saturday, October 19 beginning at 10am. I look forward to seeing everyone there enjoying a hay ride and a warm cider donut. Also, it may seem far in the future now, but don't forget to mark your calendars for the annual Holiday Tree Celebration on the evening of Friday, December 13!

I'd like to devote most of my column to providing a status update on the various capital projects that the Township has been working on for the past several years. These projects get a lot of publicity and resident participation in the initial planning phase, but then disappear. However, Township staff have been toiling feverishly behind the scenes on all of these projects. Here is where they stand today.



Paoli Pike Trail

We are very excited to begin construction on the Paoli Pike Trail very, very soon. This trail will provide for increased walkability and convenience in the Township, which will, in turn, ensure that East Goshen property values continue to grow for years to come. As a first step, the Public Works Department will construct the segments of the trail through Applebrook Park between Line Road and North Chester Road

once road paving season is over and, of course, weather permitting. Moving west along Paoli Pike, we are hopeful that we will be able to go out to bid for construction of the trail sections between North Chester Road and Reservoir Road before the end of 2019, with construction occurring in phases through 2021. The final segments of the trail, from Reservoir Road to Airport Road, will be the last sections to be built.

As has been reported in previous newsletters, the Township has received approximately \$3.6 million in grant funds for the construction of the trail, and we will be applying for additional grants this fall. These grants are supplemented by the proceeds of the Township's AAArated 2017 general obligation bonds, which have absorbed the various engineering and preconstruction costs associated with the Trail. 

On behalf of the Board of Supervisors and Township staff, thank you for bearing with us during this long planning process. For some historical context, in June 1956, President Eisenhower signed the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1956 that authorized the construction of the first 41,000 miles of the U.S. interstate highway system. Less than a year later, construction had commenced. Fast forward 63 years later and it will have taken approximately four years from the date that the Board of Supervisors first authorized the construction of the 2.7-mile Paoli Pike Trail until we break ground. Indeed, the engineering and permitting process, involving multiple state and in some cases federal agencies, has been staggering, to say nothing of the practical considerations of obtaining rights-of-way and relocating utilities. But if NASA can put a man on the moon, then East Goshen can build a trail!

Milltown & Hershey's Mill Dams

As you likely know, the Township is in the process of restoring the areas above Milltown Dam and Hershey's Mill Dam into park and open space. We are cautiously optimistic that we will be able to go out to bid on both projects sometime next year and that construction will be materially complete in 2021, although we do expect to perform some follow-up work in 2022 and beyond. From a financial standpoint, the Township has received over \$1.5 million to restore these areas into parkland and, as with the trails, proceeds from the 2017 bonds are paying for engineering costs, as well as the cost to remove, or "breach", the actual dams.

These projects are being undertaken in response to determinations by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection that both dams were not in compliance with current dam safety standards. Plans for the new parks were developed in coordination with volunteer committees

consisting primarily of property owners living near both sites. More information about the Milltown Park project can be found here: https://eastgoshen.org/boards/milltown-dam-committee/. Traffic Improvements on Boot Road and Paoli Pike

The one constant complaint that all municipalities receive is about traffic calming and congestion mitigation or, in other words, controlling speeding and traffic backups. With that in mind, the Township expects to undertake two road projects over the next year: Boot Road Restriping and Paoli Pike/Hibberd Lane Signalization.

The **Boot Road Restriping** project is a joint initiative with West Goshen Township that will involve adding a northwest-bound lane between Wilson Drive and Greenhill Road approaching Route 202. Importantly, this can be accomplished without widening the road, as the existing cartway is wide enough to add an extra lane for vehicles of all sizes (including semis and school buses), while retaining the existing left-center turn lane. As anyone who travels this road during the afternoon rush hour can attest, the existing roadway does not have sufficient capacity to carry the volume of traffic currently using it. This improvement, which will be funded through the Township's Transportation Fund, will not use taxpayer dollars. The Transportation Fund is funded with developer contributions from past projects that are earmarked for transportation improvements. East Goshen and West Goshen will split the costs 50/50.

Finally, in June, the Township awarded a contract to install a **full traffic signal at the intersection of Hibberd Lane and Paoli Pike**, also known as the western entrance to the Park. Signalization at this site will ensure a safe pedestrian crossing from East Goshen Park to Applebrook Park and, eventually, the Paoli Pike Trail. We expect this project to be complete or nearly complete by the time the newsletter arrives in mailboxes. As with the Boot Road Restriping project, this traffic signal will be funded through the Township's Transportation Fund and will not use taxpayer dollars.

As mentioned in previous newsletters, the Township has an e-mail communication platform called **Constant Contact**. Residents are able to receive timely information on specific areas of interest. Residents can sign up by going to the Township's website at www.eastgoshen.org. Residents are also encouraged to sign up for **ReadyChesco**, an emergency notification system, so you can be made aware of any emergency in your area. ReadyChesco uses mapping technology to tailor specific messages to residents based on where they work or live. Visit www.readychesco.org to sign up today.

CLEAN ENERGY UPDATE

The West Chester Area Council of Governments—which includes East Goshen, West Goshen, West Whiteland, East Bradford, Westtown and West Chester—has hired Cadmus, an environmental consulting firm, to develop a plan for the West Chester region to get to 100% renewable electricity by 2035 and 100% renewable energy from all sources by 2050. On July 11, which was one of the stormiest days of the year, scores of area residents turned out at a public "visioning" workshop with Cadmus to provide input on local priorities around clean energy, as well as to identify implementation challenges that our region may face. Cadmus' final report is anticipated in October and will be posted on the Township's website. Thank you to the many Township residents who attended the visioning session and shared their thoughts!

SPOTTED LANTERNFLY—SOUTHEASTERN PENNSYLVANIA'S VEXING PEST



Have you heard about the Spotted Lanternfly? These insidious pests are an invasive pest from Asia and are currently threatening Pennsylvania's agriculture economy, including the wine, beer and fruit industries, as well as millions of trees throughout our region. Spotted Lanternflies are planthoppers, a type of insect that is best known for their hopping ability.

Their preferred food source is another type of invasive species known as the Tree-of-Heaven; however, Spotted Lanternflies have been sighted feeding on a wide variety of common trees and plants in Chester County.


East Goshen Township intern Gabrielle Long has been running a **Spotted Lanternfly Awareness Campaign** to encourage residents to become aware of local pest species and to help stop this pest dead in its tracks. A survey was available to Township residents last month and out of the 74 responses received, over 95% know how to correctly identify the different lifecycles of spotted lanternflies! This is a crucial skill to have in order to know what you are looking for and when to look for them. Gabrielle has been compiling a Spotted Lanternfly data collection project at West Chester University where she is currently pursuing her Master's degree in GIS. To check out

Imagine going for a walk in the forest, only the beautiful trees and plants that once stood there ceased to exist. What will happen to all the animal species that relied on those resources for shelter and food? If this pest continues unchecked and has the opportunity to reproduce, the fate of our future ecosystem could become irreparably damaged. It is up to us to take a stand and to show invasive species that they do not belong!



Introducing the East Goshen Township Payment Portal!



East Goshen Township is pleased to be one of the first municipalities in Chester County to allow sewer and trash/recycling ratepayers to check their account balances and safely and securely make payments on-line with no added convenience fee! Users will eventually also have the ability to sign up for email bills and go completely paperless. This portal was developed in collaboration with Paymentus, a leading payment solution provider. To register, go to https:// ipn2.paymentus.com/cp/egt or access the portal through our home page by clicking on the blue button labeled "Online Bill Pay - Pay Sewer & Refuse". Note that this service is only for sewer and trash/recycling payments, and not real estate taxes. The Township will continue to accept sewer and trash/recycling payments through the Baltimore "Lockbox" postal address, at the Township

building and via our electronic debit program. However, this additional payment platform will bring the Township squarely into the 21st century and provide a convenience that many residents have been requesting for several years.

JOHN J. SULLIVAN, Esq.: HIS HOUSE, HIS HORSES, HIS RELIGION

John J. Sullivan was a lawyer, affluent landowner, accomplished horseman, a devout Catholic and founder of the Malvern Retreat House. He was born in Philadelphia in 1877, the eldest of nine children, and grew up in the family home on Rittenhouse Square. Like several family members before him, both in Ireland and Philadelphia, he chose the law as his profession. After graduating from St. Joseph's College and the University of Pennsylvania Law School, Sullivan taught law parttime while establishing his practice, and also wrote two law books.

Soon Sullivan began to buy land in Chester County, one of the three original Pennsylvania counties created by William Penn in 1682. More and more wealthy Philadelphians were beginning to acquire country estates as weekend retreats and later, after the advent of rail and motor transport, as full time commuter homes.

Sullivan eventually owned some 2,000 acres, composed of many parcels in East Goshen. His first purchase was on October 25, 1911,

from the Estate of Abraham Wanger for \$14,148.36. This price included 148 acres of land, with a dilapidated house and barn. After extensive renovations, Sullivan finally moved into the house year-round in the 1930s. Today, "Sullivan House" serves as a meetings and entertainment center for the surrounding Hershey's Mill Villages and Golf Club.

invited its members to ride through his grounds, and frequently entertained them at post-hunt breakfasts and dinner parties. He also belonged to the Rosetree Hunt.



Sullivan was proud of the staircase he added. Though a confirmed bachelor, Sullivan enlarged and revamped the kitchen. He also added a new barn with a two story tack room and with box stalls to accommodate his two mounts. He was active in the Radnor Hunt,

Sullivan lived there until 1956 when he sold the house with about 104 acres. He died on April 30, 1958, in East Goshen Township. In 1973, title passed to Hershey's Mill, Inc., the developer of the

WEGO PD wants to remind everyone of things to consider as schools are back in session.

Bus Safety

- Always cross in front of a bus, not behind.
- Pay attention to children getting on and off at bus stops.
- Wait until the bus driver says it is safe to enter and exit the bus.
- Do not drive around a stopped bus.
- Remind your children to remain seated at all times and listen to the bus driver.

Cyber Safety

- Remind your children of appropriate online behavior.
- · Implement parental controls on devices.
- Teach your children about tricks online predators may use.
- Ensure emergency phone numbers are in their phones.
- Have your children check in with you to tell you where they are.

Stranger Danger

- Never get into strange cars or talk to strangers.
- Scream "No!" if someone approaches them or they feel uncomfortable.
- Inform your children about how to be more aware of their surroundings.
- Teach them to call 911, their emergency contact, to find a trusted adult to tell and where they can go in the case of a stranger talking to them.

Emergency Contact

• Rehearse your address and phone number with your children, so they have it memorized in case of an emergency.

Bullying

- Discuss the importance of being kind to others.
- Tell your child how they can help if they see someone being bullied.
- Create a plan of action if you sense your child is being bullied or bullying others.
- Become familiar with the bullying policy at the school.



What's Happening at the Goshen Fire Company

Today's cars and trucks are more sophisticated than ever. Airbags, electric/hybrid power and high strength steel make them safer and more efficient, but can pose challenges and risks for firefighters. Members train on the use of stabilization tools that make the work area safe, hydraulic extrication tools sometimes known as the "jaws of life", and other specialized tools. Perhaps more important than the tools is the strategy and tactics to know how and when to use them, taught by experienced Goshen officers.

As you are probably aware, we are having a very wet year. Now would be a good time to check the sewer cap(s) in your yard for any signs of cracking or damage. Damaged sewer caps are the main entry point for rain and groundwater into the Township's sewer system. Excess groundwater in the Township's sanitary sewer system, known as "Infiltration and Inflow", is very expensive to treat and accounts for a substantial portion of the Township's sewage treatment costs. Please take the time to inspect your cap.



RECYCLE SMART

About two years ago, East Goshen began to receive invoices from our recycling center for the cost of processing our paper, plastics, glass and aluminum. While these invoices are relatively small (about \$3,500 per month, up from about \$1,500 per month a year ago) compared to the Township's entire trash and recycling operation (about \$1,000,000 per year), these invoices were initially a surprise, as until recently global demand for recyclables was high enough that the processor would refund us for a share of their sales.



While Chester County recyclables generally remain in demand, anecdotally, we've heard stories of recycling centers both locally and throughout the nation struggling to eliminate non-recyclable materials and contaminated waste—including batteries, food waste, plastic bags, candy wrappers, diapers, you name it—from their supply chains. These materials can gunk up machinery and contaminate huge streams of plastics, glass and paper, rendering them unusable.

Therefore, as stewards of this earth and residents of the Township, we need to reaffirm our commitment to smart, strategic recycling. Below find a list of common household items that should not be recycled:

- Plastic bags (they can only be recycled at dedicated recycling stations at grocery stores). AND WHATEVER YOU DO, DON'T PLACE RECYCLABLES IN PLASTIC BAGS AT THE CURB!
- Anything with food waste in it. This could include the old plastic ketchup bottle or the greasy pizza box or the plastic cup with the dregs of yesterday's take-out iced coffee or your kid's half-eaten yogurt or that dirty napkin from dinner. If you can't get all the grease or food waste out with a quick rinse, don't recycle it!
- Straws
- Plastic bottles with the cap still on (take the cap off)
- · Plastic utensils
- Drinking glasses and cups
- · Children's toys, wood, clothing
- Empty chip bags
- Diapers—clean or dirty!
- Plastic containers with flammable or toxic residue (e.g. empty motor oil containers)

YARD WASTE TIPS

- Yard waste like leaves and grass clippings piled along stream banks can suffocate and kill the trees and shrubs that are critical for preventing stream bank erosion.
- Yard waste piled along streams can easily be washed into streams during large rain events.
- Leaves and other yard waste raked into streets can wash into storm drains and cause flooding.
- Put your yard waste out for collection or compost your leaves. DO NOT use plastic bags, only use paper yard waste bags.
- DO NOT burn leaves. Burning results in air pollution and is prohibited in the Township.

Maintaining your septic system will save you money by avoiding costly repairs and/or replacement.

- Redirect downspouts and snowmelt away from absorption fields to avoid flooding and incapacitating the field.
- Keep trees and shrubs at least 35 feet away from your drain field to prevent roots from plugging or breaking pipes.



- Avoid using a garbage disposal and dumping grease down the drain: Both of these activities add sludge to the septic system and prevent it from working properly.
- Do not flush or pour old medicines or strong cleaners (like bleach) down the drain: These materials will kill beneficial bacteria that break down the waste.
- DO NOT burn leaves. Burning results in air pollution and is prohibited in the Township.


