LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Dear Friends, Neighbors and Fellow Residents:

I hope that everyone is having a very happy holiday season! As many of you know, this will be my final Chairman's letter in the newsletter since my term in office ends at the end of the year. It has been an honor and a privilege to serve East Goshen for the past 40 years on the Planning Commission, the Zoning Hearing Board and finally the Board of Supervisors.

When I first moved to East Goshen in the mid-1970s, it was semi-rural. Residents enjoyed the farms and extensive open space and did not want any more development. My new home in



Marydell had just been constructed, and the residents of the adjacent (and slightly older) Pin Oaks development were so furious about the potential for additional traffic that they asked the Township to put up traffic barriers on Barker Drive to keep the new Marydell residents out. A decade later, Marydell and Pin Oaks residents put aside their differences and banded together to try to stop Bow Tree from being approved. Variations of this pattern have continued ever since. But, despite it all, the Township grew into the attractive, desirable suburban community that we all live in and love today. And now the torch is being passed to a new generation of leaders who will face their own challenges managing future growth and ensuring that each of our investments in East Goshen remains as solid and secure as ever. I wish them luck!

There are so many things to be proud of about our Township—our award-winning park, the new Paoli Pike Trail, and the passion and pride that our residents have about calling East Goshen home. Through the years I have worked with some very talented and dedicated people, starting with Tom Smith, Rick's uncle and the first Township Manager, and long-time Planning Commission member Whitey Hassler and moving forward to my fellow Supervisors, Township staff and ABC volunteers of today. I have learned so much from all of them and could not have done my job without their support.

And finally, I have also gained so many tremendous insights from the countless residents who have made an effort to express their views at meetings or by email. Your input, concerns, and opinions have been critical to shaping the Township into the place that it is today and will be long after I'm gone. Serving the Township and balancing the competing demands of 18,000 stakeholders is never easy, but it is why we do what we do. You are what ultimately makes East Goshen a great place to live, work and play. So, from the bottom of my heart, thank you!





WEGO Recommends ReportIt, a Citizen Property Inventory System

WEGO PD encourages residents to use a free online system that will help keep track of valuable—and invaluable—personal property. ReportIt is a free, secure online service allowing citizens to record serial numbers and upload images for phones, electronics, and other valuables. Should those items ever be stolen, WEGO PD says having the information will go a long way in accurately and quickly identifying your property. Citizens can access the site at reportit.leadsonline.com. The ReportIt service is a part of LeadsOnline, an online system that works with police across the country to track and recover stolen property. WEGO PD uses LeadsOnline to help track and recover stolen property, including everything from jewelry to sporting equipment to electronics, computers, cameras, and other items such as designer clothing, collectibles, and more. The system allows detectives to search for the items using a variety of parameters, including item descriptions and serial numbers. When an item is sold to a pawn or secondhand shop, the product information is entered in the LeadsOnline system.

Pennsylvania State Fire Commissioner Visits Goshen Fire Company

On October 3, 2019, Goshen Fire Company had the privilege to have Bruce Trego, State Fire Commissioner for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, visit our Park Avenue fire station. During the visit Fire Company President Bob Fleming and Fire Chief Grant Everhart discussed how the support of the Office of the State Fire Commissioner (OSFC) and Pennsylvania State Fire Academy (PSFA) have enabled the fire company to enhance our operational effectiveness, efficiency, and safety and our ability to continue to serve our community through the provision of high-quality fire, emergency medical services, and fire police services.

An example of this support is the 16-hour Rapid Intervention Team Exercise course that a cadre of six instructors from the Pennsylvania State Fire Academy delivered at Goshen several years ago. This course, which was scheduled at our request and hosted by the fire company, provided advanced classroom training and extensive hands-on training designed to provide participants with the skills and knowledge necessary to function effectively, efficiently, and safely as members of a rapid intervention team assigned to rescue emergency responders trapped during a structural fire response.

Sixteen of our members completed this training and met the qualifications to serve on our Rapid Intervention Team. This sophisticated and expensive training was provided at no cost to the fire company. The lessons learned during this course were also invaluable as we revised our related response policies and procedures.

For a number of years Goshen Fire Company has received two separate grants each year through the Office of the State Fire Commissioner Grant Program. The Fire Grant has been used to make a number of important purchases including firefighting and rescue equipment and personal protective equipment (PPE). For several years this grant funded the purchase of specialized technical rescue equipment and related training in support of our technical rescue and rapid intervention capabilities. The most recent Fire Grant was used to purchase replacement fire hose and new nozzles. Over the years the EMS Grants have similarly been used to purchase necessary emergency medical services equipment and personal protective equipment. During Commissioner Trego's visit we were able to discuss the equipment that we use that was purchased using the funding provided through the Office of the State Fire Commissioner.

This visit also provided an opportunity to discuss the challenges that all contemporary fire departments face in terms of recruiting and retaining personnel and securing necessary funding to support the essential services that we provide in a manner that not only meets but, ideally, exceeds the expectations of the community that we have the privilege to serve. We are genuinely grateful for the many ways that the Office of the State Fire Commissioner and Pennsylvania State Fire Academy support and assist us.

How You Can Save East Goshen...and the Planet Too!



The East Goshen Sustainability Committee (SAC) is excited to launch two new initiatives with the long-term goal of ensuring that our Township (and planet) remain healthy and sustainable for generations to come.

The first is the **3.5% Brigade**, which is based on the theory developed by Harvard professor Erica Chenoweth that no policy can withstand a challenge of 3.5% of a population. For the SAC's 3.5% Brigade, the idea is that if at least 3.5% of our residents, or about 630 residents out of over 18,000 total, can become change agents for renewable energy, we will be able to effect positive change. Will you stand up and be counted?

By joining our 3.5% Brigade, you will start receiving emails with suggestions and invitations to events, which will include demonstrations of products and services to help you convert to clean energy, recycle more efficiently and make smarter purchases. We may invite you to contact state and federal officials in support of safety and environmental protection. We may invite you to attend public meetings and gather for peaceful events. You can choose whichever forms of involvement are most comfortable to you.

If you are super busy right now, you can help in less public ways by being part of our second initiative, the **Green Brigade**. Join our **Green Brigade** to receive a monthly email rather than more frequent communications.

Sign up for either the 3.5% Brigade or the Green Brigade by emailing us at sac@eastgoshen.org. In the meantime, here is a checklist for your consideration to help create a Cleaner, Greener East Goshen.

REFUSE: Bring your own bags whenever you shop. Bring your own containers when you eat out for leftovers. Buy in bulk when you have a reasonable expectation of usage. Share leftovers with family, friends and neighbors.

REFUSE plastic utensils for take-out. Plan ahead! Carry a set of utensils and paper or cloth napkins in your car or purse. Refuse to use or purchase plastic straws. Carry your own in bamboo or stainless steel.

REFUSE to drive when you can walk or bike. Group your errands to use your car less frequently each day. Plan to buy an all-electric car. In the next few years there will be an explosion of charging stations for your convenience, as new technology will result in much shorter charging times.

Consider replacing your oil burner with a geothermal or electric

heat pump unit. Help counteract the dangers of highly volatile liquids coursing through our neighborhoods by showing we don't wish to rely on fossil fuels to power our cars, our homes, and our purchases of plastic products. Consider solar panels for your roof and yard.

REUSE: Reuse and recycle plastic bags in bins provided by local merchants. Plastic food containers can be reused in the kitchen, garage, shop, basement, etc. for non-food storage. The less plastic we buy, the less fossil fuels are used to make these containers.

REPURPOSE: Many items you no longer need in their original form can be repurposed. Numerous examples are illustrated on-line. Doors become tables and desks. Head and foot boards convert to benches. Bookcases become toy cubbies. Non-working grandfather clocks become shelves, updated with paint and wallpaper.

RECYCLE: When an item can no longer be reused or repurposed, donate it to a local non-profit that can help those in need. Some of these organizations will pick up at your home or office.

RECYCLE newspapers, junk mail, used computer paper, and all paper not heavily coated with plastic. (This newsletter is coated to withstand postal delivery, but can be recycled.) If your pizza box is only greasy on the bottom half, cut the top off and recycle it. Rinse out glass jars. Peanut butter jars require soap and patience, but they come clean!

These efforts may seem minor in the face of dire climate predictions, but what we each do matters. We have hundreds of suggestions to pass along to you. We will provide more specifics soon for EGT recycling guidelines. Refer to your HOA or community guidelines if your residence is not served by the Township's refuse and recycling contract.

WINTER WEATHER AND SNOW REMOVAL

Pre-storm Preparedness Checklist:

- ✓ No on-street parking to allow efficient and safe plowing/salting
- ✓ Clear snow from any fire hydrants on or near your property
- Keep a safe distance from all plow trucks
- ✓ Avoid all unnecessary travel
- ✓ Have a 7-day supply of all medications

- ✓ Have 1 gallon of water per person per day on hand
- ✓ Have a 3-day supply of non-perishable food
- ✓ Have baby supplies, diapers, formula, etc.
- ✓ Flashlights and batteries
- ✓ Radio battery operated

- ✓ Blankets
- ✓ Full tank of propane for grill
- ✓ Have your gas tank filled
- ✓ Have your pets inside; make sure they have a 7- day supply of food
- ✓ Have dry wood in a garage or covered for the fireplace or wood stove

Snow Removal:

- We put a layer of brine on the road before the snow event starts; this prevents snow from bonding to the pavement and creating ice.
- Then we put a layer of salt down on the roads when the snow event starts.
- Once the snow starts to accumulate the plows begin to make one pass in and out of every street until the snow stops.
- When the snow stops we begin to clear the streets by pushing the snow to the curb.
- When clearing your driveway **do not** deposit the snow into the roadway; this can cause hazardous conditions for other motorists.
- · Cul-de-sacs and storm drains are the final areas to be cleaned up after a storm.



Important Information on Snow Removal:

- Do not park on the street during a snow event.
- When shoveling your driveway leave the last six feet of your driveway un-shoveled until the plowing has ceased. This un-shoveled part will allow the snow being pushed by the plow to remain on the plow and not pushed into your driveway.
- The Township does not plow residential driveways.
- If an ambulance has been called to an address in the Township, we will help bring in the emergency vehicle.
- Please bear in mind that we cannot be everywhere at once. We will plow all roads in order of traffic priority, first the main roads then the secondary roads.
- Our snow plow drivers are asked to take precautions to avoid striking mailboxes with their plows, but snow can be extremely heavy and a cold brittle mail box can come down easily.



Mailboxes:

- Expensive/Ornate mailboxes should be replaced with a basic mailbox for the winter months
- Mailboxes should be located so the face of the box is 6-8 inches from the edge of the curb. This is according to USPS guidelines. We suggest putting them as far as 15 inches back from the road edge.
- Is your mailbox sturdy? Plastic mailboxes tend to become brittle from the sun's UV rays.
 Make sure the door on the mailbox is closed tightly. If the door is missing or open the mailbox is sure to "fold" on impact of the snow.
- The East Goshen Township Board of Supervisors have passed a resolution that states the Township will reimburse a resident \$25 for replacement or repair of a damaged mailbox, provided the resident has advised the Township of said damages within one week of the snow removal operation. The Township does not repair mailboxes.

THERE'S NO WINTER BREAK FOR PARKS AND RECREATION!

On behalf of my fellow Park Commission members, thanks once again for making 2019 a banner year in our parks! The new playground played host to its first full year of activity and was constantly packed with kids laughing, running and playing with one another...it has truly become the valued community gathering spot we envisioned! One housekeeping note about the playground: the poured in place surfacing is porous, which means it allows water to drain quickly and reduces the negative effects of winter freeze/thaw cycles. Sand should not be moved to the smaller play structure, even though it's fun to do. It gets caught in the surfacing, reducing its overall effectiveness.



It is with great pride that we announce once again some recognition the Township received this year. In April, we were named the 2019 Pennsylvania Parks and Recreation Department of the Year and this past September, we were named a National Parks and Recreation Association Gold Medal Finalist, one of four municipalities from across the nation in the 30,000 and under population category. While we didn't end up winning the gold medal "Grand Plaque", we were the first Gold Medal Finalists from Pennsylvania in the award's sixty-year history, so we were elated with the accomplishment. Each of these awards is given to communities that exhibit excellence over a number of years, so thank you to everyone involved that makes East Goshen Township such a special place. It goes without saying that these awards belong first and foremost to the Township residents who spend their leisure time in our parks. One can simply drive through on any given day and see the many, many people using the parks for a wide variety of activities. As I said above, our parks are the public spaces where people gather as a community, learn new skills, develop friendships and experience a full and memorable life. Congrats to you!



STORMWATER IN THE WINTER: IT'S EVERYONE'S BUSINESS

Environmentally-Friendly Winter Deicing Tips for Residents

Excess salt and other deicing chemicals can harm aquatic life in our streams and impact drinking water supplies. This winter, you can help by following these environmentally-friendly snow removal practices:

- Shovel snow before it turns to ice to limit the need for deicing chemicals like rock salt.
- Shovel snow onto permeable surfaces including gently sloping and level land-scape and grassy areas so as the snow melts it will soak into the ground rather than flow directly into a nearby storm drain or stream.

If you must use deicing chemicals, follow these suggestions:

- Control application of chemical deicers and avoid over application.
- Limit chemical applications near environmentally-sensitive areas such as springs, streams, ponds, wetlands, and water supply areas and sensitive landscape and vegetation.
- Sand and sawdust can be used as an environmentally-friendly alternative to commonly-used salt products.
- Use salt substitutes that are less harmful such as Calcium Chloride (CaCl2) and Calcium Magnesium Acetate (CMA).
- For larger areas, apply salt as a brine solution to prevent drift off of paved surfaces.
- After snowmelt, sweep up residues, including sand, to prevent them from washing into storm drains and streams.

Why should I limit my use of salt and other chemical deicing products?

Deicing products contain chemical constituents that can be harmful to the environment including water resources and drinking water supplies. For example, sodium can break down soil structure and decrease soil permeability, which adversely impacts vegetation and soil microbes; chloride mobilizes heavy metals and impacts fresh water supplies including ground and surface waters; and heavy metal components can adversely impact water quality, plant and aquatic life.

SEWER/REFUSE DISCOUNT PROGRAM FOR LOW INCOME RESIDENTS

In addition to state and federal programs that offer financial assistance to senior citizens and those with lower incomes, East Goshen Township offers a 5% discount on utility bill to residents who meet certain criteria. To be eligible for this discount, a resident who meets the eligibility requirements for any of the following programs must complete an East Goshen Township application by December 31, 2019:

- Senior Citizen Property Tax or Rent Rebate Act (must file PA-1000 with State)
- Pharmaceutical Assistance Contract or the Elderly Act (PACE)
- Federal Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended through 2030
- Women's, Infants and Children's Nutrition Improvement Act
- Aid to Families with Dependent Children
- Public Assistance Law

Residents already enrolled in this program must re-apply each year. Applications to enroll can be obtained at the Township Building. If you have any questions, contact Chris Boylan at the Township 610-692-7171.

2020 TRASH & RECYCLING PICK-UP DAYS

Attention: Change in Trash Collection Dates Upcoming on January 1st!

Please be advised that effective January 1, 2020, we will switch your trash collection days for the next three years. Residents currently on the Monday (trash & recycling) and Thursday (trash only) cycle will be moved to Tuesday (trash & recycling) and Friday (trash only), and vice versa.

This switch is done to ensure fairness across the Township, as residents who have Monday & Thursday service receive fewer pick-up days than those on Tuesday & Friday, due to the trash holidays of Memorial Day, Labor Day and Thanksgiving always falling on either a Monday or Thursday.

Proposal on trash and recycling fees

The 2020 Budget reflected a \$5.12 per quarter increase to the refuse rate (from \$69.88 to \$75 per quarter) for residents served by the Township's trash and recycling contract. This rate increase is necessary to absorb the recent increase in the cost of processing recyclable materials, due to less international demand for U.S. recyclables. Whereas until a couple years ago, the Township received money back from the processor for recycled materials, we now pay \$34 per ton of recycled material. The refuse rate has not been changed since 2011 and, even after this rate increase, East Goshen's rate will still be lower than in several other area municipalities, including West Goshen (\$85 per quarter) and Westtown (\$80 per quarter). If formally adopted by the Board of Supervisors, this higher rate will appear on your January 15th utility bill.

2020 Trash Holiday Schedule

Please be advised that next year there will be no trash (or recycling) pick-ups on:

Monday, May 25, 2020 (Memorial Day)
Monday, September 7, 2020 (Labor Day)
Thursday, November 26, 2020 (Thanksgiving)
Friday, December 25, 2020 (Christmas)

These days will not be made up, meaning that for residents on the Monday-Thursday schedule, the next recycling pick-up will occur on the next Monday after Memorial Day and Labor Day.

Please note that Christmas 2019 and New Years 2020 will fall on a Wednesday this year, when there is no regularly scheduled trash or recycling pick up, so there should be no disruption in regular trash service in East Goshen this holiday season! Joy to the World!


