1. **Pumpkin Challenge** – Ed mentioned this and Ted verified that Jason Lang is planning to have this challenge for the ABC's at the Pumpkin Festival.

**New Business.**

1. **Events** – Ted got an email from Jason Lang outlining events impacted by COVID restrictions. They cancelled the Pumpkin Festival and will try to have the Christmas Tree Lighting virtually. Ted discussed the possibility of having a virtual event. Chris Reardon, who is a township resident and reenactor, was a suggestion. He has a collection of historic guns, etc. Also, Mark mentioned Sean Moir who has made interactive maps of Revolutionary events. Ted will check with Karen at the County to see what they are doing.

2. **2021 Budget** – Ted reported that the 2019 ornaments are being sold at the Sullivan House and the Blacksmith Shop. There will not be a 2020 ornament since the budget is gone due to the pandemic. For future ornaments, he will order 100 instead of 300. They will request the following for the 2021 Budget:

Professional Services –	200
Events -	<u>500</u>
Total	3000

Mark will give this to Jon Altshul. Also, Ted will ask Jon where they record the receipts from the sale of the ornaments.
