- a. C. Supple discussed the film Kiss the Ground and encouraged everyone to watch the film. It deals with soil quality issues across the country. This might be something we can share on the SAC portion of the website.
- b. C. Supple discussed the SAC's recommendation to create the Gardener Laureate program in addition to naming Philip Watson its inaugural recipient.

- c. C. Supple discussed the Sunoco Pipeline Taskforce (SPT) work and encouraged the SAC to pass a motion standing in solidarity with the SPT.
 - i. Motion: The SAC stands in solidarity with the SPT and encourages the Township to act swiftly and decisively to act with the county, engage and notify PennDOT's Engineer. D. Shuey noted they had already been done, but a general motion encouraging solidarity would make sense and align with the SAC's mission. T. Killion expressed concern that he isn't that knowledgeable about the issues, and that the SPT has been tasked with supporting and informing the Township Board of Supervisors. D. Shuey gave an overview of the pipeline's progress and current problems and issues the Township is monitoring. C. Supple to send J. Lang a motion regarding the topic.
