Kilburn discussed a recommendation to pilot a program for larger recycling 21 cans with lids. Larger cans with lids would have the benefits of: 22 i. Residents can increase recycling volume 23 ii. Percentage of turned away recycling would decrease (currently 10%) 24 a. This would be a direct cost-savings to the Township 25 b. M. Kruger and T. Kilburn drove around their respective neighborhoods and 26 about 25-30% of houses have larger totes. They saw grouping of larger totes 27 were it seemed neighbors were talking about the benefits. Maybe we should 28 create a "Recycling Ambassadors" program, M. Truitt said 65 gallon toters 29 might be too big, maybe a max 50g size. M. Kruger to follow up with whether 30 plastic bags would be recyclable in a lidded can. T. Kilburn will get additional 31 information about can sizes, pricing and potential grant programs to offset 32 Township investment and present a recommendation a the February SAC 33 meeting. 34 11.
