NEW BUSINESS

- 1. Discussion of CIP shift Jason explained the Capital Improvement Program which covers large projects for the next 5 years. Currently there is \$92,500 allocated for the Amphitheater shell. He reported that Pickleball has become very popular. He gets calls every day about our courts at the East Goshen Park. There are 6 tennis courts and 3 are being used for Pickleball. After an analysis, it was decided that we only need 3 tennis courts. Jason proposed to shift some of the funds for the shell to resurfacing the other 3 tennis courts into 8 Pickleball courts. Six posts and a net will be included. Wind screens will be installed around all of the courts next year. Joe feels people using the courts should be East Goshen residents. He also feels they should have to sign up so there is a schedule. Jason will look into this. He commented that 2022 application for grants will be for 2023 installation. This will be discussed next month.
- 2. October Events Jason mentioned that the Pumpkin Festival on Saturday October 16 from 10 am 12 noon still needs volunteers. He mentioned the Phelps School and East High School volunteers that he always gets. You should be at the park at 9:30 am. The Food Truck and Music Festival is the same day from 2:30 pm to 6:30 pm.
- Raindate is Sunday. He reviewed the map of the park showing the layout for this event. The East Goshen table
- will be moved to the side of the stage and there will be more bleachers this year.
- 51 <u>3. Toddler Trick or Treat</u> This will be held on October 29 in the playground. Jason wants ABC members to wear costumes.
- 4. Storms Jason mentioned that the first storm was 8 inches high water at the middle pergola in the playground.
- All of the sand and mulch was gone. At 8:30 am the Public Works Department drove to New Jersey to get the kind

of sand required for the surface in the playground. All of the P&R members acknowledged the great job the PW department does to maintain our parks.
