- 5 Bill stated that he represented the TF at the Annual ABC Planning meeting held on
- 6 1/25/22. Bill reported that potential future changes to the TF were discussed and
- 7 explained that this is on the agenda for the current meeting.

## 13 **8a. Possible Changes to the Pipeline Task Force**

Bill reported that at the ABC planning meeting there was discussion on possibly combining the TF with the Planning Commission.

- 17 David explained that the Board's perspective is not to combine the TF with another ABC,

18 but renaming the TF and to refocus its efforts towards more hazard mitigation and

- 19 safety evacuation plans.

21 Derek added that broadly among ABCs, the following changes are under review:

- combine meeting nights, possibly meet less frequently (every other month), have ABC
   members record their meeting notes internally.

David said that currently all is status quo with the TF and that this is an emerging
dialogue among the Board. As liaison, he will gather input from the TF and present the
ideas to the Board. Now that the pipeline is in the ground, what does EGT need regarding
pipeline activities in the next two years? A few topics discussed were: 1) Evacuation

planning, 2) Hazard mitigation, 3) Enhance communication between and with Sunoco,
the Township, and its residents.

32 Bill made a motion that future Pipeline Task Force meetings will be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup>

- 33 Thursday of the month and workshops will be held the 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of the month as
- 34 needed. All meetings will be held in the township building. Also, the TF has the option to
- 35 cancel a monthly meeting as needed with one week notice. Jim seconded. The motion
- 36 passed unanimously.

The TF discussed options for a new name for the TF. The TF agreed that it could become a committee with the name "Pipeline Safety and Public Awareness".

Gerry said that although it is important to have an evacuation plan, this group by itself is
not qualified to develop one. They could provide input and comments. David reminded

43 the TF that Chester County has an Advisory Board addressing this.

6 7	<b>8c. Sunoco work on Boot Rd in front of Wellington</b> There was discussion about the communication between Sunoco and the Township in
8	reference to the work on Boot Rd in front of Wellington. Derek said that he does not
9	think that a PA One Call is sufficient notification from Sunoco to the Township. Sunoco
10	also did not notify Wellington that any work was taking place.
11	
12	Judi asked Derek if the Township has formally provided Sunoco with the notification
13	information the Township's contacts.
14	
15 16	Everyone agreed that the Township will codify the Township's contacts with a letter sent
16	to Sunoco and all companies that have pipelines in EGT. This letter will list Derek Davis as the first contact and Mark Miller as the second. It will also emphasize that 811 is not a
18	sufficient way to notify EGT.
19	
20	Bill question if there is a penalty if Sunoco violates this. Derek said that he will verify this
21	the solicitor and ask how Judge Barnes' decision impacts it.
