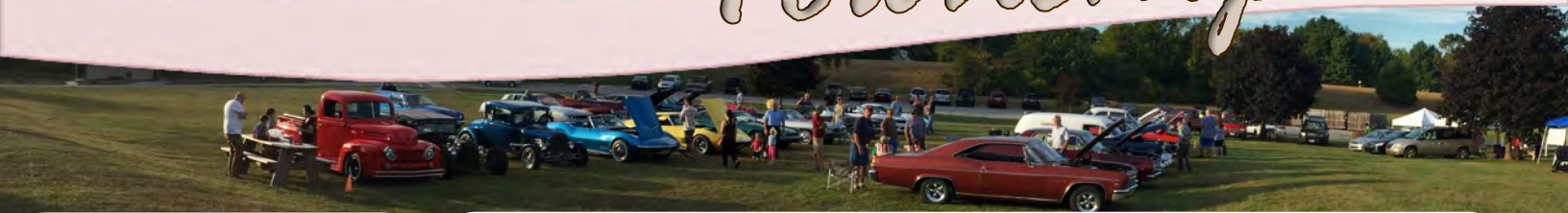

Hello Neighbors!

As I write this update, I am looking outside on a cold, dreary morning, wishing for the warmer, sunnier, spring days ahead. Not usually one to hurry the seasons along, but I am grateful we got through most of the winter without too many big snowfall totals or icy roads.

One "casualty" of winter was that both the park and "triangle" (Boot & Paoli Pike) township informational LED signs stopped working. The internal controllers have been replaced once before in 2018 or so. Unfortunately, both controllers have failed again. We can repair these signs for approximately \$5,000-6,000, or, if we wait until they can be budgeted for next year, spend \$42,500. In the interest of conserving where we can, we are going to take our chances with the refurbished controllers. We will start preparing for replacements in the coming years, considering how much more the signs cost today versus back when they originally were installed.

Things are running smoothly at the Township building under the direction of Derek Davis, our new manager, as well as Dave Ware, our new finance director. If you have any concerns, please do not hesitate to contact Derek so that your issue can be addressed immediately (610-692-7171).

Jason has been busy with the Park and Recreation schedule, introducing new programs that were well received by our community! The tree lighting was beautiful, but being given the chance to see the elves busy at work in the Blacksmith shop while meeting a real-life reindeer? Priceless! Parents, don't worry, there is already a plan to expand the reindeer visit for 2022. And, as in years past, summer camp registration was opened on February 1 and was immediately filled! We currently have a wait list, so if your 16+ year old teens are looking for temporary summer work, and are willing to be camp counselors, that wait list could go away! looks great on a college application and will not take up the entire summer vacation. ALL of the recent donation drives have been immensely successful, thanks to the generous community in which we live, work, & play! The WEGO annual warm coats project brought in record donations, and residents just kept on giving to the Park and Rec toy drive for a record year of over two hundred toys! This enabled Jason to get presents into the hands of over fifty local school children who may not have had a gift to open on Christmas Day. This spring, we also collected over thirty prom gowns, which were given to WCASD students who may not have been able to afford a gown this year. Thank you for being so generous!

Other projects that are in the process are the Hershey's Mill Dam, Milltown Creek Dam, Bow Tree Pond restoration, construction of new pickleball courts, the Ridley Creek sewer treatment plant ultraviolet sanitation system replacement, as well as the Hershey's Mill Estate sewer project. All of these projects are in some stage of completion, whether ready for landscaping, waiting for DEP permits before going out to bid, or applying for grant money to help defray costs. Because there are so many open projects, other projects have to wait for a while before we can dive into them. The Paoli Pike Trail project is not complete, but the eminent domain process has been reversed, and an alternative plan is being considered by the BOS, as well as the people who are directly involved in the project (landowners from whom we may have to request a right of way for completion). This project will resume once the BOS can budget for engineering costs for this small section. In the meantime, please get out and use the trail all the way up to Enterprise Drive, maybe take a loop in the corporate park & head back to the park! The Township has secured approximately \$1.6M in grants for ongoing Township projects! While it's terrific that our amazing staff has

successfully received so much money for these great projects, there is still much to do-projects in the queue, infrastructure that needs upgrading, unforeseen repairs or replacements of equipment and/or vehicles, and the Westtown-East Goshen police (WEGO) contract to negotiate.

While we NEVER want to increase township taxes, there are choices that must be made to keep taxes where they are. Unfortunately, the projects currently in progress are projects that were started under the direction of past boards, and many of the projects seem to have converged into 2021 and 2022, with the likelihood some will not be completed until 2023. That means continuing to seek grants to help offset tax dollars whenever possible. When it comes to WEGO, we MUST fund our fine police department. Inflation is affecting us all. We are all experiencing supply chain issues, various shortages, fuel increases, and property tax revenues do not go up with inflation. In the event we are close to having to make a decision that NONE of us want to have to make, please be assured that there will be ample communication with residents if a tax increase is even being considered. While no one wants to see taxes go up, no one wants the level of services to be decreased, or projects to go unfinished. I would invite you ALL to attend meetings, particularly when we begin our budget workshops in the fall. It's so easy now because our hybrid board room is completely installed! Zoom capability has changed how we do business-from anywhere at all, you can interact with us live in meetings; it's great! Meetings will be posted to YouTube.

Looking to the future, we have a lot of terrific things planned for the spring, summer, and fall! During the pandemic, it became evident immediately that residents relied heavily on the Park and Recreation Department to fill needs-help with kids during the summertime, exercise opportunities in the park (pickleball, tennis, baseball, softball, and basketball to name a few!), Zoom programs, as well as community events for all. Please join us for the Easter Egg Hunt at the Park (April 9), Community Day (June 25), and be sure to be in the Park this summer, you never know when something BIG might happen...especially during the week of August 15!

Please look for our electronic newsletters, constant contact announcements, and for something new, we are going to try to take this show "on the road"! For at least two meetings this year, we are going to try to get out into the community to bring a board meeting to your neighborhood! Those meetings will have agendas with topics that are most important to your area, so we encourage you to come out to hear those updates and give your input to us directly.

As always, it is our pleasure to serve our community as supervisors of the township. Please do not hesitate to contact any one of us, or all of us, with your questions, concerns, and comments.

Now Handling East Goshen Township Real Estate Taxes

East Goshen Township Taxes

Chester County Treasurer's Office is now handling all aspects of East Goshen Township real estate taxes. Your 2022 East Goshen Township tax bill was mailed from the Chester County Treasurer's Office in early February 2022.

East Goshen Township tax payment options:

- * Pay DISCOUNT amount before March 31 *OR*
- * Pay FACE amount between April 1 – May 31
- * After May 31, any tax not paid will be due at 10% penalty amount

Payment for East Goshen Township taxes must be remitted to Chester County Treasurer, 313 W. Market St., Suite 3202, PO Box 2748, West Chester, PA 19380. **Check must be payable to: Chester County Treasurer.**

Are your taxes escrowed in your mortgage? If so, your mortgage company should be sending your East Goshen Township tax payment to Chester County Treasurer. We suggest asking your mortgage company before remitting your personal check for payment.

A Message from State Representative Dianne Herrin

To the Residents of the 156th Legislative District

After much consideration, I will not be running for a second term as your State Representative. My reasons for retiring are primarily personal, and I want to reassure you that I will continue to serve this community throughout the remainder of my term, which expires November 30, 2022.



As I reflect on the past 15 months, I am very proud of the high level of service my District Office staff has provided. My team has resolved 99% of our 2,971 district cases to date – including unemployment claims, tax questions, professional licensing inquiries, SEPTA pass requests, state record questions, unclaimed property retrievals, and PennDOT issues – and together we expedited hundreds of COVID-19 vaccination appointments for seniors who needed help. I am also proud of our work supporting those who live along the Mariner East pipeline in their ongoing efforts to restore clean water disrupted by pipeline construction, be the watchdogs on the ground, and secure viable emergency evacuation plans. I am honored to assist the many committed residents and local officials who continue to work tirelessly to preserve the entirety of Crebilly Farm. I voted on many bills that reflect the promises I made to you during my campaign, which include supporting quality public education, boosting our local economy, and protecting the environment. My staff and I also shed light on the pressing need to address the early childhood education crisis with a successful policy hearing and video series. I also introduced two bills in Harrisburg – the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI) Investments Act, and an Act to Hold Government Contractors Accountable for Past Failures, the latter which may soon pass the PA House.

While I will no longer be serving as your state legislator as of December 1, I will never stop pursuing my passion for public service. I have served the West Chester area for more than two decades as a highly active volunteer, West Chester Mayor, and State Representative, and I look forward to applying the invaluable insights I gained in all of these roles to continue supporting and improving our community in the months and years ahead.

I extend my sincere gratitude to all citizens of the 156th District, including our friends and neighbors who work every day to improve our community and the citizens who advocate for a stronger democracy through the political process, my legislative colleagues, and my amazing staff here in our District Office and in Harrisburg.

Did you know???

How much water does it take to make one cotton shirt?

Answer: 715 gallons (2700 liters) of water

Wow - come to the sustainability expo to find out how we can live more sustainably.

How much water do you use a day?

Answer: People in the U.S. use approximately 100 gallons of fresh, drinkable water per day for bathing, drinking, flushing, cleaning and yard care. And this number only takes into account the amount of water we use directly every day. 2 - 7 gallons per flush. 17 gallons to shower. 25 gallons to wash a load of clothes. 27 gallons to hand wash a sink of dishes. 3 gallons to run the dishwasher.

How much of EG waste is yard waste and food waste?

Answer: Together, yard debris and food waste account for nearly 30% of the materials disposed in U.S. landfills. However, both these items can easily be composted instead!

Is the idea of Meatless Monday effective?

Answer: Based on current data and consumption patterns, if everyone on the planet went without meat for one day per week, we could reduce emissions by an estimated 1.0 gigaton per year. That's equal to taking 273 million cars off the road.

The Blacksmith Shop has reopened for 2022



If you are interested in history and/or want to watch a blacksmithing demonstration, the Goshenville Blacksmith Shop is now open. Through January and February the weather was too cold to open the unheated shop, but by early March the water in the slack barrel had thawed and temperatures were warm enough to open to visitors.

Over the winter the forge's primary anvil was sent out for repairs and is now in better condition than when it was purchased in 1971. We have also learned more about the history of the wheelwright shop including why there are large doors into the second floor on the south wall of the building. We can also answer question like why the two main anvils have heavy chains around their waists and what our 500 lb. swage block was used for.

Being your questions about the early years of the Ashbridge family who built the wheelwright shop and forge, about the old Goshenville general store built ca. 1800 across 352 from the shops, or about the Hickman Plank House on the east side of the blacksmith shop parking lot.

Both the Blacksmith shop and Plank House are open on Wednesdays and Saturdays 10 AM to 4 PM from mid March through October.

Private tours can be scheduled for days other than Wednesday or Saturday by contacting the receptionist at the East Goshen Township building.
