#### **Chairperson's Report**

- 2 Gerry received an email from Christina Morley regarding the purchase and installation of
- 3 a water monitoring system near the Adelphia valve station on Paoli Pike. This is an
- 4 online system that would monitor and report pollutants in the creek near the valve
- 5 station. Gerry outlined the initial and ongoing costs. The Willistown Conservancy has
- already implemented a plan for monitoring local water ways including Ridley Creek. 6
- 7 Gerry recommended and the TF agreed that the Township not pursue this system at this
- 8 time. Gerry will keep the information for future reference.

#### **New Business**

### 8a. Adelphia Gateway monitoring and preparation for operations

- 17 Gerry asked Derek if Adelphia provided an update regarding the aerial inspection work
- 18 that was done recently in preparation of their pipeline conversion to natural gas. Derek
- 19 replied that he did not receive an update. Derek continued that Adelphia was originally
- 20 planning to go active in Q1 of 2022 but this will now take place Q2 of 2022. Derek added
- 21 that based on Federal regulations, Adelphia will be putting in new markers and some
- 22 may be placed on resident's properties.

## 8b. PUC Invites Public Comments on Enhancements to Regulations for Petroleum and Hazardous Liquids Pipelines

- Gerry stated the Chester County Planning Commission posted an announcement on their
- 27 website stating that the PUC published a notice on February 12 inviting public comment 28 on a Proposed Rulemaking Regarding Hazardous Liquid Public Utility Safety Standards.
- 29 There is a 60-day window for comment. Gerry asked Derek if he was notified to which he
- 30 responded no.

Gerry explained that this invitation for comments was the outcome of a meeting and an advanced notice of proposed rulemaking from 2019.

- 39 what the BOS already submitted. If needed, the TF can provide additional comments and
- 40 Derek can place this item on a future BOS agenda.

- 43 9a. Sunoco work on Boot Rd in front of Wellington
- 44 Derek reported that he is currently working with the Township solicitor on this issue.
- 45 The Township is planning to send a letter to Sunoco strongly stating that PA One Call is

not sufficient notification of future work. ET/Sunoco needs to notify both Derek Davis and Mark Miller from the Township.

# 9b. Sunoco Pipeline Maintenance Line Road

Derek explained that Sunoco will be back to complete seeding this area along with the Wellington and other areas as needed. The Township will monitor that these areas are properly restored.

#### 9c. 352 Subsidence
