Chairperson's Report

5 Gerry shared highlights from an article in The Associated Press reporting that the US 6 Transportation Department adopted a new rule for installation of pipeline emergency 7 shutoff valves. This rule is in response to past pipeline incidents that occurred across the 8 country. While this is a step in the right direction, it is not a cure-all solution since it only 9 applies to newly constructed or replaced pipelines. Also, even with these shutoff valves 10 and other emergency measures, a significant amount of hazardous material could be released during an accident due to the high operating pressure and long distances 11 12 between the valves in the pipeline.
