From The Chair...

Happy Fall, Y'all!

With the impending turning of the leaves, a reminder to anyone with a storm drain on their property, please be sure to unblock drains before a storm so the flow of water can be unimpeded. Or call the township if you see a storm drain in need of being cleared.

Other reminders for fall-SCHOOL IS BACK IN SESSION!! Please, be mindful of school buses! Where there are buses, there are children. When the red lights and stop sign are engaged, children are getting on to/off of the bus. Motorists must STOP behind the bus on our streets, as well as undivided highways. Watch your speed in your own neighborhoods, and please remind teen drivers that there are small children at play or getting onto/off of the buses in the neighborhoods, they should slow down in the their community.

And it's the most wonderful time of the year, when political candidates start knocking on your doors! Please remember that any political or religious representatives are free to exercise their First Amendment rights to inform and educate us on their beliefs. They are NOT required to get a township permit, they are NOT soliciting/selling anything, & they are NOT required to observe individua "no soliciting" signs you have posted. You may choose to answer the door or not, you may tell them please leave, but this is not a police concern. What IS a concern is when a solicitor knocks on your door without having gotten the required township permit, which comes with a township issued ID that they are required to wear when soliciting. These people are also required to follow the "do not knock" ordinance we have in the township. If you ask for the ID, they must show it to you. If you are on the "do not knock" list, you can tell them they are not following the list and that you are reporting them to the township IMMEDIATELY. Please call the township between 8am and 4:30pm so management can send out someone to issue a warning to the solicitor. After 4:30, please call 911 for the police to come out and site them. Their company will be notified with the first infraction, and with an additional infraction, their company will lose their permit to solicit for one year. If they do not have a permit, the township will deal with that as well. It does no good to call the next day, please take a minute to speak up immediately so we can

help crack down on the offensive solicitations in our community.

Last update for the fall is to remind residents that we are holding meetings every Tuesday in September to begin the budget process in earnest. You are ALL invited to come out, give us your opinion on what things are important to spend more money on, what things you see as less important, and to see how the township budget process is done from the beginning to end. The budget will go to final approval in December, but the most important part of the process is happening NOW, when YOU can have a say on how we spend your tax dollars!

As an update to the Hershey's Mill Dam Park wetland, we are currently going through the punch list and awaiting the final inspection from the state/county. We are also waiting for the landscape architect to take Mark Miller through the wetlands to explain the maintenance requirements needed moving forward. Vegetation is starting to grow up through the walkway, which is making the walkway "disappear" and a little more "grippy". Having personally seen the new set up in action on Tuesday in the storm (we received over 3" in just over an hour!), we have more assurance that this new system works as intended. In past storms of several inches of rain, Greenhill Road would often need to be closed because the water ran over the roadway, presenting a hazard for motorists. At no point was there water over Greenhill Road, all water went through the three existing culverts, there was no ponding on the residential properties adjacent to the stream, and the walkway was never under water. Look for more history on the dam and a ribbon cutting in the spring!

Optional Electronic Payment Program for utility bill:

This program is offered as a complimentary service to our residents. If enrolled in this electronic payment program, we will still mail the utility bill so you know how much it is, but it will indicate "STATEMENT ON-LY". Utility bills are mailed on/around January 15th, April 15th, July 15th, and October 15th and are due at the end of the following months. When enrolled, we will pull the quarterly utility bill amount, from the bank account provided, on February 20th, May 20th, Aug 20th, and November 20th (or the next business day if these are a weekend).

To enroll in the electronic payment program, please complete the form found on our website at www.eastgoshen.org, select SERVICES, FORMS AND APPLICATIONS, ELECTRONIC PAYMENT AUTHORIZATION FORM. Include a voided check with the completed form when you send it to the Township Building, 1580 Paoli Pike, West Chester, PA 19380. Alternatively, we have a drop box at the front of the building where you can place the completed form and voided check any time of the day or night, no postage necessary.

How Public Works Prepares for the Winter Weather

The East Goshen Township Public Works begins preparing for winter storms well in advance. They start preparing in early November. Once the buzz of snow is reported all the snow equipment will be checked from snow shovels to the loaders and dump trucks with the plows will be put on and ready to go.

First, if a snow event is imminent crews will arrive in the early morning hours of the day prior to the storm and apply a layer of salt brine to the



road. The salt brine is designed to separate the initial layer of snow to the road. Once the salt brine is applied crews will return to their shop, clean and restore the apparatus to snow ready.

Second, the public works crew just like all of you are watching the weather closely to determine the timing of the snow event and the big question... How much snow is expected? Crews will fuel all apparatus and load the salt trucks, so there is no delay from when the snow starts to the trucks getting on roads.

Just as the snow begins to fall crews will man their assigned apparatus and depart to their assigned snow plow routes. A layer of rock salt will be applied to all roadways initially. As the snow begins to



pile up, crews will begin plowing the roadways, the roadways are maintained for emergency vehicles and essential personnel to pass through. We prioritize main roads then back roads and neighborhoods. We ask that if you do not need to be out in the weather please stay home for your safety. Crews will plow until the snow event is at its end. Once the snow has completely stopped the team will push the snow all the way back to the curb and clean up all intersections and apply the final layer of salt.











Helpful tips for residents to prepare for the winter season

- 1. Inspect your mailbox before the winter season. To prevent damage during a storm, make sure they do not extend past the road edge and that the posts are sturdy.
- 2. Trim any tree limbs that are hanging over your curbs.
- 3. Please remove vehicles, trash cans and basketball nets from roadways to help relieve hazards for the plow operator.
- 4. Do not pile your snow on the roadway or side of roadway; please pile it in your yard.
- 5. At the end of the storm, we plow all roadways edge to edge. If you have shoveled your driveway before this happens your driveway will be plowed shut again.
- 6. If you do not have to be on the roads during a winter storm, please stay off them until they are clear.

Hope to see you at the Pumpkin Festival in the Park on October 15th! Like last year, we are offering children the opportunity to create birdfeeders out of pinecones and paper rolls, sun butter and birdseed, that they can hang on adjacent trees. They can also make an extra one to take home.

This year we are offering additional projects too! Children will be able to create animals out of natural materials we will provide. They can learn about the types of bees that pollinate pumpkins in a fun way. Plus, we will show them how to use small pumpkins as birdfeeders, and how to prepare pumpkins so that deer and smaller animals can enjoy the delicious pumpkin meat inside. (Of course you can save a few pumpkins if you plan to make your own pumpkin pies!)

We will show children (and adults) how to harvest and prepare pumpkin seeds for eating, and how to plant them to grow their own pumpkins for next year.



Sustainability Expo:

Last May we offered our first Sustainability Expo to East Goshen residents. We were able to provide excellent resources, products and services offered by local businesses. This event was well attended and received very positive feedback. By popular demand, we plan to offer another Expo on Saturday, April 15, 2023. We expect this time the event will be held in our Park in order to give us more space. We may also partner with the West Goshen SAC to plan this event, and include a wider range of offerings to our combined pool of residents. Stay tuned, and save the date!

A few things to remember:

- 1. Take reusable bags with you whenever you shop. Keep some in your car. Refuse single use plastic bags, and paper ones too when possible.
- 2. Recycle as many glass, metal and plastic products as possible.
- 3. Join the East Goshen Buy Nothing group on Facebook to share no longer needed items in good condition, or schedule pick up by a charity. Don't throw away what someone else can still use!
- 4. Be creative instead of buying. Reduce your carbon footprint by buying locally instead of online when you need to purchase a gift item.
- 5. Wrap gifts in leftover fabric, scarves, plain paper with your own drawings, special messages, etc. Or use gift bags which can be reused many times, instead of non-recyclable shiny gift paper.

Consider reducing outdoor light displays for winter holidays to respect the needs of nocturnal birds and wildlife. Light up inside instead if you want to use lights.

How would YOU handle a pipeline emergency?



In the last newsletter, the Pipeline Task Force gave you some tips as to how to best handle a pipeline emergency. As we all know, prior preparation is a good thing. It is practical to be prepared. Of the approximate 18,200 residents of East Goshen around 16,000 of us live less ½ mile from an active pipeline which is the evacuation radius in the event of a leak in some pipelines in our town. These pipelines carry natural gas, butane, ethane, and propane.

One the most important duties of our public officials is to keep us safe. Chester County spent over 2 years reviewing possible threats to our county and in July 2021 released its "Hazard Mitigation Plan". This plan includes risk assessments and action steps to be taken to lessen hazards. There are a number of action steps that are being taken. Bocce Courts at East Goshen Park!



The EGT Park bocce courts are open for play! Special thanks to Rian Gionfriddo for completing this Eagle Scout Project. Want to learn how to play? The Township has two sets available at the Township Building. They can be signed out for up to two days. Below are the basic rules based on the United States Bocce Federation.

Game Objective:

The object is to throw your bocce balls closer to the Pallino, than your opponent. The first team to reach 12 points wins the game (must win by 2).

Equipment:

Set of 8 balls with different colors and "pallino" the target ball. Measuring Device

Players:

Need two teams - can have up to 8 people

Court Lines:

- Center Line- Used when tossing the pallino.
- Foul Line typically 13' from boundary line. You can not go over the foul line when rolling the ball

Start the game!

- Flip a coin between the teams. The winner of the coin flip throws the pallino.
- The pallino must pass the center line but cannot hit the back wall
- The original team who tossed the pallino should toss the first bocce ball.
- The opposing Team must toss the ball until they make a new (closer) point. This will alternate until all balls are in play.
- At the end of each frame, points will be awarded. Only one team scores in a frame. One point is awarded for each ball that is closer to the pallino than the closest ball of the opposing team.
- Winners of the previous frame get to toss the pallino in the next frame.
- Games are usually played till 12
