Monthly Flows:

The average daily flow to West Goshen was 673,239 per day.

Meters:

The meters were read on a daily basis.

C.C. Collection:

All pump stations were visited on a daily basis; the wet wells were washed down. We received a call from a resident on Glenmont Lane who stated that sewage was backing up into his home. We went down and found that his trap was full of grease and the clean out stack pipe was out of the hub. I gave him a copy of the local contractors to call to get it repaired.

C.C. Interceptor:

We are in the process of scheduling to televise the trunk line from Strasburg Road down to the Westtown Way meter. This work has to be done between the hours of 12:00 am to 5:00 am, and we have to plug the lines so we can get a full visual of the pipe.

R.C. Collection:

The pump stations were visited on a daily basis. We received a seal failure alarm on Christmas day so I changed the run sequence so the pump would only run if the other pump could not keep up with the flow. We swapped the pump out the next day. We cleared the sanitary sewer line right of way thru the golf course. While we were clearing the right of way, we pulled the manhole lids to check the condition of the manholes, which were fine.

Hibberd Lane meter locked up this month, John Laidley was called in to repair the issue. The meter is up and running.

Ridley Creek Plant:

We performed general maintenance as needed. We had a problem with pump #2 for the utility water. We are scheduled to clean the line from metering manhole into the screen room. We had Lenni cut out power to the plant while PECO did repairs on Line Road.

Hershey Mill sewer line Replacement:

I have been keeping the residents informed on what the status of the project is. I had asked Mike to have his people stake out the easements thinking this would get the residents attention, which it did. I have been speaking to residents advising then that we would be utilizing the easements. Public Works still has to put the roads in for the contractor, which we hope to de next week. We can discuss further at the meeting.

Alarms:

We responded to 21 alarms for December.

PA 1 Calls:

We responded to over 57 PA One Calls for the month December.

Monthly Rainfall:

6.20 inches of rain for the month of December.

<u>Lateral repairs or Caps:</u> We had two cleanout repairs for December.

Ridley Creek Sewage Treatment Plant (RCSTP)

• Caustic Soda Conversion – We conducted a pre-construction field meeting with Jim Woods (the PADEP "certified installer" consultant) and Public Works. Jim requested that vacuum control valves be added to the chemical feed pumping system and that thermal expansion be added to the exterior tank suction piping. We obtained cost quotes from Pyrz (supplier of the tank and chemical feed pumps) for the applicable equipment that has been forwarded to the Township and plant operator for review. Jim expects that PADEP will authorize the permit within approximately one week of submission of the application, at which point the tank and system can go into use. The permit application cannot be submitted until all work is complete.

We also met virtually with Scott Towler to determine the alarms and controls scoping for the tank and chemical feeds. The controls will remain the same as those from the caustic trial with pump feed rates adjusted manually (not automatically controlled by pH or other conditions). There will be outside visual alarms for a tank leak (via interstitial monitoring between the tank walls) and tank high level. The tank level is also proposed to be visible through SCADA with remote alarm notifications for tank high and low levels only.

• UV Disinfection System – The system is being fabricated by Glasco, and delivery is expected in late February or early March 2023.

The bidding and contracting schedule for the mechanical and electrical work remains dependent on the notification of awards for the Commonwealth Financing Authority (CFA) Local Share Account (LSA) grants. Awards are expected to occur on January 12, but we are not aware that the agenda for the CFA meeting has been made available yet to confirm the grant awards will be considered.

We are awaiting advertisement until the CFA's public meeting is scheduled to make the LSA awards. The UV solicitations for mechanical and electrical work can then be advertised. The tentative bidding schedule follows, based upon the CFA meeting occurring on January 12:

- Bid Advertisement late January
- Bids Due mid-to-late February
- Award Consideration March 13, 2023 at the Municipal Authority Meeting
- Generator #2 Replacement We are continuing with design and coordination with vendors on pricing for various size generators.

Westtown Way Pump Station

No update since our last report.

Sanitary Sewer Pipe Rehab

 Supplee Valley – No have updated the construction scope and construction cost estimate for pipe lining the remainder of the asbestos cement sewers in the neighborhood and will submit to the Township for review. We anticipate bidding the project in February 2023 with construction in earlyto-mid 2023.

Engineer's Report

 Hershey's Mill Estates – We prepared the Intent to Award and Precast Commitment letters to the low bidder, Joao & Bradley. We reviewed construction submittals and shop drawings for the manholes, storm sewer endwall, and bypass pumping plan. It is our understanding that the manholes and endwall have been ordered. We are awaiting the contractor's bonds and insurance documents, which need to be in-hand to execute the contract.

We recommend the MA formally award the contract to Joao & Bradley at the January 9th MA meeting conditioned that the contract not be signed until after the CFA's January 12th meeting in which they are tentatively expected to award grants.

An initial pre-construction meeting was conducted, and a second pre-construction meeting is scheduled for January 10.

We also prepared a revised design of pipe slopes and manhole invert elevations since all manholes are now expected to be replaced given the bid pricing. The revised design provides for increased pipe slopes on certain pipe segments that are currently very flat. A Construction Issue set of plans was prepared accordingly and has been issued.

We provided the Township with quantities of materials for storm sewer piping for the Township to order.

We have contacted PADEP about the procedure for amending the GP-11 permit to include the additional wetland crossing at the upstream end of the project site to allow for additional construction access off of Tanglewood Drive and are awaiting their direction. A revised / supplemental permit application will be submitted pending their response.

A field survey stakeout of the existing easement and proposed limit of disturbance, which extends outside the easement, was performed at the end of the Fox Glove Lane cul-de-sac for use by the Township in discussing the need for temporary construction easements with the two property owners.

Provided the contract is executed by January 13, the contractor intends to mobilize the week of January 16 and begin pipe replacement on January 23, starting at the downstream end. They will provide a detailed schedule after the second pre-construction meeting.


 Ridley Creek Exposed Sewer Rehab – A full PADEP permit application has been prepared and will be submitted to PADEP in follow-up to the emergency authorization now that construction has been completed.

New Connections

- 301 Reservoir Road We reviewed a Land Development sketch plan for the 5-lot residential subdivision and provided a comment letter including a comment that design and Sewage Facilities Planning for a public sewer extension is required.
- 1671 and 1681 Strasburg Road We performed a cursory review of a sketch plan for an approximately 1,800-LF long low pressure sewer lateral to connect the proposed residential property to the sewer main immediately upstream of the treatment plant.

Industrial Pretreatment Ordinance

 No activity since our last report. As discussed at the May 2021 MA meeting, a headworks study with sampling at the RCSTP can be conducted to set contaminant limits.





Executive Summary

The Ridley Creek sewage treatment plant outfall 001 is anticipated to achieve compliance with all effluent limitations regarding water quality for the month of December. All supplemental reports were submitted for the month of November with the eDMR. Discharge to the Applebrook irrigation lagoon remains offline. Chemical usage utilized for, and total alkalinity remained consistent with previous months. Aluminum sulfate solution volumes were slightly increased to a daily average of 72.6 as compared to the previous month at 70.0 gpd to achieve phosphorus removal. No significant mechanical or operational issues were observed during the operation of sludge dewatering equipment or SBR treatment process. Sludge dewatering continues at around 500,000 gallons or more per month. There were no odor complaints during the month.

Treatment Process Operation

Table 1 illustrates the final effluent composite sample data reported to date for outfall 001 December 2022. The month-to-date average total phosphorus was reported as 0.15 mg/L as compared to the permit limitation of 0.50 mg/L. The TSS samples were consistently in single digits, except for the December 6th test result of 11.5 mg/L. The results remain below the weekly maximum of 15 mg/L. The draft monthly average TSS is reported as 6.5 mg/L as compared to the discharge limitation of 10 mg/L.

The final effluent test results demonstrate that the biological treatment process performed well during October. The sequencing batch reactors (SBRs) numbered 2, 3, and 4 were in service. Process monitoring of each SBR included ammonia as N, nitrite as N, Nitrate as N, COD, SSV, MLSS, and total phosphorus. Daily analysis of the final effluent flow equalization grab sample for

total phosphorus is ongoing. Sample collection and analysis of the influent wastewater collected at the influent pump station wet well is ongoing.

Discharge to the Applebrook irrigation lagoon, outfall 002 remains offline.

The influent wastewater pollutant concentrations and loading entering the wastewater treatment facility generally remained within the design concentration and organic loading values. The TSS and CBOD₅ monthly average weekly concentrations were generally observed to be less than the design parameters for the treatment process.

Table 2 presents the available pollutant data for the influent wastewater collected at the doghouse manhole during December 2022.

The foam on the SBR surface remained consistent with November with approximately 15% to 20% coverage of the surface area. The foam thickness is approximately 2 inches with a light to medium brown color. These conditions may contribute to a decrease in clarity within the final effluent post-flow equalization basins; however, the clarity is improved after passing through the disc filters. The operation strategy is to lower the MLSS to maintain a F:M ratio of 0.06 while ensuring the ammonia effluent discharge concentration remains within the seasonal limit of 2.5 mg/L.

During December, the average monthly influent wastewater flow measured at the "field" flow meter was 463,911 gallons/day as compared to the influent flow into the SBRs as 473,220 gallons/day. The difference between the daily averages is 9,309 gpd, which is consistent with the average daily volume of internal recycle flow of 13,997 gpd. These values are considered typical as the flows to the SBR should be greater due to including all the internal recycle flows.

<u>C.C. Collection:</u> All pump stations were visited on a daily basis. The wet wells were washed down and the FOG rods were cleaned. We did get a call for a sewer backup at Ellis Lane. However, the problem was on the homeowner's side of the sewer.

C.C. Interceptor:

R.C. Collection: The pump stations were visited on a daily basis. The wet wells were cleaned. We did respond to four alarms due to power outages. The generators ran and kept the stations in service.

- Ridley Creek Plant: We have started work on the caustic soda system. The pump table was built in the shop and taken down to the plant to be put in place. Lenni Electric has been running the bridge conduit for the alarms and power for the pumps. They also installed additional conduit for some of the communication lines that Verizon installed. We had a problem on December 1 when a limb came in contact with a high voltage line. PECO was on location when the line dropped. We had to call Lenni in to throw the disconnect 33KV switch. Once power was installed, Lenni threw the switch and we brought the plant back on line. Kevin is setting up the schedule to clean the main trunk line from the new meter pit into the screen room. John Laidley will be on hand so he can zero out the
- new flow meter.
 We have started clearing the lay down area at the Hershey Mill sewer project. Stumps were
 excavated and the soil was hauled out. Millings were hauled in and a level area was constructed.

Alarms: We responded to 22 alarms for November.

Monthly Rainfall: 3.15 inches of rain for the month of November.

<u>Lateral Repairs or Caps</u>: We had nine cleanout repairs for November. We had a clog at Glenmont Lane today.

Ridley Creek Sewage Treatment Plant (RCSTP)

- Caustic Soda Conversion We are prepared to assist the PW Department with construction layout for the concrete pad and installation work, if needed. We obtained the attached cost quote from a PADEP "certified installer" for inspection and sign-off of the PADEP bulk tank permit application as the system is installed by the PWD. The permit application will be submitted to PADEP after installation with the certified installer's certification. We are also setting up a meeting with the operator to determine the alarm needs for the caustic system (i.e. leak detection, liquid level, chemical feed pump failure, etc.). Dana moved to approve \$1,245 fee for Data Design Services. Jack seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
 - UV Disinfection System The system is being fabricated by Glasco, and delivery is expected in late February or early March 2023.

The bidding and contracting schedule for the mechanical and electrical work remains dependent on the notification of awards for the Commonwealth Financing Authority (CFA) Local Share Account (LSA) grants. Those awards had been expected to occur in November, but the funding agency, PA DCED, informed us that the awards will now occur in January at the earliest, but it could be later than that.

The MA authorized bidding at the November MA meeting with the intention to advertise the solicitations in early December. However, we now propose to extend the advertisement to occur when the CFA's public meeting schedule to make the LSA awards is announced. The UV solicitations can then be advertised approximately one month in advance of the CFA meeting so that UV bids will be received and can be awarded right after the CFA meeting. The tentative revised bidding schedule follows, based upon the CFA meeting occurring in late January:

- Generator #2 Replacement We are continuing with design and coordination with vendors on pricing for various size generators.

No update since our last report.

Sanitary Sewer Pipe Rehab

- Supplee Valley No have updated the construction scope and construction cost estimate for pipe lining the remainder of the asbestos cement sewers in the neighborhood and will submit to the Township for review. We anticipate bidding the project in January 2023 with construction in early 2023.
- Hershey's Mill Estates We administered the bidding process including responding to prospective bidders' questions, conducting two on-site pre-bid meetings, re-designing portions of the access routes and sewer alignment based upon the site meetings, adding storm sewer replacement scope, coordinating for pre-construction site clearing and site preparation by the Township, preparing and issuing Addendum #1 consisting of a new plan set and updated specification sections, and conducting bid opening. Bids were received on December 8, and an unofficial bid tabulation is attached. We are preparing an official bid tabulation and reviewing bid documents, and we will confirm the bid and scope with the low bidder and also check references in order to make an award recommendation.
 - If the CFA LSA grant award meeting is scheduled to occur in January, we will recommend award at the January MA meeting conditioned that the contract cannot be executed/signed until after the CFA meeting since that grant requires that contracts not be signed or Notice to Proceed (NTP) issued until after grant awards are made. PA DCED confirmed that the contract can be signed and NTP issued immediately after the CFA meeting so we do not have to wait several months for the subsequent grant agreement to be provided and executed, if the grant is awarded.
 - If the CFA meeting is not scheduled in January, we can discuss with the low bidder about extending the contract award timeframe beyond the 60 days that is provided in the bid document, in which case award consideration would then be projected to occur at the

The Ridley Creek sewage treatment plant outfall 001 achieved compliance with all effluent limitations regarding water quality for the month of November. All supplemental reports were submitted for the month of October with the eDMR. Discharge to the Applebrook irrigation lagoon was discontinued during September. Chemical usage utilized for pH and total alkalinity remained consistent with previous months. Aluminium sulfate solution volumes were slightly increased to a daily average of 70.0 as compared to the previous month at 69.1 gpd to achieve phosphorus removal. No significant mechanical or operational issues were observed during operation of sludge dewatering equipment or SBR treatment process. Sludge dewatering continues to be increased to avoid potential odors during the sludge holding tank decanting process. There were no odor complaints during the month.

Gentlemen,

I wanted to share the 2023 Proposed Municipal Authority Budget with you all.

Expenses are driving the revenue needed from the Sewer Operating Fund and Sewer Capital Reserve Fund for 2023. We also anticipate grant reimbursement for the RCSTP Caustic Soda project.

The majority of expenses are necessitated by projects and ongoing infrastructure maintenance. We anticipate upgrades to the Hershey Mill Pump Station, relining of Supplee Valley AC pipe, final payments for the Westtown Way Pump Station improvements, rebuild/install SBR and Sludge pumps at the RCSTP, replace the RCSTP generator, completion of the Hershey's Mill Estates Sewer Rehabilitation, completion of the Caustic Soda Project, manhole lining, new RC flow meter and media for filters, and a replacement Muffin Monster. That's over \$1.5M needed from Reserves and the Operating Fund. Even with the sewer fixed rate increase of \$20/QTR implemented in Q4 2022, I project a \$159K balance reduction in the Sewer Operating Fund and a \$648K reduction in the Sewer Reserve Fund. Hopefully, with the majority of work done in 2023 as outlined in the 5 Year Capital Plan (included in the agenda), we will be able to transfer more dollars each year from Operating to Reserve, and that the current interest rate environment will help grow those savings. In 2023, I plan to work on an extensive asset management plan for the sewer plant and system to understand the need for sewer rate increases for the next 10 years. Then I can begin the process of educating our populace about the system, its costs and age, and the plan of any rate increase as well as why.

I hope this provides some clarity to the figures shared in the 2023 MA Budget. Please note that I have not included outstanding grant money that has not been awarded as of this date.

Responsibilities

The Municipal Authority, which is a legally separate entity from the Township, is responsible for financing the construction, expansion, monitoring, and upgrade of the Township's sewage collection and treatment infrastructure

2022 Accomplishments

Pennoni Associates Inc. (Pennoni) is pleased to submit the following proposal to the East Goshen Municipal Authority for construction administration and inspection services for the Hershey's Mill Estates sanitary sewer replacement. It also addresses increased effort that was required for the bid phase beyond that which was previously estimated.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

1. Bid Assistance

Pennoni provided bid assistance services consisting of attendance at pre-bid meetings on-site, issuance of addenda, response to questions from prospective bidders, re-design of the sewer alignment and access routes to address bidder comments to enhance bid competitiveness, storm sewer and other scope additions requested by the Township, assistance with ordering of materials by the Township, coordination on award and funding with the LSA grant funding agency (PA DCED), review of bids, and recommendation for construction contract award.

The bid assistance work was authorized by the Municipal Authority for payment on a Time and Materials basis for an estimated amount of \$7,500.00 not to be exceeded without approval from the Municipal Authority. The scope and associated level of effort exceeded that which was originally projected since there were two pre-bid meetings (instead of one) and notable plan revisions, scope additions, and addenda based on bidders' feedback in order to maximize the competitiveness of bids which yielded a low bid approximately \$200,000 under budget. Our actual bid assistance effort was \$9,690.50.

We request the Municipal Authority's approval for the additional \$2,190.50.

2. Construction Phase

Pennoni will provide professional services during the construction phase on a Time and Materials basis at our approved hourly rates. Services are expected to include:

- Review of construction submittals and shop drawings
- Attendance at pre-construction and progress meetings
- Assistance with ordering materials and equipment
- Response to Township and contractor questions and RFIs
- Preparation of a Construction Issue Plan set

- Coordination with PADEP regarding the GP-11 permit compliance
- Application for a PADEP permit amendment for additional wetland crossing for secondary construction access off of Tanglewood Drive
- Survey and stakeout of the sanitary sewer easement off of Fox Glove Lane cul-de-sac
- Monitoring of stone and aggregate quantities from Township's supplier
- · Review and processing of contractor payment applications and any change orders
- Coordination with PA DCED for use of grant funding if the LSA grant is awarded
- Coordination with adjacent property owners
- Preparation of post-construction record plans based on survey data and redline markups from the contractor
- Nearly full-time inspections during pipe installation and trenching and part-time inspections during site preparation, restoration, and other work

The estimated fee for Construction Phase Services is a range based upon a 100-day construction duration as allowed by the construction contract. A schedule has not yet been provided by the contractor. For purposes of this proposal, we assume approximately 30-40 days of active pipe and trench work at 8 hrs/day of inspections and another approximately 30-40 days of site preparation, restoration, and other work at 2 to 4 hrs/day of inspections for a total of approximately 330 to 440 hours of inspections. We also included 8 hours of survey by a 2-person field crew, 120 hours of engineering/office support, and 10 hours for record plans.

DELIVERABLES

We will provide a record plan upon completion of construction based upon redline as-built markups from the contractor.

SCHEDULE

We will perform the scope of services based upon the contractor's schedule.

FEE

Pennoni will provide the above referenced scope of services for Task 2 on a Time and Materials basis, to be billed at the Authority's approved rates for Pennoni, for an estimated fee range of \$50,000 to \$60,000 based on the aforementioned assumptions on duration of work.

BILLING AND PAYMENT

Invoices will be submitted monthly. Payment is due within 30 days of invoicing.

Mark,

It would obviously be a really long run for a typical grinder pump service pipe, but it appears to be the only option that doesn't involve a main extension. The pump should be fine to pump that distance, but we will confirm.

We marked up the attached PDF sewer map noting that the closest other existing sewer main is near Hunters Circle or Christine Lane. I expect that the preference is to keep this property in the RCSTP service area though, and those options would involve several easements, PennDOT permits for road crossing, and undesirable lengthy service piping in the road ROW. Therefore, the connection to the sewer immediately upstream of the plant is likely the best solution.

There is a slight possibility that a gravity sewer may be technically feasible (we haven't analyzed in detail yet), but that would likely be significantly more expensive to construct and potentially problematic with solids deposition given the pipe length and limited flow. The following requirements are therefore based upon a grinder pump solution.

A sewer to tie in immediately upstream of the plant would require the following:

- Preparation of plans with design calculations for the proposed pump to confirm it will work
- Recorded Grinder Pump Operation & Maintenance Agreement
- Sewage Facilities Planning exemption from PADEP
- Easements from the Township on Parcels 53-4-134.8 and 53-4-578
- PADEP permit for piping under the Ridley Creek (this would likely be through a General Permit GP-5 "Utility Line Stream Crossings"). This will likely require a topographic field survey for the permit plans.
 - A PNDI environmental search receipt will be required. The PNDI receipt will almost certainly require a
 wetlands and bog turtle habitat assessment since there will likely be work to connect to the sewer main
 in the wetlands immediately upstream of the RCSTP
 - The assessment that we commissioned for the Reservoir Rd Pump Station project concluded that the area upstream of the RCSTP IS bog turtle habitat. Therefore, approval of US Fish & Wildlife Service for bog turtle protective measures will be required. Those measures will likely necessitate the applicant provide an environmental scientist on-site during construction to monitor for bog turtles with time-of-year restrictions, but there may be other requirements.
 - Chester County Conservation District approval of E&S plans is required for GP-5 permits.
- PADEP permit for temporary disturbance to wetlands, assuming that the connection to the existing sewer main would be in the wetlands area upstream of the RCSTP
- Policy has been not to tie pressure service pipes directly into the Township's gravity sewer main. If that is the
 case here, they would need to tap the sewer main and run a gravity lateral whatever distance the Township will
 be responsible for. I would suggest approximately 10 linear feet if that policy is applicable here.

An 1,800 LF pipe of 1.25" diameter holds about 115 gallons of wastewater. Therefore, the detention time in the pipe should be about 1 day, which is not ideal but may not be a dealbreaker.

For the applicant's cost considerations:

The Morstein Rd grinder pump and lateral construction cost approx \$38,760 per Botella's cost quote, which was for a grinder pump, approx 300 LF of low pressure service piping, and abandonment of the existing septic system. If the pump system was about \$10K of that cost and the septic abandonment about \$5K, then the unit price for piping via directional drill was about \$80/LF (\$23,760 / 300 LF). For about 1,800 LF for the subject property, the piping cost could therefore be nearly \$140K. Adding in \$10K for the pump & tank, and \$15K-\$20K for engineering, legal, & permitting, the whole project cost could be over \$160K. Alternatively, as you know, a septic system typically costs around \$35K-\$40K.
