CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Deborah called the meeting to order at 7 pm.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the February 2, 2023 meeting were approved.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

1. Deborah acknowledged Janet Vokoon who is here to discuss Pickleball courts.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Poet Laureate – Jason mentioned the two candidates for this position. Ethan Altshul a sophomore at East High School and Richard Donze, a physician and published poet. Jason wants to recommend both for the position. Ethan would be appointed as our Youth Poet Laureate and focus on promotion of the written word among our youth. Richard would be given the traditional title of Poet Laureate and would work with adults in township poetry circles. Peter made a motion to recommend Richard Donze and Ethan Altshul to Township Poet Laureate appointments for the year 2023 and 2024. Kishor seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. Janet Vokoon suggested that Jason go to Goshen Elementary to announce Ethan's appointment and maybe post a picture of him so the kids get used to him.

2. 2023 Egg Hunt -- Jason commented that this event will be held on April 1, 2023. He will set up time slots according to age like last year, starting at 9:00 am. He feels there will be 200-300 kids per age group. He needs volunteers to spread the eggs and do face painting.

3. 2023 Summer Camp – The 550 spots were filled quickly. There are 500 on the wait list. Jason tried to get a second location. Next year he will have 2 locations and will take reservations from EG residents first.

1 4. Milltown Park – This location was initially a school house. Jason mentioned that he and several PR members
2 walked through the neighborhood a while ago to see what the residents might want in the park with these results:

- 3 a. a play structure (there is a set of swings)
- 4 b. leave the flat area as grass
- 5 c. incorporate a shade structure
- 6 d. improve the hillside – there are 2 paths that people walk their dogs on and the kids sled on

7 Jason met with the playground contractor today. He could install in 2 days. The total price for this project is \$150,
8 \$50k for the playground. There are 100 houses and 2 apartment complexes in this area. All are within walking
9 distance to the park. John commented that he would like to get this phase started and do upgrades in the future.
10 Jason mentioned that he spoke to a resident who attended the school when it was there. He wants to install a plaque
11 for the school.

12 5. Cubing Tournament – This contest was very successful. There were 15 kids with about 100 parents. Girls
13 participated and one was a winner. Jason wants to do this on a quarterly basis.

14 6. Book Club – Deb reported that they started in January with 10 members and met in February with 14 members.
15 The next meeting is Tuesday March 14 at 1:00 pm.
