

Spring Greetings from the Chairman

Hello Neighbors!

As the weather warms up from an already mild winter (my apologies to all the snow lovers!), I wanted to share with you what is happening in and around East Goshen as well as provide some updates on important issues that we will continue to deal with throughout 2023.

Large infrastructure projects and ongoing maintenance/ repairs of existing infrastructure continue to dominate staff's effort and time. Public Works Director Mark Miller and his crew are tackling much needed repairs to many miles of sewer pipe here in the township by proactively televising the system and repairing exposed issues in order to keep non-sewage water intrusion to a minimum. The "infiltration and inflow" of this ground water into our sewer system can have an enormous impact on the bottom line costs of a sewer system.

We remain diligent in this task so that we meet our environmental obligations while also providing the most economical solution for a wastewater utility option to residents and businesses. Though we do see some municipalities selling their systems to private entities, the current board believes that the best way to keep rates stable while also providing our township with a well-functioning system is to have an "in-house" approach and retain ownership of sewer operations as we have a great team comprised of staff, the Municipal Authority, and the Board of Supervisors.

Besides this long-term approach, we have also had to deal with a large swath of sewer pipe totally failing in the Hershey's Mill Estates section of the township. While it was an expensive repair for which we needed to go out to bid for as well as an impactful one to the surrounding community, it was necessary and the project has been moving along quite nicely.

The largest and most expensive project on the horizon continues to be the Milltown Dam Park project which has been in discussions for 5 years. Unfortunately, there were extreme delays due to the necessary construction permit from the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) taking over 2 and a half years to receive. There are continued postponements due to grant agencies lack of direction on extensions for already approved grants. However, the Board of Supervisors, Township Manager, and Finance Director have made it a priority to get this project through the current phase and out to bid as soon as possible so that the Board of Supervisors can evaluate the true cost and allow work to start in some way, shape, or form in 2023. The project is a standing issue at every board meeting and we welcome any and all public input.

While that project gears, another one comes to a close. The Hershey's Mill Dam Park, at the intersection of Hershey Mill Road and Greenhill Road, is now open to the public and provides a unique experience by being able to walk and explore a distinct wetland ecosystem.

The township is seeing a steady amount of applications with regard to zoning variances, land developments, and conditional uses. They can range from small requests for items such as a variance for an in-ground pool to larger land developments that require much more of a process. Proposed ordinance changes also come up from time to time. Please join us on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of every months at 7:00 PM to learn about the issues that come across our desk and provide feedback welcomed by all of the citizenry. Our meetings are always open to the public.

On a fun note, our Parks and Recreation team comprised of Jason Lang and Jess Wilhelmy, with help of a terrific group of volunteers, continue to come up with innovative programing while still making sure our longstanding and beloved events shine! The ever popular East Goshen Community Day will be take place this year on Saturday, June 24th from 5:00 PM to dusk. The fireworks are always a hit. Please call the township building at 610-692-7171 for more details on this event. Additionally, be sure to follow the calendar for a full list of events as the year continues.

In closing, I would be remiss not to mention two retirements that took place in February 2023. The township said goodbye to Barbara Phillips (Staff Accountant) and Sue Smith (Public Works Administrative Assistant), two long-time employees who were an integral part of our team. Their contributions to East Goshen were immeasurable and very much appreciated. We wish them health and happiness in their well-deserved retirement.

Healthy Yards, Healthy Creeks

Even though you may not live close to a creek, you live in a creek watershed. What you spray or spread on your lawn affects the quality of the creek's water and the plants and wildlife that depend on it. Rains commonly wash lawn care chemicals into streams and creeks and pollute them, particularly if these products are not properly used. Many synthetic pesticides (insect and weed killers) broadcast over lawns affect the soil as well. They harm the micro-organisms that give soil life, creating nutrients for plants and texture to improve the soil's ability to absorb and retain water. Pesticides applied to shrubs also may poison the food chain, harming beneficial insects, such as ladybugs, and the birds which feed on them.

The way we take care of our lawns effects our neighbors, our air, our ponds, our streams, and us.

To begin with the ponds and streams, fertilizers and pesticides frequently applied to lawns drain into them, resulting in algae blooms and chemicals damaging to insects and fish.

Fortunately, *The Chester County Water Authority and The Penn State Cooperative Extension* has come up with some suggestions:

- 1) Mow High. Set the mower as high as it will go--3-4" is recommended and it slows growth and discourages disease. When grass is cut low it grows more rapidly, weakening the plant and encouraging disease and pests. Also, taller turf produces more grass plants and shades out weed seedlings.
- 2) Leave the grass clippings on the lawn when left on the lawn return moisture and nitrogen to the soil, thus feeding the lawn's root system. They decompose rapidly with no thatch buildup.
- 3) Water infrequently. Water only when the grass shows signs of drought stress and then water deeply. It reduces water used for maintaining a healthy lawn, forces the grass roots deeper than weed roots, so that the grass draws on moisture below while the weeds die in the dry surface soil. In our area showers and thunderstorms usually provide enough water for lawns.

Remember *never* to mow near streams or in wetlands. In East Goshen, an unmowed buffer of 50' of natural grasses, shrubs or trees is recommended along a stream or pond.

Furrowing plows followed horse hooves. For harvest, unmechanized scythes. Sustainable farming's lost formula preserving earth's bountiful prize.


For centuries Goshen farms flourished; no chemicals sprayed as they tilled. Mother Earth's glad genuflection on Abraham's symbolic hills.

Pipeline Task Force

Please be aware that a formerly unused pipeline is now actively carrying natural gas though East Goshen. It cuts through the middle of Hershey Mill and crosses Paoli Pike by Tallmadge Drive, not far from the East Goshen Municipal building, before continuing into Westtown following Route 352. Just a few feet from Paoli Pike is a "blowdown" valve for this pipeline. A blowdown allows the pipeline operator, Adelphia, to safely vent methane into the air either as part of routine maintenance or a problem with the pipeline. The venting of gas is extremely loud. We have asked to be notified when this will happen. When given prior notice, East Goshen will use Constant Contact to email residents who have signed up to receive these notices. Join us at the Marydell Pond Ribbon Cutting!

Township leadership and members of the Marydell Pond Project Committee would like to invite you to a ribbon cutting on Saturday, June 3rd at 10am. This simple, but important event, will mark the end of a very successful project. In 2016, the Township completed a comprehensive pond study, noting that many of our neighborhood centric bodies of water were in need of remediation. The Township



created a plan to systematically improve these ponds, one at a time, beginning with Marydell Pond. The improvements included dredging the bottom to remove silt build up and the addition of a bubbler to improve and maintain high quality water levels. Acres of native plantings and low mow areas were added to improve the riparian buffer zone and ecological health of the natural space. It was also stocked, so we encourage everyone to come with a fishing pole as well! The Township will next move to Bow Tree Pond II in 2023, details to be announced as they are finalized. Please join us at the Marydell Pond for some remarks and a walk along the water's edge and perhaps some line casting!

East Goshen Township Electronic Payment Program – Sewer/Trash Bill

Utility bills are mailed on/around January 15th, April 15th, July 15th, and October 15th and are due at the end of the following months. When enrolled, we will pull the quarterly utility bill amount, from the bank account provided, on February 20th, May 20th, Aug 20th, and November 20th (or the next business day if these are a weekend).

East Goshen Municipal Authority

The Municipal Authority Embraces Sustainability

The EGMA has focused on managing the wastewater and major sewer assets of the Township to build a more sustainable operation for over a decade. The approach has been a multi-pronged effort with the goal of providing the expected level of service to meet regulatory requirements as well as the expectation and needs of residents. These major assets include 86 miles of sewer lines connecting the many Township neighborhood sewer systems, pumping stations, and the Ridley Creek Sewer Treatment Plant. The Municipal Authority upgraded and expanded the Plant (originally constructed in 1984) in 2010 to treat 750,000 gallons per day at a cost of \$8.6M. Currently there is \$10.9M of outstanding sewer obligations (including principal and interest). Additionally, we send an average of 800,000 gallons per day from the western portion of the Township via the Chester Creek Interceptor to West Goshen's Westtown Way Pump Station that pumps to the West Goshen Sewage Treatment Plant. This agreement contractually obligates ongoing Operating & Maintenance (O&M) costs as well as capital improvement costs paid to West Goshen Sewer Authority. Since 2017, this includes our portion of the \$28M comprehensive West Goshen Sewer Authority capital improvement plan (CIP) and upgrade of the Westtown Way Pump Station for over \$5M.

Mark Miller and the Public Works Department lead the proactive effort managing the sewer assets on the behalf of the Municipal Authority. Public Works is constantly conducting assessments of the entire sewer and pumping station system to plan, budget, and schedule repairs prior to failure occurring. The visible efforts for residents is the televising of sewers to assess structural sewer issues and eliminating non-sewage flows from the system, performing emergency repairs, and responding to calls from users. Even with preventative maintenance, unforeseen events occur such as the necessary replacement of the Hershey's Mill Estates Trunk Sewer, estimated to cost over \$1M. Future improvements and upgrades include the Ashbridge, Hunt Country, and Hershey Mill pump stations as well as relining old cement pipe in Supplee Valley, Lockwood Lane, Waterview, and Grand Oak. Based on industry depreciation standards, we estimate that the majority of equipment at the Ridley Creek Sanitary Treatment Plant will have exceeded its anticipated life within 10 years and need replacement.

The Municipal Authority is 100% funded through East Goshen Township's Sewer Operating Fund and Sewer Capital Reserve Fund. These necessary investments in maintenance, capital improvements, and ongoing capital replacements has strained the financial stability of the MA to manage our sewer assets, producing a funding gap. Asset Management can be defined as a "process for maintaining a desired level of customer service at the best appropriate cost." This process has the primary focus of long-term life cycle performance, rather than short-term, day-to-day aspects. Meeting our fiscal responsibility requires us to meet the annual operating budget, build sufficient reserves to address short-term and long-term needs, and provides us the opportunity to borrow monies under favorable rates and conditions. To address the funding gap, in 2022 the Municipal Authority requested that David Ware, the Township Finance Director, undertake an in-depth review of the monies needed to meet level of service and maintenance goals, current debt financing, and the forecasting of near and long-term capital investments with the assistance of the Public Works Department. The review indicated that the primary reason for the funding gap was due to the manner of sewer rate calculation - focusing on satisfying an annual budget, rather than a rolling full 10-year direct and indirect cost accounting of our assets. Sewer rates had only increased 0.5% per year from 2012 to 2019, whereas annual inflation increased 1.6% per year. After this analysis, East Goshen Township approved a \$20 per quarter increase in the fixed rate portion of the sewer rate, a first step in addressing the funding gap. Our intention is that each July, Dave will evaluate the forecasted 10 year revenue, expense, and balance of the Sewer Operating Fund, Sewer Reserve Fund and the life-cycle of our sewer assets to ascertain whether the Municipal Authority's fiscal responsibilities are sustainable at the current sewer rates. The goal is to maintain ownership of the sewer system, provide necessary regulatory and expected customer service levels, and sustain the system for the fore-seeable future through ongoing, modest rate increases rather than sell to a large water utility company and relinquish management of both service and rates. Continued Asset Management and proper funding will allow the East Goshen Municipal Authority and East Goshen Township to provide the level of expected wastewater treatment services at a reasonable cost.
