Approval of Minutes

The minutes from the meeting on March 9, 2023 were unanimously approved.

Presentation by Ginny Kerslake on Potential Pipeline Projects

Ginny made a presentation on two potential pipeline projects that could impact EGT. The first was the Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) Export Terminal in Chester. The PTF had previously discussed this subject and Ginny provided an update. This project could utilize the Williams Transco or Texas Eastern pipelines in EGT. The Philadelphia LNG Export Task Force will hold the first of three hearings on 04/20/2023 at the Navy Yard. A report is expected in November 2023.

The second project was the Mid-Atlantic Clean Hydrogen Hub (MACH2). This is one of several proposed hubs that could produce blue hydrogen from methane with some carbon capture via underground storage of carbon dioxide. An extensive network of existing petroleum pipelines would be utilized. These pipelines could include Mariner East and Williams Transco in EGT. There are concerns with transporting hydrogen in steel pipelines. Modifications (including the installation of plastic linings) may be required. There are currently only minimal regulations regarding the transportation of carbon dioxide in pipelines.
