



Greetings from the Chairman

Hello Neighbors!

As we continue to enjoy the dog days of summer and look to fall months, I wanted to briefly give you all some key information about township business and upcoming events to keep on your calendar.

My last update detailed many of the infrastructure projects we continue to tackle here in East Goshen. While we more specific information will be given as these projects progress, I will simply say that our Public Works team is working persistently to address all of our infrastructure needs, both planned and unplanned. The phase "end of useful life" is one that has proved to be very relevant with all of our roads, sewer lines, stormwater pipes, and even trees. Rest assure that the board of supervisors and staff continue to plan on a long-term basis with regard to these important community assets and we will budget appropriately and prudently while maintaining our responsibility to provide residents with a place they can be proud to call home.

Speaking of the budget, we are nearing that time of year where the 2024 budget will be front and center at multiple board meetings in the coming months. The budget process started in June with a look at the long-range budgeting forecast during one of our board meetings. We now turn our focus specifically to 2024. The budget will be front and center at the special September 12th meeting at 7:00 PM and will completely focus on the General Fund. Further budget discussion will take place on September 19th, October 3rd, and November 7th. The preliminary budget is scheduled to be voted on at the November 21st meeting with the final budget vote coming on December 19th. Please keep an eye on the board agenda and calendar for any changes to these dates that may come up.

As the weather cools down, our fall event schedule really heats up! September 16th will be our *Township Yard sale* followed by the *Chester County Art Walk* a week later on September 23rd. Make sure that October 14th is clear so that you can participate in our big events, the *Pumpkin Festival* in the morning followed by the always popular *Food Truck and Music Festival*. Both events will take place at East Goshen Park. We round out October on the 28th with the *Toddler Trick or Treat*.

As the holidays approach, please do not forget about Neighbor to Neighbor Day on November 18th followed by the *Holiday Celebration* and Christmas Tree Lighting on December 2nd. That same day, our *Meet the Reindeer* event will be at the Blacksmith Shop but be sure to get your tickets early for that one as space is limited.

Lastly, I would be remiss if I did not mention the passing of long time board member, Marty Shane. 36 years of public service is truly remarkable and we thank Marty for that commitment to our community as we also wish all of his friends and family comfort in their time of grief.

Pipeline Task Force

The East Goshen Pipeline Task Force has been busy. We have been looking into Hazard Mitigation Plans. Both Chester County and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania are doing thorough reviews of the current hazard mitigation plans. The East Goshen Township Pipeline Taskforce provided input on both plans.

Hazard Mitigation plans are the blueprints for our first responders. These plans give direction in case of an emergency. These emergencies could be flood, hurricane, earthquake, blizzard, wildfire and among other things that most people don't think about because they happen infrequently but need immediate and accurate response by those people who keep our community safe.

In the past pipelines have been approached using an all-hazard response. The Pipeline Task Force along with other interested parties is actively pursuing a more specific and comprehensive response plan for pipelines. We are pleased at the cooperation of our elected officials especially the East Goshen Board of Supervisors as we actively advocate for a pipeline only response. It is imperative that our first responders know what to do in case of a pipeline leak or explosion.

Other interested parties include schools, senior centers, workplaces and anyone that is near the 11 pipelines that are currently located within East Goshen Township. All though the problems have been rare we need to be aware of the Marine slogan: Prior Planning and Preparation Prevents Poor Performance (a P has been omitted for this article:). 
National Law Enforcement Memorial Week


Officer Joshua P. Micun was a member of a family that was deeply committed to community service.



As a result, he began serving the community at a young age by becoming a member of the Green Ridge and Aston Beechwood Fire Departments. Prior to joining the Westtown-East Goshen Regional Police Department, he also served as an officer with the Delaware County Park Police, Upper Providence Police Department, and the Aston Police Department. He began his career with WEGO in June 2015 as a part-time Patrol Officer and was quickly promoted to full-time in March of 2016. He is remembered as a person who always had a smile on his face and who loved to make others laugh.

On October 31, 2021, Officer Micun passed away from a COVID-related illness at the age of 37 while serving his community. He left behind his wife Amanda and his two children, Hayden and Sophia. The Annual National Peace Officers' Memorial Service was held on Monday, May 15, 2023, in Washington, D.C. During this ceremony, Officer Micun was honored for his sacrifice, and his name, which has been









SCAMS



Scammers are constantly finding new ways to steal your money but you can protect yourself by knowing what to look for. Below are just two common ways you can be tricked. NEVER give out personal information, stay calm, think before you act, and always remember to call us at 610-692-5100 if you have any questions or have been the victim of a crime.

Warmer Weather Scams

With the warm weather approaching do not be surprised if you begin to receive calls, emails, texts, uninvited visitors looking for work, and loads of door hangers offering landscaping, roofing, painting, and home repair.

If you need help around the house, our advice is to do your research and make sure whomever you hire is licensed, insured, bonded, and experienced. Also, try to get bids from three reputable companies and remember that cheaper is not always better.

Two more suggestions, never pay in cash or upfront, and don't fall for the line "I just finished a job at your neighbor's house and I'll give you a good price if you hire me today because I'm already in the neighborhood."

Gift Card Scams

Grandparent Scams occur when you are contacted via email or telephone by a subject claiming to be a friend or relative and in most cases your grandchild (thus the name "Granny Scam"). The caller claims they have an emergency and asks the victim to send money immediately. Frequently the caller will claim that they have been involved in a serious crash or have been arrested and need money to keep from being taken to jail. Sometimes, the caller has been claiming to be a police officer who has arrested the friend/relative and will send them to jail unless the victim posts bail. The victim is requested to go to the nearest store (Walmart, Rite Aid) and purchase Gift Cards. When the cards are purchased, the person is requested to provide the numbers from the backs of the cards (enabling them to retrieve the money electronically).

Another version of this scam is when you receive an email from a friend you haven't heard from in a while. They will tell you that they missed their child's birthday because they were sick and unable to leave the house. They then ask you to go to the store for them and purchase Google Play gift cards and share the codes with them.

Emergency Contact Form for Businesses

Dear Business or Property Owner,

The Westtown-East Goshen Regional Police Department is in the process of updating its database for all commercial properties within our coverage area. In order to accomplish this task, we need your assistance and are requesting that you update the emergency contact information for your business. This information is used in the event of an after-hours emergency or incident at your business.

We want to assure you that this information will not be shared outside of law enforcement agencies and other emergency response agencies such as fire and ambulance.

An Emergency Contact Form for Businesses has been attached for your convenience. Completed forms can be submitted using any of the following methods:

- 3. Deliver the form in person to our Department during regular business hours (Monday Friday, 8:30 am to 4:30 pm)

We also offer the ability to electronically submit the form. To use this method:

- 1. Visit www.wegopd.org
- 2. Using the top ruler, select "Contact Us"
- 3. Select "Emergency Contact Form for Businesses"
- 4. Complete form and submit it

You will be asked to complete this form every **12** (**twelve**) months at a minimum to maintain the accuracy of our records. Updated information is accepted as often as necessary for the business.

E. Martin Shane, long time East Goshen Board of Supervisors member, passed away on June 16th at the age of 82. Marty served the township on the board for 36 years. His time on East Goshen's governing body ended in 2021, but those who knew him believe his legacy and impact will be felt for quite some time.

"He was always someone who put East Goshen first" said close friend and former fellow board member Carmen Battavio. "Whether he agreed with you or not, Marty always wanted his colleagues to do what they thought was right for East Goshen and the residents that live here. He genuinely cared about this township."

Current board member, Mike Lynch, had the pleasure of knowing Marty both as a colleague on the board and as a resident himself before that. "He lived and breathed East Goshen Township and realized great joy in the good fortune and success of our outstanding township" stated Lynch. "The only thing Marty ever took from East Goshen was the pride of service to his community."

Being from a different political party or background never mattered to him much according to David Shuey who joined the board in 2018 and quickly became friends with Shane. "Despite our different political alignment when I was first elected, Marty saw that I really cared about East


Goshen Township and took me under his wing. He was my mentor. Marty always wanted and fought for what he believed was best for our residents."


Former board member Thom Clapper summed it up rather simply. "East Goshen is the quality Township that it is because of Marty's

East Goshen Township Electronic Payment Program – Sewer/Trash Bill



This complimentary program is available to our residents. When enrolled in the electronic payment program, a utility bill is mailed for informational purposes, and the invoice indicates "STATEMENT ONLY". Utility bills are mailed on/around January 15th, April 15th, July 15th, and October 15th and are due at the end of the following months. When enrolled, the quarterly utility bill amount is debited from the bank account provided on February 20th, May 20th, Aug 20th, and November 20th (or the next business day if these dates fall on a weekend).

To enroll in the electronic payment program, please complete the form found on our website at www.eastgoshen.org, select SERVICES, FORMS AND APPLICATIONS, ELECTRONIC PAYMENT AUTHORIZATION FORM and include a voided check.

Paying your Sewer/Trash Bill

Should you choose not to enroll in the electronic payment program, please understand that the U.S. Postal Service has experienced changes over the past few years resulting in mail delays. If you generate a bank bill payer to pay your bill, your bank mails your check to the Township. Ultimately, residents are responsible for ensuring utility payments are received by the deadline in order to avoid any additional fees. Paying by personal check? Save a stamp and ensure the Township receives your payment. Deposit your check in the drop box, accessible 24/7 at the front of the Township building.

What's Happening at Goshen Fire Company?





WATER SUPPLY

Most of East Goshen Township is covered by fire hydrants. There are some areas that are not, however, where we have to use tankers to bring water to the fire. We recently trained with neighboring fire companies on the use of a "tanker task force" which uses tanker trucks to bring water from the closest hydrant to a fill site near the fire. This water is then pumped out of the portable tanks to an engine that will extinguish the fire.

Keep snow and ice 3 feet away from fire hydrants.

In case of fire, firefighters need to be able to get to the hydrants quickly to protect people and property.





If you do have hydrants on your street, don't forget to "adopt" one this winter if we actually get some snow! Shovel a 3 foot area around the hydrant so firefighters can easily access it.

Winter Weather and Snow Removal:

Pre-storm Preparedness Checklist:

- ✓ No on-street parking to allow efficient and safe plowing/salting
- Clear snow from any fire hydrants on or near your property
- ✓ Keep a safe distance from all plow trucks
- ✓ Avoid all unnecessary travel
- ✓ Have a 7-day supply of all medications
- ✓ Have 1 gallon of water per person per day on hand
- ✓ Have a 3-day supply of non-perishable food

- ✓ Have baby supplies, diapers, formula, etc.
- ✓ Flashlights & batteries
- ✓ Radio (battery-operated)
- ✓ Blankets
- ✓ Full tank of propane for grill
- ✓ Have your car's gas tank filled
- ✓ Keep your pets inside; make sure they have 7-day supply of food
- ✓ Have dry wood in a garage or covered area for the fireplace or woodstove





Snow Removal:

- We put a layer of brine on the road before the snow event starts. This prevents snow from bonding to the pavement and creating ice.
- We then put a layer of salt down on the roads when the snow event starts.
- Once the snow starts to accumulate, the plows begin to make one pass in and out of every street until the snow stops.
- When the snow stops, we begin to clear the streets by pushing the snow to the curb.
- When clearing your driveway, **do not** deposit the snow into the roadway; this can cause hazardous conditions to other motorists.
- Cul-de-sacs and storm drains are the final areas to be cleaned up after a storm.

Important Information on Snow Removal:

- Do not park on the street during a snow event.
- When shoveling your driveway, leave the last six feet of your driveway un-shoveled until the plowing has ceased. This un-shoveled part will allow the snow being pushed by the plow to remain on the plow and not be pushed into your driveway.
- The Township does not plow residential driveways.
- If an ambulance has been called to an address in the Township, we will help bring in the emergency vehicle.
- Please bear in mind that we cannot be everywhere at once. We will plow all roads in order of traffic priority: first, the main roads and then secondary roads.
- Our snowplow drivers are asked to take precautions to avoid striking mailboxes with their plows, but snow can be extremely heavy and a cold, brittle mailbox can come down easily.



Mailboxes:

- Expensive or ornate mailboxes should be replaced with a basic mailbox for the winter months.
- Mailboxes should be located so the face of the box is 6 8 inches from the edge of the curb. This is according to USPS guidelines. We suggest to put them as far as 15 inches back from the road edge.
- Is your mailbox sturdy? Plastic mailboxes tend to become brittle from the sun's UV rays. Make sure the door on the mailbox is closed tightly. If the door is missing or open, the mailbox is sure to "fold" on impact of the snow.
- The East Goshen Township Board of Supervisors passed a resolution that states that the Township will reimburse a resident \$25.00 for replacement or repair of a damaged mailbox, provided the resident has advised the Township of said damages within one week of the snow removal operation. The Township does not repair any mailboxes.

Letter from Park and Recreation Commission

Well, this summer flew by and we had a marvelous time having fun in the park this summer! This got off to an auspicious start when we had to move Community Day from June to August, but everything else was smooth sailing!

Our summer camp program this year was tremendously successful! We had 150 campers each week, wonderful staff and made plenty of memories. A personal favorite memory this year was our "Shave Jason's Head" canned food drive. We smashed our record with 1200 pounds of donations, and the campers really did a number on my head! The chant of make him bald" could probably be heard all the way down in Philly…but the kids had fun! Looking forward to next year, we hope to have two dedicated camp sites to meet the need of families in the area. We'll work to make that happen this fall, and look for postings and emails as we finalize arrangements.

We also opened our new pickleball and tennis courts this summer that has been a welcome addition to East Goshen Township Park. Residents, interested in giving pickleball a try? Check out the programming section in the newsletter for dates and times for upcoming clinics. I've definitely received a few calls from residents confused about how play moves when the courts are full. There are two options currently available on our eight pickleball courts. You can reserve courts one and two, for up to one hour at a time, three times per week, booking up to two weeks in advance. We understand some residents have busy schedules and have to juggle pickleball play amongst other priorities. But the majority of our play is called "paddle up" which is essentially next person up. There are two racks bolted to the fence that can hold twenty-four racquets. If the courts are full when you show up, simply put your racquet in the next slot and start to stretch out! When a court opens, the players leaving the court say, "Open court", and next in line would play. The full rules and court etiquette listing is located on site in the kiosk.

Looking at this fall, we have a lot going on! We have trips to Dutch Apple Theatre and aboard the Kalmar Nyckel coming up! We are also bringing the Building Bridges: Senior's Tech Classes back! Each Monday afternoon in October, East High School students will come to the Township Building to help seniors learn more about their smartphones and computers. If art is more your thing, the 3rd Annual Chesco Art Walk is Sept 23rd and its entirely in EGT Park this year! The Art Walk is also sponsoring a teen art competition, \$500 to the winning piece! Email me with questions! Piggybacking on our wildly successful Teen Filmmakers Showcase, we'll be offering our first Filmmakers Academy throughout the fall! This "filmmaking 101" program will be a ton of fun, and is great for any teen creative types. As the weather undoubtedly cools, events heat up with the Pumpkin Festival on October 14, Food Truck Festival that evening and a new one, our first 30+ Co-Ed Flag Football Turkey Bowl on November 11th! So strap on those cleats, start running some wind sprints, and get ready for some football!

So as we take those final trips to the beach and start to pull out our comfy sweatshirts and jeans, don't get ready to hunker down just yet. Fall in EGT Park is our BEST season. The weather is cooler and less temperamental, and our events just keep getting bigger and better. 



The Frog Barometer

Recent hikes through various preserves in the township have revealed a bounty of animal sightings of different sorts. One animal in particular, a frog, caught my eye because of it's deep green color and relative scarcity among the many hikes made. This particular frog was a green frog, (Lithobates clamitans). About 4" long and perched in the grass about 6' from the Ridley Creek shore. Once seen, the green frog lept to the edge of Ridley Creek in a single jump.

For a little background on the green frog: like most frogs, adult Green Frogs are carnivores. Green Frogs are opportunistic feeders, consuming virtually any available prey small enough to swallow, including insects, spiders, small fish, crayfish, other crustaceans,

groomed landscapes near to the riparian edges of our streams. Green frogs breath through their skin, and store chemicals in their fat. Over chemical exposure can result in negative impacts for the frog (including birth defects, hormone abnormalities, death). They are also very temperature sensitive. They need a cool, shaded habitat. Fortunately, this frog lived quite a distance from the nearest treated lawn or storm sewer outlet. The stream and riparian area was well shaded. He seemed quite healthy given his beautiful markings, stark green color and sizable leaping ability.

Why do frogs matter? Besides fitting into the ecosystem as animals of prey and also predators, think of frogs as another barometer on the health of our streams, riparian areas and, in some ways our community as a whole. The more chemicals that get washed into the creeks via storm sewers and impervious surfaces, the more chemical load there is in our environment. That can be unhealthy for frogs and people.

The good news is the frog was out there and healthy. The frog barometer says we can manage our natural terrain to all our benefit. But it takes a smart approach. There is no one size fits all solution. Here are some helpful ideas to consider no matter where you live in the township:

Prevent water pollution - Soaking up the rain helps keep rain water on-site and reduce the polluted runoff flowing into our streets and local waterways (e.g. grading & planting). Reduce flooding - When heavy rain falls, the runoff that flows into the street can back up and cause street flooding. When we soak up the rain we help reduce the amount of water that flows from our properties into the street and the storm water system (e.g. rain gardens and rain barrels)

Protect our water resources - When we soak up the rain we help get water into the ground. This helps to keep our streams and rivers flowing and replenish the groundwater we rely on for drinking water and other uses. By reducing the rush of storm water flowing downstream we're also helping to reduce soil and stream bank erosion.

Climate resiliency - As different parts of the country become drier, wetter or hotter from more paved surface or more structures, green infrastructure practices can help communities improve their resiliency.

Beautify neighborhoods - When we soak up the rain with trees and rain gardens in our yards and in our cities, we're adding beauty to the landscape. (plant native specie trees and shrubs).

Cool the air - When we soak up the rain by planting trees and other plants in our urban neighborhoods we're helping to cool the air and reduce urban heat islands.

Save money - When we soak up the rain and reduce the runoff that flows to the street, we reduce the water to be handled by the town drainage systems. This can help lower community costs for managing this water. Green roofs can lower building energy costs;

permeable pavements can lower construction costs for residential and commercial development by reducing the need for some conventional drainage features.

Create habitat - When we plant trees, grasses and flowering perennials, especially native plants suitable for the area, we create habitat for birds and insects such as butterflies, bees and other pollinators. https://www.epa.gov/soakuptherain/soak-rain-whats-problem

Vary the timing & amount of lawn & garden treatments - For example, instead of applying a full coarse of weed and feed every several months, halve the amount of treatment applied at each application and double the frequency with which it is applied, while timing the application to avoid contributing to contaminated storm runoff.
