## Smoke Detector/Smoke Alarm Disposal





## There are two common types of smoke detectors:

- ❖ <u>Ionization detectors</u> have a small amount of radioactive material (Americium-241) that creates a chemical reaction with smoke.
- **Photoelectric detectors** use a laser to detect smoke. These types of detectors do not contain any radioactive material; therefore, they can be disposed of in the trash.

Smoke detectors are not accepted at Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events. Smoke detectors should be sent back the manufacturer or to a reputable service for recycling and proper disposal. See below for the best options.
