9 Gerry noted that West Whiteland Township recently adopted a carbon dioxide pipeline10 ordinance that is very similar to the one in EGT.

13 Hydrogen Pipelines

14 Continued discussion of this topic including our latest findings. So far, few existing

- 15 regulations and guidelines specific to hydrogen pipelines have been identified. The group
- 16 reviewed a first draft of a proposed ordinance and an appendix. Barbara suggested that
- wording be added to the subsection on material of construction for hydrogen pipelines in
- 18 the draft ordinance to better explain why hydrogen embrittlement is a critical issue. This
- comment will be addressed in the next draft. The use of permits to regulate hydrogenpipelines in the township was discussed. It is felt that an ordinance could serve as the
- 20 pipelines in the township was discussed. It is left that an ordinance could serve as the 21 basis for any future permitting requirements. The group agreed that we need to do some

32 **Pipeline fire in La Porte Texas**

- 33 The group discussed a summary of this incident that Gerry prepared and emailed on
- 34 09/22/2024. There are many features of this La Porte pipeline that are similar to those
- 35 for pipelines in EGT. Mary will research regulations regarding the requirement for
- 36 protective/safety equipment around above-ground infrastructure (like valve stations) on
- 37 pipelines. These regulations could be at the federal, state, or local level.

39 <u>Reports / Legislative Update</u>

- 40 Mary reported that she emailed Chester County Commissioner Josh Maxwell in October to
- 41 express concern regarding potential damage to pipelines as a result of extreme flooding.
- 42 In his response, Commissioner Maxwell cited the Pipeline Incident Annex being
- 43 developed by the Chester County Department of Emergency Services. He also mentioned
- 44 current work on a flood mitigation plan for the entire Brandywine watershed. The intent
- 45 of this plan is to expand the capacity of retention basins and dams.

1 Approval of Minutes

8 <u>Chairperson's Report</u>

9 Gerry noted that October 8th was National Hydrogen and Fuel Cell Day. That date was
10 chosen because 10/08 is the same sequence of numbers as the atomic weight of
11 hydrogen, which is 1.008.

12

Gerry shared that the Center for Hydrogen Safety (CHS) announced that PHMSA joined as
 a strategic partner. CHS is a global non-profit dedicated to promoting hydrogen safety

- and best practices worldwide. Gerry intends to do more investigation of CHS to
- 16 determine if they have any information that could be useful to the PTF.
- 17
- 18 Gerry also shared an article on sequestering carbon in wood vaults. As is the case with 19 most new technologies, barriers to scaling up include permitting and funding. But the
- simplicity of this methodology means implementation could be rapid.

22 Old Business

23 Hydrogen Pipelines

- 24 The group continues to work on a draft hydrogen pipeline ordinance. Proposed setback
- distances from the pipelines were discussed. So far, it has been difficult to find
- information that strongly supports a rationale for a specific setback value. More researchis needed.
- 28

29 La Porte Texas Pipeline Fire

- 30 Many features of the La Porte Texas pipeline are similar to those for pipelines in EGT. The 31 group discussed the four above-ground valve/meter stations in our township and
- 32 preventing an accident like the one in La Porte. The valve station on the Williams natural
- 33 gas pipeline south of Paoli Pike is the most vulnerable to a vehicle strike. Several means
- 34 of reducing this risk were discussed. Paoli Pike is a state road which is managed by
- 35 PennDOT. Michele will ask Derek to place this topic on the agenda for the next BOS
- 36 meeting on 11/19/2025 and Gerry will attend.

38 <u>New Business</u>

The group discussed what to do in the future if there is another Zoom-bombing issue like
the one that occurred at the October meeting.

- 42 John will not be continuing with the PTF in 2025 and will resign effective 11/30/2025.
- 43 The PTF thanked him for his service during the past two years.
- 44
- 45 Gerry proposed some changes regarding the PTF meeting schedule in 2025. He would
- 46 like to reduce the frequency of meetings and change the meeting time. He recommended

1	that the PTF meet every other month and during the day. The group agreed with this
2	proposal and gave suggestions for possible dates and times. [PMN: The group agreed to
3	meet at 10:00 am in the small conference room on the third Tuesday of odd numbered
4	months with the exception of May. Since 05/20/2025 is Primary Election Day, the PTF
5	will meet at 10:00 am on Monday 05/19/2025 (3rd Monday). This 2025 PTF meeting
6	schedule was approved by the BOS at their re-organization meeting on 01/06/2025.]
