## **Public Comment**

Russ Frank had questions about the proposed hydrogen hub MACH2. Gerry responded.

## Chairperson's Report

Gerry summarized an article he read about planting trees to offset carbon emissions from fossil fuels. Researchers in the UK performed calculations to determine the practicality of this methodology. They started by estimating the potential carbon dioxide emissions from the fossil fuel reserves of the 200 largest oil, gas, and coal fuel companies. They then determined the ability and cost of planting trees to remove carbon through photosynthesis. They concluded that trees would have to cover the entire land mass of North and Central America to capture this amount of carbon dioxide. The cost to plant that many trees would be \$10.8 trillion, which is more than the entire combined market valuation of \$7.01 trillion for these companies. This article makes the point that it is financially impossible to offset enough carbon to compensate for future fossil fuel burning.

He also shared another article about a startup company using bacteria to turn carbon dioxide into commercial-grade compounds. By using carbon dioxide that would have otherwise entered the atmosphere, this technology can reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

The formal request was submitted to PennDOT by Pennoni. It is typically a 4 to 6 week turnaround time for a reply.

# Update on jet fuel pipeline leak in Upper Makefield Township

Judi had previously asked if water quality testing by Aqua would have detected the compounds from this leak. Gerry reviewed the Aqua 2024 Water Quality Report for the Main System in the West Chester area for some guidance. There is testing for certain volatile organic contaminants. However, it is unclear if typical water quality testing protocols would have detected the compounds in question. Also, the affected wells were private water sources which are not routinely tested by a municipal water authority. DEP has scheduled a town hall in Upper Makefield Township building tonight to provide updates.
