- Plank House Dolores and Judy met with Heather Hansen of the CCHS at the Plank House. 2
- 3 She was very surprised and pleased and made some recommendations for things that are
- appropriate for the Federal time period. She sent a report. Dolores researched the items in the 4
- 5 report and distributed copies to everyone. Dolores feels that, since we want the Plank House to 6
- be interactive, we should have reproductions made instead of trying to purchase the originals. 7
 - Reproductions will cost \$500-800 each. Some of the items are:
 - 1. Sheraton Drop-leaf Work/Sewing Table
 - 2. Ashbridge Chester County Sampler done by Hannah Ashbridge around 1731. She was born in Goshen on 2/26/1715 and lived her whole life here. Dolores mentioned that there is an antique dealer in Sugartown who can appraise this sampler.
 - 3. Pillar and Scroll Clock Eli Terry Jr was the first person to produce these clocks so the ordinary person could have a clock.
 - 4. Rocking Chair without arms was used for nursing and/or sewing so it is referred to as a woman's rocking chair.
 - 5. Antique French Needlework or Embroidery Stand
 - Dolores feels these items should be prioritized, i.e. rocking chair, clock, table, frame.
- 18 Heather also suggested making some simple window valances.
- 19 Plank House Security - A security system has been installed in the Plank House and
